My Dear IADVLites,

This current EC is nearing its term. I take this opportunity to let all of you know what we have accomplished in last one year.

We were fortunate to start our term nearly two months early and this allowed us to plan our year well.

- Four "Research Methodology Workshops" were conducted in four metros. They were very well received.
- We received around 40 applications for IADVL-Ranbaxy and IADVL-Galderma research Grant. Eleven of them were selected by the academy.
- Our academy has become very vibrant and the selection process to various positions is now very transparent. The Academy met midyear for the first time, and discussed various issues. All the vacant position in SIG's were announced and even academy positions has been announced.
- MIDDERMACON held at Aurangabad was a great success. Many young members got for the first time, an opportunity to be faculty. This process is being continued in DERMACON at Mangalore. MIDDERMACON was not only successful on the scientific front but also on an organisational front. For the first time, the organising committee presented unaudited provisional accounts to CC members. They saved Rs. 20 lakhs after spending for the CC meet.
- For the first time, this EC could convince the organising committee of DERMACON 2015 and 2016 and SARAD conference to sign Memoranda of Understanding with IADVL. The EC along with finance committee and CC, is trying in full earnest to look at accounts of DERMACON 2012 held at Jaipur, DERMACON 2013 held at Ahmedabad and ICD held at Delhi.
- The hard work of our EC members has seen a rise in the number of e-voters and also membership to DVL trust.
- Our constitution has been updated and will be published very shortly.
- Many new activities have been started for post-graduates (Is in next line). We have "Resident's forum" for the first time in DERMACON, Mangalore and newsbulletin for post-graduates. They also have an interactive "Residents IADVL" Facebook group.
- Practice management cell and IADVL Media cell is looking after the interest of our practising dermatologist's colleagues.
- ITATSA is trying it's best to educate the public at large, about topical steroid abuse.
- We are in the process of developing mobile software for our members. It is at present in beta version, and will be launched during DERMACON 2015 at Mangalore.
- The IADVL website was revamped with a new look.
- IADVL EC 2014.

It is the last quarter of the year and difficult to imagine a year gone by. It was a year of challenges with every day a learning day. It was also a year of several firsts. First time ever informative Research Methodology Workshops all over the country; a robust IADVL Residents' Welfare Program with their own e-publication- "Residents' Dream-IADVL Residents' News Bulletin", an interactive Facebook group and a first time ever Residents' Forum in DERMACON 2015, Mangalore; first time ever invited applications from members for faculty posts in MID DERMACON, DERMACON 2015, as well as Academy and SIG positions; financial transparency being worked upon with first time ever MoUs signed by DERMACON 2015, MIDDERMACON 2015, DERMACON 2016 and SARAD 2015 Organising Teams. IADVL Membership drive is going strong with more than 350 new members by February 2015 and more than 110 members converted from PLM to LM and still going strong. Perhaps what has worked well is good liaisons with the IADVL Academy and IADVL journals in working together, delineating methods and joining hands to disseminate information. It has been a challenging year for my Treasurer friend, Dr Somesh Gupta as well but he has done his best to organize few pending accounts and also the fresh ones, no mean feat. From the Treasurer's Desk

Dear Colleagues,

Almost a year has been passed since I took over as Hon. Treasurer of IADVL with Rashmi as secretary. It was a great learning experience for me to go into financial nitty-gritty of a magnanimous organization. I have realized that there is enough scope of bringing in financial transparency, correcting tax issues, and decentralizing finances by dividing funds between IADVL, Journal and academy. With the help of EC and Finance Committee I am working on this. Although IADVL has registered society status, the consensus is that IADVL should pay taxes on income rather than chasing for charitable status.

IADVL assets are growing, slowly but surely. The income sources are largely IADVL conferences, membership enrollments, and pharmaceutical contributions or donations for research. I am pleased that our president, Dr. Deepak Parikh has successfully tried to generate sponsorship or contributions from pharmaceutical industries to cover cost of the most of the meetings held. IADVL is the beneficiary of the same.

IADVL, with the help of Pharmaceutical partners, is contributing funds towards research. I personally feel that annual IADVL membership should be open to Dermatologists from abroad. That will not only bring more finances, but also strengthen the association at international level. Dermatologists from many Asian and African countries feel more comfortable at Indian meetings than at meetings in developed world for several reasons, including lower cost, high quality, similarity of dermatological problems between their patients and Indian patients, and more understandable Indian accent of English language. In the mutual interest, we need to promote annual overseas membership with all full membership benefits including reduced membership fee and complimentary journal.

In summary, IADVL's priorities should be to use funds judiciously for its members in the form of journals, research grants, training workshops, SIG conferences, fellowships, international exchange programs, and scholarships. Tax transparency, prompt settlements of all tax liabilities, decentralizing the financial control with independent status and separate PAN to academy and journals are other priority issues.

I sincerely thank President, Dr. Deepak Parikh, President Elect, Dr. Venkatram Mysore, Hon. Secretary, Dr. Rashmi Sarkar, Immediate Past President, Dr. Suresh Talwar and EC members, Dr. Sanjeev Gupta, Dr. Rajesh Verma, Dr. Narendra Gokhale, Dr. Krina Patel, Finance committee Chairman Dr. Roopak Saxena and other colleagues for their continued support in the smooth functioning of treasurer's office.

- Dr. Deepak Parikh thanked Dr Rashmi Sarkar and commented on Constitutional committee meeting and suggestions, put on website for comments and final constitution will be updated and will be sent for printing on 15th October finally. MOU sign by Dermacon 2016 will be handed over in this meeting and SARAD 2015 will be handed over in next CC meet. DERMACON Mangalore is taking up requests for speaker proposal as per suggestion by IADVL EC. Dr. VK Sharma inquired about the budget for elections to which Dr. Deepak Parikh replied that there will be projected budget but if required can be exceeded.

Permission of house was asked for passing EC meeting minutes as they were already circulated. On concern raised by Dr. VK Sharma that EC minutes have to be projected on screen; Dr. Deepak Parikh suggested that it has already been circulated to all members and as minutes are in multiple pages, any member who wish to go through minutes can do so today and minutes will be passed in tomorrow's meeting.

Dr. Deepak Parikh informed regarding change of editor of IJDVL. Dr. DM Thappa was acknowledged with certificate of appreciation and memento by Dr. Deepak Parikh and Dr. M. Ramam was welcomed as incoming editor and acknowledged by bouquet by Dr. Rashmi Sarkar.

Editors Report

1. Dr. DM Thappa presented the editors report along with the accounts.
2. The new editor has taken over since January 2014. He informed about last impact factor gained in 2014.
3. Regarding finance – he informed that he had received Rs.56 lac from last editor Dr. Uday Khopkar and he has transferred Rs.1.98 crore to new editor.
4. He has not received any interest from IADVL headquarters in last year and requested IADVL to be more liberal to journal editor regarding finance.
5. He informed that some money from Dr. Reddys Lab was pending which will be passed on once received. Dr. Deepak Parikh asked him to mail Dr. Reddys with a copy to him and Dr. Rashmi Sarkar.
6. He also complained about the money of IJDVL lying in IADVL accounts which has not been transferred to IJDVL account which is around 3.24 crores. Accounts of journal circulated to members.

Dr. Deepak Parikh said that although money may not be transferred as journal is self sufficient but fund with interest should reflect in the ledger as IJDVL fund. This is decided in CCmeet at Ahmedabad conference.

The treasurer informed that the Past Hon. Gen Sec had said that tentatively 50 lakhs can be set aside for IJDVL as FD and interest can be calculated from that. Part of membership fees goes to IJDVL but it is not in records what exact amount of fund is lying in account of IJDVL in central fund.

Dr. DM Thappa informed that in last account circulated by Dr. Narsihma Rao shows Rs 3.24 crore of IJDVL is lying with centre and should be shown as separate IJDVL fund.

Dr. Roopak Saxena informed that when during his tenure as treasurer they had made an FD and the interest was transferred to IJDVL. When he finished his term the IJDVL amount was 2.9 crores.

Dr. Jaydev Betkerur informed that around 23 lakhs was received as interest every year from IJDVL FDs.

Dr. VK Sharma asked why the practice was changed. It should be recorded and minuted. Dr. Deepak Parikh informed that the decision was taken in GBM at Ahmedabad and minuted.

After discussion, Dr. Deepak Parikh suggested that Rs. 3.5 crores in ledger must be ear marked for IJDVL. This was passed by house.

7. Dr. Chetan Patel asked why fixed assets of journal office are not transferred, to which he was told that this is as the value is very less.
8. Dr. Venkatram Mysore wanted to know whether the accounts are till December or till March. Dr. Thappa informed that they are April to December. January to March account will be submitted by new editor with next year's account.
9. Dr. Venkatram Mysore asked why ad figures are odd figures. He was told that the amount is received after TDS has been cut.
10. Dr. Venkatram Mysore asked why IJDVL gets tax deducted while IADVL doesn't pay tax. Dr. Deepak Parikh suggested that there are various issues regarding taxes in IADVL account which should be streamlined.
11. Dr. Laha asked why receivables are not mentioned. Dr. Parikh informed that it was to reduce unnecessary tax paying before receiving the actual amount.
12. There was a query on the issue of payments to Aurora enterprises and Hawaii Singh.
13. The house passed the account with request to clarify points regarding Aurora enterprises and Hawaii Singh by auditor of IJDVL.
14. Dr. DM Thappa handed over policy and procedures for the



journal to Dr .Ramam.

IADVL Academy Report

Dr. Rashmi Sarkar invited Dr .Manas Chatterjee to give report on academy. Dr. Deepak Parikh asked Dr .Manas Chatterjee to discuss only points which need discussion.

IADVL academy report was presented by Dr. Manas Chatterjee, the Chairman of IADVL Academy. He gave a brief overview of how the academy is functioning since he has taken over. He proceeded to present the reports of various SIGs.

Pigmentary disorder, Occupational & contact dermatitis, Leprosy, Dermatosurgery are 4 new SIGs formed.

1. Occupational and Contact dermatitis – there is no activity in this SIG. The convenor is not active and he is out of country also.
- Dr. Parikh asked the house whether the chairman can be replaced. The house agreed to replace the Chairman.
2. There was a discussion on the course of action to be taken against non functioning SIGs. Many members wanted such SIGs to be dissolved. The house agreed to this. Later there was a discussion whether closing a SIG will mean closing with immediate effect? Dr. Deepak Parikh suggested that a letter be sent to such non performing SIGs. If they do not improve their performance, such SIGs will be closed with existing members. Immediately fresh applications will be invited from new members. If no interested suitable candidates are found, such SIGs will be scrapped. The house agreed to this course of action.
3. In some SIGs only lectures are taken which can not be considered as activity.
4. Teledermatology – No report is received from this SIG. Decided to close.
5. Dr. Ramesh Bhat wanted to know what to do with this SIGs session during DERMACON? It was decided to give to another SIG.
6. Curriculum development and training – No work done and no substantial report received.

Dr Arun Inamdar pointed out that curriculum development and training is done by MCI, so this SIG cannot do it. Dr. Sudip Das commented that selection of right people at the right place should be done. Dr. Deepak Parikh reminded members that applications were invited.

Dr. Jayadev Betkerur informed about difficulties faced in functioning SIG including funds. He wanted to know why

research methodology workshop was conducted by SIG clinical trials when that can be done under SIG curriculum development. Dr. Parikh answered that all training can't be done by this SIG alone and the topic of the workshop was more suitable for the clinical trials SIG. Dr. Koushik Lahiri asked that activity like uniform UG and PG teaching program across country can be done by this SIG. Dr .Deepak Parikh agreed to this and added that we can influence government on teaching program.

The house agreed to wait for 6 more months before deciding. During Manglore DERMACON report will be reviewed and then decision should be taken.

7. Pemphigus SIG – workshop was done in 2013. . Dr. Marfatia said that every year one CME is done under SIG pemphigus. No other activity done. House decided to close.
8. STI and HIV – no significant activity done under this SIG. As there are already NACO and other government agencies working on this subject ,Dr Manas seeked the opinion of house.
9. SIG trichology , SIG urticaria

On opinion of many members Dr. Deepak Parikh informed that final decision on all non –functioning SIGs is to wait for 6 months till DERMACON 2014. These SIGs will be given guidelines in area of work and their activity will be reviewed. If CC feels that there is no activity that particular SIG will be closed or fresh applications for post of convener and members will be invited.

Dr. Mysore also showed a concern that there are more than required number of SIGs which is difficult to handle by academy and should be reviewed.

IADVL Training fellowships

As there were no guidelines and criteria for IADVL training fellowship centers, criteria for the same are laid down.

Dr. Manas Chatterjee informed that there is a prescribed format for all training centers for those who want to start a fellowship program. Applications received from those centers which score more than 40% will be visited on site and if found suitable will be approved.

Dr. Deepak Parikh informed that even existing centers will have to fulfill criteria. He asked house's opinion whether 40% cut off suggested is proper or not and whether on site visit is required.

Dr. Arun Inamdar wanted the centers to specify their field for fellowship. Dr. Manas informed that institutes will apply with



specific subject for fellowship.

Dr. Vijay Garg informed that administrative charges are applicable at different institutes.

Dr. Arun Inamdar wanted a limit on such administrative charges.

Dr. Amit Valia said that for administrative charges specific limits can be decided depending upon type of institute.

Dr. PN Rao wanted that the advertisement should include the information about administrative charges, an option to pay these charges either through IADVL or from scholarship given to candidate. To which Dr. Deepak Parikh informed that IADVL will pay admin charges and not candidate.

Dr. Karthick wanted IADVL not to pay this charge. Dr. Deepak Parikh informed that this is association activity and member benefit activity.

There was also a debate on whether administrative charges are part of the scholarship.

Finally the following points were agreed upon

1. Centres scoring less than 40% not to be considered
2. Centres scoring more than 40% or more to be visited by academy
3. Cap of Rs. 2500/- as admin charges will be paid by IADVL
4. Admin charges to be borne by IADVL
5. Inspector to inspect and report to IADVL academy
6. Academy to write back to the centre concerned
7. Feedback form by institute and by candidate will be mandatory.

Academy finances

1) From DERMACON Surplus 25% will go to IADVL academy is decided by GBM at Jaipur conference.

There is a need to create separate ledger for IADVL Academy. Passed by house.

2) Use of IADVL PAN by SIG – Dr. Deepak Parikh informed that this will be discussed along with accounts.

3) Model MOU is prepared for SIG to do activity

4) Dr. Deepak Parikh informed that as on today SIG activity can be done with states and PAN card of State may be used. Surplus amount can go to state.

5) There will be one meeting in the middle of year for academy ; suggested budget for academy – 5 13.24lac ; 5 lac each

for SIG activity and academy meeting, other expenses to be covered are visit to training centers, administrative charges for convener and chairman – 1000Rs. Per month, other contingencies and stationary as per requirement. Dr. Marfatia suggested local centers can spend on visit charges and person visiting should be from nearby places.

Dr. Kartik suggested inspector shall visit and give report. If an inadequacies found can be communicated for correction. Finally academy shall decide on continuing / granting fellowship centre. These suggestions were agreed.

Other activities academy will do are -

- 1) Manual on recent advances in Dermatology from India – Dr. Imran Majid has agreed to do it.
- 2) Year book of Indian Dermatology

All these will be done as e-book to avoid expenses.

Academy pages will be updated on website.

DVL Report

Dr. Rashmi Sarkar invited Dr. Chetan Patel to give DVL Trust Report.

Dr. Chetan Patel gave overview of DVL welfare trust.

Dr. Deepak Parikh asked to discuss points only needing discussion.

Accounts of DVL welfare trust was presented. Audited account for year 2013-14 was projected including income, expense details.

Money collected from member is deposited in FD under SBI and till now every year Rs .5 lac is given by IADVL for expense.

Dr. Jaydev Betkerur informed that advertisement of DVL welfare trust will be put in all journals and on journal website link will be attached.

Awards Committee And Dermacon 2015

Dr. Rashmi Sarkar invited Dr. Ramesh Bhat to give report of DERMACON 2015 and awards committee.

- 1) Dr. Ramesh Bhat informed that Award committee has recommended drastic changes in awards given which require constitutional approval and will be presented in GBM. One approved at Delhi GBM are life time achievement award and excellence award. House agreed on starting both at next DERMACON.
- 2) Orations – out of three orations – Systopic and Ambady oration are going on at present and third oration is stopped



as Neutrogena has not renewed oration ; so with house's permission IADVL oration as 3rd oration will be started in next DERMACON only.

- 3) Dr .P.N.Rao said that if any sponsor come forward, will IADVL allow 3rd oration to pharma company ? Dr .Deepak Parikh said that any pharma company or any member ready to give Rs.10lac will be allowed till then it will continue as IADVL oration

- 4) Final decision -

Life time achievement awards – 3 and excellence awards – 5 and orations – 3

- 5) Dr. PB Haribhakti travel award for contact dermatitis in AIMS – this will be reviewed.

Dr. Ramesh Bhat gave updates regarding DERMACON 2015. Plan of conference venue, Halls with capacity, accommodation arrangements, stall arrangements etc . were highlighted. MOU signed by organizers and installments from registration and pharma sponsorship incomes deposited at central IADVL account was highlighted. Dr. Deepak Parikh also informed that accommodation will be available to members at discounted rates through organizers. Speaker and chairperson proposals is invited for DERMACON Mangalore.

Signed MOU was handed over to President Dr .Deepak Parikh by Dr .Ramesh Bhat

World Congress of Dermatology Bid

Dr. Sacchidanand was invited by Dr. Rashmi Sarkar for highlighting WCD bid.

Dr. Sacchidanand showed proposed venue for WCD at Bangalore.

Dr. Deepak Parikh informed that it was decided in EC meet at Mumbai to actively participate as IADVL association in bidding process. IADVL has sanctioned Rs 10lac and Bangalore Dermatology Association has also granted Rs.10lac to meet expenses for bidding. Dr. V Mysore from EC will be looking after bidding process.

Dr. Sachidanand gave overview of financial commitment –

- 1) Organization shall I have separate account
- 2) ILDS registration fees will be 60\$ per participant
- 3) 70% of net surplus after deducting taxes will go to ILDS
- 4) IADVL will get 30% of total income
- 5) All officials of ILDS travelling shall be given business class

air fare and 5 star accommodation

- 6) If WCD bid is won 100,000\$ will be given as seed money by ILDS.

Dr. Sacchidanand presented the activities that have taken place and are being considered. He informed that Bangalore Dermatology society will contribute financially for the bid.

Dr. PN Rao wanted to know if BDS is contributing, then why Karnataka branch of IADVL. The house was informed that Karnataka branch will also contribute.

Also even if IADVL loses the bid, BDS and Bangalore Dermatology Society will write off the amount.

The house also wanted to know the registration charges. The details of the finances involved were outlined by Dr. Sacchidanand. Dr. Deepak Parikh informed that Dr .Sacchidanand will have to find out ways to decrease fees for Indian delegates.

Dr. Shyam Verma suggested that IADVL should look beyond WCD2019 and also keep an eye on 2023.

Andhra Pradesh Issue

Since the political split of the state of Andhra Pradesh, there was a demand for separate branch of IADVL for the newly formed Telangana state. The house was informed that the president had personally intervened and had been able to work out an amicable solution to the issue which was agreeable to both the sides. The representatives from both the sides informed the house of the same. An extra ordinary GBM of the state would be held to pass this proposal. Financial agreement was also decided by both states mutually as to divide assets equally between both branches.

Dr. Deepak Parikh and house congratulated all representatives from both states for working on problem and finding solution by mutual understanding.

Dr. Ganeshwar Rao president of Telangana branch and Dr .Reddy president of AP branch thanked Dr Deepak Parikh, Dr. Rashmi Sarkar, Dr. V Mysore and Dr. Suresh Talwar for their help in solving the issue.

WCD 2019 website was released by Dr V. Mysore and Dr. Deepak Parikh and Dr .Suresh Talwar and highlights and important features were displayed by Dr. V Mysore.

Dr. V Mysore informed that representatives from IADVL will promote Bangalore bidding in all upcoming international conferences including EADV, AAD, and others with different kind of activity like booth booking, boat cruise etc. Budget for all



these activities is Rs 45 lac which will be met through pharma help, government help.

Dr .V Mysore and Dr .Sacchidanand requested all members to whole heartedly support WCD bidding.

Dr .K .Lahiri suggested to plan booth booking and get to gather in international conferences shall be done by end of September.

IADVL News letter was released by Dr. Deepak Parikh and Dr Rashmi Sarkar. Copies of newsletter were distributed to all members present.

Report of SARCD 2015

Dr. Betkerur highlighted the theme, venue, accomodation and other aspects of SARCD which will be held between 4th -6th September 2015. Proposed budget was projected. Website is launched and expected delegates are 800-1000. Proposed registration fees was highlighted. 180 \$ for SARCD delegates and Rs. 8000/- for Indian delegates including service tax.

Dr. Deepak Parikh asked Dr. Betkerur for any seed money required. Dr .Betkerur proposed 15 lakhs seed money which was sanctioned. Dr .Deepak Parikh informed that money will be given in installments as and when required.

Signed MOU was handed over to Dr .Deepak Parikh by Dr .Betkerur.

IADVL Textbook

Presented by Dr. Sacchidanand

All 106 chapters received.

It is in 3 volumes. Copy editing and type setting done for almost 98 chapters.

Dr Raghunataha Reddy wanted to know if a chapter on TSDF can be included. Dr Sacchidanand replied that he will take the opinion of the editorial board and get back.

The text book would be released during DERMACON 2015.

It was passed recently that an IADVL Overseas scholarship/fellowship should not be offered twice to IADVL members. Most scholarships are given in a good number for major international conferences based mainly on abstracts. There are however few stand-alone awards which should be differentiated from these scholarships like the recent YDIAA (Young Dermatologist International Achievement Award) or similar stand-alone awards, which is given to a person for his body of work. An exception and differentiation should be made between an overseas scholarship and an overall achievement award so as not to deprive a good candidate for the same. This should be clearly mentioned to all future scholarship aspirants-as this has not been done so far. This will help IADVL to choose one best candidate for an international award.

If constitutional – will it replace existing clause? Or modify?

No. This is administrative.

Do you think this needs referral to any specific committee? NO

EC Opinion: Passed

Dr. Ameet Valia suggested maintaining archives of awards given. One member cannot get award/ scholarship in the same category twice.

3. IADVL Mentorship Program –Proposer: Dr Rashmi Sarkar

Name of proposer/s: Dr Rashmi Sarkar and EC 2014

Is any one of the proposer member of CC? Yes

Is it constitutional related (select one) OR

How will it help IADVL?

At present IADVL has their training fellowship for young dermatologists which are mainly subject based and are academic programs. An IADVL Mentorship/Leadership Program is the need of the hour based on the model of Leadership Institute of AAD and others globally. This program could pick up 4-6 applicants below the age of 40 who would want to be mentored regarding implementing leadership in academic/faculty positions, private practice, financial management, editing in journals, to be groomed for future leadership in IADVL etc.

Implementation: The applicant could be asked to name 3 mentors of their choice. Alternatives we can start with 6 volunteer mentors. The IADVL EC could match one of these mentors depending on being able to give time and willingness to maintain liaison with mentee in future. This does not require physical going for the mentorship/leadership program. The mentor/mentee could fix up telephonic or video call discussions

on situations twice a month or email according to their mutual agreement. According to their convenience they could have 2 face to face meetings a year, which could be common conferences like DERMACONS, CUTICONS etc. The mentee and mentor would submit reports at the end of a year.

MERITS: Does not require finances. Doable and needs to be assessed after first few mentees do this. This will build up more interested junior faculty, and members interested in serving IADVL in the future.

The proposer has served on mentorship and international committees of ISD and Women's Dermatologic Society and feels that this will help us to build more responsible leadership for the future in academics and administration in IADVL.

If constitutional – will it replace existing clause? Or modify?

No. This is administrative.

8. MIDDERMACON

Dr. Somesh Gupta informed that 48 lakhs were collected and 2 lakhs as saving received by Treasurer, Dr. Somesh Gupta. There were certain queries which remained to be answered.

- a. Income and expenditure statement not prepared.
- b. Period of receipts and expenses not shown.

Dr. Sudhanshu Singhs was asked to answer the above queries after consulting their CA.

- c. TDS deduction not shown on payment. Dr. Jha replied that since there was no event manager all payments were made to the hotel so TDS was not cut.
- d. Separate income from stall booking and registration not shown.

Dr Jha replied that 280 delegates registered. For most members from CC the registration amount was returned. 2.3 lakhs were by registration and rest was from stall booking. He informed that he will reply with the details with the breakup of head of stall and registration.

Dr. Venkataram Mysore asked whether all CC members were refunded. Dr. Jha informed that many resisted. On direction of the president he stopped registration and the original receipts of those who had already registered were collected and such members were refunded.

The house passed the accounts of Patna MIDDERMACON once the queries were answered.

Dr. Venkatram Mysore pointed out that MIDDERMACON has helped finance the CC meet.

9. DERMACON 2012 Jaipur

Dr. Somesh Gupta informed the house that certain queries were raised by IADVL auditors who reaudited the accounts. They were replied to by the OC and further queries were raised in response to those replies.

Dr. Somesh Gupta presented the report of the Finance Committee and EC regarding the same. The treasurer Dr. Mathur was present to answer the queries. He told the house that he will get back after consulting the OC.

- a. The trust was formed without consulting EC.
- b. Dr. Venkataram Mysore appreciated the willingness of OC to personally come and answer all quires in front of the



CC. He wanted to know why a payment of Rs 2.5 lakhs was made to a laser company for workshop.

- c. There was a query on the disproportionate number of lunch plates consumed for which the answer given was volunteers. No suitable answer to why such a huge number of volunteers was not provided.
- d. There was a query on payment to volunteers. These expenses should be under different head. He was asked to produce name of volunteer, his bank statement with PAN card number and whether TDS was cut on payment to volunteers?
- e. TDS certificates where TDS was cut was not included
Finally Dr. Deepak Parikh concluded that the account cannot be closed as the house was not satisfied with the replies provided by the OC. He said that he hoped that the OC of Jaipur appreciates this and answers the queries. He also expressed his displeasure at the language used at certain times during the communication between IADVL EC and the OC of Jaipur.
- f. Dr Manish Gautam wanted to know if more than one company was involved and if payments were made to them? Dr. Mathur replied that other machines were from the college and so no payment was made to any other company.
- g. There are a lot of payments which are not supported by bills. When this issue was raised by IADVL auditor, the OC sent many bills but still there are many payments which are not supported by bills.
- h. Dr. Koushik Lahiri wanted to know if the house had information on how much was paid to the brother of the chairman, organizing committee. Dr. Suresh Talwar mentioned that specific payment to relatives was not mentioned.
- Dr. Deepak Parikh admitted that he had not asked the specific question of payment to relatives to the chairman, organizing committee. So a specific query will be sent to the chairman, organizing committee regarding this.
- i. Dr. VK Sharma said that records should be preserved and IADVL accounts should also be re audited.
- j. Dr. Rajib Gogoi wanted to know the stand of IADVL stand on the issue of Jaipur. Dr. Deepak Parikh informed that the stand will be taken only after the facts are cleared.
- k. Dr. Venkatram Mysore pointed out that the IADVL auditor and FC was asking routine questions during the course

of re auditing. He wanted to know why a language like "we had enough of this" was used during correspondence. Dr. Deepak Parikh asked why they asked the matter to be closed. Dr. Mathur apologized for the same.

- I. Dr. Manas Chatterjee wanted to know if an expense of 20 lakh on liquor is acceptable. Dr. Deepak Parikh said that there is no guideline.

It was decided not to pass the accounts of Jaipur DERMACON. The house was not satisfied with replies provided by the OC and the accounts will be passed only when the queries are answered.

10. DERMACON 2013 AHMEDABAD

Dr. Deepak Parikh pointed out with regret that in spite of invitation to attend the CC meet, no responsible member of the OC of DERMACON2013 at Ahmedabad is present for the meet. Hence issues may be raised and then written to the OC.

Dr. PN Rao said that since Gujrat state president and secretary are here, they can also convey the issues.

Dr. Somesh Gupta gave the background about the whole issue from the visit of the fact finding committee to look at the systems and procedures followed to the reaudit of the conference accounts. Dr. Deepak Parikh stated that there are two issues here the, the auditors report and the report of the fact finding committee.

Dr Koushik Lahiri congratulated the President and EC for putting in place a structured mechanism for the redressal of this issue. Dr. Deepak Parikh in turn said that the organizers have also cooperated completely.

Dr. Shyam Verma asked why the treasurer is not present. Dr. Deepak Parikh said that he was invited. Dr. PN Rao asked, whether he was specifically invited. Dr. Parikh said that in one of the mails, he complained that OC is not being given a chance to present their view point. So he was specifically asked to come and present their position.

Dr. Byravathinam suggested that we write to the office bearers of organizing committee that the CC has decided that their physical presence is a must in the GBM at Mangalore.

Dr. Chetan Patel informed that this is the first meeting where no member of organizing committee is present. Dr. Ranjan Rawal is suffering from enteric fever. Dr VK Sharma wanted to add that, if they do not come, it will be a conduct unbecoming of a member. Passed.

Dr. AK Bajaj wanted the state to be penalized too.



It was passed to direct the members of organizing committee to be physically present during the GBM at Mangalore and answer the queries raised by the members.

Dr. Rajib Gogoi asked why infrastructure and rent increased so much. Dr Parikh informed that the owner of the venue changed who increased the rates.

Dr. Koushik asked how much is the alcohol expense. The alcohol was served on one day only and that too with limited area and the alcohol expenditure is same as that of Jaipur where alcohol was served freely on all days.

Dr. Jayadev Betker asked why the accounts are being discussed threadbare when the auditors have already given their report. Dr Parikh replied that members have a right to ask questions.

Dr. Lahiri asked why the fact finding committee did not check accounts. Dr. Parikh replied the GBM had authorized them to check procedures. Dr V Mysore reminded him that they are not finance experts but IADVL members.

Dr. Somesh Gupta presented the view point of the IADVL FC and EC.

Dr. Deepak wanted to put up standards for expenses under various heads.

Dr. Suresh Talwar said that it was not necessary with the MOU in place.

The fact finding committee felt that there were procedural lapses.

Dr. Parikh informed that the OC Chairman had tendered his apology and the EC and FC accepted it. Dr Deepak Parikh read out the letter of apology. Dr. Koushik Lahiri said it is to be appreciated and felt a lot of pain when he spoke against Dr. Joshipura, but he felt it is delayed. Dr. VK Sharma appreciated the apology but it is unfair to dissociate himself from the OC. Dr. Byravathinam appreciated the letter. Dr. PN Rao said that this apology should be considered before taking action.

Dr Shyam Verma appreciated the apology but said it should be noted that he has dissociated himself from financial matters. Dr Deepak Parikh reminded him that he has owned responsibility.

The house appreciated and accepted the apology and the CC recommended that he should be pardoned for procedural lapses. Dr. Venkatram Mysore said that the idea is correction not retribution.

Dr. AK Bajaj asked if all OC members apologize, will it be accepted. Dr. Deepak Parikh said that it will be.

11. ICD 2013

Seed money has been received along with 10% interest and

affiliation money. IADVL has already received 46 lakhs + and another 50 lakhs is expected. Dr. VK Sharma said that accounts are being finalized and expected to give IADVL more than 1 crore rupees and also 100,000 dollars to USD.

Dr. Shyamanta Barua raised the issue of ICD certificates. Dr. VK Sharma said that they can be asked for. Dr. Deepak Parikh wanted a last date for receiving certificates of conference.

12. SERVICE TAX, INCOME TAX

IADVL doesn't have service tax number and has never paid service tax. Auditors stated that IADVL has to pay service tax with a permanent office.

Dr Deepak Parikh gave an overview of service tax discussion and talk by Mr Solanki, service tax commissioner, during EC meeting.

Dr Mysore pointed out that SIGs can't organize meetings on their own but because of lack of PAN have to organize it with a state branch.

Dr Chetan Patel wanted service tax to be paid now onwards. Dr PN Rao wanted to wait till court ruling on service tax for societies. He suggested separate PAN card for SIG activities.

Dr Deepak Parikh pointed out that if different SIGs use a PAN which belonged to IADVL, any irregularities done by them will have bearing on the treasurer.

Dr. Ameet Valia wanted a separate PAN for the IADVL Academy. Dr. Somesh Gupta wanted a separate PAN for IJDVL. Dr Manas Chatterjee agreed to take responsibility of it if given adequate staff. Dr. PN Rao agreed to 3 separate PAN for IADVL, IJDVL, Academy.

Dr. VK Sharma wanted to set up trust to save income tax. He suggested IADVL Academy run as a trust. Dr Karthick pointed out that for income tax exemption, the trust will have to carry out charitable activities. Dr Deepak Parikh said that it should be for public services and work according to objectives of the trust.

Finally it was agreed that there should be separate PAN card for IJDVL and Academy. The Academy PAN should preferably be in the name of a trust.

There was a debate on form 12AA, whose original is missing. Dr Deepak Parikh informed the house that form 12 AA requires tax filing at the place where it is issued and is not applicable for service tax. The 12AA certificate of IADVL has not been acknowledged by even GSK. Dr VK Sharma informed that ICD CA had also not acknowledged it and ICD has cut TDS before paying IADVL. He suggested that we work like a corporate. Finally after much discussion it was decided to do away with



12AA exemption and pay income tax.

Dr. Somesh Gupta warned that if we start paying tax from back date with interest, there is a danger of bankruptcy. Dr. Deepak Parikh informed that there is an amnesty scheme for those who come clean the first time. Dr. Venkatram Mysore agreed. Dr Somesh Gupta wanted to explore the possibility of reviving 12 AA as SBI still accepts it for TDS. Dr PNR said his bank didn't accept it. But for that accounts from 1987 will be needed. Certificates issued before 2008 are valid for lifetime but for that all past returns have to be filed.

Finally after much discussion it was decided to do away with 12AA exemption and pay income tax. The house authorized Dr. PN Rao to settle the income tax issues including back issues and that he will be reimbursed for any expenses borne for this.

Dr Assheesh Batra wanted to know how state branch branches can get PAN if they can't use the state name. He was suggested to use a city name or different name. He can bring a separate proposal for the same.

It was decided that since IJDVL and Academy will have separate PAN and service tax number, IADVL need not pay service tax as the income will be from membership fees and conference surplus. Regarding membership fees we should wait till the court ruling and then decide to pay service tax.

Dr Rajib Gogoi wanted to know how much money IADVL has. Dr. PN Rao answered that it was around 7 crores.

13. Dr Prashant Palwade presented the unaudited provisional accounts of MIDERMACON 2014 at Aurangabad. Income from registration 25l , pharma 50,90,000 expenses for accommodation 6l, lunches and dinner 17,65000, cultural 3.5l, liquor 1,50,000 total 56l. Balance 17 lakhs. The house appreciated and applauded him.

14. EC MINUTES

The minutes of the EC meeting held in April 2014 were passed.

15. CENTRAL OFFICE OF IADVL

Many members wanted IADVL to have a permanent physical office with full time staff. The following venues were considered

a. Dr Venkatram Mysore said he was looking at KMC office in

Bangalore, which they are vacating

b. Hyderabad

c. Dr. Laha offered office space in Kolkata in the premises of IADVL WB branch after permission from EC of WB branch.

16. IADVL APP FOR MOBILE PHONES

Dr. Venkataram Mysore gave an overview of an application for smart phones which can be very useful for IADVL members. This was approved.

17. ACADEMY BUDGET

Passed

18. ITASTA

The letter drafted by Col Rajesh Verma to be signed by President and Secretary IADVL and the Chairman and convener of ITASTA and to be sent to pharma companies. This letter can be used by any member of IADVL to influence pharma companies.

19. DERMACON2016

- a. 10% increase from Ahmedabad including service tax
- b. Dr. Shyamanta Barua wanted to increase rates for non IADVL members. It was decided to increase non member registration fee by 50% in all classes. Researchers in the field of Dermatology can be given a concession.
- c. Spot registrations also to produce copy of registration with MCI if they are not IADVL members
- d. The house allowed Dr. Reena Rai, Organizing secretary to begin registration for DERMACON2016.
- e. Dr Reena Rai presented the MOU signed by OC of Coimbatore to the President elect Dr Venkataram Mysore.

20. Vote of thanks

Dr. Deepak Parikh and Dr. Rashmi Sarkar thanked all the members present for taking out their valuable time on a long week end to have helped make this meet a successful one. They also thanked the hosts of CC meeting and MIDERMACON for working hard to make the meet a reality.

Sub: SERVICE TAX- Changes applicable wef 1st July, 2012

Dear Sir,

The Service Tax law has undergone major changes in Union Budget 2012. Currently there are 117 odd specified services which are liable for service tax. However Budget 2012 has changed this concept of positive list of services into *negative list concept*, whereby all services covered in the definition of 'Service' will be chargeable to tax except those specified in the negative list, exempt list and excluded list.

Further there are nine activities which are declared to be deemed services like renting of immovable property, construction of complex, use of IPR, development of IT software, service portion in works contract and consumption of food & beverages etc.

In respect of a few specified taxable services where there is a overlapping of service and sale, like works contract etc abatements have been provided. Reverse charge mechanism will apply in case of certain specified services whereby instead of the service provider, service recipient will have to pay service tax on payments made for eg. Freight for transportation of goods, Payments made by business entities to individual lawyers, while in some cases of services provided for manpower or hiring of motor vehicles etc service tax will have to paid partly by the service provided and partly by service recipient.

Service tax will be chargeable on the value of taxable services at 12.36% (including 3% Cess). Service tax will be payable on accrual basis/completion of service or receipt basis, whichever earlier.

The basic exemption for service provider for the taxable services of aggregate value not exceeding Rs 10 lacs in a financial year subject to certain conditions is continued.

Notification no 25/2012-st dtd 20-6-2012 lists out 39 services exempt from service tax and Section 66D gives 17 negative list of services on which service tax is not chargeable. Prominent ones include;

- Services by Charitable trusts registered u/s 12AA of IT Act 1961 by way of charitable activities.

- Health care services by a clinical establishment like a hospital, clinic or authorised medical practitioner or paramedics.

- Renting of precincts of a religious place meant for general public or services by person for conduct of any religious ceremony.

- Legal services provided by an individual as an advocate or a partnership firm of advocates to another advocate/partnership firm of advocates providing legal services or any person other than a business entity or a business entity with a turnover upto Rs 10 lacs in the preceding financial year.

- Services provided to or by educational institutions in respect of education including by way of auxiliary educational services or renting of immovable property.

- Services by Government or a local authority excluding Support services by Government or local authorities. Support services of Government are chargeable to service tax under reverse charge mechanism where the service receiver is liable.

- Specified services like construction of canal, dam, pipeline etc provided to Government or local authorities.

- Execution of certain infrastructural services for use of general public like road, airports, ports etc

- Construction of a new single residential unit otherwise than as a part of a residential complex. (The earlier exemption of upto 12 units for a residential complex is done away with).

- Renting of hotel rooms having declared tariff below Rs 1000/- per day per room. (Abatement for declared tariff above Rs 1000/- is decreased to 40%).

- Restaurant serving food & beverages not having a liquor license and air conditioning in any part of the restaurant.

- Job work in relation to any goods on which excise duty is payable by principal manufacturer.

- Trading of goods

- Any process amounting to manufacture of goods.

- Selling of space or time slots for advertisements other than advertisements broadcast by radio or television.

- Admission to entertainment events or access to amusement facilities.

- Renting of residential dwelling for use as residence.

The abatements for Tour Operator liable for tax on taxable portion 25%/10%/40% depending on nature of services; on Goods Transport Agency-taxable portion 25% (3.09%); and for builders on sale to buyers (except where entire consideration is received after issuance of completion certificate by competent authorities) taxable portion is 25% (3.09%) (provided value of land is included in amount charged to buyer) continues.

Property taxes paid to local authorities like municipal taxes are deductible from rent of immovable property and service tax will be charged on the balance amount .

The major services on which service tax is to be borne by the service recipient and not the service provider under the Reverse charge mechanism are:

Services provided by individual lawyer	12.36%
Support services by Government/local authority	12.36%

In the following cases the reverse charge mechanism is applicable only if the service recipient is a company (Pvt Ltd/Ltd) and the service provider is a non-body corporate (eg individual/firm/LLP).

- Works Contract services
- Renting or hiring of motor vehicle to carry passenger
- Supply of manpower services

in the above cases the service liability will have to be shared both by service provider and service recipient in specified shares eg. on work contracts, 50% will have to borne by service recipient and 50% by service provider .

To summarise, wef 1st July, 2012 all services are taxable and only services specified in negative list or exemption notification are not liable for payment of service tax.

Sub: Review of Books of Account of DERMACON – 2012

Dear Sir,

We have reviewed the books of Account of above mentioned conference and our observations in this regard are as under:

1. Service Tax not provided on Booking of stall :

We have found that Dermacon - 2012 has provided Taxable Service like booking of stall income of Rs.5,08,58,582/- but it has not been collected service tax on that income as per service tax act which is violation of service tax act 1994.

2. Books of Account :

We have found that Dermacon - 2012 has not prepared books of account (Receipt & Payment account, Income & Expenditure account and Balance Sheet) financial year wise but prepared only one Receipt & payment account, Income & Expenditure account and Balance Sheet for the period from February 2011 to May 2013. But as per Income tax act accounts should be prepared on yearly basis.

3. Income tax Return :

We have found that Dermacon-2012 has not file its income tax return for the Assessment Year 2013-2014 while TDS receivable amount shown in 26AS of Rs. 45341/- . If Dermacon-2012 not file income tax return for the A.Y.2013-2014 possibility of receipt of notice from Income tax department cannot be ruled out .

**4. Computation of Taxable Income :**

During the course of checking of computation of taxable income we have noted that Dermacon - 2012 has shown profit as per profit and loss a/c of Rs. 35,44,262/- in computation of taxable income for financial year 2011-2012 but proper explanation for this amount has neither been mention in computation of taxable income and nor it has attached profit and loss account of Rs. 35,44,262/-. So we are unable to express any opinion on this computation.

5. Expense debited under cultural expenses & cricket match expenses

We have found that Dermacon-2012 has debited food bill under cultural expense & cricket match expenses. Details are as bellow:-

Moreover we have repeatedly clarified the matter regarding service tax & provided the supporting rules and regulations prevalent at that time. Once again we submit that we acted as per the knowledge of the rules and regulations prevailing at the time of organization of DERMACON-2012 & as per advise of our learned Chartered Accountants. We had paid the service tax wherever applicable as evident from the vouchers of DERMACON-2012 placed before the official auditors of IADVL.
2. **PAN Card Issue**- Since as per the rules & regulations of IADV the National Conference (DERMACON) is only allotted to a state branch & DRAMACON -2012 PAN number was the PAN No. allotted by IT Department to the Rajasthan State IADV & L who's office bearers & office was situated at Udaipur at the time of organization of the event & the same PAN numbers is used in our all state branche's activities & accounting purpose.
3. The **food Bills/Dairy** products under cultural head belongs to the food items/ dairy items (Chachh, Rabri, Jalabee, Shri khand, Ice-cream, etc.) served free at huge spouse center during the conference.
4. **Dermaindia cheque**- As Honorable member of EC committee are aware that we had organized a pre conference workshop on cosmetic Dermatology and Laser's. The said bill in question was paid to Dermaindia for the equipments and laser services provided to delegates. We humbly submit to EC to frame any query in a non offending language.
5. **The cheque's issued in the name of individuals** are important members of organization they are Resident doctors, Faculty members, Clarikal staff, Computer operator's etc. the amount paid was against the realization of different activities needing cash transactions. We really feel embraced now in asking about the PAN No. of these dedicated volunteers who had served the IADV & L by providing unpaid services.



6. **SS Investment** - The cheque's issued in the name of SS Investment is for Hotel Royal Empire only who have given a clarification and certificate regarding the same which is enclosed herewith.
7. **Volunteers-** We are unable to understand about the query raised regarding the high number of volunteers. We could not understand which member you are referring. We are sure that Honorable EC has misinterpreted few data's regarding this issue. We submit that during organization of such a mega event many persons are involved such as persons working in exhibition stalls, sponsors, Pharma company persons, Tent erection persons, auditorium person, catering people, sanitation people, Ambulance, fire fighting, volunteers during scientific session, spouses center, security guard, venue management person, Media person and so on so forth. It was our duty to provide them basic minimum food and beverages for smooth running of conference & we did not do any favor by providing food to them. It will be interesting know that what number of volunteers were allowed in last 5 DERMACON including Haryana, Lucknow, Delhi, Ahmadabad etc.

We once again emphasis that we were never provided any guidelines before starting the organization of conference. We had, had it enough & kindly close this matter at the earliest.







Sub: Review Books of Account of DERMACON – 2013

Dear Sir,

We have reviewed the books of Account of above mentioned conference and our observations in this regard are as under:

1. **Service Tax**

We have found that organizing committee of conference has paid excess service tax of Rs. 9,06,804/- to the Service Tax department. But excess payment of service tax has claimed for refund from service tax department and till date Service Tax department has not refunded Rs. 9,06,804/- to the Dermacon 2013.

2. **Notice from Service Tax Department**

We have found that Dermacon 2013 has received notice dated 07th August, 2013 from office of the Commissioner of Service Tax, Ahmedabad for audit of Dermacon 2013 accounts for the period from 2008 -2009 to 2012-2013.

3. **TDS**

We have noted from books of account maintained by the Dermacon 2013 till 20th July, 2013, TDS Rs. 10,28,041/- refundable from Income Tax Department.



4. **Conference Books of Account**

We have found that Dermacon 2013 conference end on dated 27th January, 2013 and it fall under accounting year 2012 to 2013. But conference books of accounts have not been closed in financial year 2012 to 2013.

In our opinion conference books of accounts should be closed on 31th March, 2013.

5. **Catering Expenses:**

We have found that Dermacon 2013 has expended Rs. 2,23,90,815/- against Catering expenses for conference. Out of Rs. 2,23,90,815/- organizing committee of conference has paid Rs. 1,06,71,586/- to a single party Swagat Catreres Pvt Ltd and catrer has charged dinner/lunch per plate for conference Rs. 725/- to Rs. 775/-.

We are thankful to the organizing committee for their co-operation extended to us during the course of review of accounts.

REPORT OF IADVL ENQUIRY COMMITTEE FOR DERMACON 2014

VISIT TO AHMEDABAD ON 15 & 16 FEB. 2014

At the outset, we express our sincere gratitude to the IADVL General Body for having reposed faith in us while appointing us as members of the IADVL enquiry committee to look into the financial matters of DERMACON 2013. After thorough discussions held individually with various members of IADVL Gujarat State branch, members DERMACON 2013 organising committee including chairpersons and members of various subcommittees, the Chairperson, Organizing Committee Dr. Suresh Joshipura, the organizing Secretary Dr. Ranjan Rawal and the Treasurer Dr. Keyur Shah , we were informed about the following:

A. ORGANIZING COMMITTEE (OC) & SUBCOMMITTEES:

- The OC members reported that the OC meetings were held regularly at a fixed venue of the conference secretariat, with power point presentations.
- The Organizing Committee members were aware of the three bank accounts being opened and operated simultaneously.
- The Chairpersons of the various subcommittees said that they were consulted before various decisions were taken.
- The Chairpersons of the various committees said that all bills were shown to them.
- However, the Chairperson Cultural Committee said that he was unaware of the various proceedings in relation to his committee as also the details of the financial transactions of the cultural committee. He said that though the expenditure for entertainment was Rs 4 Lakhs above the budget, he was not responsible for this overspending.. One payment to an artist was delivered through him but it was in a sealed envelop which he did not think justified to open and go through.
- The scientific committee was not involved into any financial matters
- The President GSB & Chairperson Finance Committee, GSB said that they were not consulted before the submission of the accounts at the CCMIDERMAMEET at Patna. They had expressed their displeasure about this through a letter circulated to all members of the GSB and OC.
- A member of the Communication subcommittee. Dr. Sapna Chotai, who was very actively involved in the meetings, claimed that she faced repeated humiliation



from some members of the OC, the names of whom she did not disclose. Her main grievance was that her queries, repeatedly sent through mails were not answered. But she could not assign any reason for the same. She guessed that there was some misappropriation of the funds but could not justify her statement by quoting any incident or name of the person.

B. TRUST

- Dr. Keyur Shah said that the Trust was formed so that a separate PAN card could be obtained. This was done after they were not allowed to use the national IADVL PAN by the national Treasurer.
- A letter from the office bearers of GSB & OC dated 10.12.2011 allowing formation of Trust was submitted to the enquiry committee.
- No permission was taken from the National executive Committee for formation of Trust. However, it was claimed that the National Observer, Dr. S. D. N. Guptha was informed after the opening of the trust.
- In the first audited account submitted to the GSB at Baroda in September 2013 only Dr, Keyur Shah's name was printed as Trustee. Dr. Shah explained that there were 3 Trustees. But the error occurred because he was the settler of the trust and erroneously only his name was printed. The other trustees were Dr. Suresh Joshipura & Dr. Ranjal Rawal.
- Though Dr. Rawal and Dr. Shah said that trustees were regularly informed about the income & expenditure of the trust Dr. Joshipura said that since his place of residence was 200 kms away from Ahmmedabad he could not keep a regular tab on the accounts.
- It was revealed that as of 15.02.2014 (date of visit of enquiry committee) the Trust has not been dissolved even after almost three months of submission of audited accounts. When confronted with the comment by Dr. Talwar in the AGBM that as long as the Trust remains active any of the Trustees can keep on transacting on behalf of the Trust Dr. Keyur Shah commented that though this is legally and technically possible yet they had their moral responsibility to dissolve the Trust and not to conduct any further transaction till then.

C. BANK ACCOUNTS

- Authorization for opening of 3 bank accounts: All three office bearers corroborated that there were three bank accounts of DERMACON. This was



authorized by the GSB President, Secretary and Treasurer and the OC Chairperson, Secretary and Treasurer.

- Necessity for opening 3 bank accounts: Dr. Keyur Shah said that opening the Axis bank account was necessary because SBI was not keen on electronic transfer which was necessary for various transactions. Dr. Ranjan Rawal said that though Axis is not a nationalized bank the account was opened there for the sake of easy banking. Dr. Keyur Shah said that for the sake of convenience in “segregating receivables”, the SBI account was used for Trust purpose, the Axis bank account was used for receiving registration fees and the Vijaya bank account was used for receiving sponsorship amounts from Pharmaceutical companies. The SBI account was opened on 18.04.11, Axis bank account on 28.11.11. and Vijaya bank account on 09.02.12.
- Closure of bank accounts: All three accounts were running simultaneously and none of them had been closed till 15.02.14. Dr. Shah said that the SBI account was shown in the Trust and hence could not be closed till the Trust was dissolved. Dr. Joshipura said that at the Bhavnagar meeting of OC held in November, 2013 he had asked Dr. Keyur shah to “freeze” the accounts but that had not been done so far.

D. EXPENSES

- The explanation for the exorbitant tariff of the venue was that due to the change in the management of the Convention center, the tariff was raised after booking and the OC had no alternative to search for a new one since no other suitable venue was available which would be able to accommodate the anticipated large number of delegates.
- Dr. Rawal said that organising committee members particularly each committee chairperson, wanted a particular menu and a particular entertainment. Hence food and entertainment expenses may have exceeded the budget.
- All three said that the food prices were high due to the fact that DERMACON was held during the marriage season. A number of caterers such as Radison, TGB etc. were rejected because of their high charges and the caterer who gave the least rate was appointed

**E. AUDITED ACCOUNTS.**

- “Accounts” submitted at CCMIDERMAMEET (Patna): When questioned about the document submitted during the CCMIDERMAMEET at Patna Dr. Keyur Shah said that it was not an audited account but only a “narration” of accounts. He had submitted it because Dr. Joshipura had asked him to do so. Dr. Joshipura said that he was aware of the contents of the document. He also corroborated that it was not an audited account but a report submitted at the insistence of Dr. Suresh Talwar who had got a questionnaire passed at Ahmedabad AGBM and these questions were answered in this report. Dr. Ranjan Rawal said that this was a partly audited account and it was given to satisfy the IADVL President Dr. Talwar and Secretary Dr. Narasimha Rao who were repeatedly asking the organizers to hand over audited accounts within 6 months of end of DERMACON
- Audited accounts submitted at GSB & OC meeting at Baroda on 8th September, 2013: Some members of the OC said that an audited account which contained a few objections from the auditor was submitted at this meeting but when questions were raised it was withdrawn. While Dr. Joshipura said that he was not present at this meeting, Dr. Rawal said that submission of this account was a mistake and Dr. Keyur Shah that he did not know that the accounts should not be submitted before compliance to auditor’s queries and objections.
- The final audited accounts were passed by GSB at Bhavnagar on November 10th, 2013 in a meeting chaired by Dr. Joshipura who admitted that the meeting was “non-quorum”. The minutes of the meeting could not be provided.

E. SEED MONEY

- All three OC office bearers said that 50% of seed money (Rs 10 lakhs) was returned at CCMIDERMAMEET at Hyderabad (6 months before DERMACON 2013) and 50% was returned at CCMIDERMAMEET at Patna (6 months after DERMACON 2013).
- Dr. Keyur Shah said that he was ignorant about the rule about seed money being returned in one tranche at the end of closing year’s AGBM at DERMACON 2013. Both Dr. Rawal and Dr. Joshipura said that the final Rs 10 lakhs was not returned at DERMACON 2013 because they were very busy with the organization of the conference and the matter slipped out of their minds



F. SURPLUS

- A part of the surplus (Rs 25 lakhs) was given at Patna on 18 August 2013 a few months before submission of audited accounts Dr. Keyur Shah said that this unprecedented partial transaction of surplus even before auditing was completed was authorized by Dr. Joshipura who said that he had done this to help IADVL and they had been thanked by the Hon. General Secretary, Dr. Narasimha Rao for the same.
- This surplus was not accompanied by the mandatory letter to be signed by the OC Chairperson and organising Secretary. (as per Rule 17A(vi) of the Constitution). Dr. Keyur Shah said that he was ignorant about this rule. Dr. Joshipura said that the mandatory letter is “pending”.

G. GULZAR_SURGICALS ISSUE:

- Dr. Keyur Shah said that Pharma companies who had paid money for stalls were given no dues certificates which they produced on the day before DERMACON to claim their stalls. Gulzar group representative came with a letter purportedly signed by Dr. Rawal. Both the letter as well as the signature were forged. When threatened with the possibility of a FIR being lodged against them, Gulzar group accepted the mistake (also mentioned by the vendors in the letter written to the President, IADVL).
- However, Gulzar group kept on pleading that a stall be given to him and though Dr. Shah was against this he acceded to the request when some other OC members asked him to do so. Gulzar gave a cheque of Rs 5 lakhs + tax. Since Dr. Shah was apprehending that a cheque given by a proven fraudster could bounce, Gulzar was asked to pay Rs 5 lakhs in cash as caution money. This was done in the presence of many OC members but no receipt was given. The cheque was encashed after 2 days and the cash was returned to Gulzar again without any receipt.. Though there were no OC members present when the cash was returned some of his staff were present there. There are no documents regarding either of the cash transactions. Dr. Joshipura corroborated this story though he was not present during these episodes. However, he called up Dr. Janak Takkar at Rajkot. Dr.Thakkar narrated the same story told earlier by Dr. Keyur Shah



PROCEDURAL LAPSES

1. Formation of the Trust without permission from national IADVL.
2. Trust had not been dissolved more than two months after submission of audited accounts
3. Seed money was returned in 2 instalments
4. Seed money was not fully returned to IADVL at end of closing year's AGBM of DERMACON 2013 (as required under Annexure V! Rule D(2) of the Constitution)
5. Opening of bank accounts in non-nationalized banks (in violation of Rule 20(A) of the Constitution)
6. All Bank accounts were still in operation more than 2 months after submission of audited accounts.
7. It was not clear as to whether transactions were still being conducted in these accounts.
8. Unaudited partial accounts (termed narration) submitted at CCMIDERMAMEET at Patna 6 months after DERMACON 2013
9. The presentation of accounts in CC-Meeting at Patna was done without the consent & knowledge of GSB President & Chairperson Finance Committee.
10. Audited account was not submitted to national IADVL within 6 months of DERMACON (as per By-laws 11 (d) of the Constitution)
11. Surplus was given to IADVL before auditing and closure of accounts i.e before surplus could be calculated.
12. Surplus was not accompanied by mandatory letter from OC Chairperson & Secretary (as required under Rule 17 A(vii) of Constitution.)
13. Cash transaction with stall holding companies was done by Treasurer without written receipts of payment and refund.

OTHER OBSERVATIONS:

1. Necessity of opening third bank account not explained satisfactorily
2. Many rules of IADVL Constitution regarding seed money, surplus, Bank accounts and audited accounts were ignored by the three OC office bearers.
3. IADVL member holding the important post of Treasurer of DERMACON was ignorant of many Constitutional laws as per his own admission.



4. Submission of audited accounts to national IADVL was said to have been delayed due to the objections raised by GSB members at Baroda.
5. The final audited account was passed by the GSB GB at a meeting at Bhavnagar where there was insufficient quorum.
6. OC Chairperson said that he was not involved in any financial transaction of DERMACON since he lived 200 kms away from Ahmedabad
7. Most members of the OC who met us said that they were satisfied at the manner in which OC meetings were regularly held and details of accounts explained to them.
8. The OC Chairperson and a number of other subcommittee chairpersons however admitted that they had not gone through the accounts.
9. Food, cultural and venue expenses exceeded the budget. Only verbal explanations for the same were given by the office bearers.
10. Chairperson Cultural Committee said that he was not fully aware of selection of the artists for entertainment program & amount of payments made to them
11. Some members of OC expressed apprehensions about misappropriation of funds but were not able to cite specific instances.
12. Dr. Sapna Chotai, a young member of IADVL claimed that she was repeatedly cold-shouldered in her attempts to seek explanations about various financial matters.

We as members of the Enquiry Committee wish to express our thanks to the members of Organizing Committee of DERMACON 2013 for their cooperation and hospitality and to Dr. Krina Patel, Joint Secretary, IADVL for lending us all assistance on behalf of the national executive committee.

1. Formation of the Trust without permission from national IADVL.
NO SOP provided. Permission of GSBIADVL was taken and letter was submitted to committee. Purpose of forming trust is to save income tax & to generate more surplus fund for association

2. Trust had not been dissolved more than two months after submission of audited accounts
TDS and service tax is yet to be deposited.

- 3 Seed money was returned in 2 instalments
No SOP given, cheque was accepted by president and secretary IADVL. Money was given in a good faith that it can be utilized by IADVL

- 4 Seed money was not fully returned to IADVL at end of closing year's AGBM of DERMACON 2013 (as required under Annexure V! Rule D(2) of the Constitution)
Because of the busy schedule during conference

5. Opening of bank accounts in non-nationalized banks (in violation of Rule 20(A) of the Constitution)
For administrative convenience. It was already answered during GBM at Delhi and to committee

6. All Bank accounts were still in operation more than 2 months after submission of audited accounts.
TDS and Service tax yet to be deposited. IADVL C.A. was already aware of this and discussed with Dermacon 2013 C.A

7. It was not clear as to whether transactions were still being conducted in these accounts.
IADVL chartered accountant has seen all account detail

8. Unaudited partial accounts (termed narration) submitted at



CCMIDERMAMEET at Patna 6 months after DERMACON 2013

Compliance report of audited account was to be obtained.

9. The presentation of accounts in CC-Meeting at Patna was done without the consent & knowledge of GSB President & Chairperson Finance Committee.

GSB IADVL CC meeting & organizing committee meeting was scheduled after Patna meeting and it was narration of account mentioning income and expenditure of DERMACON 2013

10. Audited account was not submitted to national IADVL within 6 months of DERMACON (as per By-laws 11 (d) of the Constitution)

It was not possible to prepare audited account within six months

11. Surplus was given to IADVL before auditing and closure of accounts i.e before surplus could be calculated.

It was a partial surplus money and It was done in a good faith so that IADVL can utilize surplus money in better way

12. Surplus was not accompanied by mandatory letter from OC Chairperson & Secretary (as required under Rule 17 A(vii) of Constitution.)

It was only partial surplus and remaining surplus is still pending which will be given with mandatory letter

13. Cash transaction with stall holding companies was done by Treasurer without written receipts of payment and refund.

It was a single company and not companies and explanation is already given. Gulzar has produced forged letter and caught red handed in front of Dr. Joshipura, Dr. Ranajan Raval, Dr. Keyur Shah, Dr. Jagsish sakhiya, Dr.,Janak thakkar, Dr. Bhavesh Devani, Dr. Krina patel

OTHER OBSERVATIONS:

1. Necessity of opening third bank account not explained satisfactorily

It was for administrative ease and all account were reflected in audited account which was checked by IADVL chartered accountant

2. Many rules of IADVL Constitution regarding seed money, surplus, Bank accounts and audited accounts were ignored by the three OC office bearers.

No clear SOP was given. There was no mala fide intention behind it.



3. IADVL member holding the important post of Treasurer of DERMACON was ignorant of many Constitutional laws as per his own admission.

No clear SOP was given

4. Submission of audited accounts to national IADVL was said to have been delayed due to the objections raised by GSB members at Baroda.

Already explained. Compliance report was to be obtained

5. The final audited account was passed by the GSB GB at a meeting at Bhavnagar where there was insufficient quorum.

All members were informed and invited for meeting well in advance. Passing of the audited account of conference was very well on agenda and minutes and agenda of the meeting was mailed to National H.Q

6. OC Chairperson said that he was not involved in any financial transaction of DERMACON since he lived 200 kms away from Ahmedabad

Agreed for day to day transaction but OC chairperson was regularly updated about transaction during meeting including finance chaired by him..

7. Most members of the OC who met us said that they were satisfied at the manner in which OC meetings were regularly held and details of accounts explained to them.

These has reflected the transparency

8. The OC Chairperson and a number of other subcommittee chairpersons however admitted that they had not gone through the accounts.

Accounts were sent through email to all committee member and remained opened for 15 days for all members for review. Those who were interested had gone through accounts and Queries raised by them were answered.

9. Food, cultural and venue expenses exceeded the budget. Only verbal explanations for the same were given by the office bearers.

Catering committee chairperson, entertainment committee chairperson, and finance committee chairperson has already issued clearance certificate after going through all expenses. Explanation was given to committee and all bill of the same were cross checked by IADVL C.A

10. Chairperson Cultural Committee said that he was not fully aware of selection of the artists for entertainment program & amount of payments



made to them

cultural committee chairperson has already given clearance certificate

11. Some members of OC expressed apprehensions about misappropriation of funds but were not able to cite specific instances.

To relieve their apprehension, account was sent through email to all committee members and we have kept account opened for 15 days

12. Dr. Sapna Chotai, a young member of IADVL claimed that she was repeatedly cold-shouldered in her attempts to seek explanations about various financial matters.

She has already visited secretariat during account was open and queries were satisfied. She was the only person from 140 committee members felt that she was cold shouldered. What does it suggest?

IADVL chartered account has already screened DERMACON 2013 account. Queries raised by him answered satisfactorily. He has not mentioned any financial irregularities in DERMACON 2013 account and appreciated for paying service tax and deducting tds during payments

Final closure of account will be done once TDS and service tax refund will be deposited

We have found that Dermacon-2013 has paid **salary of Rs.9,99,200/-** through cheque to different persons for organizing of conference and all salary payment debited under account head of Secretarial & Meeting expenses.

We have found that organizing committee of conference has paid excess service tax of Rs. 9,06,804/- to the Service Tax department. But excess payment of service tax has claimed for refund from service tax department and till the end of our audit Service Tax department has not refunded Rs. 9,06,804/- to the Dermacon 2013.

11. **Balance sheet show nil balance but Service Tax is still receivable from Service Tax department**

We have observed that Balance sheet is not showing service tax receivable from service tax department on 31st July 2013 but Service tax excess payment is still receivable from department of Rs. 906804/- on or after 31st July 2013

**12. Notice from Service Tax Department**

We have found that Dermacon 2013 has received notice dated 07th August, 2013 from office of the Commissioner of Service Tax, Ahmedabad for audit of Dermacon 2013 accounts for the period from 2008 -2009 to 2012-2013.

3. Printing and stationery expense was done as per requirement of conference. All expenses were with proper support as it is highlighted in IADVL C.A. comments. All bills were cross checked by IADVL C.A. . All payments were done through cheque and tds is deducted.

2 temporary staff for 6 months during conference(Dec 2012 to July 2013)

10. By Dermacon 2013 C.A.

Service Tax :

It has been observed that the service tax is paid in excess. In response to the contention, I would like to inform you that the service tax paid in excess due to followings:

- a. Reverse charge mechanism consent was newly introduced during the tenure of the conference. The trust has however, collected the service tax from the sponsor.
- b. The service tax is required to be paid on monthly basis. However, Cenvat claim can be logged only after receipt of the bills of the expenses.

The claim of refund is logged with the service tax department and proceeding is going on. The same will be recognized on actual receipt.

11. By Dermacon 2013 C.A.

service tax receivable :

It is stated that the service tax refund is not accounted in the balance sheet as receivable.



As stated elsewhere in the reply, the claim of refund is not necessary accept by the department or in full. Hence, the board of trustees is of the opinion that the same should be recognized only on receipt of the actual refund.

3rd point in the point no. 13 , the query regarding the short payment of TDS of Gandhi Corpo.. But I would like to draw your attention that it is a contract and fall u/s 194C and not 194J. And therefore we were liable to deduct TDS @ 2% & NOT 10%

14. By Dermacon 2013 C.A.

Tds returns were file late particularly of two quarters b/w July to Dec. 2012. Those were the busy days of conference and that's why it was very difficult to maintain day to day account. However, I would like to draw your attention that till the date we have not received any notice from Income Tax Department regarding late filing of TDS return.

Thanks for your email dated 13 October 2014. We have discussed this matter and following is our pointwise reply:

1. The IADVL trust was made in good intention of continuing academic activities in our state which is resource poor. We have not utilised this fund which is lying in the bank account. If as per IADVL constitution such trust cannot be formed we agree to pay Rs 5 lacs to the IADVL national body.
2. During CC meeting Dr. Deepak Mathur, Treasurer, DERMACON 2012 was present with all documents required for clarifying DERMACON 2012 accounts. Forefitting state share was never discussed during CC meeting. Our state branch is already poor in funds and such harsh action will be detrimental for the health of our branch which is also not constitutionally correct.
3. Regarding holding any post in IADVL we are not holding

any post presently.

We humbly request EC to reconsider the decision.

Letter 2 to Organizers of Dermacon 2012:

Dear Sirs,

Thanks for your prompt reply. I have forwarded it to EC.

During CC meeting, members raised following queries. Please reply these within 15 days:

1. Why a payment of Rs 2.5 lakhs was made to a laser company for workshop.
2. Disproportionate number of lunch plates consumed, particularly on the day of workshop.
3. Payment to volunteers. These expenses should be under different head. He was asked to produce name of volunteer, his bank statement with PAN card number and whether TDS cut on payment to volunteers.
4. Please provide copies of TDS certificates where TDS was deducted.
5. How much was paid to the brother of the chairman.
6. Payments for liquor are not supported by bills. When this issue was raised by IADVL auditor, the OC sent many bills but still payments for liquor are not supported by bills.

Q.1. Why payment of Rs.2.5 Lakhs was made to Laser Company.

Ans. The payment of Rs.2.5 Lakhs was made to Derma Company in lieu of instrument and one Co2 laser machine used for the workshop purpose. After the workshop was over, the instruments and gadgets, if any, were used in the respective skin department for clinical & teaching purpose. The Co2 laser machine used for the above purpose is still the host institute of workshop i.e. Mahatma Gandhi Medical College & Hospital, Jaipur. All these decisions were taken after duly approved by the local organizing committee.

Q.2. Disproportionate number of lunch plates consumed particularly on the day of workshop.



Ans. Lunch on workshop day was in the campus of the host institute i.e. Mahatma Gandhi Medical College & Hospital, Jaipur. Beside more than a record number of delegates (around 1800), a large number of host institute's faculty members, resident doctors, support staff & ground workers were invited as a courtesy for providing excellent services and environment. We had virtually used the whole institute (free of cost) e.g. Auditorium, LT, Operation Theater, Parking Space, security, audiovisual etc etc.

Q.3. Payment to volunteers.....

Ans. The amount paid to volunteers seem to have been misunderstood, as what so ever amount was paid by bearer's cheques to volunteers was not paid as remuneration to them, rather it was paid for reimbursement of the different petty expenses which were paid in cash. Bills submitted by them were duly verified by the concerned supervising organizer & checked by the auditors. As it was not a personal payment to the volunteers, the question of TDS does not come in effect. The copies of TDS paid have been submitted to the national body of IADVL earlier also & once again the same are submitted to you as required.

Q.4. Copies of TDS.....

Ans.. The copies of TDS paid have been submitted to the national body of IADVL earlier also and once

again we humbly submit to you. The copies of TDS challans paid are submitted to your kind self (sent by surface mail).

Q.5. How much was paid to the Brother of organizing Chairman.....

Ans. Nothing was paid to the Chairman's brother or sister or for that purpose any relative of any organizer. Infact the vendors & service providers who worked for more than 2 Years in the organization of Dermacon in 2012 were paid the duly approved bills. The amount paid in Question was Rs. 4250145/- (Copies of ledger have been supplied earlier also & submitted once again). The aforesaid amount Paid to Priyanka advertiser company, belongs to Mr. Rajesh Mathur who beside the brother of chairman also happens to be a well known event organizer specialized in organizing medical conferences of national & and International repute. e.g Indian Psychiatric Conference, World conference of NARCHI, National Conference of IMA and many others. Selection of the company was made unanimously by the organizing Committee on the basis of his track record, expertise, experience, dependability & cost effectiveness.

Ans. 6. the Payment for Liquor was made by cheque to Lucky Wines. The Payment of Rs.1963365/- was paid through Oriental Bank of Commerce for the purpose of Liquor.

"Service tax department has mentioned in its order that Dermacon - 2013 has not claimed refund within time period and as per service tax return -ST-3 they have not shown excess payment of service tax. Hence department has rejected refund claim.

On the other side Dermacon - 2013 has wrongly taken service tax input credit and at the time of audit department has found that cenvet credit wrongly claimed. Hence in our opinion due to wrong claim of input credit Dermacon-2013 is liable to pay service" tax.

Service tax Rs.360032/- deposited. Detail of calculation required because service tax Rs.585861/- comes on receipt under Delegate Registration & Stall Booking and spot registration.

1. The venue needed to be ready 2 days before the event. 1 day extra because of elections. But the charges are for 5 days before and 2 days after for dismantling. I am sure it is in the provisions of the contract that the contractors will take 2 days to set up and 2 days to dismantle and will charge for those 4 days.

Please provide contract with the vendor?

2. In spite of having a "free venue", we still had to pay more than 2 crores as venue infrastructure related expenses.
3. 13 lakhs on accommodation for speakers, ICD and IADVL office bearers comes to around 100 hotel days assuming a room rent of 12000 rs for each room plus taxes.

Can u provide the list of this guests?

4. What are the free services in 25.6 lakhs provided by event managers is not explained in the reply. For most of the other services provided the event manager has charged separately.

What is the logic to have 2 offices and claim separate expenditure?
8. Your reply states:
We had adequate income to conduct the conference and keeping international nature of conference, the booking amounts for stalls were comparatively higher.
Does this mean because the delegate fee was high, the organizing committee was complacent towards raising funds from pharma and hence did not put in extra efforts? Should the policy have been different and more efforts to get more funds from pharma made?

Queries on ICD Account

Our compliments to Drs VK Sharma and Dr Rajeev Sharma for the prompt work within a short time. We wish to place on record our appreciation for the excellent organization of the Congress, prompt submission of accounts amidst rather difficult circumstances and our inexperience of handling an international event of this size. There are few queries to achieve clarity on submitted accounts. We request that they be taken in that spirit

1. Venue Rental. It was apprised that venue is free if the food is from the hotel. Why there is venue rental of 99 lacs. Pl. Also clarify infrastructure development expense-(11.7 lacs), does it refer to the pandal? This is in addition to venue rent of 99 lakhs .
2. Accommodation expenses- 54, 64, 0000- Appears on the higher side? pl. provide details.
3. Income-
 - A. Sponsorship fee and stall booking fees have been shown separately. Can you clarify as to what are these two?
 - B. Can we have a breakdown of how much money came in because of international delegates and international sponsorship?
 - C. The ratio of income from stall, sponsorship vs registration fees is around 1.2:1. In DERMACONS, this is almost 4:1. How do you explain such low sponsorship amount?

Why more companies were not allowed to take stalls and raise more finances?

4. Service tax -Service tax paid on delegate fee - is it shown? We must have received service tax from stalls and sponsorship amount also. Hope it's all included in the receipt column –all 3 sources.
5. Event management fee of 25.6 lac has been claimed. Under separate head a sum of 7.2 claimed as professional fee and manpower exp of 1.39 lacs, salary a/c 1.7 lacs, and secretariat exp 1.45 lacs has been claimed. Was it not included in event management fee? In 25.6 lacs , what all free services were provided by the event managers in terms of manpower , computer , website etc

Clarify Professional fee, Manpower expenses, Salary details.

6. What is the "Office expense" in addition to "Printing & Stationary", "Postage & Courier", "Secretarial expense", "Salary", "Telephone & Internet expenses"?
7. "Accounting charge" and "Audit fee" was paid to same party?
8. What is "Cartage expense"?
9. Pl explain Conveyance a/c (.41 lacs)? There are two more heads of expense by the names "Bus & Taxi hire charge (10.49 lacs)" and "Travelling expenses (25.6 lacs)".
10. "Equipment hire charge" – what equipment? There is one more head of expense by the name "Audio Video Service".
11. What is "Reimbursement of expenses (10.39 lacs)"? Who was reimbursed for what expense?
12. Clarify "Royalty" expenses.
13. Clarify recipients of "Salary" and "Professional fees".
14. Pl give breakup and details of conf and meeting expenses.
15. What is publicity exp of 6.68 lacs? Was it necessary?
16. Give details of Misc. Income/expenditure.
17. What are the bank charges of 3.74 lacs? In fact bank generally gives incentives instead of charging.
18. Savings -While significant sum has been saved the IADVL share is similar to what used to be saved in dermacon prior to Jaipur. This is despite charging 4 times more delegate fee as compared to dermacon. Would you agree that while our international prestige had gone up because of the Congress, in terms of surplus earned, money from our delegate's benefited ISD rather than IADVL? Is this a lesson to be learned?



Reply to ICD DERMACON Queries -2

1. The venue needed to be ready 2 days before the event.1 day extra because of elections. But the charges are for 5 days before and 2 days after for dismantling. I am sure it is in the provisions of the contract that the contractors will take take 2 days to set up and 2 days to dismantle and will charge for those 4 days.

Please provide contract with the vendor?

Reply: We had exhibition venue used for 5 days(4 days of conference venue to be ready one day before and extra 5 days for preparing and 2 days for dismantling. The venue takes longer time to prepare as work is not allowed at night after 8PM as it disturbs other guests staying in the five star hotel. Rent is paid directly to hotel Ashok/Samrat

The Hotel Ashok rates are as follows:

- Rental @ Rs 3.25 lacs taxes & service charge (14.45%) per day for Swimming pool lawn.
- Rental @ Rs 2.25 lacs taxes & service charge (14.45%) per day for Hardcourt area.
- Rental @ Rs 1.00 lacs taxes & service charge (14.45%) per day for Foyer area, lily pond

The above areas were used for Exhibition, registration, family area

The Hotel Samrat rates are as follows:

*3.5 lacs plus 14.45% tax for parking area used for **making extra hall***

All above comes to Rs near 10 lacs plus 14.45% tax daily. We paid for approximately 7 days after negotiations.

In addition ,Rs 2027350 for Dinner has been shown by owner as Rental to save on taxes as our agreement was for rate inclusive of taxes for dinner. In automated accounts , it was shown in rental, it is in fact a part of dinner bill for Dec 6, 2013. A copy of his total dinner bill is enclosed.

There was no clause about time needed for preparation in the vendor agreement.

The copies of agreement are attached.

2. In spite of having a "free venue", we still had to pay more than 2 crores as venue infrastructure related expenses.

We reiterate that only Scientific halls were free after commitment for tea and lunch. All DERMACONS pay venue rent and it is very unrealistic to expect venue can be totally free of cost in a five star hotel in the national capital.



Please understand that rates of venue vendor are fixed by hotel Ashok by tender process and outside vendor is not allowed. We have no choice in this matter.

The copy of agreement by hotel Ashok with vendor and rate list is enclosed.

We have already replied to infrastructure in previous reply:

Infrastructure: It refers to preparation of grounds, fabrication of water proof exhibition hangar, preparation of booths, registration area, dinner area, family area, stage in halls, carpets, fire safety etc.

We also constructed 1 Sound proof hangar Halls which was required by observations of site visit committee to accommodate 700 -800 delegates. This hall was created through Sound proof Boards. All venues were made of fire resistant material.

As Hotel Ashok has a fixed vendor policy as the Hotel has selected the vendor through Tender Process for which the Official licensee has to pay Licence Fee for providing the services in the Hotel. As no outside vendor is allowed and the rates for the various infrastructure related work are fixed by the Hotel. Hence we had to take the services from the official licensee for the various Infrastructure related work for smooth functioning of the event.

3. 13 lakhs on accommodation for speakers, ICD and IADVL office bearers comes to around 100 hotel days assuming a room rent of 12000 rs for each room plus taxes.

Can u provide the list of this guests?

Reply: We had 30 guests including plenary speakers (10), International Society of Dermatology(8), IADVL(5) and ICD(7) organising committee, List of guests is attached. We consider that our expenses have been less than DERMACONS in this aspect inspite of need to accomodate both IADVL and ISD office bearers. The organisers stayed for 4-6 days, plenary speakers for 4 days and one plenary speaker for 7 days, IADVL 4-5 days, ISD for 4-6 days,

4. What are the free services in 25.6 lakhs provided by event managers is not explained in the reply. For most of the other services provided the event manager has charged separately.

List of services provided is attached

The conference organiser was involved in designing brochure, website management, preparation of material for souvenir, handling abstracts and replying to authors, registration confirmation and dealing with queries, The conference organiser provided manpower for carrying out above work in conference office in the department and conference manager office.



Manpower was provided for onsite management 4 persons for 6 days . Onsite registration management, receiving souvenirs, distributing registration kits, and handling government agencies, permission, handling visa queries, issuing stall booking vouchers, dealing with pharmaceutical queries regarding bookings etc, cultural program, opening ceremony, closing ceremony, certificates etc.

Onsite management was carried out totally by conference managers coordinating with hotel, infrastructure creation, pharmaceutical, family area management, tea coffee, lunch , transport coordination, IADVL and ISD meeting coordination.

The list is endless and cannot be completely given. Conference manager has overall responsibility of smooth conduct of conference and is participant in the success of the event.

5. "Pharmaceutical related expenses".....The pharmaceutical related expenses (62.5 lacs approximate) included in our accounts are : 41.6 lacs for accommodation, 14.79 lacs for travel, 6.7 lacs for transport.

Does it mean pharma paid the money for accommodation and travel of delegates to the org committee? If so is this shown separately?

How does 'travel' and 'transport' differ?

What does Pharmaceutical related travel mean?

Reply : The pharmaceutical companies have made payment in ICD DERMACON account to sponsor members attending the conference for hotel, air travel and transport .

In audited accounts these expenses have been clubbed and as copy will go to International Society of Dermatology.

Travel refers to pharmaceutical offering air ticket to our members, transport refers to local taxi etc

6. Was the hotel expenses paid to hotel directly or to event managers?

If so event managers, any reason?

Reply: All payments were made by cheques directly to Hotel Ashok or Samrat for hotel expanses for stay of IADVL ,ISD and ICD team during ICD DERMACON

7. Event manager was given 25 lacs and she offered only consultation as stationary , staff salary both at Aligarh and Delhi has been claimedseparately , pc , printer rental claimed separately , travelling ,conveyance , telephone , website management all claimed separately.

What is the logic to have 2 offices and claim separate expenditure?

Reply: Event manager replied in Query 4

The work was divided between Secretary General and Congress President and maintaining two offices was needed. Secretary General carried out all correspondence with speakers,



planned scientific sessions till finalised, coordinated with International Scientific chairman, issued letters of scientific invitation, reply to all emails etc and charged salary for one office person, internet and telephone charges only. No PC was provided, Dr Rajeev Sharma used his personal laptop for the Congress. The conveyance was paid to Dr Rajeev Sharma as he had to travel to Delhi for conference purposes and related meetings.

The Delhi office was used by Dr VK Sharma as Congress President, Treasurer Dr Somesh Gupta, to supervise all work related to venues, registration, bank dealing, maintain records, email replies, coordination with IADVL and ISD. Delhi office purchased one printer only. We used department office PC and at home personal PC for conference work. Dr VK Sharma only claimed expenses for telephone and internet. No payment was taken by Dr Somesh Gupta as same office worked for all of us. Despite maintaining two offices for more than 3 years, our expenses are comparable to DERMACONS and may be less.

There was only one website for conference paid by head office at Delhi.

The above expenses need to be viewed in perspective of international congress organising office for more than 3 years.

8. Your reply states:

We had adequate income to conduct the conference and keeping international nature of conference, the booking amounts for stalls were comparatively higher.

Does this mean because the delegate fee was high, the organizing committee was complacent towards raising funds from pharma and hence did not put in extra efforts? Should the policy have been different and more efforts to get more funds from pharma made?

Reply: There was no complacency and we were keen to assure international standards. Many pharmaceuticals were not able to adjust to idea of international conference with no loud speakers, limitations on promotion style e.g. no promotions within the halls, concept of sponsored sessions that have to be completely sponsored by the company as in AAD/EADV.

It is interesting if you go through sequence of events as how IADVL dealt with ICD and we had many decisions that probably adversely affected the ICD financially. We are summarising this and sincerely hope, we shall not be misunderstood. We do not aim to criticize any particular individual but this how our association works as seen from the other side:

- a) *In 2011 DERMACON in Gurgaon- It was decided to separate ICD and DERMACON. It affected the confidence of both pharmaceuticals and international dermatology community in the financial success of the conference. Dr Hemangi Jerajani Organising Secretary, Dr VK Sharma Congress President resigned and asked IADVL to find another persons to organise the conference. Later only after reassurance by then*



President Dr SDN Guptha and President Elect Dr CR Srinivas that both conferences will be combined but we need to convince IADVL members, DR VK Sharma withdrew the resignation as Congress President. It took us another one and half years to combine ICD and DERMACON after constitutional Comiittee referral and GBM and Finally CC at Hyderabad in July 2012. We were still debating conference registration in January 2013 at Ahmedabad.

- b) In summary, we lost precious two years in this process to market the conference as International conference being held in India and unintentionally created doubts in minds of pharmaceuticals and many of them did not participate in the conference. It is the major reason for not being able to raise more funds. Ongoing fiscal recession in India and abroad contributed to it. Holding DERMACON 2013 in January and ICD and DERMACON in December 2013 was considered as same financial year by some multinational companies and they did not participate.*

We all at IADVL needs to learn from this experience for organising international conferences . It needs stable supervising or monitoring committee, so that policy is not affected by change of IADVL office bearers every year. All new office bearers should be briefed by outgoing team for the sake of continuity about ongoing projects and handover agreements signed by them.

c) Finally despite all odds, we have managed to make conference successful in both scientific and financial terms and enhanced reputation of IADVL in international dermatology community. We have saved adequate amount for IADVL despite sharing 50% savings with International Society of Dermatology and have successfully transferred share of ISD and same has been acknowledged in presence of President IADVL at Manila by International Society of Dermatology.

9. Reimbursement of expenses includes reimbursement of travelling expenses of those persons who were selected as plenary speakers from abroad and IADVL Presidents. How many were provided travel?

Reply : We provided tickets to 9 international plenary speakers, President IADVL and Immediate Past President IADVL. List enclosed.

Dr Yoshiki Miyachi did not avail ticket for travel but asked for 7 days stay at upgraded room in Hotel Ashok

The pharmaceutical related expenses (62.5 lacs approximate) included in our accounts are : 41.6 lacs for accommodation, 14.79 lacs for travel, 6.7 lacs for transport. It may be kept in mind while assessing accounts

1. Venue Rental. It was appraised that venue is free if the food is from the hotel. Why there is venue rental of 99 lacs. Pl. Also clarify infrastructure development expense-(117 lacs), does it refer to the pandal? This is in addition to venue rent of 99 lakhs .

Reply: Venue Rental :The Scientific halls were free after commitment for lunch but rental is charged for area used in fabrication of AC hall for 800 persons, exhibition area, registration area, dinner in lawns as per the Ashok Hotel policy. Rental was charged for days of event and extra days(5 days before and two days after the event for dismantling). We have to pay one day extra as December 4 was declared holiday due to elections in Delhi and all areas were to be ready two days before the event . Rental is payable to both Hotel Ashok and Samrat and New Delhi Municipal Corporation (NDMC).

Infrastructure: It refers to preparation of grounds, fabrication of water proof exhibition hangar, preparation of booths, registration area, dinner area, family area, stage in halls, carpets, fire safety etc.

We also constructed 1 Sound proof hangar Halls which was required by observations of site visit committee to accommodate 700 -800 delegates. This hall was created through Sound proof Boards.

As Hotel Ashok has a fixed vendor policy as the Hotel has selected the vendor through Tender Process for which the Official licensee has to pay Licence Fee for providing the services in the Hotel. As no outside vendor is allowed and the rates for the various infrastructure related work are fixed by the Hotel. Hence we had to take the services from the official licensee for the various Infrastructure related work for smooth functioning of the event.



2. **Accommodation expenses-** 54, 64, 0000-Appears on the higher side?pl. provide details.

Reply: Significant amount was pharmaceutical related(41.6 lacs) and only balance amount 13 lacs has been spent on accommodation and we provided accommodation to all plenary speakers, IADVL and ISD office bearers, ICD organising committee office bearers.

3. **Income-**

A.Sponsorship fee and stall booking fees have been shown separately. Can you clarify as to what are these two?

Reply: We have shown sponsorship and stall income separately but can be clubbed. Sponsorship is higher as there was only 2% tax deduction and stalls had TDS of 10%.

B. Can we have a breakdown of how much money came in because of international delegates and international sponsorship?

Reply : International income was basically from registrations and only one company from Phillipines came for exhibition. The total amount was approximately 133,000 USD; 113,000 as registration and 20,000 USD approximately as Sponsorship. It may be noted some pharmaceuticals paid in Indian currency for international delegates as they cannot pay in foreign currency to event happening in India, they are not included.

C. The ratio of income from stall, sponsorship vs registration fees is around 1.2:1. In DERMACONS, this is almost 4:1. How do you explain such low sponsorship amount?

Reply :Our registrations was higher that lead to change in the ratio.

Why more companies were not allowed to take stalls and raise more finances?

Reply :We had adequate income to conduct the conference and keeping international nature of conference, the booking amounts for stalls were comparatively higher and many companies did not participate citing lack of interest in International Dermatology Congress. Few multinational companies said they have difficulty in financing two conferences in one financial year for IADVL (DERMACON 2013 in January 2013 and XI ICD and 42nd DERMACON in December of same year). India is in recession and conference collections are generally lower for last 2-3 years as shown by savings from DERMACON 2013 and 2012.



4. **Service tax** -Service tax paid on delegate fee - is it shown? We must have received service tax from stalls and sponsorship amount also. Hope it's all included in the receipt column –all 3 sources.

Reply : We have paid service tax of 1.3 crore on all collections including delegate fees but it was collected from all delegates and companies

5. **Event management fee** of 25.6 lac has been claimed. Under separate head a sum of 7.2 claimed as professional fee and manpower exp of 1.39 lacs, salary a/c 1.7 lacs, and secretariat exp 1.45 lacs has been claimed. Was it not included in event management fee? In 25.6 lacs, what all free services were provided by the event managers in terms of manpower, computer, website etc

Reply : We maintained conference office for 4 years at Delhi and Aligarh and salary and secretarial expenses refer to it.

Event management fees 25.6 lacs were paid separately to conference manager.

A amount of Rs 7.62 lacs was paid to previous conference manager CIM as professional fees for work from 2009 to 2012 including site visit, presentation and other professional services.

Clarify **Professional fee, Manpower expenses, Salary details.**

Manpower expenses were during conference for registration, coordination of scientific halls and lunch and dinners and preparation of kit and cultural programs.

6. What is the "**Office expense**" in addition to "Printing & Stationary", "Postage & Courier", "Secretarial expense", "Salary", "Telephone & Internet expenses"?

Reply : Telephone and internet expenses refer to amounts claimed by Congress President and Secretary General during last 4 years. Secretarial and Salary expenses are also for office of Congress President and Secretary General over 4 years.

Printing and stationary are direct expenses of conference for printing for conference related activities.

Postage and courier are for sending conference brochures by post to all IADVL members and important International participants. Some times printed material was sent to IADVL members by courier for distribution in international conferences of Dermatology

7. "Accounting charge" and "Audit fee" was paid to same party?



Reply : No both charges paid to different party – Audit fees paid to Sanjay Labh & Associates(Chartered Accountant) and Accounting Charges paid to Mr. Sujeet Kumar who is professional accountant.

8. What is “Cartage expense”?

Reply : This for bringing printed material to conference venue and or office

9. Pl explain Conveyance a/c (.41 lacs)? There are two more heads of expense by the names “Bus & Taxi hire charge (10.49 lacs)” and “Travelling expenses (25.6 lacs)”.

Bus and taxi hire is during the conference for speakers, office bearers and delegates for going to Dinner venue.

Conveyance refer to small day to day expenses by office staff to travel for coordination in last 3 years

Travelling expenses include 14.79 lacs of pharmaceutical related travel and balance was expended for Central scientific committee meeting travel and office bearer travel for promotion and organisation of the conference. International ticket from USA was provided direct to one plenary speaker.

10. “Equipment hire charge” – what equipment? There is one more head of expense by the name “Audio Video Service”.

Reply : It refers to renting of PC, Printer and other equipment for office of conference at venue during the conference

Audio video was for the whole conference running 7-10 halls for full 4 days

11. What is “Reimbursement of expenses (10.39 lacs)”? Who was reimbursed for what expense?

Reimbursement of expenses include reimbursement of travelling expenses of those persons who selected as plenary speakers from abroad and IADVL Presidents.

12. Clarify “Royalty” expenses.

Reply : As per agreement with International Society of Dermatology, 75,000 USD at @Rs 45 (Rs 33.75 lacs) was paid to International Society of Dermatology .



13. Clarify recipients of "Salary" and "Professional fees".

Reply :Refer to reply of Query No 5.

14. Pl give breakup and details of conf and meeting expenses.

These refer to miscellaneous conference expenses including website, Android and blackberry platform for mobile application, photography, inauguration function including cultural program and stage, certificates, badges etc

15. What is publicity exp of 6.68 lacs? Was it necessary?

Publicity expenses include amount paid for making of multi colour banner, posters , brochures and different types of electronic display placed outside the venue and at the entrance gates.

16. Give details of Misc. Income/expenditure.

Miscellaneous expenses are only Rs 31128 are for tea and snacks and sundry expenses over 4 years.

Miscellaneous income is forfeited amount of Corium Meditck company for cancellation of the booking of stall

17. What are the bank charges of 3.74 lacs? In fact bank generally gives incentives instead of charging.

Reply : For online transactions , a fixed percentage fees is charged by merchant bank, ICICI in our case. Our main account was in SBI, they donot give any incentives other than prompt service.

17. Savings -While significant sum has been saved the IADVL share is similar to what used to be saved in dermacon prior to Jaipur. This is despite charging 4 times more delegate fee as compared to dermacon. Would you agree that while our international prestige had gone up because of the Congress, in terms of surplus earned, money from our delegate's benefited ISD rather than IADVL? Is this a lesson to be learned?

We are in recession times and savings were low in 2012 and 2013 DERMACONS. We also organised conference in a 5 star hotel increasing our expenses. Our savings are otherwise adequate and 1.61 crore has been saved after paying 33.75 lacs of Royalty to ISD , 48.2 lacs paid to IADVL as Affiliation fees plus interest on seed money. We have also paid income tax of 91.43 lacs and 62.5 lacs are pharma related expenses. We have for first time paid travel expenses of all 11 Plenary speakers . We believe that we have satisfied the expectations of both IADVL and ISD .

Successful XI ICD and 42nd DERMACON is great step forward in bidding for WCD as we showed that India can organise a conference and save money.



The savings that we are transferring to ISD should be considered as long term investment in this direction .

Benefit to ISD: ISD spent most of Royalty (75,000 USD) or 33.75 lacs in India and only 5793 USD were sent from Royalty to them. Most of their expenses in India were on scholarships and ISD Quiz prizes. Out of savings after paying taxes they are likely to receive approximately 100, 000 USD (62 lacs) .

Compared to this , IADVL is getting a total of more than 1.26 crore and out of that 48.2 lacs has already been paid as affiliation fee and interest on seed money and balance will be transferred soon.

Lessons learnt is a separate topic and not related to accounts and may be discussed separately.

We hope the above reply to comments will satisfy the IADVL Executive and accounts can be placed in front of AGBM for approval.

It has been found that most of PLMs do not apply to convert themselves to LM

If constitutional - it will modify existing rule.

Clause 5 (b) Provisional Life Member (PLM)

Postgraduate students studying in the specialty can be made provisional life members. They will present to the Honorary General Secretary a letter from the head of the specialty department where they are studying, stating the date of their joining the postgraduate course and the date of its due completion, along with the application for membership. They have to send their qualification certificate within 5 years of their registration for the postgraduate course to the Honorary General Secretary in order to become permanent life members. In case they don't do so, in the defined period, they will have to register once again as a Life member after following the due procedure through the state branch. The Provisional Life Membership number will reflect their tenure of PLM membership. It shall read as PLM/number/tenure of PLM membership (e.g. 2014-19)

Proposal: PLM will only get access to online version of IJDVL. PLM if wishes to apply as delegate for DERMACON will need permission from Head of Department or state branch secretary. Or else he/she will be considered non-member.

This procedure shall be completed within a period of ten days

- iii) The disqualified candidate will have the right to appeal to an arbitration committee against the decision of election officer, which shall be constituted by the president as per the provision of the constitution; The committee shall give its decision within one week and that decision will be final. The candidate or any member on his behalf cannot raise the issue with general

members in any of the e groups and should raise this issue or any issue of dispute on through returning officer.

This national award will bring to the forefront three projects in different states around the country and will encourage the awardees to continue their work to improve the quality of life of their patients.

ELIGIBILITY

Exclusions: This award is aimed at all **voluntary initiatives**, coming from individuals, associations or hospital or organizations and providing a real **benefit to dermatological patients, independent from their routine treatment**. The project must fall specifically within the scope of a **community project**: a social project, focused on the patient, with the aim to **improve his personal well-being**, and his integration. **Projects providing benefit to individual patients by virtue of a medical treatment will not be considered**.

Inclusions:

1. FIVE MAIN FIELDS are identified:

- **Prevention and education:** any initiative favoring the prevention of dermatological illnesses, and education therapy for patients and their support network relating to their pathology, together with information and promotion of dermatology for the general public (e.g. consultations/patient – family information workshops, screening campaigns, camps, information campaigns...)
- **Quality of life and comfort:** projects favoring improvements

in quality of life for patients, whether this be physical or psychological (e.g. supporting and accompanying patients, help in accepting their conditions, advice on environmental factors and healthy living ...)

- **Access to care and coverage:** projects aimed at facilitating public access to care (e.g. free screening, travelling doctors, mobile clinics, ...)
- **Social inclusion:** initiatives leading to improved social integration for patients by reducing stigma attached to their diseases (e.g. vitiligo patients, leprosy patients, HIV patients, behavior therapy,...)

7. Proposal: Dermatology Online Atlas

Proposal: It is proposed that the project of Dermatology Online Atlas be converted into a printed atlas project.

Introduction and Background: The Dermatology Online Atlas project by IADVL has not met its logical conclusion of producing an online atlas with good quality images. Initially, lot of issues with the website portal similar to that experienced by the surgical registry was faced. The portal was not stable, it had provided long passwords and after 2 minutes or so the website would go back to home page, not saving all uploads. Then there were issues with the uploading. The images would get uploaded, but all the descriptions of the image were not matching up. Once the portal issues were sorted out, images were uploaded



by very few of the registering users. Probably the credit for the uploader, not being there in print, led to disinterest in uploading images. But what negated the originating idea was the quality of images uploaded. Most of the uploaded images were of poor quality and not worthy of use. There was also the problem of copyright of images. Whether images from published articles of Indian journals can be used and whether the images uploaded by the users will be used by online hacking by somebody else, were also some other issues which were raised. These also probably kept good images from being uploaded.

Justification: All e-projects actually face a similar problem. Many good contributors may not be net savvy. Uploading images with description takes valuable time. Good quality images are sent to journals for publication. It is therefore felt that good quality images will only come to a print atlas- where proper credits will be given. In view of all the above, converting the online atlas into a print atlas is a good idea.

The IADVL atlas will have to be of real good quality and therefore has to be a collaborative effort of all major institutions, academicians and members alike. One chief editor will be appointed who can in turn nominate assistant editors to help him in the endeavour. An invite in the form of an announcement would be sent to all members and departments to contribute images. In addition, academy members and premium institutions would be specially invited and involved in the contribution. There would be a specific deadline of four months by which images are to be submitted with a brief 2 to 3 line explanation. After this, the editor shall analyse the output and if further images are required, contact IADVL and authors for permission. This would enable editor to complete collection by 6 months & printing by 1 year.

It is therefore proposed that the online dermatology atlas project be converted into a printed atlas project with contributions expected from all concerned to produce a real quality product.

How will it help IADVL? By converting it into a printed atlas, everybody, including IADVL, stand to benefit. It will be a good academic venture not undertaken before by IADVL. It will be a ready reckoner for Residents and Dermatologists alike as reference material when they are faced with dilemmas in clinical diagnosis. The authors and contributors will get authorship credits in print alongside the images. It will add on to the already existing successful academic ventures like IADVL textbook and its concise form for undergraduates. Finally it will also generate royalty and income to IADVL.

The IADVL Training Fellowships are "open to members or provisional life members of the IADVL who are not working in the same institution and who ... (are) .. aged less than 35 years at the time of commencement of his or her fellowship." This excludes the vast majority of members, for whom updation of skills is equally important. Practitioners possess some basic skills and may actually not need 4 weeks, as for the present fellowship. They may also find it difficult to spare that much time. Hence, the duration of the fellowship can be two weeks. No financial support would be provided by the IADVL.

Proposal:

RULES FOR IADVL TRAINING FELLOWSHIPS FOR PRACTITIONERS

1. The fellowship will be open to life members of the IADVL who are not working in the same institution.
2. Applicants must be aged 35 years or more at the time of commencement of their fellowship.
3. The IADVL Academy of Dermatology will select the course of training and institution based on the criteria used for the existing IADVL Training Fellowship.
4. The duration of training will be 2 weeks.
5. Applicants must apply with their full biodata, including their name, contact details, current affiliation and IADVL life membership number. They must specify the course of specialization and institution (not more than two in order of preference) that they intend to undergo, and state whether they have ever been awarded any IADVL Fellowship.
6. Awardees will be selected by the IADVL Academy of Dermatology on the basis of merit and the possible utility of the training in the discharge of their duties, with preference being given to those who have never availed any IADVL Fellowship.
7. The host institution must be ready to accept the awardee.
8. The list of awardees will be announced by the Hon. Gen. Secretary during DERMACON.
9. Awardees must give an undertaking to complete the fellowship within the stipulated time, failing which they may not be considered for future IADVL fellowships.
10. While the Fellowship will not carry a grant, a certificate will be issued by the Hon Gen Secretary after successful completion of the course and receipt by the IADVL Academy of the Feedback forms (as for the existing IADVL Training Fellowship) from the Fellowship Director and Trainee as well as a brief report of their experience of the same.

IADVL Task force Against Topical Steroid Abuse (ITATSA)

The misuse of topical corticosteroids has been the cause of much dismay and discussion in the dermatology community in the recent past. These extremely useful agents are being rampantly used by the general public to treat any and all skin disease and even more alarmingly as "fairness creams". The physician community including dermatologists, GPs and other specialists are also not free of blame. At best, we have allowed this menace to develop unchecked. At worst, we are guilty of failing to teach our colleagues the importance of safe prescription of topical corticosteroids. Unchecked approval and marketing of irrational combinations containing potent and superpotent steroids is another, perhaps most important aspect of this problem.

To try to develop a coherent and well planned strategy to attack this problem, our association has formed the IADVL Task force Against Topical Steroid Abuse (ITATSA). Under the chairmanship of Dr. Koushik Lahiri, and with Dr. Abir Saraswat as convener, this task force is working with the active support of our President Dr. Deepak Parikh and Hon. General secretary Dr. Rashmi Sarkar. All the authors of our pathbreaking study on topical steroid misuse on the face that was published in IJDVL in 2011 are members and many more interested IADVLites from around the country have joined in the effort. An advisory board comprising senior members Dr. VK Garg, Dr. VK Sharma, Brig. Rajan Grewal and Dr. Mysore Venkatram is guiding us. Dr. Lalit Kumar Gupta and Dr. Rajesh Kumar of SIG-Adverse drug reactions are also putting their might behind this effort. Dr. Sanjeev Gupta, Vice President and Col. Rajesh Verma are our liaison officers with the IADVL executive. We welcome more and more members to come forward and join this group to strengthen our efforts to stamp out this menace.

ITATSA had its first meeting on August 15 at Aurangabad during the MIDERMACON. Many concrete proposals were discussed and as a direct result of this meeting, a letter to all major pharma companies was drafted which outlines this problem and seeks their active help in curbing it. With the active help of Dr. VK Garg, a letter was also delivered to the Drug Controller General of India apprising him of the problem of unrestricted approval and sale of irrational steroid combinations. While we tackle this problem at the regulatory and commercial front, we are also developing several initiatives to teach, train and remind our colleagues, both dermatologists and others, to use these agents responsibly. Initiatives to make the general public and especially pharmacists aware of the dangers of unrestricted use of topical steroids are also on the anvil. We seek advice, guidance and proposals from all members of IADVL to help us end the menace of topical steroid abuse.

Mysore Dermatology Society psoriasis awareness camp was conducted at KR hospital Mysore. Dr Nanjundaswamy gave



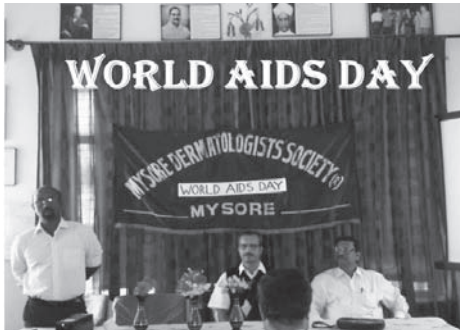
awareness talk to patients.

It is one of the important financial benefit scheme aimed at securing financial security for the family members of our association. 23rd European Academy of Dermatology and Venereology-IADVL - EADV subspecialty group meeting

Twenty third congress of EADV was planned from 8-12 October 2014 at Amsterdam, Netherlands. IADVL subspecialty group meeting in EADV was slotted for 8th October, 2014 between 9.00 to 13.00 hrs. The scientific programme for the same was finalized by Dr Suresh Talwar (immediate past president-IADVL) and Dr Venkat Mysore (president elect -IADVL) after inviting the scientific papers.

Prof A J Kanwar and Dr Suresh Joshipura chaired the meeting at Amsterdam. The meeting was well attended. Delegates from India and abroad including South Africa, UAE and neighboring countries attended the meeting. Prof AJKanwar in his opening remarks welcomed all the delegates and showed confidence about the prolific session to follow. Dr. Suresh Joshipura conveyed the message that the first sister society meeting of IADVL at EADV was held at Lisbon and that the current meeting was fourth in the row.

The theme of the program, Indian dermatology, innovations and trends, perfectly tagged the scientific content of the meeting.

Speakers spoke on diverse subjects related to various facets of dermatology providing insight of its current trends.

Dr. A. Luthra, the first speaker, spoke on 'Neck rejuvenation: Indian perspective'. He aptly emphasized that selection of the combination of procedure is the key step to achieve optimum results.

Dr. Kiran Godse spoke on 'Platelet rich plasma in dermatology - Accumulating experience from India'. He quoted that good results of PRP were found in Male pattern androgenetic

alopecia. However, he mentioned that further studies were required to attest its role in other indications.

Dr Koushik Lahiri chaired the next session, along with Prof. AJKanwar.

Dr Rohit Batra presented his views on 'Tattoos: A new age menace (Indian experience)'. He expounded various adverse effects of Tattoos and various aesthetic surgeries to overcome it.

Dr. V. Pradyumna spoke on 'Various lasers for skin resurfacing for Indian patients'. He pertinently described various choices of lasers along with their indication, suitable in Indian skin.

Prof A J Kanwar in his talk on 'Rituximab in pemphigus - Indian experience' cited that Rituximab is a promising drug for treatment of pemphigus.

Dr. Koushik Lahiri in his lecture on 'Pruritus in elderly, discussed various etiopathological and therapeutic options at length.

Dr Nilendu Sarma, the last speaker of the session, gave his talk on 'Current scenario of hand, foot, mouth disease - an emerging infectious disease in India'. He mentioned that though complications are limited, encephalitis is a rare complication and also highlighted the preventive aspects in school going children.

After a series of very interesting sessions, the session was concluded by vote of thanks. Participation certificates were given to the entire scientific team.
