

IADVL Academy Annual Report July to 10th December-2019

IADVL Academy has gone through another successful year with more IADVL research grants, awards, scholarships, new observership centers, support of postgraduate activities and CMEs and workshops in association with state branches and continuation of online CMEs, supported by IADVL EC.

Applications were invited for observership centers and candidates, speakers for Dermagyan Online Lectures, , and MIDDERMACON 2019 Academy sessions, DERMACON Orations, and editors and authors for IADVL books. Application forms have been specifically designed (and approved by the EC) to allow objective evaluation, using a scoring sheet, by Academy members to ensure selection by merit. Confidential evaluation of SIG functioning, verification visits to observership centers and monitoring of e-library usage were regularly performed. Formal feedbacks were obtained for PGCONs, Research Methodology CMEs and workshops, and from Observership candidates.

CONFERENCES, CMEs & WORKSHOPS

IADVL Research Methodology and How to Publish Workshops-2019

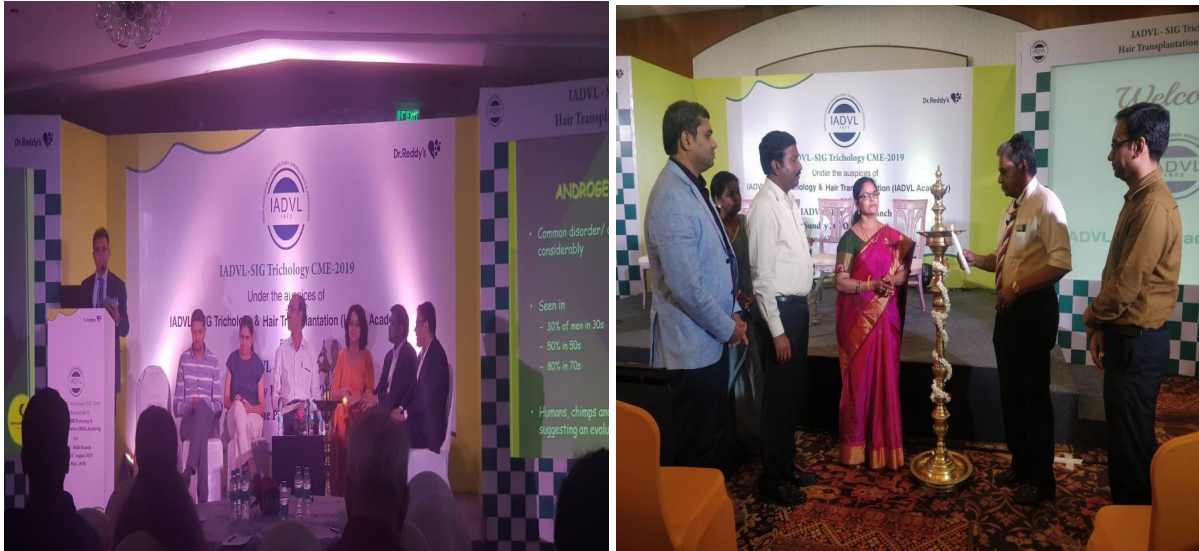
IADVL Masterclass on Psoriasis Awareness, Challenges and Treatments (IMPACT 3.0 CMEs)

IADVL Resident Program (PGCON)

Postgraduate conferences (PGCONs) were conducted in all zones in association with the respective state branches and were supported by an educational grant from Intas : PGCON West on 13th and 14th July 2019 at Indore, MP; PGCON East on 10th and 11th August 2019, at Cuttack, Odisha; PGCON North on 14th and 15th September 2019 at Amritsar, Punjab and PGCON South on 28th and 29th September 2019 at Hyderabad, Telangana. Faculties from all the respective zonal states participated and positive feedback was received from the Postgraduate participants.



MIDDERMACON-2019

SIG Lasers and Aesthetics and SIG Pediatric Dermatology sessions and Academy sessions on Vasculitis and therapeutic and investigative dermatology were held at MIDDERMACON-2019, at Patna, Bihar.

DERMACON Pune, 2020

SIGs Dermoscopy, Neglected tropical diseases, Psoriasis, Female genital dermatoses and Pigmentary Diseases, are participating in the SIG sessions at DERMACON 2020 at Pune and the program has been approved by EC and central supervisory committee. The speakers for the IADVL Research Grant session were finalized after approval from the IADVL EC.

IADVL OBSERVERSHIPS

One hundred and one observers were selected for observerships at 24 centers for 2019 (8 were of >35 years for 2 weeks Observership without stipend and 93 were <35 years for 4 weeks observership with Rs.10,000 stipend).61 candidates have completed their observership till date. Nine candidates withdrew from joining the observership due to personal reasons.

Research projects and Grants

IADVL Research Grants-2019:

Applications were invited from members of IADVL for research grants for projects in Dermatology, Leprosy and STIs. A total of 42 research proposals were submitted by the IADVL members for research grant for the year 2019. Two research proposals were withdrawn by the investigators. All the revised proposals were discussed and scored by the jury members during the IADVL Academy meeting held on 29th June 2019. Various aspects including funding, sample size, methodology, novelty, feasibility and ethical issues were taken into consideration while deciding the research grant. Based on the scores obtained 8 proposals were shortlisted for IADVL Research Grants for 2019 with a total grant of Rs 47,20,980. The investigators of all the shortlisted proposals were informed regarding the results of jury meeting on 19-07-2019 along with jury's comments related to budget allocations and research methodology. Based on the satisfactory modification of shortlisted proposals the final list of research proposals eligible for IADVL Research Grant 2019 were announced on 11-09-2019 along with a request to submit necessary documents for disbursement of first instalment of grant. The investigators of non-selected proposals were also informed with the reasons for not making the final list.

Till now investigators of 2 research project submitted all the necessary documents and were given first instalment of the grant on 21-10-2019.

IADVL Scholarships

IADVL members are eligible for only one national and international scholarship each in their lifetime. Only registered delegates presenting a paper/poster and have no other funding source are eligible.

World Congress Of Dermatology 2019

30 scholarships of Rs 50,000/- each were awarded to IADVL members (14 to LMs >35 yrs, 10 to LMs <35 yrs and 6 to PLMs) attending the World Congress Of Dermatology, 2019 held

at Milan, Italy from 10th to 15th June, 2019. The scholarship amount was disbursed to 27 members along with e certificate after receiving WCD participation certificate.

MIDDERMACON 2019:

All 10 eligible members of the 30 available scholarships (19 PLMs, 3 LMs<35 years & 1 LM > 35 years) were awarded MIDDERMACON 2019 scholarships. The scholarship money of Rs 15,000/- each has been disbursed to all the selected candidates.
