
IADVL Academy Report: 16th July to 15th December 2021

IADVL Academy has gone through another successful year with the support of IADVL EC. The activities remained limited on the web this year as well due to the ongoing Pandemic. Activities on the web are archived on IADVL Digital Academy platform at https://iadvl.mediknit.org/. This in one way is a blessing in disguise as IADVL members across the country could peruse the activities without being limited to a state or a zone.

Applications were invited for observership, new centers for IADVL training courses, MIDDERMACON 2021 Academy sessions, DERMACON Orations, Dr B.V. Satyanarayana best thesis award 2021 and editors and authors for IADVL books. Application forms specifically designed by Academy members (and approved by the EC) are used in order to allow objective evaluation, using a scoring sheet to ensure selection by merit. Confidential evaluation of SIG functioning, verification visits to new training centers and monitoring of e-library usage were regularly performed. Formal feedbacks were obtained for PGCONs, basic and advanced PGPDTs, Research Methodology and how to publish workshop and from Observership candidates.

SIG Coordinators meeting with IADVL Academy

The meeting of the IADVL Academy with the SIG Coordinators were held on July 24, 2021 on the web. Updates on the SIG activities/ activities of the taskforces presented and future plans for the year were discussed.



CONFERENCES, CMEs & WORKSHOPS

IADVL Research Methodology and How to Publish Workshop-2021

Evening e-workshop on research methodology in collaboration with Manipur IADVL on 08.09.2021. A full day workshop on the web in collaboration with IADVL Maharashtra State branch on how to publish was held on 18.09.2021. This workshop was coordinated by SIG Dermatology Clinical Research (Dr Ajithkumar K, Coordinator; Dr Rahul Mahajan, Convener). Various basic and practical aspects of drafting a study protocol to a manuscript was discussed. A quiz was held as a part of the program with enthusiastic participation.

SIG Dermatology Clinical Research under the aegis of IADVL Academy has been holding research methodology workshops and later how to publish workshops for several years now. This year there was a big leap as a workshop on systematic review- Cochrane reviews and meta-analysis was held on 21.11.2021 for the first time. This workshop was coordinated by SIG Dermatology Clinical Research (Dr Ajithkumar K, Coordinator; Dr Rahul Mahajan, Convener). Dr Laxmisha Chandrashekar gave valuable input in planning the workshop. A quiz was conducted as a part of this program. Sun Pharmaceuticals Ltd supported this activity.

Acne e-CMEs

A series of 10 acne e-CMEs were initiated. An acne taskforce (Coordinator- Dr Niti Khunger, Convener- Dr Swapnil Shah) was constituted for this purpose. Members of the taskforce and members nominated by the respective state branches were the faculty for these workshops. Seven workshops were held during this period- 25.07.2021 (Andhra Pradesh), 15.08.2021 (Gujarat), 11.09.2021 (Maharashtra) 19.09.2021 (Kerala), 10.10.2021 (North-East), 21.11.2021 (Uttar Pradesh and Uttarakhand) and 28.11.2021 (Karnataka). Sun Pharmaceuticals Ltd supported this program.



Advanced hair Transplant workshops

The third and fourth workshop in the series of four such workshops were held with the SIG Trichology and Hair Transplantation (Coordinator- Dr Kavish Chouhan, Convener- Dr Kuntal Deb Barman) on 01.08.2021 and 22.08.2021. The activity was supported by Dr Reddy's Laboratories Ltd.


Aesthetics CMEs

Two CMEs were held with SIG Aesthetics during this period- Radio frequency tightening (02.10.2021) and Microneedling (31.10.2021). This activity was supported by Biopharmacieaa Pvt Ltd.

ASCENT Workshops

IADVL ASCENT (Assimilate Evidence Based Insights in PsO and PsA) workshops were held as a series of 4 web-based workshops to equip our members with essential updates about Psoriasis & Psoriatic Arthritis with the aim to facilitate updated and effective management of these conditions. These workshops were held with the SIG Psoriasis (Coordinator- Dr Sushil Tahiliani, Convener- Dr Bikash Ranjan Kar) and included co-opted members- both IADVL members and experts from rheumatology. These were held on 12.09.2021, 17.10.2021,

31.10.2021 and 14.11.2021. This activity was supported by Pfizer. Six sigma communications was the logistics partner.



CME on Dermatological Neglected Tropical Diseases- SAARC Experience- A CME involving faculty from 4 SAARC countries deliberated on NTDs in this part of the world, challenges and way forward in collaborative activities. This CME was organized in collaboration with the SIG Neglected Tropic Diseases (Coordinator- Dr P. Narasimha Rao, Convener- Dr Parul Verma) on 28.11.2021.

Eczema and hydration webinars and activities

Three webinars were held- Pediatric eczema beyond atopic dermatitis (04.09.2021), Eczema and hydration in the elderly (01.10.2021) and Vulvar eczema and pruritus (04.12.2021). The webinar on 01.10.2021 was held with the SIG Geriatric Dermatology to mark the International Day of Elderly. The webinar on 04.12.2021 was held with the SIG Geriatric Dermatology. This activity is supported by Dr Reddy's Laboratories.





e-Dermatology workshops

Two e-Dermatology workshops were held by the taskforce specifically constituted for this purpose (e-Dermatology taskforce, Coordinator- Dr Feroze Kaliyadan, Convener- Dr Shashank Bhargava). Co-opted experts also participated as faculty. The third and fourth workshops in the series of 4 workshops were held on 25.07.2021 and 15.08.2021. The activity was supported by Pfizer Ltd.

e-PEDDERMACON 2021

The third in the series of PEDDERMACONs, a full day conference on the web was held on 03.11.2021 with the SIG Pediatric Dermatology (Coordinator- Dr Bhumesh Kumar Katam, Convener- Dr Ranugha PSS). International faculty including Prof Rudolph Happle, Dr Matilde Iorizzo, Dr Nina van Beek, and Dr Arti Nanda and several national experts, including SIG members participated in the event. A quiz was conducted as part of the program. This program was supported by Sun Pharmaceuticals Ltd.

GA²LEN Allergy School

GA²LEN Allergy School was brought to India for the first time in collaboration with the global association GA²LEN. These activities were held on 04.07.2021 and 18.07.2021. International certification was provided to the IADVL members who attended both the activities and was complimentary. Two workshops were also held as part of this program. This activity is supported by an educational grant by Sanofi.

PeDerm eCMEs

This series of 4 inter-disciplinary CMEs were organized this year in collaboration with Indian Academy of Pediatrics to promote inter-disciplinary knowledge sharing. The third (22.08.2021- skin as a marker of systemic diseases in pediatric age group) and fourth (05.09.2021- Genodermatoses- a model for multidisciplinary approach) were held within this period. This program was supported by Curatio Healthcare India Pvt Ltd.

Pigmentary Disorders CMEs

A series of 10 CMEs over 2020 and 2021 were concluded during this time. During the period of report, CMEs were held with SIG Pigmentary Disorders (Dr M. Sendhil Kumaran as Coordinator and Dr Chethana Gurumurthy as convener) in collaboration with the IADVL State branches of Telangana (18.09.2021), Karnataka (20.11.2021) as well as Uttar Pradesh and Uttarakhand (05.12.2021). The state branches facilitated these CMEs by coordinating with the SIG, providing inputs for scientific content and faculty from the states and dissemination of information to members to make these CMEs well attended.



Pruritus CMEs

Three CMEs were held by SIG Pruritus (Coordinator- Dr Asit Mittal, Convener- Brig (Dr) Rajesh Verma) on 28.08.2021, 02.10.2021, 14.11.2021 within this period. The CMEs are supported by Dr Reddy's Laboratories Ltd.



Recalcitrant Dermatophytoses Virtual CMEs

In a series of 4 virtual CMEs organized with the SIG Recalcitrant Dermatophytoses (Coordinator- Dr Manjunath Shenoy, Convener- Dr Nayankumar H Patel), varied aspects of epidemiology, diagnostic aspects and management of recalcitrant dermatophytosis. These CMEs were held on 29.08.2021, 12.09.2021, 17.10.2021 and 07.11.2021. This program was supported by Alkem Laboratories Ltd.

Video- based Laser workshops

Five video-based laser workshops were held with the SIG Lasers (Coordinator- Dr Sachin Dhawan, Convener- Dr Pradeep Kumari) and other co-opted experts. These were held on 01.08.2021 (advanced indications of pigmentary lasers), 19.09.2021 (Advanced techniques and indications of laser hair reduction), 10.10.2021 (Acne and rosacea), 07.11.2021 (Skin firming and contouring) and 12.12.2021 (Advanced indications of Lasers potpourri). The activity was supported by Sun Pharmaceuticals Ltd.

IADVL Resident Program (PGCON)

8th Postgraduate conference (PGCON) was conducted centrally on the web like the previous year. This was held on 25.09.2021 and 26.09.2021. This program was supported by an educational grant from Intas Pharmaceuticals. Faculties and delegates (Provisional and Life IADVL members), from across the country participated and positive feedback was received from the Postgraduate participants. A quiz was held as a part of the program with enthusiastic participation. How to face the exams including theory papers and virtual practical exams, navigating residency during the COVID times were introduced considering the changed scenario is postgraduate training and evaluation. Postgraduate were also encouraged to submit well worked-up difficult to diagnose cases.

Postgraduate Procedural Dermatology Training Workshop (PGPDT)

Second PGPDT was held with SIG Dermatosurgery (Coordinator- Dr Nilesh Goyal, Convener- Dr Syed Mubashir) on 29.08.2021. This online workshop, though had been planned to be a physical one, was held on the web as in the previous year. The scientific activities included focus group discussions with video demonstrations, tribute, talks, short video presentation by residents, quiz and a innovative ask the expert session



MIDDERMACON-2021

SIG Dermoscopy and SIG Neglected Tropical Diseases and two Academy sessions- one on COVID and skin and the other one on small molecules in dermatology were held during MIDDERMACON-2021, at Mangaluru, Karnataka from 28-30th October, 2021. It was the first major physical conference after onset of COVID-19 Pandemic. The faculty for the Academy sessions were by invited applications.

e-DERMACON 2022

SIGs (Dermatology Clinical Research, Dermatopathology, Pruritus, Recalcitrant Dermatophytoses, Trichology and Hair Transplantation) are participating in the SIG sessions at e-DERMACON 2022. The speakers for the IADVL Research Grant session were finalized.

IADVL OBSERVERSHIPS

For observerships in 2021, we received 217 applications for 35 IADVL observership centers. A total of 107 candidates (89 < 35 yrs and 18 > 35 yrs) were selected. Of them 79/89 and 17/18 respectively confirmed their slots for Observership 2021. Fifty-one candidates completed their observership by now. Remaining candidates can complete their observership by March 31, 2021.

Ninety-three observers were selected for observerships in 2020. Of the 83 consenting candidates, 40 have completed their observership so far. As per EC approval, remaining can complete their observership by December 31, 2021.

Considering difficulties faced by program directors and observership candidates of last 2 years in completing their observership and because of huge backlog and uncertain times ahead, no applications for new observership centers were invited.

For Observerships 2022, 226 applications were received for 28 centers. Evaluation is being caried out and the list of selected candidates will be announced before e-DERMACON 2022.

IADVL Training Program

This program was initiated in 2021. Eight candidates were selected for training in 4 sub-specialities- Dermatology, Hair Restoration, Pediatric Dermatology and Procedural Dermatology. Three of these 8 candidates have completed their training by now. Remaining candidates can complete their training by 31.01.2022.

Applications were invited for new training centers. After evaluation by Academy and physical verification, 3 new centers are added. Applications for training program will be called shortly.

IADVL International Dermatopathology Obseverships

None of the candidates selected for IADVL International Dermatopathology Observership in 2020 could initiate it. Fresh applications for observership in 2021 and 2022 were not invited.

Research projects and Grants

IADVL Research Grants-2021

Applications were invited from members of IADVL for research grants for projects in Dermatology, Leprosy and STIs. A total of 29 research proposals were submitted by the IADVL members for research grant for the year 2021. The comments of initial review by the members of SIG Dermatology Clinical research were communicated to the Principal Investigators. All the revised proposals were discussed and scored by the jury members during the IADVL Academy meeting held on 10.07.2021. Various aspects including funding, sample size, methodology, novelty, feasibility, and ethical issues were taken into consideration while deciding the research grant. Based on the scores obtained 10 proposals were shortlisted for IADVL Research Grants for 2021. The investigators of all the shortlisted proposals were informed regarding the results of jury meeting along with jury's comments related to budget allocations and research methodology. Based on the satisfactory modification of shortlisted proposals the final list of 10 research proposals eligible for IADVL Research Grant 2020 were announced on 20.11.2021 along with a request to submit necessary documents for disbursement of first instalment of grant.

Till now investigators of 1 research project has submitted all the necessary documents and were given first instalment of the grant.

IADVL Postgraduate Thesis Grant

Dr B.V. Satyanarayana memorial award 2021 for best thesis

Applications were invited for DR. B. V. Satyanarayana Memorial Award 2021 for best thesis award. These 29 applications, were evaluated by the members of the SIG Dermatology Clinical Research based on a pre-approved scoring scheme and were ranked based on mean scores obtained. Winner of this award for 2021 is Dr Suvesh Singh for the thesis 'An Open Label Non-Randomized Preliminary Non-Inferiority Study Comparing Home-Based Hand-Held Narrow Band UVB Comb Device with Standard Hospital-Based Whole-Body Narrow Band UVB Therapy In Localized Vitiligo' under the guidance of Dr Sujay Khandpur.

IADVL Abbott Researcher award

The IADVL Abbott Researcher award is for published research papers in Dermatology, Venereology and Leprosy for original research articles. A cash prize of Rs 25,000 each for one researcher below 35 years of age and one above 35 years of age, along with a certificate is given to the awardees. The award is given during DERMACON and the awarded research work are presented during IADVL research grant session, DERMACON. The evaluation for the 2 awards was done by members of IADVL Academy with a pre-decided evaluation sheet, approved by IADVL EC.

IADVL Scholarships

30 scholarships (10 each under PLM, LM <35 years and LM over 35 years) for MIDDERMACON and 99 scholarships, 33 in each of the three categories, for DERMACON are allocated each year. No applications were invited for MIDDERMACON 2021 or e-DERMACON 2022 this year as both these are held on the web and registrations are free of cost.

Applications for scholarship were invited from IADVL members for attending XIIIth International Congress of Dermatology 2021 that was held virtually on 11th -13th November 2021. As it was a virtual event, the scholarship was only to cover the registration fee for the conference (on an actual basis, up to a maximum of Rs 30,000/-). A total of 8 eligible candidates; 4 -PLM, 3-LM<35 and 1- LM >35, were awarded the scholarship based on merit. After obtaining necessary documents, the scholarship amount has been transferred to 5 scholarship awardees.

Online Training Modules (OTMs)

Online training modules were initiated in 2020 with an educational grant from Mankind Pharmaceuticals Ltd. A total of 11 OTMs have been developed and are available at https://iadvl.mediknit.org for viewing by the members of IADVL. 

Postgraduate training classes


