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Message from President

Central council meeting is on the anvil- the midpoint in IADVL calendar and the time to release our newsletter- print version. This is also the right time to take stock of the term gone by.

By all accounts, 2015 has been an exhilarating year so far- an year that has seen initiation of programs, meeting targets-and fulfilment of promises leading to progress. It has been an year so far of **factum**- of achievement. Workshops, CMEs, Community programs, webinars, bulletins, scholarships, grants, have come thick and fast. We in IADVL can look back with satisfaction at what has been accomplished.

I said in my presidential speech: I want IADVL to be Committed, communicative and Competent; Reliant, Responsible and Responsive; Influential, interactive and innovative. I can happily proudly say we have gone some way to be all these.

Communicative: we have used the app, e groups, whatsap, and for the first time bulk sms and mass email blasts to communicate with members. We have tried to communicate with public through press releases and press meets. We have had a bulletin every month- in practice management, residream, derma Academia, Laser bulletin (Dr Sanjeev Aurangabadkar) in addition to our official newsletter.

Competent: We have delivered on time-bulletins, newsletters, scholarships, webcasts, webinars. We have had webinars on dermatopathology (Dr Nanda Kumar), trichology (Dr BS ChandraShekhar), dermatosurgery (Dr Salim), and vitiligo. Committed to the community: We had massive organization of vitiligo day across the country through our vitiligo mission (Drs Devinder Prasad and Umashankar)- press meets, press releases, camps, free clinics, educational events, webinars, documentary, street plays, candle light vigils. We had an essay competition on vitiligo. We have tried to put "colour in to the skin, smile on the lips and joy in the life of these paitents". Our unique ITATSA (headed by Koushik Lahiri and Abir Saraswat, Shyam Verma) has aggressively and energetically pursued the objective of educations the community, chemists and general doctors through press releases, webinars, social media, posters (treat your skin right program). We supported Yoga Day through online yoga workshop! We will soon have IADVL CHALA GAON KI ORE AND SWACCH TVACHA CAMPAIGNS (our Sr VP Dr Raghunath reddy is taking this forward)-All these part of DERMASEWA – OUR COMMUNITY SERVICE PROGRAM

Responsive: IADVL responded to the needs of members by announcing scholarships for world congress, EADV, SARAD congress and ISDP congress. There is a four fold increase in fellowships in India and new international dermatopathology fellowships were announced-there is also a scientific CME meant specifically for residents in Delhi(Dr Somesh Gupta)- all these part of DERMAYUVA- our youth oriented program. Very soon, is to come a couple of programs oriented towards women- DERMA-EVA!! We are also presenting a clinic software program to the central council for approval.

Responsible: We have tried to set our records right and are nearing the completion of archiving all our records (Dr Suresh Joshipura). We are streamlining our tax payments, both wrt 12 A and service tax. More SOPs have been drafted to streamline administration through our SOP committee (Drs Suresh talwar and Col Rajesh Verma).

Innovative: we have innovated and how! We have had online symposia, WEBINARS, information through app. We have used youtube to air lectures! Our academy (lead by indefatigable Col Dr Manas Chatterjee and Ameet Valia) is bustling with activity. We have campaigned for E voting registration thanks to efforts of Rajesh Buddadev, to sms campaigns and the number is set to cross 1000!

Minutes of EC meeting, New Delhi, 25th & 26th April, 2015

Venue: Radisson blu Hotel, Dwarka, New Delhi

25th April 2015

Attended by: Dr. Venkataram Mysore, Dr. Deepak Parikh, Dr. Devesh Mishra, Dr. Rashmi Sarkar, Dr. Somesh Gupta, Dr. Raghunatha Reddy, Dr. Rajesh Buddhadev, Dr. Manish Gautam, Dr. Rohit Batra, Dr. Suresh Josipura, Dr. Arijit Coondoo, Dr. Roopak Saxena, Dr. V.K. Garg, Dr. Ameet Valia, Dr. Rajib Kumar Gogoi, Dr. V.K Sharma, Dr. Ramesh Bhat. Dr. Reena Rai, Dr. Manas Chatteriee, Dr. M Raman

The EC meeting commenced with President, Dr Venkataram Mysore welcoming all present.

Meeting with the Auditor, Mr Sanjay Labh

The issues discussed were related to continuation of 12 A continuation, Service tax registration for IADVL, Permanent office address for IADVL and separate account for Academy.

Regarding 12-A status it was decided that we continue and further accounts added should be sent to Patna. IT can be paid online. Auditor informed that until a notice is served or any letter received from govt, there is no need to worry about status of 12 A and we should continue to enjoy its advantages

No separate account for Academy till we have Service Tax registration and all SIG activities to be conducted with State branches.

Auditor firmly said that we however need to get servicet ax number and pay taxes as due- and for this a permananet number is absolutely necessary

For permanent office, it has been decided to inspect the branches which have applied to give their office on rent. Till that time for the next 8 months we can rent the Delh State Branch office after getting confirmation from President Dr Mukesh Girdhar.

Mr Sanjay Labh and Dr Somesh Gupta were requested to calculate the amount of Service tax due since July 2012 till date. It can be presented to the CCM and get it passed to pay off the Service tax.

These points were agreed upon by the House and passed.

Treasurer's report: Dr Somesh Gupta presented the report. He said that till December 2014, we have 70 lacs interest and after tax deduction its 63 lacs. We have to spend approx 50 lacs(80%).

The President said that we can spend that much on IADVL SIG Grants and scholarships. If need be, we could increase the number of Scholarships.

The President, Dr Venkat, asked Dr Reddy whether he will need

funds for IADVL Chala gaon ki ore or Swatch Twacha mission. Dr Raghunatha R. Reddy said that it will be only after planning and not right away.

Dr VK Sharma requested the Treasurer to have a Finance Committee meeting before presenting the report.

Secretary's Report: Dr Rashmi Sarkar, Hon. Gen. Secretary presented the report highlighting about the various events (ITATSA, Leprosy Day), Research and grants, Scholarships and Resident welfare program. She needed the approval for Vitiligo Day Essay competition prizes for the postgraduates under the IADVL Residents' Welfare Program. An amount of Rs 10000, 7500 and 5000 respectively were approved for 1st, 2nd and 3rd prizes.

She further highlighted about upcoming IADVL webinars and videos and IADVL Mentorship program, IADVL App and SMS campaign, Practice management cell. IADVL had organised a press conference and was well appreciated. She mentioned about IADVL archiving project by Dr Joshipura and also expressed concern on the dwindling attendance in IADVL sister society meets in International conferences and whether we really need them. It was decided that we would not be holding sister society meeting at EADV this year as it is being held on the last day after closing ceremony of EADVL instead of the first day.

Venue inspection of DERMACON 2017 and ADC 2016 were done and IADVL office inspection of Delhi and Kolkata were done. Only Bangalore office inspection is due on 14th August. She also mentioned about the important meetings with govt officials (DGHS, health secretary, DGCI, MCI, DNB) planned pre and post EC meeting.

Dr Coondoo raised an important issue about discrepancy in Constitutional issues at national and State level. The President, Dr Venkat, explained that this is because of lack of communication between states and EC. Surveys have been conducted with this aim in mind to get an idea of the working of States and to try to find a solution to this problem.

Day 1, 25th April 2015, Post- Lunch session

Academy report: Dr Manas Chatterjee, Chairman, IADVL Academy presented the report. He highlighted the various designations to Academy members as co-ordinators. Dr Venkataram Mysore informed the House that this was done so that all things do not have to be done by Dr Ameet Valia /Dr Manas Chatterjee and IADVL Academy will have people



functioning on their own with proper delegation.

Dr Manas further spoke about the Academy Newsletters, which will be three in number. Dr Venkat added that there will be an additional column of Top Ten News similar to AAD and other international societies.

Minutes of Academy meeting at Mangalore were presented. The feedback from DERMACON Mangalore was discussed. The President added that the feedback came in 2 ways, on the IADVL App - 600 members responded and others on Academy. The gist of the feedback was a question mark on the CME. Most felt that the CME should be on Clinical Dermatology and not converted to Workshop. This was passed on to Organising Committee, DERMACON 2016 at Coimbatore.

Coming next to the Mentorship Workshops, Dr Manas informed the members that the Dermatosurgery Workshops was in 3 centres. Trichology symposium was held on 8^{th} March and next is due on 21^{st} June.

As regards the Research Methodology workshops, Dr Manas raised a point that MSD wanted to host the proceedings on the Univadis website, to which the President said that this will not be possible.

The IADVL Online Lecture series in Dermatopathology had a test run on 22^{nd} April by Dr V Ramesh. The President added that this could be converted into a Certificate Course with Q & A in the end. In addition, 40 lectures have been planned over a year with help from Sun Pharma.

Dr Manas next moved on to SIG reports, starting with the Psoriasis SIG. About the Psoriasis guidelines in IDOJ, he said that the entire guidelines be submitted as a single document after all replies received. He also added that the Psoriasis Registry was a collaborative project of SIG and JIPMER Pondicherry. JIPMER wanted to host the Registry on their server. The President said that there was no official communication from their end and even if it comes, it should be from Director JIPMER and not Dr Laxmisha alone. Dr Parikh felt that any project of IADVL on any website other than IADVL site is not safe and can be misused. Dr Manas felt that we can try and get it to our website. The president asked Dr Manas to discuss with Dr Laxmisha regarding this.

Further in SIG reports, he informed about the SIG Leprosy Quiz and about the FAQs on childhood vitiligo by SIG Pediatric Dermatology. SIG Genodermatoses have released a list of Centres for Genetic Testing in India. It is zonewise and will be put up on website. The first SIG-CADR workshop will be in Mumbai on 10th May and next will be in DERMAZONE WEST at Udaipur.

The IADVL Academy meeting will be on $11^{\text{th}}\&~12^{\text{th}}$ July and is merged with Jury meeting of Sun Grant to cut costs. He added

it is being done in Army area to reduce expenses further.

Coming to IADVL Training Fellowships, Dr Manas stated that there was an issue with the Trichology Fellowship, where the candidate was told that there were will be only observation and no Hands-on. Later, the issue was sorted out and she was allowed some Hands-on as well. Here came the issue whether a 1 month training deserves the use of the word Fellowship or it be called Observership. The President felt that the 1 month to be called observership and 1 year course as Fellowship. Dr Somesh felt that Observership does not need Hands-on. Dr Parikh said that mention fellowship for 1 month with observation only and no Hands-on training. Dr Manish asked whether there was any defined criteria for duration of a course to be called Fellowship. Dr Venkat said that we call it Observership with no Hands-On guaranteed. Dr V.K.Garg chipped in by saying that students from US coming to their Institute for 2-4 weeks training get Observership Certificate. Dr VK Sharma felt that it will not make a difference whether it is fellowship or Observership. Dr Parikh told Dr Manas that the Centres and candidates be informed about the change in nomenclature of the course, giving them freedom to back off if not interested.

Dr Manas further put forth an issue raised by a student regarding the common evaluation form and evaluation criteria for Fellowship. The student felt that if an Institute (read faculty) or PG does not have very strong CV (publications), whether they can apply for Scholarships, Travel grants etc. Dr Somesh felt we should categorise according to Institute profile. DR VK Sharma felt that 1-2 seats can be reserved for students/Institute with less publications. Dr Reddy felt that if a candidate can get recommendation of 5 Professors, it would be good to consider. Dr Parikh said that this was more necessary for states like J&K, NE states, Orissa and interior Andhra where hardships are more with less facilities. Dr Rajib Gogoi thanked the EC for considering and added that ACSI also has special grants for J&K and NE states. Dr Manas felt non-metro is a good term and Dr Rashmi added non-metro far flung area was a better idea. Dr Coondoo suggested 4 groups, Govt. Colleges in Metro, Private colleges in Metro, Govt. colleges Non-Metro and Private colleges Non-metro. Dr Rohit felt we could have out of 4, 2 can be for good academics and 2 for not so good. Dr Manas/Dr Amit felt 1 out of 4 can be reserved. The president summed up that it was not so easy and asked the Academy to come with a proper solution to this issue.

The next point was about the International Fellowship in Dermatopathology. Dr Manas informed the house and congratulated the main "architects", Dr Ramam and Dr Venkataraman. Dr Venkat suggested that Dr VK Sharma,



International Liason Head can consider same in other subjects. Dr VK Sharma said that amount of Rs 50000/- was not enough to sustain in any foreign country for 6 months. Dr Reddy also agreed and said that people who have started their practice already may find it more difficult.

Regarding Workshops on Dermatosurgery, Lasers & Aesthetics, Dr Manas informed the House that MOU with Torrent has been prepared. There will be 10 such workshops, 5 in Dermatosurgery and 5 on Lasers & Aesthetics. The President added that 2 of these will be for members above 40 years of age. He also asked Dr Manas to avoid Delhi or Mumbai and include smaller cities.

Dr Manas also informed about Genodermatoses Work Shop in Delhi on 13^{th} September. Also, he congratulated Dr Seetharam for the E-library project and added that the details have been sent to the States.

Coming next to the multicentric studies, he enumerated the selected topics as 1. Therapy of SJS 2. Pemphigus Pulse Therapy 3. Vitiligo Pulse Therapy 4. Antifungal resistance and 5. Phototyping of Indian Skin. He also informed that Dr AJ Kanwar and Dr Sandipan Dhar will be incharge of these studies.

Dr VK Sharma raised an issue about the Guidelines of SJS/TEN not being on website. Dr Manas said that they were removed so that the new guidelines be put up. Dr Sharma suggested we let the old ones stay till the new ones are put up. Also, the guidelines on Journal website can be put on IADVL website. This was accepted by the EC.

Moving on to **SIG Action plans**, Dr Manas informed about the official newsletter of the Academy, IADVL — DERMA ACADEMIA. Dr VK Sharma suggested that the newsletter should not have the President's message in all the issues. Only 1st issue every year can have the message and subsequent issues should have salient features on front. This point was agreed upon.

Regarding CADR form, Dr Manas informed the house that a minimal sum of Rs 8000/- is required to create a form for CADR reporting with backend database. The President declared it passed by EC but also said that CADR reporting is a difficult task. DR VK Sharma added that all Dermatology departments do not give data. Dr Joshipura reminded of legal issues if patient names are mentioned. Dr Manas confirmed that names will not be mentioned.

The next issue was regarding a request from Dr JK Maniar for IADVL partnering HIV Congress 2016. DR Mysore felt that if no financial issues involved, we can endorse. Dr Parikh said that if we allow one, others will also ask. Dr Mysore was of the opinion that we should support major associations / those working for HIV/ Leprosy. Dr Devesh Mishra too felt we should

go ahead with academic partnership. DR VK Sharma also added that our name will help them get funds so there should be no objection. Finally, It should be treated on per case basis but preferably allow for HIV/ Leprosy conferences. Passed in EC, referred to CC.

Dr Somesh Gupta felt it was too cumbersome to give multiple cheques for IADVL – L'Oreal grant and if we allow amount below 1 Lac in a single amount, the transactions can be reduced. This was passed.

Regarding change in designation in Academy to Ex- Officio, Dr Manas requested that the Immediate Past President, President Elect and Treasurer be part of the Academy meeting. Approved in EC, referred to CC to be passed.

Regarding adding Immediate Past President to list of members for Selection committee for SIG members, it was agreed upon.

MOU with ABBOTT

The President asked the opinion of the House on the ITATSA MOU which was discussed in AGBM and for which we are supposed to sign with ABBOTT. Copies of MOU were distributed to all members

Dr Parikh felt that point 4 last para and Point 5 1st para are improperly framed and to be discussed with ABBOTT. He felt that it should be clearly mentioned that this agreement and material are to be used for 1 year and not beyond that period. This was agreed. The next point raised by Dr Parikh was about Point 2, Clause(a)" active help of ABBOTT sales and marketing force" for what purpose. Dr Mysore clarified it was to reach out to doctors with the material etc. Dr Coondoo felt that if they promote Lobate, how will they propagate safe use of steroids. The President replied that they are talking of abuse inspite of their product, is to be noted. Point 5. "Treat your Skin right" is not ABBOTT property should be clearly communicated. Dr Mishra pointed out an important point regarding the Term of contract which should be till DEC 2015 and not till next DERMACON. Each company will have only one DERMACON to promote. Second was a typing error which needed correction, Dec 2016 was written instead of 2015. All felt that Company logo should not be more prominent and they specify where all they will use their logo. After the discussions it was decided to go ahead with the MOU

IJDVL Report was presented by Editor, Dr Ramam. The salient point discussed was about the IJDVL Team meeting to be held discussed during DERMACON and he asked approval for the same from EC. Dr Mysore agreed and suggested that part of the meeting can be made educational in terms of How to publish papers. Future of journal needs to be professional and help can be hired if required.

Regarding Medknow printing adequate number of issues and



posting them, it was confirmed that a person from IADVL Maharashtra was sent to check and he reported back that the adequate numbers were printed and dispatched with no discrepancy found,. This will be done in all subsequent issues as well.

For journals returned, it was suggested we publish names in the journal itself or involve State branch Presidents and Secretaries. Dr Ramam will send the list of journal returned to Dr Devesh Mishra for this whole year. He also asked Dr Rajesh Buddhadev to see if he could check with the same as he is working on e-voting list.

Government Liason Cell Issues: Dr VK Garg, Chair, informed the House that meeting with NBE has been arranged and the meeting with MCI Director has been fixed. Dr Coondoo put in a request about reducing the required bed strength for Dermatology Inspection in colleges.

International Liason Cell Issues: Dr VK Sharma, Chair, talked about starting more fellowships in other areas on the line of Dermatopathology fellowship, exchange programs and training centres. He also put forth the issue for starting International Quiz as our quiz is of high standards. We should have exchange programs for Gulf Countries. IADVL can arrange for experts to be invited. Faculty should be paid unlike DERMACON. This will ensure that the courses continue. For the international faculty to operate in India, we will need temporary registration with Medical Council. Dr Mysore felt that distance education is call of the hour. He requested the Academy to look into this.

Accomodation issues at DERMACON

The President informed the House that Getz events (Event Company incharge of Mangalore, Coimbatore and Kolkata DERMACONs) was bypassing the MOU repeatedly. Dr VK Sharma felt that we should have uniform MOU. Dr Reena put forth that she had only received contracts of some 4-5 hotel for accommodation and rest 15 odd hotels, just email exchanges. Mr Sameer from Getz was asked about the discrepancy in rates at Mangalore and was told to see that the rates are uniform at Coimbatore. We have been discussing the poor interaction and coordination between the centre and states which is the main hurdle in implementing many of the ambitious projects. It would be better if we have a representative from each zone that may be called as zonal E C members or it may be four joint secretaries and four vice presidents who will help coordinate between states and centre to function more effectively with specific responsibilities If constitutional — will it replace existing clause? Or modify? - Yes it will change the composition of national EC.

Administrative- It needs EC approval, once that is done, it will go to CCM and later to AGM and finally to Constitution committee

Proposal: To change the present composition of E C without much change in the power and responsibilities of existing E C members.

IADVL Media Cell report: Dr Rajib Gogoi, Convener, presented the report of Media cell (Dr Anil Abraham is the Chairman). He highlighted the aims and objectives of Media cell and the progress so far. Dr Mysore stressed upon the importance of Media retainer and asked the House to think openly about it till the CCM. Regarding Communication means, Dr Manas felt that magazines were not the best means but newspaper or

electronic media is better. Dr Rohit felt that magazines stay more days at home and newspaper for a day only. He also stressed that we should target only A grade magazines and newspapers. As regards the retainership for any magazine or media, it should be atleast 1 year, was Col. Rajesh Verma's opinion. This issue was referred to CC.

Besides this, the importance of Media workshops and training for members was stressed upon. Dr Shyam Verma felt that we introduce lectures or sessions on' Media importance' in CUTICONs. Dr PN Rao said that we should have media training for State Presidents and Secretaries. All these points were agreed by the EC.

The IADVL Promotional videos for General Public on 1. Responsible Skin Care and 2. Psoriasis were discussed. The President explained that the Skin care video tells the people to go to an IADVL dermatologist for treatment. Dr Manas and Dr Shyam Verma felt that we should not have any foreign models or faces and it should be Indian.

Dr Rajib ended with some points on the Bulletin issue and that they were working on it. This was referred for detailed discussion in CCM.

SOP Committee — Dr Suresh Talwar, Chair presented the progress of the various SOPs and showed that only 2 were in progress and rest completed. Due to the problems in accomodation in DERMACON, the President suggested that we have SOP for accommodation too. Event manager needs to give copies of contracts with all hotels. Dr Talwar said that we should not have different rates (Registration/Accomodation) for Delegates and Pharma. Dr PN Rao felt that we should fix a central IADVL Event manager. Dr Mysore said that it is not possible as members will question the credibility of EC in this. Dr VK Sharma asked the EC to call for Quotations from Event managers as it is taking active part in the process now. This issue was referred to the CCM.

Elections issue — Dr Patwardhan felt that we should have zonewise ballot results declared to candidates. Referred to CC. Col. Rajesh Verma, Convener presented his part of the SOP committee report. He said that ideally Principle should be in Constitution and Duty in SOP. There is repetition and overlap in the Constitution. Faulty numbering of annexures and appendices were the issues. Some annexures need to be deleted and process is on. Constitution is in 3 parts 1. Rules and regulations, 2. Bye-laws 3. SOPs. Further discussion to be carried on in CCM. House then again took up the Accomodation issue at forthcoming DERMACON —Dr Reddy and Dr Reena said that after further discussion with Mr Sameer, Hotels will be at rack rate before 30th November at Coimbatore. No benefit (share) for DERMACON 2016 from event Manager and benefit to be passed on to delegates. No service charge applicable. This is



only for DERMACON at Coimbatore.

Quiz SOP: We should remove GSK from the quiz and call it IADVL Pharma quiz. Dr Raghunatha Reddy was requested to talk with other pharma companies as agreement is getting over with GSK. The points to be stressed upon would be that they will have participation in CUTICONs and other conferences, unlike GSK. This should be included in MOU.

For Quiz master, lump sum of Rs 25000/- is not enough as accommodation cost can be higher at some places depending on the number of days. The Secretary assured that we will give on actuals in such cases.

WCD bidding report — Dr Sacchidanand, Chairman, WCD bidding committee gave an overview of WCD bidding which included information about stall, luncheon, and bid document. Designed visting cards, social media activity and gift for all voting members were also discussed. An international video presentation is in the process and oral presentation for 4 mins will be given. Dr Coondoo added that we should have professional voice over for the video.

SARCD report- Report presented by Organising Secretary, Dr Jaydev Betkerur. He requested IADVL scholarships for SARCD as in other international conferences. The President assured that it will be announced soon.

Dr Mysore said the late demand by SARAD of share of 50% surplus is not in good taste and has left the EC unhappy. He asked Dr Betkerur to convey the same to SARAD so that they communicate well in advance for further conferences. The President, Secretary and Treasurer of SARAD will be given free registration and accommodation. 3 faculty from each SARAD country will be given free registration. No Indian faculty will be given any benefit. It was finally clarified that this 50% refers to the surplus that remains after giving IADVL share. This was accepted. Dr Manas pointed out that the Academy is not included in the brochure and expressed unhappiness on this issue as it has also occurred in the IADVL newsletter. The President apologized on behalf of the EC and issued directives to Organising Secretary and IADVL Secretary for corrections.

ADC 2016 report: Dr Vinay Saraf, Organising Chairman, ADC 2016 presented the report. The travel agent for accommodation and the event manager are separate so as to avoid unscrupulous increasing of prices. Upto 8% will be given to ADA from surplus and 4-5 members from ADA EC will be given free registration and accommodation. National faculty will have complimentary registration.

IDOJ report: was presented by Editor, Dr Shyam Verma. He expressed concern over the diminishing number of reviewers and asked whether we can have a central IADVL pool for the same or IJDVL shares their reviewers with IDOJ. He also felt

that Case Reports could be given a priority as there are many first timers although it may affect Impact Factor. He asked the EC's opinion on this. Dr Rashmi said that the diminishing case reports are a concern and impact factor is another issue. Dr VK Sharma said the focus should be maintained on Clinical Dermatology. Dr Valia felt that we need Pubmed recognition for the journal so that more people are eager to publish. Dr Verma agreed and put forth that Pubmed recognition is for new people and for known authors although impact factor plays a key role. Dr Verma wanted to give prizes for reviewers- and also enhance prize money for best papers. He was requested to send a proposal

Practice Management Cell report — Was presented by Dr. Narendra Patwardhan Chair and Dr. Narendra Gokhale, Convener. The first issue of "DERMAPRACTICE", the news bulletin of Practice Management Cell by Guest Editor, Dr Siddharth Sonthalia was released.

Dr Narendra Patwardhan and Dr Narendra Gokhale apprised everyone about the Clinic management software. It is versatile, Dermacentric, easily upgradable, web connected, cost effective, Cloud based with a smart script engine and above all, MCI compliant. Few Practice Management Cell Workshops will be held in the coming months.

Col. Verma asked whether it can be modified for institutions. Dr Gokhale said that it can be multi-user friendly. The President said that the cost will be Rs 200/- per member per year. Dr VK Sharma expressed that it should be IADVL software and not sponsored. DR PN Rao felt that the web based may have network issues and it should be on hard disk. Dr Mysore said that hard disk based is not a good solution and everything is Cloud based in today's times. PMC was told to go ahead try the soft ware and then present to CCM. The EC congratulated the guest editor, Dr Siddharth Sonthalia for the Derma-Practice bulletin.

Vitiligo Mission report was presented by Dr Davinder Prasad. He detailed about the activities planned for IADVL Vitiligo day on 25th June and about the plans of Vitiligo mission in the future. Dr Talwar added that write-ups for newspaper should be given. Dr Venkataram said that the essay competition is arranged for residents organised by Dr Rashmi Sarkar. The President added that any mission or event can be successful only if there is effective communication between State branches and Centre. Dr Venkataram Mysore summed up the EC meet by thanking the EC members for their co-operation highlighting each one's role. Dr Rashmi Sarkar proposed the Vote of thanks.

Name of Proposal: Budget proposal for Media Cell, IADVL Proposed by: Dr. Anil Abraham, Chairperson, Media Cell, IADVL Dr. Apratim Goel, Member, Media Cell, IADVL Dr. Rajib Kumar Gogoi, Convener, Media Cell, IADVL

Proposal:

The Media Cell has been in existence for 1 year now. The past and present set of members have tried their best to explore various options available to IADVL to pave its way to the mainstream national and regional media of different forms in order to establish itself as a familiar force to reckon with in issues relevant to IADVL and the speciality of Dermatology, in general, in this country. While various activities have been enthusiastically planned for the days to come and few are already being worked on, members of the Cell have realized the need for a pre-allocated budget for proper planning and execution of the Cell's activities. We are hereby proposing the following budgetary allocations exclusively for the Media Cell's activities during next IADVL year:

1. Expenses on Public Relation activities, as quoted by PR



- agency, monthly for 1 year @ Rs. 50,000 per month: Rs. 6.0 lakh per annum
- 2. Short Promotional videos of 3-5 min. length which will have to be shot 6 times a year @ Rs. 30,000 per video editing and shooting charges with voice over : total Rs. 2.0 Lakh per annum
- 3. Facebook page maintenance with weekly twice changing artwork and paid promotion of the page: Rs. 20,000 per annum
- 4. Additional artwork to be done in case for material to be put on website etc of IADVL would cost an extra of Rs. 25,000 (in which up to 10 times artwork can be changed)
- Press meets: for at least 3 press meets during the year, one each on the sidelines of DERMACON, MIDDERMACON/CCM and EC meeting, a total amount of Rs. 1.0 Lakh may be earmarked.
- 6. Rs. 1.0 Lakh as travel grant for Media Cell members to attend various meetings of IADVL, Press meets etc.
- 7. Radio broadcasting activity: to be started in all four metro cities initially. Expense of Rs. 5000 per month in 4 zones totalling Rs. 5000 X 4 X 12 = Rs. 2.4 Lakh per annum.
- 8. Additional press meets as a part of observing various days like "Vitiligo Day" etc., paid news/advertisements etc. in various media: Rs. 2.0 Lakh

We are, therefore, proposing a budget of Rs. 15,00,000/- for one IADVL year to cover all foreseeable expenses that may be incurred by the Media Cell during the year. However, the entire exercise being something new, only time will tell if this budget will be sufficient as there remains innumerable options to explore in order to establish IADVL as a strong brand in the media and make IADVL a familiar formidable force to reckon with.

How will it help IADVL?

Improving the current guidelines will bring more logistical transparency. It will also allow opportunity to more aspiring quiz masters and innovations to make the quizzes more exciting.

Objectives

- To conduct mentally stimulating quizzes with uniformity and transparency all across India
- To ensure better coordination and logistical arrangements between the organizers, representatives and quizmasters

Guidelines for the quiz committee

- 1. The quiz committee shall comprise of a chairperson, convener, expert advisor and six members.
- 2. They must have adequate experience in conducting guizzes.
- It is the responsibility of the committee to conduct the quiz at various levels, formulate guidelines to improve the quiz program and communicate these with the central committee for approval.
- To place advertisement of the quiz program on the IADVL website and IJDVL to increase awareness among post graduates.
- 5. They are to call for quizmaster applications, screen and select quizmasters and allocate them to state CUTICONs.
- They must communicate with the GSK representatives to ensure that the information about the quiz is disseminated to all colleges across the country, thus ensuring maximum participation and enthusiasm.
- 7. They must facilitate communications between the GSK representatives, local organizers and quizmasters to ensure smooth conduct of the quiz.

Guidelines for the state level IGNQPP

- A. Eligibility criteria for quizmasters:
- 1. He/she should have a minimum of 3 years work experience after completing postgraduate studies.
- 2. He/she should not be over the age of 50 years at the time of sending the application.
- 3. He/she should not have conducted more than three state level IGNQPP quizzes in the past. Those who have conducted more than three quizzes in the past may also apply, but their applications will be considered when there are no other suitable applications or at the time of crisis.
- B. Eligibility criteria for participants:
- 1. The participants must be provisional life members of IADVL or have applied for the same.



- 2. The participants should not have won the final IGNQPP quiz.
- C. General guidelines:
- 1. The quiz must be preferably conducted at the state CUTICON.
- 2. The organizing committee of the state CUTICON must specifically designate a faculty responsible for smooth conduct and organization of the quiz. The contact details of this local coordinator must be informed to the IADVL quiz committee well in advance. He/she is expected to communicate with the quizmaster and local GSK representatives for logistical support, and assist them during the quiz.
- 3. The quizmaster is to be treated as faculty. The organizers are to provide reasonable accommodation to the quizmaster for the entire duration of the conference and provide complimentary registration. This may be coordinated with the help of GSK representatives. The travelling expenses must be reimbursed by the local organizing committee during the conference. An amount of Rs.30,000 will be reimbursed to the organizers by the central secretariat after the conference, upon receipt of the expenditure detailsincurred towards hosting the quizmaster.
- 4. Only one team comprising of two members can participate from a college. They must write their names and full contact details (mobile number, email and postal address) for future communications. They are to write their answers on the same sheet.
- 5. The preliminary round is conducted as a closed-door session in a separate hall, with the time and location specifically mentioned in the scientific schedule.
- If there are less than four teams participating from a particular state, they are to be directed to participate at an adjoining state CUTICON, and informed well in advance.
- If there are exactly four participating teams, a preliminary round is not necessary and the state finals may be conducted directly.
- The final round must be done in the main hall as a plenary session and allotted 60 minutes. The time and location must be specifically mentioned in the scientific schedule.
- 9. Proper stage arrangements must be handled by the local GSK representatives and the local coordinator.
- 10. The quizmaster will be provided a feedback form which has to be completed and sent to the quiz committee within one week of conducting the quiz. He/she will have to submit a soft copy of the quiz questions for archival purposes. He/ she must also preserve all the answer sheets and forward the contact details of every participant to the quiz committee.
- D. Format for the state preliminary round:
- 1. Questions will be in MCQ format either in print or

- powerpoint presentation, and must cover all subspecialties of dermatology, venereology, leprosy, dermatopathology, dermatosurgery, therapeutics, history of dermatology, etc.
- 2. There will be 40 questions in 30 minutes, with every 5th question bearing an asterisk mark (to be used in the event of a tie; the person scoring higher in these questions will qualify)
- 3. The first 30 questions must have a single answer.
- 4. The last 10 questions must have multiple answers (2 to 3 answers). All the multiple answers have to be marked correctly in order to qualify for the points. Every correctly answered question is given 1 point.
- 5. A negative marking system of [-0.25 points] for every incorrectly answered question.
- 6. Questions that are not attempted do not carry negative points.
- In case of a tie in the final score, the team that answered the most `asterisk-marked' questions correctly is considered the winner.
- 8. If there is still a tie, then the team with lesser negative marks is selected. If that is also tied, then the winner is selected by lots.
- The decision of the quizmaster is final. In the event of a controversy, the quizmaster must be able to provide adequate references.
- E. Format for the state final round:
- The positions of the teams on the stage will be selected by lots.
- 2. There will be eight regular rounds and one rapid fire round.
- The regular rounds will comprise of four questions each. The question must have only one part and a direct answer. Innovative ways of framing questions are encouraged. The answer to the question must be displayed in the next slide.
- The question must be answered within 10 seconds or passed to the next team. Passed questions must be answered immediately.
- A correct answer to a direct question is given 10 points. A correct answer to a passed question is given 5 points. There are no negative points.
- 6. Structure of the regular rounds:
 - a. Round 1: Basic sciences
 - b. Round 2: Clinical dermatology
 - c. Round 3: Pediatric Dermatology
 - d. Round 4: Leprosy and tropical dermatology
 - e. Round 5: STI and HIV
 - f. Round 6: Dermatopathology
 - g. Round 7: Therapeutics
 - h. Round 8: Dermatosurgery and cosmetic dermatology



- 7. The questions are asked in a clockwise manner for the first four rounds, and in an anticlockwise manner for the next four rounds.
- 8. Round 1 begins from the $1^{\rm st}$ team, Round 2 from the $2^{\rm nd}$ team, Round 3 from the $3^{\rm rd}$ team and Round 4 from the $4^{\rm th}$ team
- 9. Round 5 begins from the 4th team, Round 6 from the 3rd team, Round 7 from the 2nd team and Round 8 from the 1st team.
- 10.Structure of the rapid fire round:
 - a. Each team gets ten questions, all of which have to be answered within one minute. These questions do not pass to the other teams.

- 11. There will be no separate audience questions. If a question is not answered by any team during the regular rounds, it is passed to the audience. Members of the audience are requested to raise their hands, following which the quizmaster randomly selects a person to answer the question.
- 12. The scores of the teams must be announced periodically at the end of every two rounds.
- 13. If the final score is a tie, the quizmaster must conduct a tiebreaker round consisting of three questions for each team. There are no passes in this round. If the score is still tied, the team with the highest score in the preliminary rounds is considered as the winner. If that score is also a tie, then the team with lesser negative marks is selected. then the winner is drawn by lots.

Guidelines for the national level IGNQPP

- A. Eligibility criteria for quizmasters:
- The chairman of the quiz committee in the current year is given the responsibility of conducting the quiz finals at DERMACON.
- The preliminary round of the national level IGNQPP may be conducted by the convener or other members of the quiz committee.
- B. Eligibility criteria for participants:
- The winners of each state level IGNQPP of the current year are eligible to participate in the preliminary round of the national level IGNQPP.

- C. General quidelines:
- 1. The quiz must be conducted at DERMACON.
- 2. The organizing committee of the DERMACON must specifically designate a teaching faculty responsible for smooth conduct and organization of the quiz. The contact details of this local coordinator must be informed to the IADVL quiz committee well in advance. He/she is expected to communicate with the quizmaster and local GSK representatives for logistical support, and assist them during the quiz.
- 3. The quizmasters are to be treated as faculty. The organizers are to provide reasonable accommodation to the quizmaster for the entire duration of the conference and also provide complimentary registration. This may be coordinated with the help of GSK representatives. The travelling expenses must be reimbursed by the local organizing committee during the conference. An amount of up to Rs.60,000 (for the preliminary round and final round quizmasters) will be reimbursed to the organizers by the central secretariat after the conference, upon receipt of the expenditure details incurred towards hosting the guizmasters.
- 4. The participants will be provided complimentary registration to attend the national conference. However, they must arrange for travel and accommodation by themselves. An amount of up to Rs.10,000 will be reimbursed to them towards travel and accommodation by the central secretariat after the conference, upon receipt of the expenditure details.
- The preliminary round is conducted as a closed-door session in a separate hall, with the time and location specifically mentioned in the scientific schedule.
- The final round must be done in the main hall as a plenary session and allotted 90 minutes. The time and location must be specifically mentioned in the scientific schedule.
- 7. Proper stage arrangements must be handled by the local and national GSK representatives with the help of the local coordinator.
- 8. The quizmaster will be provided a feedback form which has to be completed and sent to the quiz committee within one week of conducting the quiz.
- D. Format for the preliminary round:
- Questions must be on a powerpoint presentation, and must cover all subspecialties of dermatology, venereology, leprosy, dermatopathology, dermatosurgery, therapeutics, history of dermatology, etc.
- The questions must have a direct answer. They may contain pictures or be asked in an innovative manner. There will be no MCQs. The teams have to write down the answer on the sheet provided. They must also write their names and full



- contact details (mobile number, email and postal address) for future communications.
- 3. There will be 50 questions to be answered in 60 minutes, with every 5^{th} question bearing an asterisk mark (to be used in the event of a tie)
- 4. Every correctly answered question is given 1 point.
- 5. There is a negative marking system of [-0.25 points] for every incorrectly answered question.
- 6. Questions that are not attempted do not carry negative points.
- In case of a tie in the final score, the team that answered the most 'asterisk-marked' questions correctly is considered the winner.
- If there is still a tie, then the team with lesser negative marks is selected. If that is also tied, then the winner is selected by lots
- 9. The top four teams qualify for the final round.
- 10.The decision of the quizmaster is final. In the event of a controversy, the quizmaster must be able to provide adequate references.
- E. Format for the final round:
- The positions of the teams on the stage will be selected by lots
- 2. There will be nine regular rounds and one rapid fire round 15. The regular rounds will comprise of four questions each. The question must have only one part and a direct answer. Innovative ways of framing questions are encouraged. The answer to the question must be displayed in the next slide.
- The question must be answered within 10 seconds or passed to the next team. Passed questions must be answered immediately.
- A correct answer to a direct question is given 10 points. A correct answer to a passed question is given 5 points. There are no negative points.

The team will have to select a topic amongst 16 squares on a 4x4 grid. A square cannot be selected more than once. The question asked to them will be worth 10 points. If it is answered on a pass, it is worth 5 points. If a team is able to answer a question on a square that completes a line, they get 15 bonus points.
- 10.Structure of the rapid fire round:
 - a. Each team gets ten questions, all of which have to be answered within one minute. These questions do not pass to the other teams.
 - b. A correct answer is given 3 points. So the maximum score can be 30 points. There are no negative points.
 - c. The questions must be framed in such a way that they are short and crisp, with a one-word to two-word answer.
 - d. The structure of questions must be uniform for all teams.
- 11.If a question is not answered by any team during the regular rounds, it is passed to the audience. Members of the audience are requested to raise their hands, following which the quizmaster randomly selects a person to answer the question.
- 12. The scores of the teams must be announced periodically at the end of every two rounds. During this time, there can be a guiz guestion for the audience.
- 13. If the final score is a tie, the quizmaster must conduct a tiebreaker round consisting of three questions for each team. There are no passes in this round. If the score is still tied, the team with the highest score in the preliminary rounds is considered as the winner. If that score is also a tie, then the winner is drawn by lots.
- 14.As a special event, there will be an audience round on the stage while the final scores are being tallied. Four members who answered the most audience questions, or other interested volunteers will be requested to come up on the stage and join the existing teams by lots. There will be four questions, one for each participant. If they answer it directly, they get 10 points. Passed questions are worth 5 points. The help of the post graduate team can be requested, but it will attract a penalty of 3 points. The winner of the audience round will be awarded a special prize.
- 15. The decision of the guizmaster is final. In the event of a



controversy, the quizmaster must be able to provide adequate references.

Additional IGNQPP 10th anniversary Promotional activities

- As part of the 10th year celebrations of IGNQPP, it is proposed that a special commemorative logo and jingle be prepared and incorporated into all IGNQPP material. There will be no product branding.
- 2. Commemorative badges for IADVL quiz committee members, participants and GSK Staff who are present during the actual quiz to be worn during the quizzes.
- 3. GSK to print and distribute mailers to all post graduates which will contain information about the quiz and the history of IGNQPP, to help create interest among them. GSK to help handover envelopes branded with aforementioned logos containing a 'hall ticket' to CUTICON quiz participants from each college once their respective HODs select them. Content to be designed by GSK and approved by IADVL and by GSK.
- 4. To give the finals extra glamour, sashes will be given to winners along with the certificates and trophies.
- 5. A quiz question will be circulated on the IADVL Derma App every fortnight, starting from September till December, the answers of which will be provided along with the next question. Members who answer the most questions will be awarded a special prize during the finals at DERMACON.
- 6. A few quiz questions will be prepared and circulated among all postgraduates with the assistance of GSK executives once every month starting from September and ending in December, to promote enthusiasm towards quizzing. Answers with reference to these questions will also be provided.
- Posters regarding the IGNQPP are to be prepared and displayed by GSK at notice boards of dermatology departments in every medical college with the permission of respective HODs.
- 8. The GSK have proposed to try and get in touch with past quiz winners and quiz masters and request them to share their experiences. This will be used in creating AVs and 'walk of fame' posters (journey of IGNQPP). The questions asked to these past winners/quiz masters will be decided by IADVL and GSK jointly. GSK staff will do the actual interviewing, and also the making of the AV and designing, printing and distribution of other material created such as posters, mailers (in points discussed above), and also make the payments for the creation/printing of AV, posters, mailers after approval by IADVL. The AVs can be shown to post graduates in colleges before inviting participation, before the CUTICON quizzes and the national quiz finals. No

payments are to be made for interviewing the past winners and quiz masters.

- 2. Select delegates who would represent IADVL in ILDS assembly. Previously these have been selected by a closed nontransparent process which was changed last year.

Proposal: The following process be adopted for the following

- To Select one name for ILDS appreciation award every year- Applications would be invited through e groups, app, website; three judges would be appointed be past presidents or secretaries who have experience of functioning of international associations who will then recommend the name. The name will be announced by EC
- Select delegates who would represent IADVL in ILDS assembly.

The delegate list would mandatorily include three presidents, secretary and treasurer. For any additional sixth position, the following may be included: International bidding committee chair/International liason cell chairman. If more vacancies are available, applications may be invited as per the above process applicable to ILDS award and delegate chosen.

With this all ILDS positions- directors, awards and delegates would have the same process.



SOPs

NEW SOP 1- Pharma participation in DERMACON

Pharma can participate in DERMACON by sponsoring a stall in exhibition, meals (lunch /dinner), scientific session, guest faculty, transport, entertainment zone, cloak room or by giving an advertisement in the souvenir. Following general instructions will be followed:

- 1. Good space will be provided for stalls with high roof so that one should not feel suffocated. There should be enough space to move around in stall area. Location and visibility of stall area should be kept in mind. It should be easily approachable to delegates without disturbing the scientific sessions. Platinum and Gold sponsorers should be allotted prime space. AC should be mandatory for laser stalls and preferable for all stalls. No encroachment is allowed even if nearby stall is vacant.
 - In general the stall area be sectioned according to utility like sections for Lasers, Medical Books, Instruments, Cosmeceuticals, peels and aesthetic products, pharma companies, IADVL stall, DERMACON stall, local products (clothes, decoration item, jewellary etc). A sign board depicting location of each section to be provided at entrance gate.
- 2. Generally 2 category of stalls will be provided, small stalls will be 3x3 M and large stall will be 10 x10 M. However the sizes can vary depending on the space available but by and large the norms will be adhered to as far as possible
- No loud announcements are allowed at the stalls.
 Company can display and educate about new technology or have meet the experts like program in their stall area with one to one interaction. No games, eatables be allowed in the stall area.
- 4. **No announcement or bill boards on streets are permitted.** The only bill boards will be to indicate the way.
- 5. Photo identity cards in color different from delegate's batch will be provided to the representatives of the stalls who take up the sponsorship. For small stalls it should be 4 per stall while for large stalls it should 8 per stall. Extra photo identity cards for pharma can be given with extra payment Guards are placed at entrance of scientific halls to check the delegate badge before allowing entry. Pharma representatives should only be present in allotted stall area.
- No promotional material of Pharma Company is allowed in scientific hall. Even company or product name on the back of chairs is not permitted. However names of platinum, gold

- silver sponsorer can be displayed. However in sponsored scientific session company can display their name by slides before and after the lecture/session.
- 7. Movement of pharma personal to area outside the scientific hall will be limited. They will be discouraged to move in lobby areas outside the scientific halls.
- 8. Service tax and TDS will be paid by Pharma Company as per prevalent rules and a receipt of the same will be provided to the organizers.
- 9. Entrance to conference venue is limited to sponsorers only. People not participating in conference and standing in lobby or entrance gate are stopped from meeting the delegates. Accordingly personnel not wearing the designated batch are debarred from entering the venue.
- 10.Food coupons be provide to stall owners. Four lunch coupons and 2 dinner coupons to each small stall owner and 8 lunch coupons and 2 dinner coupons to each large stall (10Mx10M)owner be provided. Middle figure can be adopted for sizes in between. Even if a dinner is sponsored by a pharma company, the same rules will apply. Lunch coupons depending on circumstances can be replaced by lunch packs. If possible have separate dinning arrangement for sponsors. A separate dining area will be earmarked for drivers. (Sponsors dining area should not be with support staff such as drivers, cleaners etc)
- 11.Instruments and medical books stalls will be dispensed at concessional rate (maximum 50%). However food coupons will be provided as for small stalls. In turn instruments and medical books stalls will also provide 10-15% discount to the delegates. The rates of instruments will be displayed after approval by the local organizing committee. Laser companies can also be given a discount of 20 % and they too will give discount to delegates.
- 12. Stall will be allowed to remain open for 1 hour even after conference time is over as many of us those who wants to visit stalls after scientific activity is over, can visit it and have discussions with Pharma or laser companies.
- 13. No cash payment will be made.
- 14. Speakers topics and time slot in pharma sponsored scientific session will be decided by mutual consent of pharma and conference scientific team
- 15.Platinum, diamond, gold sponsorers and other major sponsors to be invited to inaugural ceremony along with other industry partners of IADVL and seated in a space marked for corporate (2 per company)
- 16. For any deviation from the approved norm a statement of case may be forwarded to EC



New SOP2: SOP for the Conduct of the Scientific Program in International Conferences Being Organized in India (TO BE ADDED IN SOP ON INTERNATIONAL CONFERENCE)

Though the rules vary with each international conference and are framed by the respective organizations whose conference it is, the aim of these SOPs is better supervision of the scientific program.

After winning the bid of International conference, the names of Organising chairperson, secretary, treasurer, scientific committee chairman and date of conference will be finalized by the local state organizing committee and duly approved by AGBM. President will write a letter to international society president informing about office bearers of next international conference. He along with president elect, immediate past president and secretary will inspect the venue, and also other facilities like, travels and accommodation given by host branch. After venue inspection seed money will be given as per the rules of international conference. Sharing of surplus will be decided by the IADVL and the international body. President will take updates of the international conference from time to time. If the international conference happened after his tenure, he will act as an adviser to that conference.

While the scientific program will be finalized by the Scientific Committee (as decided by mutual consent of the local organizers and the international body), the IADVL Academy Chairperson and Convener will be IADVL Scientific Coordinators of IADVL national body for the conference (and their names shall be shown as such in all publications) to liaise with the Scientific Committee on behalf of the IADVL. This is to ensure that the scientific program is shared with all IADVL Academy members and the Executive Committee. There will be one scientific committee meeting 4 months before the conference to be hosted by local organizing committee. This will be attended by scientific committee, Academy chairperson and convener, 3 IADVL presidents and IADVL secretary.

Certificate of attendance will be signed by president and secretaries of both organizations (IADVL and international) and organizing committee president and secretary .CME credit hours certificate will be signed by presidents, secretaries of both organizations and scientific committee chairperson.

The IADVL President, President Elect, Immediate Past President, Secretary General, Treasurer, the IADVL President who bids for the conference and the IADVL President who signs the contract should be provided free hospitality (registration, accommodation and travel) by the conference organizers.

In exceptional circumstances (speaker of great repute whose

presence is considered desirable) as considered by organizing and scientific secretary the waiver can be extended to 100%. However justification for this has to be provided. Complimentary travel facility for international speakers can be considered on case to case basis depending on availability of funds.

NEW SOP 3-PROCEDURE FOR ELECTION OF OFFICE BEARERS OF IADVL (Includes SOP for Elections Annexure XVIII)

- A. The election for the posts of the following office bearers shall be held annually. (i) President-elect one post (ii) Vice President 2 posts (iii) Joint Secretaries 2 posts
- B. The election to the following post shall be held every two years. (i) Honorary General Secretary (ii) Honorary Treasurer
- C. Selection for the venues of DERMACON and MIDERMACON will be held annually
- D. CONDITIONS OF ELIGIBILITY FOR OFFICE BEARERS The candidates proposed for various offices should confirm to the requirements as laid down under rule 26 of the IADVL Constitution.

PRESIDENT ELECT (i) should be a member of the Association in good standing for the previous TEN YEARS. (ii) Should have a minimum experience of 15 years in the specialty of Dermatology, Venereology, and/ or Leprology, after passing the examinations for his/her post-graduate qualification in the specialty. (iii) Should be exclusively engaged in the practice, teaching and/or Research of these specialties of Dermatology, Venereology and/or Leprology. (iv) Must have been actively involved in the affairs of the Association in an official capacity either at the Central level as Vice-President, Honorary General Secretary or Honorary Treasurer or at the Branch/Combined Branches level as President. He should have completed tenure at the time of filling nomination. (v) The candidate must declare any conflict of interest.

Since the post of President is very vital they will be provided five minutes each to address during CCM to give their vision. VICE PRESIDENT (i) Should be a member of the Association in good standing for the previous SEVEN YEARS (ii) Should have a minimum experience of 10 years in the specialty of Dermatology, Venereology and/or Leprology after obtaining his/her post-graduate qualifications in the specialty. (iii) Should be exclusively engaged in the practice, teaching and/or research in the specialties of Dermatology, Venereology and/or Leprology. (iv) Must have been actively involved in the affairs of the Association in an official capacity either at the central level as Honorary General Secretary, Honorary Treasurer or Joint Secretary or at the branch/combined branches level as President or secretary or a Central Council Member from the



branch for a minimum period of five terms either continuous or with breaks. (v) The candidate must declare any conflict of interest.

HONORARY **GENERAL** SECRETARY AND **HONORARY** TREASURER (i) should be member of the Association in good standing for the previous five years. (ii) Should have a minimum experience of 10 years in the specialty of Dermatology, Venereology and Leprology after obtaining his/ her postgraduate qualification in the specialty. (iii) Should be exclusively engaged in the practice, teaching and/or research of the specialties of Dermatology, Venereology and Leprology. (iv) For the post of secretary general the applicant must have served either as a state secretary or as joint secretary or treasurer at the national level. If there is no candidate who fulfills such criteria then election on the floor/ other candidates can be considered. For the post of treasurer the applicant must have been a Jt. Secretary, Secretary, Treasurer, Vice President or President at the state level or Jt. Secretary at the National level. (v) The Honorary General Secretary and the Honorary Treasurer must be jointly nominated from the same state / area in a particular context. (vi) The candidate must declare any conflict of interest.

HON. JOINT GENERAL SECRETARY (i) should be member of the Association in good standing for the previous five years. (ii) Should have a minimum experience of five years in the specialty of Dermatology, Venereology and/ or Leprosy, after obtaining his / her post-graduate qualification in the specialty. (iii) Should be exclusively engaged in the practice, teaching and/or research in the specialties of Dermatology, Venereology and / or Leprology. (iv) Must have been actively involved in the affairs of the Association in an official capacity either at the Central level or at the Branch / Combined Branch level or a Central Council Member from a Branch for a minimum period of TWO YEARS either continuous or with breaks. (v) Candidate must declare any conflict of interest.

- E. The Electoral Roll will consist of all direct members of the Association and members through a state branch or combined state branch and on whose behalf CFC has been received at the office of the Honorary General Secretary by 31st March of the Association year, and who have no outstanding dues to the Association.
- F. Last year election officer will be the **central national observer** of IADVL. His responsibility will be limited only during vote counting. In case of dispute between election officer and national observer the matter will be referred to the president and arbitration committee for final solution. Report of the arbitration committee will be placed in GBM for endorsement, no discussion on arbitration committee report

will be allowed in GBM

- G. ELECTION OFFICER- He/she shall be one of the past presidents of the association elected for the purpose at the first GBM for the year held during DERMACON. The Election officer may take the help of one (THE CONSTITUTION 2014 149) member of IADVL, co-opted to assist him, for every 200 ballots, up to 8 such members, who must not have proposed or seconded any of the contestants. The Honorary General Secretary and Honorary Treasurer shall assist the election officer whenever required. No honorarium will be paid to such members.
- H. **RETURNING OFFICER**-The Honorary General Secretary shall be the returning officer and the Honorary Treasurer shall be the deputy returning officer for the elections of that particular year. In case Honorary Gen Secretary is incapacitated, the treasurer can take over as Returning officer. I. The Honorary General Secretary shall provide a copy of the electoral roll as specified under clause 28 (ii) of the Constitution to the election officer by the 1st of July of the association year. J. The Honorary General Secretary will invite directly from the members on or before 15th April of each year nominations for the office of President-elect, two Vice-Presidents, one Honorary General Secretary, one Honorary Treasurer (every alternate year) and two Honorary Joint Secretaries with the instructions that the nominations should be received at his office and that a copy of the same should be sent to the election officer on or before 15th June of the year and that nominations received after that date will be declared invalid. The Honorary General Secretary and Honorary Treasurer will contest as a team and there should be a single vote for two posts. This must be specifically mentioned in the information sent to the members inviting nominations for the various posts. All nominations shall be duly proposed and duly seconded by members in good standing who have no outstanding dues to the association. The nomination paper must also bear the candidates willingness and signature. Since the tenure of honorary general secretary and honorary general treasurer is for 2 years, election to the said posts will be held every alternate year. THE CONSTITUTION 2014 150
- I. FILING OF NOMINATIONS WITH FEE STRUCTURE: Life members of IADVL who have been nominated for any of the abovementioned posts should pay a prescribed nomination fee and send it along with the completed nomination form with enclosures to Hon. Gen. Secretary through speed post/registered post/email. A duplicate set of nomination papers should be sent to election officer simultaneously. Nomination fee for contesting elections: For President elect post: Rs. 15,000, For Vice president post: Rs. 10,000, Hon. General



Secretary and Treasurer's post Rs. 20, 000/- (Rs 10000/each) and for Hon Joint secretary post: Rs. 5,000. of the nomination fee, 50% fee will be refunded if nomination is withdrawn before the withdrawal date. After that date, no refund will be allowed under any circumstances. If nomination is sent by email then prescribed fee must reach in IADVL account by bank transfer/DD. The honorary general secretary shall send a complete list of nominated members to the election officer and after scrutiny shall send the list of valid nominated candidates to the election officer and shall inform before the same to all the duly proposed and validly nominated members. If upon scrutiny a nomination is found not to confirm to the rules and regulations of laid down in the IADVL elections then the Hon. General Secretary shall inform the Election officer regarding the same. The election officer shall take a decision regarding the matter in consultation with the President. Disputes, if any, regarding the same shall be decided upon by the arbitration committee

- J. WITHDRAWAL- Duly nominated members are permitted to withdraw their proposal for nominations on or before 15th July of the association year. This shall be indicated in the information sent by the honorary general secretary to the nominated member. Non-receipt of a letter of withdrawal by the honorary general THE CONSTITUTION 2014 151 secretary shall be considered as acceptance of the nomination by the member.
- K. BALLOT In case more than candidate is nominated for the President elect, more than one team of candidates is nominated for Honorary general secretary and Honorary treasurer and more than two candidates each are nominated for the posts of Vice-president and Joint General Secretaries, a secret postal ballot and E voting must be undertaken to elect the office bearers concerned
- L. The Honorary General Secretary will invite in the April issue of IADVL NEWS, nominations for the office of President Elect, two Vice-Presidents, Honorary General Secretary and Honorary Treasurer (if applicable), two Honorary Joint Secretaries and the venues for DERMACON and MIDERMACON with the instructions that the nominations should be received at his/her office on or before 15th June of the year and a copy sent to the Election Officer. Nominations received after that date will be declared invalid. The last date for withdrawal of nominations will be 15th July. This shall be indicated in the information sent by the Honorary General Secretary to the nominated member. Non-receipt of a letter of withdrawal from the candidate by the Honorary General Secretary shall be considered as acceptance of the

- nomination by the member. THE CONSTITUTION 2014 40
- M The Honorary General Secretary shall send a list of eligible contestants to the Election Officer and subsequently, after scrutiny, the list of valid voters (both postal and e voters) by 15th September. The Honorary General Secretary shall also inform all the valid contestants by registered post by 10th September.
- N. The Honorary General Secretary and Honorary Treasurer should be nominated from the same state as a team with eligibility of a single vote for two posts. This must be specifically mentioned in the information sent to the members inviting nominations.
- O. The candidates proposed for various offices shall confirm to the requirements laid down under Rule 26.
- P. They shall be duly proposed and seconded by members in good standing who have no outstanding dues to the Association The application should bear the candidates' willingness and signature.
- Q. Candidate should declare, if he/she is associated with any pharma co. /instrument supplier/dealer/ or cosmetic co. or chain of clinics owned by non-dermatologists/ holds positions in other medical societies or associations. This should form part of the application as below: The same should be included in the newsletter/e-group announcement and uploaded along with biodata on IADVL website.

However employees/owners of pharma company / instrument supplier/dealer/ or cosmetic company will be debarred from contesting elections.

- R. The Election Officer or his or her spouse, son or daughter, or any Central Executive member is not eligible for any of the posts for which an election is going to be held for that particular year.
- S. The election officer shall send to every eligible member on the electoral roll a printed ballot paper containing the names of the valid candidates and having the seal of the IADVL, including bar-code with a number instead of the signature of the Election Officer along with a special cover printed with the words "Ballot Paper" and a bigger, stamped envelope bearing the name and address of the Election Officer, and also spaces for the name, membership number and signature of the member who votes, the words underlined being also printed. This will be dispatched in an envelope with the words "IADVL Election Ballot Paper" printed on it as well the designation of the sender (Election Officer), between the 1st and 31st October of the year. Along with ballot paper, biodata of each contesting candidate and details of MIDERMACON and DERMACON venue will be dispatched
- T. No duplicate ballot paper will be issued under any circumstances.
- U. Canvassing- Individual members cannot use IADVL central or branch organs like e-groups, web forums, app etc. for canvassing. They should not seek endorsement by state or zonal branches.

Canvassing by any state branch or branches or by any group of IADVL members individually or collectively for any candidate shall not be permitted. Candidates indulging in such practices will be disqualified for that (THE CONSTITUTION 2014 42) election and also debarred from contesting the election for the next two years. However such candidate will have right to appeal against such judgment which will be examined by arbitration committee of IADVL and judgment will be given within 7 days.

In order to avoid individual appeals by candidates, each one's biodata, not exceeding 200 words, along with his/her photograph, will be printed and circulated along with Ballot paper. However individual can appeal to members in individual capacity .The candidates cannot display posters/

banners during any of the IADVL meetings.

- V. If any data in the bio-data of a contestant printed is proved to be false, that candidate's election will be declared null and void. In that event, the candidate who had secured the next highest number of votes will be declared elected. In case there is no contestant for the post, the election will be carried in the concluding AGBM of the year.
- W. Any candidate breaking the code of conduct will be subject to punishment as below:
 - The matter will be referred to as election officer; this may be done either by the returning officer or by a candidate directly
 - ii) The election officer may take any of below actions if the complaint is found to be valid, and after giving adequate opportunity to the candidate to explain:
 - a) Issue private warning letter if it is a first offence and in the opinion of election officer a minor offence
 - b) Issue a public warning (announcements in e groups) for a second offence or if it is a larger offence
 - c) Disqualify the candidate for a third offence or a second larger offence
 This procedure shall be completed within a period of ten days
 - iii) The disqualified candidate will have the right to appeal to an arbitration committee against the decision of election officer, which shall be constituted by the president as per the provision of the constitution; the committee shall give its decision within one week and that decision will be binding. The candidate or any member on his behalf cannot raise the issue with general members in any of the e groups and should raise this issue or any issue of dispute on through returning officer.
- X. The ballot paper must be returned to reach the election officer in the stamped special cover on or before the Saturday before 5.00 pm immediately preceding counting day. After that date, it will not be valid. No hand deliveries of ballots shall be accepted. Ballots have to be returned singly; no mass collection and posting in one bunch from any district will be accepted.
- Y. ELECTION PROCEDURE (I) POSTAL BALLOT The election officer shall send to every eligible member on the electoral roll who is not registered for e-voting a printed ballot paper (through speed post/registered post) containing the names of the duly nominated members. The ballot paper must have a seal of IADVL with a number and the signature of the election officer along with a special cover printed with the words "ballot paper" and a stamped bigger envelope that



bears the name and address of the election officer, and also the space for name, membership number and signature of the member who votes, the words underlined being also printed. There will be one more paper having brief CV of all contestants. The election circular will be dispatched in an envelope with the words "IADVL Election Ballot Paper" printed on it as well the designation of the sender-election officer between 1st October to 31st October of the year. Ballot papers will not be reposted after Oct 31 at any cost. The voting paper must be returned to reach the election officer in the stamped special cover sent on or before the last Saturday preceding the 3rd. Sunday of December. After that date it will not be valid. No hand deliveries of ballots shall be accepted. THE CONSTITUTION 2014 152 (II) ONLINE VOTING (I) Registrations: The portal will ensure that ONLY life members will be able to participate in the voting. For this exercise to be successful, the data collection will be done. This data comprises of (a) IADVL LM membership number (b) Date of birth, (c) Member name, (d) PAN card number and e-mail id. This data will be used to authenticate and subsequently register a member as an online voter. The member needs to register himself/herself by sending the above details to e.votingiadvl@gmail.com to participate in the E-Voting process. E-voting registration request must be sent by the member through registered email of concerned in IADVL data. The portal will be made available to members for registration. On successful registration, the portal will generate a username and password and will send it to the registered email address of the member. On a parallel track, setup of posts and enrolment of the candidates contesting the elections for each of the posts will be carried out by the administrator of the portal. The portal will close for online registration by end of July of the election year. A list of registered online voters will be available thereafter to the election officer. This way the association will know the exact count and names of members who have registered for the online voting and therefore will not send the ballot paper to these members. Other members who haven't registered will receive a ballot paper and can choose conventional method of casting their vote. (ii) Online Voting Process: The online portal will be opened up for e-voting, at the same time as when postal ballots are being sent to those who have THE CONSTITUTION 2014 153 not registered for e-voting. Every member who has registered for online voting can use his/ her username and password to login to the portal and cast the votes for election of candidates for IADVL. The portal will ensure that every member is able to vote ONLY ONCE . Every online vote is completely confidential, even the admin will not be able to see the voting information Thereafter, no

member will be allowed to vote and the online votes will be sealed.

COUNTING OF VOTES

The voting paper must be returned to reach the election officer in the stamped special cover sent on or before the Saturday preceding the 3rd. Sunday of December. After that date it will not be valid. No hand deliveries of ballots shall be accepted. The counting will be done on 3rd Sunday of December. The ballot papers will be scrutinized and counted Simultaneously, at the time of counting of votes received by ballot paper, the administrator of online voting will unlock the portal and publish the results of e-voting to the election officer. E voting portal be opened in presence of election officer, national observer and at least 1 contestant. The overall results will be finally decided after combining the results of online voting and the ballot paper voting. No member involved in counting process should leave the counting hall before final compilation of result. For the counting of votes specified 5 observers must be mandatorily invited for counting process which includes president/secretary/ past president/past secretary of the state branch where the counting votes is held. THE CONSTITUTION 2014 154. All the contestants and DERMACON bidders will be allowed during counting and they should be asked to stay till the end. Phones are kept in silent mode during counting.

Standardized method for counting of votes- All the envelops will be counted in presence of contestants available at the time of counting and national observer. The envelops will be opened and ballots will be taken out. Count outer and inner envelops separately, count ballots. They will be divided in lots of 200 each and numbered. One lot will be given to one member of the counting team (apprx 8). Before starting the counting a trial run will be carried out. Counting will be done lot wise, one at a time. During counting each contestant will be given a paper sheet to keep individual account . Candidates should not touch ballots; but they are permitted to supervise counting from close. Simultaneously voting tally will be displayed in the blackboard. Once the lot is counted (200x8 = 1600 votes) the left over lots will be distributed and counted. The blanks left in the ballot paper against specific post should also be counted as blank separately by a separate volunteer so that in the end it becomes easier to tally the number of ballots counted .Say total ballots counted are 1000and candidate A for VP gets 550 and candidate B gets 440 and there were 10 blanks. So the grand total comes to 1000 apprising us that all 1000 votes have been counted.

What should be discarded while counting-Votes will be discarded after taking majority consent of contestant present



during counting. However in general ballot paper will be declared invalid:

- 1. If there is any noting on paper
- 2. If it is not signed by the electorate
- 3. Ballot paper not received in time, not posted as per instruction that is not put in envelop
- 4. Not put vote as per instruction i.e. there is only one way of marking and it is "X" against the candidate. However with the consent of election officer, central observer and majority of contestants ballots marked with tick mark may also be accepted, especially in cases of tie up. A cross mark against name (not in the box) may also be accepted with majority consent. However this consent be decided before the counting process begins
- 5. Voting for more than required no. of candidate/s in that section
 - All discarded votes be counted, added up in valid votes and the total of two should match the initial tally of votes received and counted.

To preserve ballots after counting; - Election officer must preserve all votes/documents till declaration and acceptance of result in AGBM. Ballots will be stored in a carton sealed by election officer in presence of national observer and all contestants present during counting. A certificate to this effect will be signed by all .This will be kept in custody of election officer .In case of reexamination it will be reopened in presence of national observer.

State /zone wise analysis of votes- State/zone wise analysis of votes will be done by election officer. This will help in putting special effort in states with poor turnout. However it will not reveal the number of votes polled by the state in individual contestants.

Returned ballots-All returned ballots will be send to the secretary general who will separate those state wise. They will be send to respective state presidents to verify the addresses and make required corrections. Corrected list will be forwarded in 30 days time to the secretary general who will make corrections in the national roster

Z. DECLARATION OF RESULTS- The official declaration should be by the election officer at DERMACON, during the AGBM of year ending. The number of votes polled by various contestants shall be announced and subsequently published in IJDVL and IADVL newsletter. Prior to that the election result should be conveyed to the President, Honorary General Secretary and all the contestants. It should be conveyed to the various state branch secretaries and editor of IJDVL and IDOJ.

- Q. Post/s for which no nomination has been received or remaining unfilled for any reason shall be filled by election on the floor of the first AGBM held at DERMACON.
- A1- MODEL CODE OF CONDUCT OF CANDIDATES INCLUDING STRICT IMPLEMENTATION AND PUNISHMENT FOR VIOLATION OF THE CODE.
- 1. Canvassing by any state branch for any individual candidate or candidates shall not be permitted. 2. Individual members cannot use IADVL central or branch organs including any IADVL e-groups, Web forums etc for canvassing. They should not seek endorsement by state branches. However, one time canvassing is allowed to each contestant in IADVL general group only. THE CONSTITUTION 2014 155 3. In order to avoid individual appeals by those contesting for the post in central IADVL, each nominated contestant's biodata, not exceeding 200 words, along with his/her photograph will be printed in the IADVL News issue 2 in August. Biodata will be available on e voting portal and can be seeen by clicking on name of same. 4. Candidates indulging in malpractices mentioned above will be disqualified for that election and also debarred for next two years. If any data in the biodata of a contestant printed in the IADVL News is proved to be false and incorrect, that candidate's candidature will be declared null and void. In that event the contestant, next in the order of votes secured will be declared elected. In case there, is no contestant for the post, election will be carried in the closing year's AGBM of that year. 5. Any contestant for National executive post or one of his nominees (who must be IADVL Life member) can be present inside the counting hall during counting of votes but shall not interfere with the process of counting at any cost. 6. Any member who has been elected for any post earlier cannot contest again for the same post.
- B1 **ARBITRATION** -1. All disputes arising with regard to election of office bearers or any dispute among the members of the association shall be referred to the arbitration committee to be nominated by the central council and further approved by the general body. The verdict of the arbitration shall be final and binding to all parties. Five immediate past president will constitute the arbitration committee. The arbitration committee for election disputes or any other disputes should be appointed along with election officer during the commencing year's AGBM.
- C1- The election result will be conveyed to the President, Secretary General and all the contestants immediately after the counting by the election officer .The secretary general will declare the election results 4 days after the counting of votes in various e-groups and it will be put in the web site and published in IADVL News.. It should also be conveyed to various state branch secretaries and Editor of IJDVL (after 4 days). In case



of a tie, the result would be decided by the casting vote of the President. During this 4 days period contestants can file objections if any to the election officer with a copy to the president.

- D1- Posts for which no nomination has been received or remain unfilled for any reason shall be filled by election on the floor of the first AGBM held at DERMACON.
- E1- All disputes arising with regard to the election of THE CONSTITUTION 2014 43 office bearers or any dispute among the members of the Association shall be referred to the Arbitration Committee to be nominated by the Central Council and further approved by the General Body. Five Immediate Past Presidents will constitute the Arbitration Committee. Its verdict shall be final and binding on all parties.
- F1- E-voting will be optional and run parallel to the voting by ballot paper. However names of members opting for E voting will be deleted from postal ballot list. Attempt will be made to phase out postal ballots and shift to total e-voting process. A separate member will be designated to conduct the E-voting (under the supervision of election officer). E-portal will be opened by election officer in presence of central observer.
- G1- Contestants will be provided with contact details of eligible voters both Postal and e-voters.

H1-TIME TABLE FOR IADVL ELECTIONS

- APRIL 15: Honorary General Secretary will invite applications for various posts for which election will be held on or before this date.
- 2. JUNE 15: Last date for filing nominations.
- 3. JULY 15: Last date for withdrawal of nominations.
- 4. OCTOBER 1TO OCTOBER 31: Despatch of ballot papers for postal ballots should be done by election officer between these dates. E voting portal shall open on October 1.
- 5. Wednesday immediately preceding 3rd Sunday of December: E-voting portal closes.
- Saturday immediately preceding 3rd Sunday of December: Last THE CONSTITUTION 2014 156 date by which ballot papers should reach Election officer.

In case no complaint is received within 4days then results will be declared in e groups and website etc.

New SOP 4 : MOU for accommodation during congresses OF IADVL

- The event manager will provide copies of all contracts he has signed with all hotels.-. Any change in contract will be immediately reported. This will also show the rack rate of hotel and the rate at which contract has been signed. Generally it should be not exceed rack rate.
- 2 The rates as per the contracts (rent and taxes separately) for each hotel and each category of rooms will be displayed on website. This will be reflected for each hotel separately. It will not be in form of hotel category —Category A -7000-1000, hotel TAJ, CLARKS This practice will not be allowed
- 3. No delegate will be charged anything more than this amount; no service charge would be levied. Service charges @5% will be paid to event manager for the hotel booking done by him apart from event management charges.
- 4. Event manager will give weekly report of delegates who has booked, rate at which rooms were booked, rooms remaining, names, telephone no and emails of delegates who booked the rooms.
- Accommodation committee will do a random check by sending the delegates an email asking them at what rates were the rooms sold to them, along with a copy of the rates agreed for that hotel and room of that category.
- 6. These rates would be applicable to all rooms booked by any



delegate / pharma as allowing different rates for different categories will also not be feasible legally.

- 7. There would be a grievance accommodation email Id on website to which members can reach out for any difficulty.
- 8. This grievance email would be monitored by an IADVL central representative (senior vice president) and organizing secretary conference.
- 9. Any lapse pointed out to the event manager would be addressed within 72 hours and if a delegate has been charged extra, the extra amount would be refunded by the event manager. Compliance report should be send to accommodation committee.

NEW SOP 5: STANDARD OPERATING PROCEDURE FOR DVL WELFARE TRUST



- A trust promoted by IADVL. [A mutual benefit scheme coupled with professional legal protection since October 2011]
- A trust registered at charity commissioner, Vadodara with its head office at vadodara.
- Trust has started it activity since October 2011.
- AIMS are
 - 1. To provide financial assistance to the family of a member of this scheme in the event of his/her death.
 - 2. To inculcate a habit of savings among the members for their mutual benefit.
 - An option to provide comprehensive indemnity cover in the event of litigant situations arising out of alleged professional negligence by the members.
 - 4. To educate the members, including clinic staff, to prevent any litigant situation and to guide them how to deal with it in the event of such a situation.
- Any life member at IADVL irrespective of age is eligible to become a regular member.
- At the time of enrollment member has to submit
 - o Enrollment form.
 - o Xerox copy of LM certificate with IADVL number
 - o Birth date proof
 - o Two passport size photograph
- A. **Admission Fees** The admission fee is onetime, non refundable, non transferable and depending upon the age

at the time of realization of check. The admission fees will be revised by the managing committee periodically. No refund is admissible to any member who wants to discontinue his membership at any time. A discontinued member, if he wants to join the scheme again will be treated as a new member.

- Annual membership fees: Every regular member / beneficiary member of the scheme shall pay Rs.300/- (with increment or Rs.50/- every year, the effective date being 1st April every year) as Annual Membership Fees. In 2005 it is 500/every year. A member may deposit his annual contribution in advance. 4% interest will be given on such deposit.
- Advance fraternity contribution: Every member has to pay initially Rs.1500/- as Advance Fraternity Contribution which will be adjusted as Rs.500/- per death during the year. However the scheme will have the right to ask additional amount of advance if necessary. At the Beginning of next year amount used during the preceding year as fraternity contribution will be collected from the member to make advance Fraternity Contribution Rs.1500/-.The advance Fraternity contribution will remain as security against the contribution payable by the member.

The advance fraternity contribution shall be refunded on termination or the discontinuation of membership or after the period of thirty years for founder regular member for founder regular member, (35 years for other regular members & 40 years for beneficiary members) of after the death whichever is earlier.

No interest is payable to members by this advance fraternity contribution

- Legal fees (optional): Member can avail the benefit of professional indemnity by paying additional legal fees. [However Member has to be a member of DVL welfare Trust.]. The legal fees will be Rs. 1000/-, Rs. 2000/- or Rs. 3000/- depending upon the type of practice & the procedures performed by the member.
- **Deposit (optional** any amount can be deposited with trust as member Deposit on which annual 4% interest will be credited to the member account)
- Beneficiary members: The family members of the regular member of the trust can become the member of trust as beneficiary members. Separate forms need to be filled for each member of a family. Beneficiary member shall not have any right to attend or vote in the general body of the trust and shall not have any right to vote or contest for any post. In case of beneficiary member the application form must be signed by the



beneficiary member along with regular member.

Special Note in Reference to Professional Protection.

- B. All medico legal risk arising out of activities in surgical & diagnostic camps shall be excluded from the perview of the scheme.
- C. The scheme is not responsible for any act of a member for which he/she is not professionally qualified and/or professionally experienced / trained.
- D. Continuous membership of IADVL for the entire period of the coverage by the scheme is Mandatory. [At the time of litigation, the membership must be continued.]
- E. The scheme shall not provide any indemnity cover for any act of a member which is against the law of the land.
- F. The scheme shall provide legal defence in civil/criminal case before the medical councils, consumer grivences redreessal Forums and Courts if opted by deposing legal fees.
- G. The scheme shall provide reasonable expense for bail procedure in case of arrest arising out of professional criminal negligence, if opted by deposing legal fees.
- H. The scheme shall supply the members guidelines for action & specimen literature for maintenance records,
- The scheme shall provide list of address and telephone numbers of the office bearers & panel lawyers selected by the scheme.
- J. In the event of Medico-legal problems the member shall (if opted by deposing legal fees.)
 - 1. Inform the Office Bearers & Counsel of defence of choice from the panel of lawers.
 - 2. Provide medical records exactly describing the evolution of the case & keep a copy in safe custody.
 - 3. Avoid making any oral or written commitment without the specific permission of the scheme.
 - 4. Hand over all the original documents or Xerox copies demanded by the legal counsel & keep extra copies with him
 - (i) If a member so desires he can engage his own defence lawyer at his owncost, which shall not be reimbursed by the scheme,
 - (ii) Such a lawyer shall assist the panel lawyer in his defence in which case the decision of the panel lawyer will be final & binding. OR
 - (iii) Arrange for his independent defence in which case any liabilities of the scheme with regards to the risk & cost arising there of shall stand discharged and shall not be reimbursed.
- Twenty percent extra of the legal fees upto maximums 100% of the legal fees shall be charged to a member per every case

- registered against him/her. The extra amount however shall automatically cease if the case against him/her is dismissed. After five litigation the scheme reserves its right of renewing or not renewing his/her memberships.
- Every member has to contribute annually as below
 - ✓ Annual Membership
 - √ Fraternity Contribution [Rs.500XN, where N=No. of death of members]
 - √ Legal Fees [by those members who opt for professional indemnity]
- Every member of the scheme shall contribute fraternity contribution of Rs.500/- in the event of death of member for 30 years for founder members, 35 years for other regular members & 40 years for beneficiary members from the date of joining the scheme. Out of the above amount, Rs.450/shall be paid to the nominee of the deceased member and Rs.50/- will go towards the social security Corpus Fund.
- The member has to pay his fraternity contribution for 30/35/40 years (as case may be). Thereafter he has not to pay any such contribution and yet he remains a member of the scheme.
- Benefit of social security will start after ONE year of joining the scheme for founder members. For other members the benefit starts after two years of joining the scheme.
- Nominee will get Rs.450 X N where N=No. of members of DVL Welfare trust. In other words, when more IADVL members join this scheme, more will be the fraternity benefit for members' families.
- Professional Indemnity coverage for regular member will start immediately after joining the scheme.
- If any member voluntarily retires as a member, he/she will get refund of only balance amount if, lying in advance fraternity contribution to his/her credit. Such member will not get any refund of his/her Admission Fees, Membership Fees, Legal Fees. No interest is payable on any balance amount to such a member.

Members Disqualification

A. If a member/beneficiary member fails to pay his Annual Contribution in terms of Annual Membership Fees, Fraternity Contribution and legal fees (for regular members only) before due date every year he/she shall be treated as a defaulter and he/she shall pay an extra amount of Rs, 10/for every Rs. 500/- or part thereof, for a delay of every month or part thereof. If the defaulter continues beyond the period of 30 days, then a notice by Registered AD post shall be issued to such a member with a notice fee of Rs. 300/-. And if such a member does not pay the dues within 30 days of the issue of notice, membership shall be terminated, and all



the contribution given to scheme will be forfeited. Afterwards if such a member wishes to join the scheme, he shall have to apply afresh. Financial assistance will not be given in any form for the default period.

- B. If a member furnishes any wrongful information in his / her application form or any time during his term of membership by which he / she claims any wrongful benefit under the scheme, after giving him / her an opportunity of being heard before the Managing Committee, and if his / her explanation is not found satisfactory, the Managing Committee of the Scheme shall have the right to terminate the membership or the member concerned without any benefit. He / She shall not be eligible for any further enrolment in the scheme and all amount paid by him / her will be forfeited.
- C. If any member, at any time, for any reason ceases to be a member of IADVL, his membership of this scheme shall cease automatically. If such member revives his membership of IADVL, within a period of six months, he can get his membership revived on payment of Rs. 1000/- and arrears of demand, if any. If he does not get his membership revived within the stipulated period, he will treated voluntarily a retired member and he will be given such benefits as per clauses 26 of this scheme.
 - Every member shall specify his/her nominee for obtaining benefit under this trust.
 - All registered members will be issued a Certificate as early as possible after their enrolment in the scheme.
 - Duplicate certificate will be issued in case of loss of the original certificate with payment [at present Rs.100/-]
 - The management of Trust is by the managing committee duly elected in the Annual General Body Meeting of the Trust members.

- ✓ The tenure of the trustee shall be of three years.
- ✓ Every year 2/3 trustee shall retire by rotation. The member can be re-elected.
- √ The General body of the DVL Welfare Trust shall appoint the trustees.
- The managing committee members of the DVL Welfare Trust must have completed 10 years of life membership of IADVL.
- Only regular members of the trust can be elected as



managing committee.

- The General Body Meeting shall consist of all the regular members of the DVL Welfare Trust.
- The General body shall ordinarily meet twice in a year out of which one meeting will be held before the General Body Meeting of the DVL Welfare Trust.
- Report of the trust will be submitted the Executive Committee of IADVL.
- Chairman, DVL welfare Trust will be permanent invited member of all IADVL executive committee/Central Council meeting.
- In absence of chairman, vice chairman or Hon. Secretary of the trust will be invited.

· Role of state coordinators

- 1. Promote the scheme at various fora in a state.
- 2. Coordinate the collection of death fund contribution.
- 3. Disburse the cheque to deceased member's nominee.
- 4. Help the members in enrolling to the DVL Welfare Trust.
- 5. Keeps the records of DVL Welfare Trust members of that particular state.
- He will work as a linkage between IADVL member and the Trust.
- No cash will be collected from the member for any type of contribution.

The admission fees will be transferred to capital Reserve Fund. The scheme will utilize the interest of this fund for administrative expenses and for any other purpose deemed suitable for the benefits of the members decided by managing committee (e.g. Permanent Disability Fund, Earning Compensation Fund, Health Checkup Fund, Loyalty Benefit Fund.) Every year some portion of surplus amount will be transferred to Building Fund. (To make provision to have trust office in future.)

- The Annual Membership fees will be transferred to specific pension & Health Fund. The interest of the Fund will be added to the Fund.
- The Advance Fraternity Contribution initially will be Rs.1500/- With each death of the member during the year the Advance Fraternity contribution will increase Rs.500/- from next financial year.

For example:

Scheme started 1/10/2011

Member joined on 2/5/2012 Rs.1500/- as AFC.

Death of One member during October 2014.

Member joining the trust from 1/4/2015 has to pay Rs.2000/- as AFC.

• The advance Fraternity contribution will be transferred to

advance Fraternity Contribution Fund.

- The interest of Advance Fraternity Contribution Fund will be transferred to social security Corpus Fund. After 30/35/40 years member does not have to contribute. At that time the trust will contribute to nominee from this fund on behalf of the members
- A member who has deposited in advance towards annual contributions will get his statement of Account every year in month of May. (See Annexure)
- A separate Bank A/c. shall be opened in any Nationalized Bank in the name of the trust and shall be operated jointly by chairman, Hon. Secretary and Hon. Treasurer (any two will sign) [State Bank of India, Dandibazar, Baroda]
- The managing committee shall approve the accounts submitted by office bearers duly audited by the Chartered Accountant of the Trust.
- Audited Account of the scheme passed by managing committee shall be approved by the members of the trust at the general body meeting.
- If the total disbursement in any year is more than the contribution collected from the member of the scheme, the managing committee shall have right to utilise the capital reserve fund or any other fund for such deficiency. It is absolutely made clear that the various funds of the scheme shall always bear a charge for meeting the obligation under this scheme.
- Annual Recurring Expenditure.
 - √ One employee Rs.3000/- month (Temporary/Part Time)
 - ✓ Website Maintenance
 - √ Auditor Fees
 - √ Stationary & Printing
 - ✓ Postage

Actions to be taken by nominee in case of death of member.

The nominee has to send a request/intination as per Annexure 5 along with the original DVL Welfare Trust member ship certificate and Death Certificate.

Actions to be taken in case of litigation against a member (if opted for legal protection)

- The member has to intimate the office in the format given in Annexure 6.
- Whenever a member gets legal notice for alleged negligency in management of his patient, he has to contact the office with a copy of complaint which he has received.
- Following records must be sent with copy of notice.



New SOP 6 :IADVL QUIZ FOR POST GRADUATES

Aim: Aim of this SOP is to outline detailed procedures and guidelines to be followed in the smooth conduct of postgraduate quiz by IADVL.

All state CUTICONs will conduct Quiz under the supervision of Central body with the help of National coordinator, under the IADVL and sponsoring pharma banner.

Teams will be selected from CUTICONs as per the existing system for participation in national level Quiz. Screening test will be held on the CME day or 1st day of conference, which will be announced well in advance. Pattern of the test will be a written MCQ type.

The top 4 teams will be selected for finals. Quiz master/Quiz masters for DERMACON will be selected by National executive (maximum two quizmasters allowed).

- 1. All state CUTICONs will conduct the Quiz under the supervision of the Central body with the help of the National Coordinator under the IADVL- Pharma Company banner. Each medical college/institution can field one team only comprising of two residents. In the event of a particular state having less than four teams participating, teams from adjoining states to be clubbed. Only one team would be selected for the national preliminary screening test from among the clubbed states.
- 2. Teams selected from various CUTICON quizzes will participate in a screening test at the DERMACON venue and the final four will be selected after the screening.
- 3. The Quiz Master for the CUTICON should be from a different state. Quiz Masters for each state can be decided by the President and Hon. General Secretary with suggestions from the National IADVL Quiz Committee. Volunteers can be invited through the IADVL e-groups. (format of mail inviting applications is attached as annexure I to SOP QUIZ) Criteria for selection will be a good academic background, experience of conducting and participating in quizzes, and interest and commitment to conduct the Quiz. Weightage will be given to people who have been assistant quiz masters earlier. (Format of application is attached as annexure II to SOP QUIZ) Each Quiz master can conduct CUTICON guizzes for a maximum of three times (extended to 5 times in exceptional circumstances) to facilitate grant of chance to conduct the guiz to new guizmasters. Quiz Masters will be free to frame their own questions, which should be short, clear, with a single answer types and noncontroversial. Quiz masters decision will be final.
- 4. Each guizmaster will forward a report to chairman guiz

- committee within 48 hours of conducting the quiz (Proforma for quiz master's report is attached as annexure III to Quiz SOP)
- 5. Every CUTICON Quiz will also have one Assistant Quiz Master selected from that state to assist the Quiz Masters in conducting the Quiz. Assistant Quiz Masters will be provided mementoes by Sponsoring Pharma company and complimentary conference registration to them be provided by respective state CUTICONS . However they will have to make their own travel and accommodation arrangements and bear these expenses. Volunteers for Assistant Quizmasters to be invited on IADVL e groups.
- 6. At the state level, if there are more than four teams there will be a preliminary screening test consisting of 30 MCQs covering all subspecialties (e.g. clinical dermatology, venereology, leprosy, cosmetology, paediatric dermatology, dermatopathology, dermatosurgery, and lasers) and lasting for 30 min. Only single answers would be allowed (no multiple answers), with correct answers carrying 1 mark and wrong answers a -0.5 mark. In case of a tie, another 10 MCQs will be put up between the tied teams. If there is still a tie, the team with the fewest negatives (not including unanswered questions) in the primary MCQ paper will be selected. In the event of a tie, lots will be drawn. The final among the four teams will consist of eight rounds (viz. basic sciences, two clinical dermatology, dermatopathology, STDs including HIV/AIDS, leprosy and tropical dermatology, pediatric dermatology, and cosmetology and dermatosurgery, in that order) and one rapid fire round. Each round would consist of four questions. Questions should be single, and not consist of two parts. The first round will start from Team A, the second from Team B, and so on, while the fifth round will start in reverse order, i.e. from Team D, Team C, etc. A correct answer carries 10 marks, while a correctly answered passed question gets 5 marks. There is no negative marking. The time for a question is 10 sec for the primary team; a secondary team has to answer immediately. In the rapid fire round, each team would be asked up to 10 questions in one minute. A correct answer carries 03 marks. There is no negative marking. In case of a tie, the Quiz Master should be ready with tie breaker questions, three for each team. If there is still a tie, whoever scored the highest in the MCQs will be declared as the winner.
- At the national level, a one hour screening test will be held on the CME day or the first day of the conference; its date will be announced well in advance. The test will consist of



50 MCQs, with correct answers carrying 1 mark and wrong answers a -0.5 mark. In case of a tie, another 10 MCQs or visuals will be put up between the tied teams. If there is still a tie, the team with the fewest negatives (not including unanswered questions) in the primary MCQ paper will be selected. One question of the tie breaker questions can be preassigned as a "tie breaker". In the event of further tie, lots will be drawn.

Once the final four teams are selected, the stage show can be similar to a state level final, with eight rounds and a rapid fire round. If there is a tie, the Quiz Master should be ready with tie breaker questions, three for each team, with no passing. If there is still a tie, whoever has scored higher in the MCQs may be declared the winner. Chairman Quiz committee is empowered to bring changes in the Quiz format for the National Final round to make it more interesting; however standard format will be followed during CUTICON Quizzes to maintain uniformity

7. Financial arrangements:

- a) CUTICON Quiz:
 - (i) Quiz Masters: Quiz masters will make their own travel arrangements and will be reimbursed by the local organizers of the CUTICON and not the IADVL. The organizing secretary of the CUTICON should take care of their accommodation and the local hospitality and reimburse their travel expenditure. IADVL will pay to the local organizers a sum of Rs 25000/ towards stay and travel of the Quizmaster to

- the CUTICON organising committee. Free registration will be provided to QM and AQM by the CUTICON OC.
- (ii) Participants from neighbouring state who proceed from their state to the state hosting the CUTICON Quiz will be paid Rs 10000 each towards cost of their stay and travel.

b) DERMACON Quiz:

- (i) Participants: The IADVL will pay Rs. 15,000 to each participant for the expenses incurred.
- (ii) Quizmaster/Quizmasters: Travel and accommodation of Quizmaster/Quizmasters will be provided for 4 days at DERMACON by local organizers who will be paid a sum of Rs 25000 per quizmaster for this purpose.

NEW SOP 7: INVOLVEMENT OF STATE PRESIDENT IN DERMACON (TO BE ADDED IN DERMACON SOP)

There will be 3 state presidents between bidding and actual conference. The state president will take keen interest in the organization of DERMACON. His main role will be:

- 1. The proposal for bidding the DERMACON has to come through the state with the approval of state AGBM.
- The presentation during valedictory function will be made jointly by the proposed organizing secretary and the state president.
- 3. During venue inspection the state president will also be present.
- 4. DERMACON OC is supposed to keep state EC informed about the progress of the conference preparation .While obtaining a PAN number ,while opening the bank account and while deciding the event manager involve the state EC represented by president and secretary. A progress report will be send 1 year after the allotment (December), then in June and October of the following year.
- 5. It will be the responsibility of state president to ensure that income and expenditure accounts are submitted within 6 months of the conference and this certificate of income and expenditure will be countersigned by the state president who will sign and mention as -I CONCUR

NEW SOP 8: IADVL MEDIA POLICY

- Press conferences will be held by EC during ECM/CCM/ DERMACON/other times as needed and decided by EC. The press conferences will be arranged ordinarily by secretary, or any other EC member authorized by president in the absence of and with the concurrence of secretary
- 2. Above policy will apply to press release/radio talk/TV talk/ telephonic talk with press also
- 3. In case of any other standing committee wishing to release a press note:
 - a) Prior information and permission would be taken from president /EC. The standing committee will inform the topic, newspaper, and content to the media cell chairman, president and secretary.  - b) Care will be taken to stick to official policy on the matter

- d) Member's name with position in IADVL may be quotedpersonal positions in clinics/hospitals are not allowed
- 4. In case of discussions with press:
 - a) The chairman/coordinator will inform media cell chair, secretary and president about the possible discussion with press
 - b) Topic to be discussed will be informed to secretary/ president
 - c) Care will be taken to stick to official policy on the matter as decided by IADVL AGBM/CCM/EC
 - d) IADVL name will be mentioned in all press releases
 - e) Member's name with position in IADVL may be quotedpersonal positions in clinics/hospitals are No pictures of President/ Secretary of any level to be printed in press releases/ advertisements. No self appraisal / glorification by members in such press releases.
 - f) Controversial issues Infections epidemic/ aesthetics/ scams- The state should contact National body on emergency basis before making announcements/ declarations
 - g) Issues related to government policy/MCI/sensitive data which are serious and important need to be deliberated at appropriate levels in standing committee and EC, official stand and policy to be determined before discussion with press
- 5. If there is any misquote, a letter of correction will be sent after discussion with president /secretary to the press
- 6. On important days observed by IADVL like vitiligo awareness day, leprosy day newspaper medial releases, advertisements can be given by IADVL members/city/district /states sticking to guidelines:
 - c) Care will be taken to stick to official policy on the matter as decided by IADVL AGBM/CCM/EC
 - d) IADVL name will be mentioned in all press releases
 - e) Member's name with position in IADVL may be quotedpersonal positions in clinics/hospitals are not allowed
- 7. Media cell is authorized to prepare matters for press releases on different aspects and on important days and circulate to members who can then release it to subject to same guidelines as above

Aims and objectives of the scheme:

- An option to provide comprehensive indemnity cover in the event of litigant situations arising out of alleged professional negligence by the members.

The indemnity coverage will be Rs. 7,00,000 (Rupees seven lakhs) per case and Rs. 15,00,000 (Rupees Fifteen lakhs only) aggregate per year. If member wishes, the indemnity coverage can be doubled by paying double the annual legal fees.

ITATSA Brief Report July 6, 2015.

ITATSA has started multi-level initiatives to combat the problem of topical steroid abuse to help in spreading the message of safe use of steroid creams.

Various members of ITATSA have written more than 20 newspaper articles on the dangers of steroid misuse in most major Indian languages over the last few months. Major newspapers like The Times of India, Ananda Bazar Patrika, Statesman etc. have carried in-depth articles on the dangers of unregulated sales and misuse of topical corticosteroids.

Based on our call to the pharma companies to support us on this issue, OPPI (Organization of Pharmaceutical Producers of India) approached us and offered to help facilitate our meeting with the various authorities in New Delhi. Dr. VK Garg as the chairperson of the Govt. liaison cell of IADVL and one of the advisors of ITATSA also played an important role in facilitating the meetings. President and Hon. Secretary along with the chairperson Dr. Koushik Lahiri and convener Dr. Abir Saraswat had a series of three meetings with Secretary, Department of Pharmaceuticals, Dr. VK Subburaj, Joint Drug Controller General of India, Dr. S Eswara Reddy and the Director General of Health Services, Dr. Jagdish Prasad on April 24, 2015. A detailed presentation was made in front of these officials explaining the nature and magnitude of the menace and our demands were put forth. A comprehensive dossier of all important literature on this subject from India, both in journals and lay press was handed over to all three officials for detailed perusal and action. All three gentlemen gave us a patient hearing and were very supportive of our efforts. They additionally assured us of all help in this regard.

On April 27, 2015, The national co-ordinator of ITATSA Dr. Shyam Verma along with Dr. Somesh Gupta and Dr. Binod Khaitan, convener of the government liaison cell met the DCGI Dr. GK Singh and made a similarly detailed presentation on this issue. He assured us of action from his office and within a few days, a letter was dispatched to all state drug controllers instructing them to take strict action to prevent non-prescription sale of topical corticosteroids under the relevant acts.

Since then the ITATSA state coordinators of four states, viz. Karnataka, Maharashtra, West Bengal and Gujarat, along with state office bearers have met their respective state drug controllers. Detailed dossiers with documentary proof have been given to them to sensitise them on this issue and they have been requested to take action against drug firms advertising and selling potent steroid containing fixed dose combination creams directly to the public.

In addition, various members of ITATSA have held numerous meetings with general practitioners, pediatricians and chemists all over the country educating them about the dangers of misuse of topical corticosteroids. For these, a model set of powerpoint slides has been prepared and made available to all members for ease of preparing presentations. A model press statement / layperson information sheet has also been prepared and sent to all members.

B. VITILIGO DAY Activities

IADVL Maharashtra State report

1. Basic Dermatosurgery workshop:

On 8th april 2015, **A** Basic dermatosurgery workshop (With Hands-on training) was held in K J Somaiya Hospital and Research Centre, Mumbai, Maharashtra.

It was jointly organised by IADVL (Maharashtra branch) & IADVL SIG (Dermatosurgery) (**Presidential project introduced by Dr Venkataram Mysore**) with Mentorship Support by (**ASDS**) American Society for Dermatologic Surgery & **DASIL**(Dermatologists Aesthetic Surgery International League)

It was graced with auspicious presence of Dr. Lawrence M. Field, The doyen of Dermatosurgery Dr. Field guided various practicing dermatologists and resident doctors in dermatology not only from Mumbai but also from all over India through live webcast of the event.

The event began with lectures by stalwarts in dermatosurgery from India. These lectures were on the very basics of dermatosurgery right from the basic preparations including preparing the surgery trolley and simple excision surgery by Dr Behroze Deputy, DR NarendraPatwardhan and Dr Vinay Saraf.

This was followed by lectures on bilevelanesthesia, incision site placement, tangential excisions and suturing techniques by Dr Lawrence Field.

At first, Dr. Field shared his experience about incision site placement. In his words "Whatever you leave behind is your professional signature, so you must make every effort to make it almost invisible." He joyfully formulated the procedure as T-SMAC3 i.e. Think, Scrub, Mark, Anaesthetize, Cut, Close,



and Cover. He explained how to follow wrinkle line and how to continue incision into a natural wrinkle line or anatomic division line; as observer's eyes follow the wrinkle and scar becomes less visible. Through various illustrative photographs he shared glimpses of his vast experience in different dermatosurgical situations and flap techniques.

Dr Field also gave a beautiful presentation over sutures, suture techniques and his philosophies regarding art of suturing. He emphasized that "If one can see suture marks, there

were surgical errors." He then expounded measures to avoid such errors. He advocated to always have precise epidermal approximations as our absolute goal. He suggested that individually placed sutures are superior to vaulted subcuticular running sutures. He also threw some light over suture removal techniques.

Continuing his lecture, he touched all the basics of dermasanding with numerous illustrative pre-op and post-op photographs.

The final topic of the workshop was most appropriately, complications of dermatosurgery by Dr Udare, alerting us about the other side of dermatosurgery

The live workshop including the lectures was webcasted all over India thanks to the efforts by Dr Mysore and our SIG Dermatosurgery coordinator, Dr T. Salim

Another highlight of the event was the hands-on training provided to 20 delegates by the expert faculty, which was much appreciated.

Dr Lawrence field also gave his valuable inputs throughout the live workshop with his valuable tips on every step of the surgeries being transmitted live

 CME on cutaneous adverse drug reactions Organized in joint collaboration of SIG-CADR with IADVL Maharashtra State branch (10th May 2015, Sunday)

Highlights of the CME

Dr Rajesh kumar, Mumbai – Introduction to CADR: A Vignette.

 Highlighted that the diagnosis of ACDRs is both an art and science and to keep a high suspicion index. He discussed the problem of under reporting, mentioned about observing caution in prescribing drugs in high risk patient, using drugs with low reaction potential, keeping in mind the variable latency in different ACDRs, possibility of polysensitivity in the same patient and the fact that same drug can cause different reaction patterns in the same individual at different times.

Dr Uday Khopkar, Mumbai – (The Art and Science of diagnosing CADR)

- Highlighted the algorithm on diagnosis of a drug eruption which includes exposure to a drug, relationship with initiation of drug, relationship with withdrawal of drug and then using methods to confirm by test dosing, drug provocation, patch test, intradermal test, RAST and also skin biopsy
- Elegantly brought out differentiating points between PhotosensitivevsPhotoallergic rash with regard to itching vs burning, dose independent vs dose dependent, Type IV vs Nonallergic etc.

Dr Sushil Pandey, Nagpur- Causality assessment and Pharmacovigilance

- Discussed the standardised causality assessment which takes into account the temporal correlation, biological possibility, dechallenge & rechallenge but pointed out the problems in causality when dealing with polypharmacy
- Discussed various probability and assessment scales including Naranjo and WHO-UMC scales for ascertaining drug causality through case based studies.
- Spoke on chain of centres handling data on pharmacovigilance starting from clinicians, peripheral PV centre, Zonal/ Regional centre, National PV centre Gurgaon, WHO-UPASALA centre, Sweden. The data from there is collected / retrieved by FDA, EMA, DGCI and other regulatory bodies.

Dr M Ramam, New Delhi- Oral provocation and other diagnostic tools in CADR: My experience

- Comprehensively dealt with practical aspects of oral provocation (should better be called supervised drug administration), its goals, methods, concerns amongst dermatologists and therefore its low acceptability and its limitations.
- Mentioned that undertaking provocation test under supervision addresses long termview on how to deal with

drug eruption. The objectives of provocation are to ascertain the cause of reaction, prevent recurrences, help the patient use drugs safely and help physician prescribe safely by generating a list of safe drugs for future use.

Dr Sudeep Das, Kolkata- SJS/TEN: Shifting paradigm in the management.

- Discussed limitation of an ideal treatment due to inherent problems in conducting head to head RCTs and variability in the treatment response in various subgroup of patients treated with different regimens.
- Suggested a modification in SCORTEN and recommended inclusion of parameters like HIV status and other electrolytes.

Dr. Manas Chatterjee, Kolkata– SJS-TEN: Newer insights.

 Presented a comprehensive and updated data on pathogenesis of SJS/TN by explaining the interaction of HLA, drug antigen and T cell receptor and discussed the conceptual change in the understanding of SJS-TEN. Highlighted the role and mechanism of reduction in T regulatory cells in causation of ADRs.

Dr. Lalit Gupta, Udaipur – Interesting and rare CADRs from literature and clinical practice.

- Presented some interesting and rare cases from his personal collection and literature including non pigmenting FDE from pseudoephedrine and ofloxacin, carbamezapine induced pseudolymphoma, hydroxyzine induced baboon syndrome (SDRIFE) minocycline induced autoimmunity syndrome
- In the end he reminded the audience of the Hippocratic admonition "Primum non nocere" (first do no harm to the patient) and be a safe physician.
- Panel discussion SCAR Panelists Dr. Ramam, Dr. Manas, Dr. Sudeep Das, Dr. Rajesh Kumar, Dr SushilPandey and Dr. Lalit Gupta comprehensively covered the topic through the following points:

First session had talk on Buffalo pox and leprosy given by Dr Anil Bhokare and DrChetan Rajput respectively. This was followed by a talk on vitamins and skin DrYashwantTawade, wherein the clinical, histopathological and biochemical aspects were elaborated and correlated.

In next session Dr Zawar showed excellent response of Molluscum to topical cantharidin. A panel discussion on Difficult to treat acne was moderated by Dr Prashant Jadhav with Dr Sushil Tahiliani, Dr Niteen Dhepe, Dr Shital Poojary,

Dr Swapnil shah as panelists. Then DrSwapnil Shah talked on Role of lasers inmelasma and facial hypermelanosis. This was followed by panel discussion on Difficult psoriasis, which was moderated by Dr Prashant Palawade.

Dr Shital Poojary gave a talk onperiorbitalhypermelanosis, where she spoke in detail about the pathogenesis. Last session was by Dr Niteen Dhepe where he discussed noncosmetic indications of lasers.

4. QUARTERLY SCIENTIFIC MEETING OF MAHARASHTRA IADVL (organised by Vidarbha dermatology society) ON "STEROIDS IN DERMATOLOGY": 5th July 2015 atChitnavis Convention Centre, Civil Lines, Nagpur. Dr. Vikrant Saoji, senior consultant dermatologist from Nagpur was the organizing chairperson and Dr. SushilPande was the organizing secretary for this CME. Dr. Vijay Zawar, President



Maharashtra IADVL and Dr. ShitalPoojary, Secretary, Mah. IADVL inaugurated the event along with Dr. ManjiriOke, President, VDS and Dr. ArchanaChoudhari, Secretary, VDS. Scientific program started with the lecture by Dr. Ganesh Dakhale, Professor, department of Pharmacology, Government Medical College, Nagpur who spoke on basic concepts of pharmacology of systemic and topical corticosteroids and its implications in clinical practice. This was followed by a lecture by Dr. ShitalPoojary who spoke on popular "Pulse therapy of CS in Dermatology practice". Dr. SmritiRamteke, Consultant Rheumatologist spoke on "Deflazacort: How it is different" from physician's perspective while Dr. RizwanHaq, noted dermatologist, spoke on the same subject presenting dermatologist's perspective about deflazacort usage in clinical practice. Dr. ShaileshPitale, noted endocrinologist delivered exhaustive lecture on "Managing systemic complication of steroid therapy". His lecture was followed by interactive and interesting panel discussion on various aspects of steroid use in Dermatology. Dr. Atul Salodkar, Senior dermatologist moderated panel discussion in which Dr. Pitale, Dr. Dakhale, Dr. Ramteke, Dr. Sandip Arsad, Dr. Sanjeev Choudhari participated as panelists.

Afternoon scientific session started with interesting and informative lecture by Dr. SangeetaVelaskar, senior dermatologist and national Medical head of Kaya skin clinics Pvt. Ltd. Dr. Velaskar spoke on widely used "Triple combination in melasma: merits and demerits". This was followed by a talk by Dr. Vikrant saoji, senior dermatologist from Nagpur who presented a critical review and his experience of uses of intralesional corticosteroids in dermatology practice. Dr. SushilPande, Asso. Professor of Department of Dermatology of NKP Salve Institute of Medical Sciences and LataMangeshkar Hospital spoke on "Steroid combinations: How rationale are they?" and its place in the management of various skin diseases. Dr. Yogesh Zawar, noted dermatologist from Amaravati presented a concluding lecture on current scenario of "Abuse of steroid creams" by general practitioners and non-dermatologists leading to various cutaneous and systemic side effects. All lectures were widely appreciated by a total of 115 dermatology delegates who attended this CME.

Part B (Vitiligo week activities-maharashtra state)

Vitiligo week: As part of vitiligo week, a vitiligo symposium was arranged in Mumbai with several interactive and educative sessions for patients in different parts of Maharashtra. Pamphlets regarding FAQs about vitiligoin English, Hindi and Marathi were distributed to patients at various hospitals across Maharashtra and posters educating people about different aspects of vitiligo were put up in the hospitals

Details of activities at some of the cities of Maharashtra:

Vitiligo symposium:

As part of observance of World Vilitigo Day on 25th June, IADVL (Maharashtra) with SIG pigmentary disorders held a full day Vitiligo symposium themed '**Understanding Vitiligo and Newer Concepts in management**' on 28th June, 2015 at Sahara star Hotel, Mumbai.

Dr. Somesh Gupta from AIIMS, New Delhi heralded the session on Etiopathogenesis of Vitiligo by highlighting new concepts like Melanocytorrhagy and absence of E-cadherin and its importance in treating this enigmatic disease. He ended the session with a beautiful story of wolves as CTL cells, Treg cells as fence and sheep as melanocytes to emphasize the importance of Tcell mediated immunity in vitiligo.

The clinical evaluation of Vitiligo with use of dermascopy in assessing the stability of individual lesions of vitiligo was favored by Dr. Nirmal B., from CMC, Vellore.

Dr. Deepak Parikh shared his experience of vitiligo in children with role of counseling and diet in vitiligo. He also advised to weigh pro and cons before starting children on oral mini pulse corticosteroids. Psychological concept of vitiligo was dealt in detail by Dr. ChitraNayak, who propagated the 'CHANGE VIEW' acronym for cognitive behavior therapy in vitiligo.

Dr. Raghunath Reddy suggested medical guidance for management of vitiligo and imparted his personal experiences in his indomitable style.

This was followed by role of Phototherapy and a new concept of 'CLOTHES ON PUVA in vitiligo' was introduced by eminent teacher and dermatopathologist, Dr. Uday Khopkar.

Surgical aspects of vitiligo was given in great detail by eminent stalwarts like Dr. Vinay Saraf, Dr. Davinder Parsad and Dr. T Salim, who discussed about various techniques in skin grafting like autologous non-cultured melanocyte – keratinocyte cell suspension, cultured melanocyte grafting, 4 compartment method, substitution of trypsin inhibitor by PBS and concept of non cultured outer root sheath cell suspension in combination to treat various difficult areas of vitiligo with tips and pits. Dr. Munish Paul shared his experience on autologous melanocyte transfer by giving practical troubleshooters on



difficult site vitiligo.

Dr. Nilendu Sharma spoke about the concept of 'Stability' in Vitiligo to conclude that 'Patch is White, Border is Black, rest is Grey in Vitiligo'. The buzz words were 'Combination Therapy with Photoherapy is Most Successful'.

The complications of vitiligo surgery were summarized by Dr. SharadMutalik as 'Modification and Innovations to avoid Complications and achieve good results to learn from ones mistakes and correct them by improved techniques'. In a nut shell, 'See one, Help one and Do one'.

The penultimate talk was a panel discussion which was a summation of the entire symposium. The event was a vast success with 280 delegates attending from all over Maharashtra and outside Maharashtra and were enlightened by legends in the field of Dermatology, with a vast exchange of knowledge amidst humor.

Involvement of the government:

- A memorandum was submitted to the Minister of Health & Family Welfare, Government of Assam exhorting him to take steps to implement the clauses envisioned in the IADVL Vitiligo Mission.
- The Director of Information and Public Relations (DIPR)
 was also approached to arrange for programmes on public
 awareness on vitiligo through mass media and poster
 campaigns.

Press and media coverage: All programmes were **thoroughly covered** by the invited media and press with most of the vernacular and English language newspapers publishing **exhaustive press releases** on June 26.




