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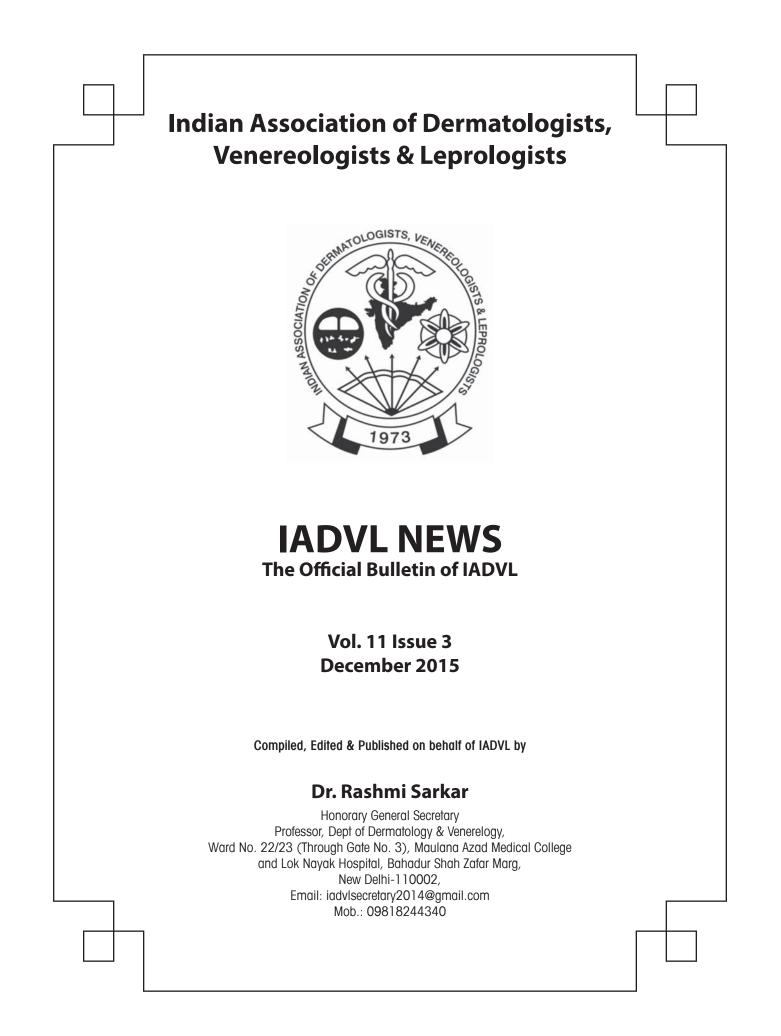

Dear IADVL Members,

This is my last issue of IADVL News Bulletin as Secretary General IADVL (2014-15). Honestly in most parts, it has been a pleasure to serve you all for nearly 2 years and 3 months approximately (as we started 2 months early in 2013 because of ICD-DERMACON and my past president Dr. Deepak Parikh had started working and organising things in advance with me as early as October 2013). It seems difficult to believe that this seemingly unending period is finally coming to an end.

Secretary Speaks

When I took up the mantle, I had few challenges to take up. I was the first women Secretary- General. I live in Delhi where travel on road is difficult in the dark or in the wee hours of the morning because of safety concerns. Secondly, it was challenging as I worked with two of the most industrious and illustrious Presidents of IADVL, who are very hands on at their work so it is perceived that there was no time to smell the roses. I took up these challenges in my own way and decided that I would balance out by completely switching off from my job mentally at home in the evening (we did not work beyond 6.00 PM and I only did midnight shifts after 12.00 PM. when all sleep). With time, both Dr. Parikh and Dr. Venkat and I worked on a mutual rapport, understanding and flexibility. I must add they were both extremely sensitive leaders with respect for feelings of their colleagues.Over the two years, there have been in-depth discussions at any time of the day.

It has been a great learning experience working under Dr. Deepak Parikh (2014) and Dr. Venkat (2015), Presidents IADVL of 2014 and 2015 respectively. I imbibed a lot like a sponge. My treasurer colleague and friend, Dr Somesh Gupta and I did not realize the huge quantum of work that we took up,but Somesh was ever smiling,ever cooperative and my sounding block most of the time. I am thankful for his constant support. The EC of both the years worked together to bring in a lot of financial transparency, working out the leftover accounts of past DERMACONs, worked for paying income tax and to acquire a service tax number, moreover, positions for faculty in conferences and SIG members were invited for the first time by application. Perhaps one program which did not pick up as much as it should, was the IADVL Mentorship Program. This program may have been a little ahead of its time but has great potential for providing soft skill learning resources to our young and middle level dermatologists.

The other part that I thoroughly enjoyed is reaching out to the common member of IADVL, who I may not have met and trying to sort out membership issues. Suddenly, one day, at some conference or the other, he/she would come forward and introduce himself/herself. What worked well for us in IADVL for these last 2 years is a good chemistry with IADVL Academy Chair and Convener, Dr. Manas Chatterjee and Dr. Ameet Valia and the journal editors. Working as a good team brings great dividends.

Secretary Report

Dr Rashmi Sarkar, Hon. Secretary General presented the work done by EC 2015 till date.

She thanked Dr Raghunatha Reddy, Dr Rajesh Buddhadev and Dr Manish Gautam for their progress in IADVL community programs, IADVL E-voting and E- groups respectively.

IADVL office inspections were completed at Delhi, Kolkata and Bengaluru.

IADVL vitiligo day now to be celebrated on $25^{\mbox{\tiny th}}$ June with rest of the world.

Other points noteworthy were the WCD bidding and ILDS meeting at Vancouver and IADVL Academy meeting at Kolkata on 11-12 July.

Treasurer Report presented by Dr Somesh Gupta.

Salient points discussed were

- 12 A status Original file not found at Patna office as yet. Dr Joshi Patodekar said that for 35C the Association needs to have Current A/c and not savings A/c.
- 2. Dr Ramesh Bhatt shared the good news that besides the 3,65,00,000/- already given to IADVL from DERMACON 2015, another 25,00,000/- will be given. Applauded by CCM.
- 3. Online Membership form Karnataka and Bihar to do pilot project. Approved by CCM.

IADVL office – The President stated that all associations of our size have their own HQ office. AGBM has approved the concept of physical office.





Dr Rashmi Sarkar presented the report of all 3 venues as follows:

Kolkata- Small office and shared. Approach difficult and parking problem.

Delhi- Good interiors, spacious but lonely area, not used for 6-7 years by DSB too. No one to supervise and cramped with furniture.

Bengaluru- Good location, bank nearby, 4 societies together and fully functional. Persons available to visit once in a day. Clubs are nearby and accessible to other places. More spacious.

Dr Devesh Mishra said that E- office is better as it belongs to no state and no difficulty of transition as training will be required in physical office.

The President commented that this has been going on and we have faced difficulties due to absence of physical office.

Dr Rishi Parashar from Delhi expressed his unhappiness about the way the DSB office is projected in the report. Dr Sudip Das highlighted that State Bank was just below the office in Kolkata and parking is available in adjacent area.

Dr Amarkant Jha felt that the report looks more like an advocacy of Bengaluru office.

Dr Mukesh Girdhar, President DSB offered office FOC (free of charge) with basic maintenance.

Dr Rajiv Sharma felt that IADVL should have own office and own staff – presently can be rented and later purchased.

Dr Arijit Coondoo expressed concern that next DSB President may not allow to which Dr Girdhar said that Presidents will be from the same branch and decision will be binding. Dr Somesh Gupta suggested that Delhi sign a MOU with IADVL. Dr Umashankar said that IADVL can go ahead with the office if anyone giving Free as Karnataka would not do so. Dr Girdhar further confirmed on behalf of DSB EC that the place can even be sold to IADVL.

Dr Devesh Mishra still felt an independent and neutral office to avoid access to everyone would be better.

Dr Parikh pointed out that the report was not biased and only looked at with benefit of IADVL in mind. He suggested that 2-3 years can be started at DSB office on rental basis and consider later for future. The President also put forth the point that DSB office was not even used by Delhi branch and suggested that DSB members work for the office once given to IADVL. Dr Rishi Parashar suggested that office should be maintained by IADVL EC in all respects. Dr Arijit Condoo suggested IADVL e-office for 2 more years to which the President refused as physical office has to happen.

Dr Rajeev Sharma suggested Video / CC camera monitoring.

Vote of CCM taken with show of hands – Delhi as IADVL Office for 3 years extendable to 5 years. MOU to be signed.

Supervision to be done by EC member. Suggestion by DR HR Jerajani that Dr Rashmi Sarkar supervise even if not in EC. President Dr Venkat suggested that both Dr Somesh Gupta and Dr Rashmi Sarkar should supervise and that DSB should appoint their EC member to coordinate, and get proper electricity, water connection, appoint an office boy and write to IADVL EC. Accepted.

Next issue was

Swatch Twacha, Swasth Tvacha – Posters on Biomedical waste disposal and Healthy Skin prepared and to be sent to all IADVL life members, courtesy J&J with no conflict of Interest.

Dr Anil Abraham, Dr Manjunath Shenoy, Dr Jayanth and Dr Shashikumar - applauded for their efforts. Dr Narsimha Rao suggested we put title in English.

IADVL Chala Gaon ki Ore – Dr Raghunath Reddy gave an overview. The President congratulated IADVL Bihar for their proactive approach in this area. He further said that the State Presidents and Secretaries have been involved and this will be done from Central corpus from Industry. Money sanctioned in GBM is 8 lacs. Dr Subba Rao suggested that giving samples will be useful. Dr Joshi Patodekar said that Pharma can give amount directly as they also have to spend 2% in charitable activities and apply for CSR.

Dr Amarkant Jha said that one camp can cost around 15-20k (including medicines).

Dr Patwardhan pointed out that IADVL Maharashtra had sponsored an educational cycle rally organised by him. This year he plans to have a cycle rally from Kochi to Coimbatore from 12th-19th Jan. Nod from IADVL given to same.

Dr PN Rao suggested you make it central program and allocate funds. Dr Venkat Mysore confirmed that proposed central Corpus is 5 lacs presently. Dr Sanjeev Handa questioned why money is required for Camps. Dr Reddy explained that for continuous program, we need proper system and therefore, funds are required for transportation and medicines etc.

Dr Narendra Kamath highlighted the PSORIA project. Dr Rui Fernandes suggested we have specialised camps involving General Practitioners so that they can also send cases. The President confirmed that it has been taken care of. Passed by CCM with 5 lakhs budget.





IADVL Quiz issue – Dr Reddy thanked GSK for their contribution and this 10^{th} year will see some fanfare and changes. Quiz Committee chair will be Dr Manjunath shenoy. Dr Shenoy said that he has worked with SOP committe and intends to make the quiz more attractive this time.

Dr Reddy pointed out that the contract with GSK ends this year. As regards sponsors for future years – GSK wanted to continue with no additional amount. Meanwhile, Torrent Pharma agreed for 25 lacs. After this, GSK came back and are now willing for 25, 26 and 27 lacs for the next 3 years respectively.

Dr Devesh Mishra felt that he should be given the charge of this project to handle it in his own way as it falls in his tenure as President. He felt it unconstitutional that this EC takes care of his job.

Dr Parikh explained that these are ongoing projects and should be shouldered in continuity by subsequent ECs. They should not get stalled and therefore, projects signed by previous EC have been continued in forthcoming year.

Dr Reddy suggested that Dr Mishra can take up the project and work afresh if he feels, he could get better sponsors.

The President informed the House that this was in full knowledge of Dr Devesh Mishra as it was repeatedly discussed in the EC. It is a matter of principle that 3 presidents work together. If every President starts a new project, it will never be completed in his/ her tenure.

Dr Rajeev Sharma suggested you put it again for a bid and give it to best bidder. Dr Jha felt that Dr Reddy should continue as he has done the ground work and deserves credit for the same. Dr Sudip Das suggested an open bidding.

The President summed the issue and directed Dr Reddy to get better bids and complete the process by GBM keeping Dr Devesh Mishra in loop.

Afternoon Session

IADVL App – Dr Shashi Kumar presented the report.

IOS version to be launched in Sept 2015. Android version active since Feb'14. Till Date, 1167 users. Recent additions - video diary, image diary, Poll/survey and member directory. Adoption and Support - Dr Reddys Labs willing to support. SMS and Email campaign from IADVL. Brochures, guides. Response time is 30 mins- 1hour. Dr Manas pointed out that journal articles cannot be increased in font. President asked the technical team to look into this.

IADVL Residents Program - Dr Ishit Agrawal presented the report.

IADVL mentorship Program - 11 Mentors and mentees.

Archiving Project – Dr Joshipura presented the details. It comprises of maintaining records of last 10 years including Orations, Awards and Accounts. Can be put on APP once its ready.

Future Conferences:

DERMACON 2016- Dr Reena – Total registration – 1669. Rs 22, 54000/- already transferred to IADVL account. Abstract submission and Scientific program presented by Dr CR Srinivas. President mentioned that the accommodation MOU had been reworked to include clauses that room rent should not exceed base price at which rooms were recd, no service charges should be charged.

MID- DERMACON 2016- Bhubhaneshwar- preliminary report presented by Dr Shukanto Mallik. Venue Inspection due in Sept 2015.

DERMACON 2017- Dr Sudip Das presented the progress thus far. Budget (Income – expenditure) presented. The President felt that the expenditure at 15 crores was very high even if status of Kolkata as Metro city kept in mind. Dr Das said that it is so because they are expecting 6000-8000 delegates. It was also felt that the Workshop fees for subjects like Dermatopathology is on higher side. Dr Sudip Das assured that this part will be looked into. Dr Talwar was concerned about the food quality and was assured by Dr Das that it will be of the best quality and variety. President asked Dr Sudeep that MOU with event manager allows a 15% service charge- to which Dr Sudeep said the MOU would be reworked and revised

SARAD 2015- Good progress in last 2 months in terms of registration.

ADC 2016- Report presented by Dr Rashmikant Shah

Practice Management Cell- Report presented by Dr Narendra Patwardhan, Chairman PMC.

Clinic Management Software - Dr Narendra Gokhale, Convenor PMC briefed the house about the recent govt regulations - Govt. Of India directive likely soon that data be preserved in EMR(Electronic Medical Records) software. Hence it is important that our members adopt softwares in practice. PMC has been working on this, evaluated different softwares and come up with its recommendation. He introduced Mr Vikram Lele a software engineer from Pune, who has supplied softwares to psychiatry associations and neurology association. Mr Lele explained the salient features of the program- he mentioned that it is cloud based, that it can be managed and altered by doctor himself and has autointelligence which is unique. He also has ISO 27000 security- the highest ever, which is used by all banks. The





cost was very cheap at Rs 250 per member. Dr Parikh asked whether Rs 250/- per member per year was based on the fact that all 7500 members register and it was confirmed by Dr Gokhale. Also, Dr Parikh wanted to know what would be the rate change if all members are not registering. Mr Lele said that the rate change will not be more as we look at this as an activity for the association. Dr Mysore said that Rs 250 per year is not much as we are now having to pay 40000/- for software individually. Dr Shital Poojary enquired about the registration number for medical college entries-Vikram lele said it can be used and is already being used. Dr Sanjeev Handa enquired about codification ICD 10, Mr lele said that we use it as it is free, others are chargeable. When questioned about importing or exporting data, Mr Lele said that we can import data from other software if they have a clause in their agreement with user. As regards this software, there is an option to exit and transfer data if required. Dr Shashikumar had a guery whether net speed will be affected with increasing data. Mr lele confirmed that it was tried on 40000 patient data and no problem with speed. Regarding queries about hacking and data safety, the President assured that a clause will be inserted for the same in the agreement.

 Dr Gokhale explained that this is the first time we are having an activity for our members in private practice and we should not have a limited outlook towards it. This is the future as soon Government will send directives regarding clinical practice. He further stressed that PMC members will further put in data about skin diseases, to make it easier for members. Members also raised issues of confidentiality-he said the system if ISO 27000 certified.

Dr Mysore said that we need to see it as an useful tool for our members and sought the opinion of the House whether we need to get it sponsored by pharma or should be given as a membership benefit from IADVL to its members. Members opined that this should be funded by IADVL

The House passed the Clinic Management software resolution unanimously and should be sponsored by IADVL for all members.

IJDVL Report- presented by IJDVL Editor, Dr Ramam.

He said that measures are being tried to reach the journal to each and every member as it is his/ her basic right as IADVL member. IJDVL meeting with all Jury, Editors and publishers was held on 26th July at Hyderabad. Future trends would be professional editorial support, shared editorial responsibility, maybe Co- editors. Try to have the journal as Open Access without author fees. Dr Ramesh Bhat asked whether we can have monthly instead of bi-monthly issues. Dr Ramam said that it might increase the load and expense.

IDOJ Report- presented by IDOJ Editor, Dr Shyam Verma.

Total 535 submissions last year. He shared good news that IDOJ indexed on Pubmed now. He appealed to members to come out with ideas to increase number of reviewers. He also felt that new authors should be encouraged. He also mentioned that new MOU had been signed and cost reduced after negotiation from rs 900 to 800 per page and thanked the president for the guidance

IADVL Academy Report- presented by Academy Chair, Dr Manas Chaterjee.

He spoke about the IADVL Acadermia Newsletter. He added that it was available online to see the activities of Academy and SIGs.

He touched upon important issues like IADVL Digital lecture series and books ready for release by DERMACON 2016. These include two atlases and one on recent advances. The Project Directors of the Atlases would be Dr Venkataram Mysore and for the recent advances will be Dr Dipak Parikh.

He further went on to highlight the activities of SIGs which included SIG Psoriasis planning a Psoriasis registry and a request for separate SIG for Aesthetics.

Modification in SOP for SIG events - Any loss in SIG activity in State should be borne by State branch and IADVL centre equally.

A proposal for an E-stall for Pharma companies is proposed by the Academy during Webinars and Online lecture series.

Dr Manas informed the House that 3 out of 4 International Dermatopathology fellowships accepted. He also highlighted about the Travel grants for International conferences. New applications have been received for Fellowship Training Centres. These will be assessed by an Academy member visiting the Centres. Also, there is a certain change in terminology from Fellowship to Observership (for training fellowships of smaller duration) as certain candidates complained that they were not allowed Hands-on training in some Centres.

He also highlighted about the 10 Dermatosurgery workshops with grant from Torrent Pharma at Rs 2 lakhs per workshop. He also spoke about the IADVL Academy project- Study on Stability of Vitiligo, protocol prepared by Dr Sandipan Dhar and approval received from Dr Nilendu Sarma to include it as a part of his existing study. He informed the House that patient education material for various diseases was also under way, thanks to Dr Vishalakshi V. Dr Narendra Kamath felt that IADVL logo should be in invites and backdrop of all SIG events.





Change of Designation in Academy to Ex-officio. Immediate Past President, President Elect and Treasurer to be included in Academy. Also he asked for the Immediate Past President to be involved in the process of selecting SIG members.

SOP Committee Report- Presented by Dr Talwar

Regarding the elections for post of Vice President and Joint secretary for EC 2016, Dr Talwar proposed elections on floor of House with new regulations as these were not specified in Constitution. Dr VK Sharma asked about the possibility of E-voting but the President felt it will be too expensive. SOP on elections were passed by CCM

SOPs for Presidential Candidates – Appeal on E- groups and APP – directly or indirectly will not be allowed. SOPs on presidential address to CCM and on E groups were passed by CCM without amendments

Presidential Candidate Address in CCM – Details have been sent to all Candidates.

ITATSA Report – Presented by Dr Abir Saraswat. Dr Koushik Lahiri could not attend the CCM due to his mother's ill health.

- Official programs Treat Your Skin Right (TYSR), lobbying various regulatory agencies and compiling information and Data.
- TYSR video will be out in Hindi as well shortly
- Mass Media Campaign Identifying adverts of steroid creams masquerading as fairness creams
- PPTs for GPs Triple combo creams for fungal infections or steroid creams on face for fairness
- Model Press release for Media use.
- Paper written to BMJ about topical steroid abuse in India
- Efforts of Dr Kiran Nabar, Dr Yogesh Zawar, Dr Rajetha Damisetty and Dr Akun lauded.
- UB Fair cream from Torque pharma Action taken and banned

Dr VK Sharma said this is a great effort and it should be in all States. Dr Girdhar felt lectures should be given by all members in all forums.

Media Cell – Chairman – Dr Anil Abraham, Convenor – Dr Rajib Gogoi

Budget proposal presented for expenses on PR activities. Dr Anil Abraham pointed out the need of promoting IADVL as a brand. An amount of 6 lacs (50,000 per month for a year) was proposed as PR agency charges which would encompass journalist interviews with IADVL spokespersons and presence in health shows on television. The President felt that Rs 6 lacs annually would not cover everything. Dr Anil assured that it will be cleared with the PR agency regarding this part. At the same time, he said that for media, an organisation is more important than individuals and therefore will do at a lower cost for IADVL. He asked the Media Cell to clarify what is included in this amount. If insufficient, take few more quotations and increase visibility for IADVL. Dr Anil Abraham thanked the House for agreeing in principle to the proposal. House approved the amount of 6 lacs after above clarifications and asked for a detailed MOU to be signed with the PR agency.

Dr Rajib Gogoi asked for the other budget proposals which included Rs 2 lakhs for 3 videos to be prepared for promoting IADVL and Rs 20000/- for facebook page maintenance. The President said that we are already working on videos through pharma companies and we may not need more videos presently. Regarding charges for Facebook page maintenance, the President instructed the Media Cell members to increase their presence on FB and then ask for further budget. The CCM applauded the efforts of the Media Cell.

The minutes of the EC meeting held in April 2015 at New Delhi were presented by Dr Rashmi Sarkar – Passed by CCM.

Dr Sacchidanand received a standing owation for his efforts as the Editor- IADVL textbook of Dermatology.

Dr Sarkar sought the permission of the House for extending the deadlines for Orations and Awards – Approval given.

Goa branch of IADVL – Dr Rashmi Sarkar announced that more than 25 Dermatologists (LMs) of Goa have submitted a written proposal for a separate branch of IADVL – Passed by CCM to be approved in AGM.

DVL Trust – Dr Chetan Patel presented the report. 211 members only as of now. The President requested the CC members to propose strategies to increase membership.

- 1. Leaders to join first
- 2. State Co-ordinators to be more pro-active
- 3. Use senior leaders name and message –" I have joined DVL Trust, have you"

DVL co-ordinator from EC will be Dr Rajesh Buddhadev.

Dr Rajib Gogoi said that Insurance schemes need to be sold. Dr Manjunath R felt that CMEs for selling the Conference should be held. Dr Parikh suggested that slots for DVL trust propaganda should be allotted in DERMACONs and CUTICONs. Dr Narendra Kamath added that it can be part of PMC programs too. Having a webcast can also be thought of as a strategy. Regarding advertisement in IJDVL, President assured that he will write to Editor.

WCD bidding – Dr S. Sacchidanand informed the House about the outcome at the WCD bid at Canada, He suggested that





presently, it would be good if we do not bid any further. The House also felt the same and it was decided that no further bids for WCD presently. CCM thanked Dr Sacchidanand and the bidding team for their efforts

International Liason Cell

Dr VK Sharma asked the opinion of the House regarding International speakers – sponsored by pharma or directly from IADVL. It was felt that we should directly pay to speakers. It was suggested that we invite 4-5 visiting scholars every year to DERMACON from other countries and offer them budget accommodation.

We should include more fellowships and exchange programs to make IADVL presence felt globally. IADVL media cell should take steps to promote IADVL in EADV and AAD. We should have scholarships in various states with a budget of 5lacs.

Budget of 10 lacs each for DERMACON passed for 2 years (Coimbatore and Kolkata) – Passed by CCM. For ADC, we will take it up tomorrow with Dr Joshipura.

EC Meeting Decision- Dr Talwar wanted to know whether the contribution will go to IADVL or DERMACON. Dr Venkat said it will be to IADVL (for Educational grants which are already going on). Dr Talwar and Dr Reddy felt that the DERMACON OC might object to this. Dr Venkat clarified that this is just giving a title and recognition to the activity which we already are doing. Dr Joshipura felt that this is good to formalize the Industry contribution. PASSED BY EC, Referred to CC.

CC Discussion- Dr Ameet Valia – how company is selected and if they do not participate after 1 year, what to do.

Dr Venkat- Recognition of pharma contribution and they have different heads for conference and other activities.

Dr CRS- They might not participate in DERMACON or state conference.

Dr Venkat- Different heads of different activities and recognition of contribution. We can reduce the cost for Diamond, Gold levels. Dr Parikh commented that we are targeting MNCs in India. The President informed that different budgets are reserved for CSR activities in Pharma.

Dr Shyamanta commented that privileges should be according to their contribution. – accepted

Dr Jha said we should have 1 company in each category. Dr Parikh added that we can have two in each if we do not have higher level contribution. Dr Jerajani asked for grants for bigger proposals for Medical colleges. The President assured her the same. Dr Valia had a query whether it was advertorial or advertisement. President said that it will only have company name and logo and nothing more.

Dr CR Srinivas felt that we can outsource for research and money should be given only when it is clear how it will be





spent. Dr Rajeev Sharma felt that 30% should be in FD and rest utilised in activities. He also added that we should have good relations with Pharma irrespective of who is in the President's Chair. Dr Parikh agreed and said that we should have an independent autonomous body within IADVL.

Dr VK Sharma felt that Pharma will spend for research as it is also necessary for them.

Dr Ameet Valia asked whether scholarships can be increased and training fellowships be started. The President replied in the affirmative.

CCM decision – IADVL to have a structured relationship with Pharma i.e General – DERMACONs and State conferences & Special Corporate Relationship – Diamond, Gold, Silver for National Programs. – Passed

Dr Narsimha Rao felt that a beautiful certificate can be given to member and they can make into plaque. Dr Rohit suggested it could be sponsored with a line at the bottom about the Sponsorship.

Referred to CC as it involves a lot of cost.

The President put forth that IADVL sponsored plaque works out to be expensive, therefore a well designed laminated certificate should work out better. Dr Parikh asserted that the members should get something as a return gesture from IADVL. Dr VK Sharma felt that we should print and give to each member and leave it to them regards lamination. Dr Coondoo said that full form of IADVL should be used. Dr Manjunath Shenoy gave a good suggestion that we should make the plaque and let members buy. Dr Parikh asked what is wrong with other awards. Dr Shyamanta said that it is because it was decided earlier. All awards which are decided before DERMACON can be given on felicitation day.

Proposal: The Media Cell has been in existence for 1 year now. The past and present set of members have tried their best to explore various options available to IADVL to pave its way to the mainstream national and regional media of different forms in order to establish itself as a familiar force to reckon with in issues relevant to IADVL and the speciality of Dermatology, in general, in this country. While various activities have been enthusiastically planned for the days to come and few are already being worked on, members of the Cell have realized the need for a pre-allocated budget for proper planning and execution of the Cell's activities. We are hereby proposing the





following budgetary allocations exclusively for the Media Cell's activities during next IADVL year:

- Expenses on Public Relation activities, as quoted by PR agency, monthly for 1 year @ Rs. 50,000 per month: Rs. 6.0 lakh per annum
- 2. Short Promotional videos of 3-5 min. length which will have to be shot 6 times a year @ Rs. 30,000 per video editing and shooting charges with voice over : total Rs. 2.0 Lakh per annum
- 3. Facebook page maintenance with weekly twice changing artwork and paid promotion of the page : Rs. 20,000 per annum
- Additional artwork to be done in case for material to be put on website etc of IADVL would cost an extra of Rs. 25,000 (in which up to 10 times artwork can be changed)
- 5. Press meets: for at least 3 press meets during the year, one each on the sidelines of DERMACON, MIDDERMACON/CCM and EC meeting, a total amount of Rs. 1.0 Lakh may be earmarked.
- 6. Rs. 1.0 Lakh as travel grant for Media Cell members to attend various meetings of IADVL, Press meets etc.
- Radio broadcasting activity: to be started in all four metro cities initially. Expense of Rs. 5000 per month in 4 zones totalling Rs. 5000 X 4 X 12 = Rs. 2.4 Lakh per annum.
- 8. Additional press meets as a part of observing various days like "Vitiligo Day" etc., paid news/advertisements etc. in various media : Rs. 2.0 Lakh

We are, therefore, proposing a budget of Rs. 15,00,000/- for one IADVL year to cover all foreseeable expenses that may be incurred by the Media Cell during the year. However, the entire exercise being something new, only time will tell if this budget will be sufficient as there remains innumerable options to explore in order to establish IADVL as a strong brand in the media and make IADVL a familiar formidable force to reckon with.

How will it help IADVL?

CCM Decision- House approved the amount of 6 lakhs in principle after clarifications with PR agency about the services offered by them and asked for a detailed MOU to be signed with the PR agency.

Dr Rajib Gogoi asked for the other budget proposals which included Rs 2 lakhs for 3 videos to be prepared for promoting IADVL and Rs 20000/- for facebook page maintenance. The President said that we are already working on videos through pharma companies and we may not need more videos presently. Regarding charges for Facebook page maintenance, the President instructed the Media Cell members to increase their presence on FB and then ask for further budget. The CCM applauded the efforts of the Media Cell

IGNQPP Guidelines 2015

Need for the modification

Improving the current guidelines will bring more logistical transparency. It will also allow opportunity to more aspiring quiz masters and innovations to make the quizzes more exciting.

- To make the quiz program more exciting than the previous versions
- To provide opportunity for aspiring quiz masters, while retaining the skill and experience of previous quiz masters
- To promote young dermatologists in academic activities of IADVL
- To ensure better coordination and logistical arrangements between the organizers, representatives and quizmasters
- To achieve transparency and clarity in the guidelines

Objectives

- To encourage better reading on all aspects of dermatology
- To provide equal opportunity to all participating teams and aspiring quiz masters
- To conduct mentally stimulating quizzes with uniformity and transparency all across India
- To ensure better coordination and logistical arrangements between the organizers, representatives and quizmasters

Guidelines for the quiz committee

- 1. The quiz committee shall comprise of a chairperson, convener, expert advisor and six members.
- 2. They must have adequate experience in conducting quizzes.
- 3. It is the responsibility of the committee to conduct the quiz at various levels, formulate guidelines to improve the quiz program and communicate these with the central committee for approval.
- 4. To place advertisement of the quiz program on the IADVL website and IJDVL to increase awareness among post graduates.
- 5. They are to call for quizmaster applications, screen and select quizmasters and allocate them to state CUTICONs.
- 6. They must communicate with the GSK representatives to ensure that the information about the quiz is disseminated to all colleges across the country, thus ensuring maximum participation and enthusiasm.
- 7. They must facilitate communications between the GSK representatives, local organizers and quizmasters to ensure





smooth conduct of the quiz.

Guidelines for the state level IGNQPP

A. Eligibility criteria for quizmasters

- 1. He/she should have a minimum of 3 years work experience after completing postgraduate studies.
- 2. He/she should not be over the age of 50 years at the time of sending the application.
- 3. He/she should not have conducted more than three state level IGNQPP quizzes in the past. Those who have conducted more than three quizzes in the past may also apply, but their applications will be considered when there are no other suitable applications or at the time of crisis.

B. Eligibility criteria for participants

- 1. The participants must be provisional life members of IADVL or have applied for the same.
- 2. The participants should not have won the final IGNQPP quiz.

C. General guidelines

- 1. The quiz must be preferably conducted at the state CUTICON.
- 2. The organizing committee of the state CUTICON must specifically designate a faculty responsible for smooth conduct and organization of the quiz. The contact details of this local coordinator must be informed to the IADVL quiz committee well in advance. He/she is expected to communicate with the quizmaster and local GSK representatives for logistical support, and assist them during the quiz.
- 3. The quizmaster is to be treated as faculty. The organizers are to provide reasonable accommodation to the quizmaster for the entire duration of the conference and provide complimentary registration. This may be coordinated with the help of GSK representatives. The travelling expenses must be reimbursed by the local organizing committee during the conference. An amount of Rs.30,000will be reimbursed to the organizers by the central secretariat after the conference, upon receipt of the expenditure detailsincurred towards hosting the quizmaster.
- 4. Only one team comprising of two members can participate from a college. They must write their names and full contact details (mobile number, email and postal address) for future communications. They are to write their answers on the same sheet.
- 5. The preliminary round is conducted as a closed-door session in a separate hall, with the time and location specifically mentioned in the scientific schedule.
- 6. If there are less than four teams participating from a particular state, they are to be directed to participate at an

adjoining state CUTICON, and informed well in advance.

- 7. If there are exactly four participating teams, a preliminary round is not necessary and the state finals may be conducted directly.
- 8. The final round must be done in the main hall as a plenary session and allotted 60 minutes. The time and location must be specifically mentioned in the scientific schedule.
- 9. Proper stage arrangements must be handled by the local GSK representatives and the local coordinator.
- 10. The quizmaster will be provided a feedback form which has to be completed and sent to the quiz committee within one week of conducting the quiz. He/she will have to submit a soft copy of the quiz questions for archival purposes. He/ she must also preserve all the answer sheets and forward the contact details of every participant to the quiz committee.

D. Format for the state preliminary round

- 1. Questions will be in MCQ format either in print or powerpoint presentation, and must cover all subspecialties of dermatology, venereology, leprosy, dermatopathology, dermatosurgery, therapeutics, history of dermatology, etc.
- There will be 40 questions in 30 minutes, with every 5th question bearing an asterisk mark (to be used in the event of a tie; the person scoring higher in these questions will qualify)
- 3. The first 30 questions must have a single answer.
- 4. The last 10 questions must have multiple answers (2 to 3 answers). All the multiple answers have to be marked correctly in order to qualify for the points. Every correctly answered question is given 1 point.
- 5. A negative marking system of [-0.25 points] for every incorrectly answered question.
- 6. Questions that are not attempted do not carry negative points.
- 7. In case of a tie in the final score, the team that answered the most `asterisk-marked' questions correctly is considered the winner.
- 8. If there is still a tie, then the team with lesser negative marks is selected. If that is also tied, then the winner is selected by lots.
- 9. The decision of the quizmaster is final. In the event of a controversy, the quizmaster must be able to provide adequate references.

E. Format for the state final round

- 1. The positions of the teams on the stage will be selected by lots.
- 2. There will be eight regular rounds and one rapid fire round.
- 3. The regular rounds will comprise of four questions each. The question must have only one part and a direct answer.





Innovative ways of framing questions are encouraged. The answer to the question must be displayed in the next slide.

- 4. The question must be answered within 10 seconds or passed to the next team. Passed questions must be answered immediately.
- 5. A correct answer to a direct question is given 10 points. A correct answer to a passed question is given 5 points. There are no negative points.
- 6. Structure of the regular rounds:
 - a. Round 1: Basic sciences
 - b. Round 2: Clinical dermatology
 - c. Round 3: Pediatric Dermatology
 - d. Round 4: Leprosy and tropical dermatology
 - e. Round 5: STI and HIV
 - f. Round 6: Dermatopathology
 - g. Round 7: Therapeutics
 - h. Round 8: Dermatosurgery and cosmetic dermatology
- 7. The questions are asked in a clockwise manner for the first four rounds, and in an anticlockwise manner for the next four rounds.
- 8. Round 1 begins from the 1st team, Round 2 from the 2nd team, Round 3 from the 3rd team and Round 4 from the 4th team.
- Round 5 begins from the 4th team, Round 6 from the 3rd team, Round 7 from the 2nd team and Round 8 from the 1st team.
- 10.Structure of the rapid fire round:
 - a. Each team gets ten questions, all of which have to be answered within one minute. These questions do not pass to the other teams.
 - b. A correct answer is given 3 points. So the maximum score can be 30 points. There are no negative points.
 - c. The questions must be framed in such a way that they are short and crisp, with a one-word to two-word answer.
 - d. The structure of questions must be uniform for all teams.
- 11. There will be no separate audience questions. If a question is not answered by any team during the regular rounds, it is passed to the audience. Members of the audience are requested to raise their hands, following which the quizmaster randomly selects a person to answer the question.
- 12. The scores of the teams must be announced periodically at the end of every two rounds.
- 13.If the final score is a tie, the quizmaster must conduct a tiebreaker round consisting of three questions for each team. There are no passes in this round. If the score is still tied, the team with the highest score in the preliminary

rounds is considered as the winner. If that score is also a tie, then the team with lesser negative marks is selected. then the winner is drawn by lots.

14. The decision of the quizmaster is final. In the event of a controversy, the quizmaster must be able to provide adequate references.

Guidelines for the national level IGNQPP

A. Eligibility criteria for quizmasters

- 1. The chairman of the quiz committee in the current year is given the responsibility of conducting the quiz finals at DERMACON.
- 2. The preliminary round of the national level IGNQPP may be conducted by the convener or other members of the quiz committee.

B. Eligibility criteria for participants

1. The winners of each state level IGNQPP of the current year are eligible to participate in the preliminary round of the national level IGNQPP.

C. General guidelines

- 1. The quiz must be conducted at DERMACON.
- 2. The organizing committee of the DERMACON must specifically designate a teaching faculty responsible for smooth conduct and organization of the quiz. The contact details of this local coordinator must be informed to the IADVL quiz committee well in advance. He/she is expected to communicate with the quizmaster and local GSK representatives for logistical support, and assist them during the quiz.
- 3. The quizmasters are to be treated as faculty. The organizers are to provide reasonable accommodation to the quizmaster for the entire duration of the conference and also provide complimentary registration. This may be coordinated with the help of GSK representatives. The travelling expenses must be reimbursed by the local organizing committee during the conference. An amount of up to Rs.60,000(for the preliminary round and final round quizmasters) will be reimbursed to the organizers by the central secretariat after the conference, upon receipt of the expenditure details incurred towards hosting the quizmasters.
- 4. The participants will be provided complimentary registration to attend the national conference. However, they must arrange for travel and accommodation by themselves. An amount of up to Rs.10,000 will be reimbursed to them towards travel and accommodation by the central secretariat after the conference, upon receipt of the expenditure details.
- 5. The preliminary round is conducted as a closed-door





session in a separate hall, with the time and location specifically mentioned in the scientific schedule.

- 6. The final round must be done in the main hall as a plenary session and allotted 90 minutes. The time and location must be specifically mentioned in the scientific schedule.
- 7. Proper stage arrangements must be handled by the local and national GSK representatives with the help of the local coordinator.
- 8. The quizmaster will be provided a feedback form which has to be completed and sent to the quiz committee within one week of conducting the quiz.

D. Format for the preliminary round:

- 1. Questions must be on a powerpoint presentation, and must cover all subspecialties of dermatology, venereology, leprosy, dermatopathology, dermatosurgery, therapeutics, history of dermatology, etc.
- 2. The questions must have a direct answer. They may contain pictures or be asked in an innovative manner. There will be no MCQs. The teams have to write down the answer on the sheet provided. They must also write their names and full contact details (mobile number, email and postal address) for future communications.
- There will be 50 questions to be answered in 60 minutes, with every 5th question bearing an asterisk mark (to be used in the event of a tie)
- 4. Every correctly answered question is given 1 point.
- 5. There is a negative marking system of [-0.25 points] for every incorrectly answered question.
- 6. Questions that are not attempted do not carry negative points.
- In case of a tie in the final score, the team that answered the most `asterisk-marked' questions correctly is considered the winner.
- 8. If there is still a tie, then the team with lesser negative marks is selected. If that is also tied, then the winner is selected by lots.
- 9. The top four teams qualify for the final round.
- 10. The decision of the quizmaster is final. In the event of a controversy, the quizmaster must be able to provide adequate references.

E. Format for the final round:

- 1. The positions of the teams on the stage will be selected by lots.
- There will be nine regular rounds and one rapid fire round 15. The regular rounds will comprise of four questions each. The question must have only one part and a direct answer. Innovative ways of framing questions are encouraged. The answer to the question must be displayed in the next slide.

- 3. The question must be answered within 10 seconds or passed to the next team. Passed questions must be answered immediately.
- 4. A correct answer to a direct question is given 10 points. A correct answer to a passed question is given 5 points. There are no negative points.
- 5. Structure of the regular rounds:
 - a. Round 1: Basic sciences
 - b. Round 2: Clinical dermatology
 - c. Round 3: Pediatric Dermatology
 - d. Round 4: Leprosy and tropical dermatology
 - e. Round 5: STIs and HIV
 - f. Round 6: Dermatopathology
 - g. Round 7: Therapeutics
 - h. Round 8: Dermatosurgery and cosmetic dermatology
 - i. Round 9: Dermatological 'tic tac toe'
- 6. The questions are asked in a clockwise manner for the first four rounds, and in an anticlockwise manner for the next four rounds.
- Round 1 begins from the 1st team, Round 2 from the 2nd team, Round 3 from the 3rd team and Round 4 from the 4th team.
- Round 5 begins from the 4th team, Round 6 from the 3rd team, Round 7 from the 2nd team and Round 8 from the 1st team.
- 9. Round 9 will have 8 questions. It begins from the 1st team for the first four questions, and the order is reversed for the last four questions. The team will have to select a topic amongst 16 squares on a 4x4 grid. A square cannot be selected more than once. The question asked to them will be worth 10 points. If it is answered on a pass, it is worth 5 points. If a team is able to answer a question on a square that completes a line, they get 15 bonus points.
- 10.Structure of the rapid fire round:
 - a. Each team gets ten questions, all of which have to be answered within one minute. These questions do not pass to the other teams.
 - b. A correct answer is given 3 points. So the maximum score can be 30 points. There are no negative points.
 - c. The questions must be framed in such a way that they are short and crisp, with a one-word to two-word answer.
 - d. The structure of questions must be uniform for all teams.
- 11.If a question is not answered by any team during the regular rounds, it is passed to the audience. Members of the audience are requested to raise their hands, following which the quizmaster randomly selects a person to answer the question.





- 12. The scores of the teams must be announced periodically at the end of every two rounds. During this time, there can be a guiz guestion for the audience.
- 13. If the final score is a tie, the quizmaster must conduct a tiebreaker round consisting of three questions for each team. There are no passes in this round. If the score is still tied, the team with the highest score in the preliminary rounds is considered as the winner. If that score is also a tie, then the winner is drawn by lots.
- 14.As a special event, there will be an audience round on the stage while the final scores are being tallied. Four members who answered the most audience questions, or other interested volunteers will be requested to come up on the stage and join the existing teams by lots. There will be four questions, one for each participant. If they answer it directly, they get 10 points. Passed questions are worth 5 points. The help of the post graduate team can be requested, but it will attract a penalty of 3 points. The winner of the audience round will be awarded a special prize.
- 15. The decision of the quizmaster is final. In the event of a controversy, the quizmaster must be able to provide adequate references.

Additional IGNQPP 10th anniversary Promotional activities

- As part of the 10th year celebrations of IGNQPP, it is proposed that a special commemorative logo and jingle be prepared and incorporated into all IGNQPP material. There will be no product branding.
- 2. Commemorative badges for IADVL quiz committee members, participants and GSK Staff who are present during the actual quiz to be worn during the quizzes.
- 3. GSK to print and distribute mailers to all post graduates which will contain information about the quiz and the history of IGNQPP, to help create interest among them. GSK to help handover envelopes branded with aforementioned logos containing a 'hall ticket' to CUTICON quiz participants from each college once their respective HODs select them. Content to be designed by GSK and approved by IADVL and by GSK.
- 4. To give the finals extra glamour, sashes will be given to winners along with the certificates and trophies.
- 5. A quiz question will be circulated on the IADVL Derma App every fortnight, starting from September till December, the answers of which will be provided along with the next question. Members who answer the most questions will be awarded a special prize during the finals at DERMACON.
- 6. A few quiz questions will be prepared and circulated among all postgraduates with the assistance of GSK executives once every month starting from September and ending

in December, to promote enthusiasm towards quizzing. Answers with reference to these questions will also be provided.

- 7. Posters regarding the IGNQPP are to be prepared and displayed by GSK at notice boards of dermatology departments in every medical college with the permission of respective HODs.
- 8. The GSK have proposed to try and get in touch with past quiz winners and quiz masters and request them to share their experiences. This will be used in creating AVs and 'walk of fame' posters (journey of IGNQPP). The questions asked to these past winners/quiz masters will be decided by IADVL and GSK jointly. GSK staff will do the actual interviewing, and also the making of the AV and designing, printing and distribution of other material created such as posters, mailers (in points discussed above), and also make the payments for the creation/printing of AV, posters, mailers after approval by IADVL. The AVs can be shown to post graduates in colleges before inviting participation, before the CUTICON quizzes and the national quiz finals.No payments are to be made for interviewing the past winners and quiz masters.

Only 2 Quiz masters max for National Quiz

Quiz master should not have any age limit. Chairman of Quiz Committee should conduct Quiz Finals in DERMACON – undecided

DERMACON Quiz- participants should be charged at baseline registration charges for DERMACON.

Another point put forth was that if someone has been part of winning team earlier, he/she cannot participate which was not accepted.

Quiz Committee- 35000/- amount to be given to each Quiz master. Dr Seetharam felt that to avoid issues, IADVL should pay directly to Quiz masters. Dr Parikh said that it will be difficult for QM to arrange for accommodation and CUTICON organisers can do it better.

CCM passed the amount for Quiz master upto 35000/-. As regards, who will be the Quiz Master for DERMACON, decision to be taken in GBM. Accomodation issue for QM should be discussed in AGBM. Role of Observer is unclear, therefore proposed that it should be drafted and then presented in GBM.

AWARDS Committee

Dr Ramesh Bhatt (Awards Committee Chairman) said that the new proposal is that Awards to be renewed every 5 years. The awards committee had written to donors asking that they donate funds to renew. Donors not happy as it was not told





earlier.Several donors have asked for revision of the decision

Need to renew awards as interest of earlier amount is not enough to run old awards.

Question to House- Do we go ahead with the process or apply it to new awards.

Dr Joshipura felt it is a sentimental issue and should be dealt softly. Dr Jha said that we continue old awards and new award started with this clause. Dr PN Rao felt that it should be for both. Dr Parikh suggested we put a filter regarding the number of years since started. Dr VK Sharma suggested that Memorial Awards should be looked at differently.

CCM opinion- Old awards will continue as it is. New awards for maximum 10 years and minimum 5 lacs rupees. No award in name of living person henceforth.

Proposal 7 & 8- Passed yesterday

Role of National Observer

Dr VK Sharma said that the National observer is required as the second person in the counting room. The President felt that he might not be needed as the Election Officer is sufficient.

CCM Opinion- Role of National Observer to be defined by Dr Coondoo and will be discussed in AGBM

Valid votes will be the ones received before 5:00 pm on Saturday preceding counting. Votes are invalid if sent in one group.

Standardised method of counting to be followed. Total number of ballots received followed by total number of white envelopes and then total number of ballot papers.

'x' sign only to be accepted and no other sign. Dr Shyamanta felt that 'correct tick mark' could be used. Dr VK Sharma said that 'x' should stay as it cannot be manipulated. Counting process to be started at 9:00 am sharp.

Statewise/ Zonewise analysis of votes- Only outer envelopes to be counted by election officer to decide for low voter turnout in areas.

Ballots need to be preserved after counting just in case any conflict arises.

With all proposals and SOPs discussed, the agenda for the CCM was completed.

The President thanked the CC members for a successful discussion and decisions taken.

Hon. Secretary, Dr Rashmi Sarkar proposed the official Vote of Thanks and the meeting was declared closed.

Brief introduction: The nomination form circulated for election of office bearers of IADVL requires the proposer to sign a declaration that the candidate is not an owner/employee/ advisor/(Specify any other capacity) in the following: pharma/ aesthetic companies/pharma co./instrument supplier/dealer/or cosmetic co.or chain of clinics. To my mind he has no way of ascertaining this information other than the word of the candidate who he is proposing.

The candidate also has to give a similar declaration as above. In addition he also has to declare the various medical societies of which he is an office bearer.

This may lead to uncalled for litigations in times to come as is with the IMA and also introduces discrimination among members which is not fair. After all what is this kind of action trying to achieve.

Proposal: (It should be properly worded/drafted) Application of the candidate should not be invalidated if he is an owner/ employee/advisor/(Specify any other capacity)in the following pharma/aesthetic companies/pharma co./instrument supplier/ dealer/or cosmetic co.or chain of clinics. But should be allowed to contest by declaring conflict of interest. This was also earlier raised by Dr.Venkatram Mysore.

As per this clause nearly three fourth of the members will be barred from filing nomination papers of various office bearer posts. Also this leads to a lot of unnecessary discrimination.

Members are very intelligent and we should let them take their own decision rather than resort to some kind of a diktat

Brief introduction: Provisional life members (PLM) join IADVL through state in which they join post graduation in dermatology and give an address which is temporary in most of the cases. To convert their PLMship to LMship they have to forward their application through the state branch from where they joined to the state branch in which they intend to join. This creates lots of hassles in conversion of PLM to LM because of multiple channels. If the submitted proposal is considered after due discussion and deliberation it is likely to facilitate seamless transfer of PLM to LM.

If constitutional – will it replace existing clause? Or modify? Not applicable

Proposal: (It should be properly worded/draffed)

Let PLM join IADVL through state branch in which they have permanent residence. After study when they go back to their state of permanent residence they can forward their degree certificate through state branch secretary and the membership can be seamlessly converted.

Flip side – Their journal/circular will come to their permanent address but both are accessible online. To maximize PLM to LM conversion an element of compulsion can be added. After 5 years of joining as PLM if membership is not converted, it should be automatically freezed. For eg.- if PLM joining is during the year 1/4/2015 to 31/03/16, the freezing date is 1/4/2021. I suggest PLM number should include freezing date. For eg.- PLM/XXXX/2021 middle 4 digit is PLM number and last 4 digits suggest date of freezing (01/04/2021). As per the terms of agreement signed in 2011 by then President Dr. SDN Gupta, these were the terms regarding termination and renewal.

This agreement shall commence on the commencement date and shall remain in effect for five (5) years (the "Initial Term") subject to the early termination rights set out below. Thereafter, the term of the agreement shall be automatically renewed on the same terms and conditions herein for succeeding one (1) year periods unless either party notifies the other in writing that it does not wish to renew the agreement, such notification to be given at least six (6) months prior to scheduled expiration of the Initial term or each one (1)-year extension thereof.

Royalty amount (10%) of Rs. 3, 07,600 /- of the first edition has been received by IADVL. There have been major changes in the composition and policy decisions in the Wiley India medical team currently. The marketing effort was sustained by the Publisher only for the first two years.

It would be wise to take up a new p ublisher for better royalty, marketing and possibly creation of e- version along with print version of the book.

 - (b) It will oversee the arrangements to bring out a new edition of the textbook periodically at an appropriate time.
 - (c) It will ask the Editor(s) at that time to convene a meeting of the Editorial Board, constituted by the Editors in consultation with the advisory committee, to assign the chapters on the different subjects to the authors, who

will be decided by the board.

- (d) The Editor(s) should obtain a written or e-mail consent by the author to update the chapter or write a new chapter and submit it within a stipulated period. If the author does not do so, the Editor(s) and the advisory committee will cancel the assignment. The Editor(s) with the help of the Editorial Board will assign that chapter to another author following due procedure.
- (e) If any chapter is not found satisfactory, the Editor(s) will inform the advisory committee, which may authorize the Editor(s) to return the chapter and assign it to another author following due procedure.
- (f) Any difference of opinion expressed in the Editorial Board meeting may be resolved by the advisory committee, whose opinion will be binding.
- (g) Any legal matter pertaining to the textbook may be discussed by the Editor(s) with the advisory committee and appropriate action should be decided, if necessary, in consultation with the President, the Executive Committee and the publisher.
- (h) Any dispute or difference with the publisher may be reported by the Editor(s) to the advisory committee, which will help to resolve it by interacting with the publishers.
- (i) The price of the textbook should be decided by the publisher in consultation with the Editor(s). It should be approved by the advisory committee. If thought proper, the advisory committee may seek the help of the National Executive to subsidize the book out of the royalty obtained from the sale of the textbook.
- (j) A new advisory committee will be constituted for a new edition of the textbook by the General Body.

Further, some of the roles mentioned above, are actually the role of the editorial board and hence need modification. Since a number of different text books and other types of books with different content and requirements are being written, editorial committee has an important role as it understands the requirements better. In fact most of the above functions are already in the realm of the editor. In this sense editor is like the editor of a journal and hence there is no role for such an expanded mandate for this committee

IADVL Reports IADVL E-Voting Final Report for the year 2015

Dear IADVL Colleagues,

We had started to popularize e-voting project of IADVL from day-one after the installation of new team at Dermacon-2015 at Mangalore. On 10 February 2015 we had 631 registered e-voters and today we have got 1005 IADVL life members who are registered e voters. (on 20th July 2015)

Friends, we have motivated the e-voting concept amongst our Life Members from day one of DERMACON 2015, by all means: Using IADVL Yahoo groups (General and ACAD), CC group, by Text messages by IADVL App, Personalized SMS campaigns, Using various broadcast messaging and group messaging via WhatsApp and Personalized email campaigns. We highlighted E voting in various Conferences by PPT and guiding our member for the easy e-voter registrations. Doing all efforts with limited time has shown these final results which is remarkably good.

I would like to state here that at closing time of final process of registration (On 20th July 2015), we were having 195 members who could not complete the final process of registration due to lack of time. They all were individually approached during last 3 days time, but either members were not reading the mails or were in need of more time to respond! You can imagine if all of them were able to complete final process of registration, we could have achieved 1200 + members as e-voters! This indicates that we need more time to motivate and mobilise our Life Members. Hope in future we can achieve more.

We started the e voting at exactly 11 am on October 1, 2015. The E voting site http://iadvlelections.net/Login.aspx is working very well with remarkable ease and speed. Till today many e-voters have used it successfully without any hassle. I am sure most e voters will use their voting right successfully in coming days.

Opening of e-voting: 01-10-2015 (Thursday 11 am) Closure of e-voting: 15-12-2015 (Tuesday 5 pm) Counting of e-votes: 20-12-2015 (Sunday)

The difficulties which we faced are:

- Members once registered with the e mail ID which later on was not active and so their mails were bouncing: I request members to register with an e mail id which they use regularly.
- Members were advised to keep their credentials safe and stored, but many members lost their earlier mails: I request all members to save the login credentials in safe place, as it will be required in future elections also. We have made

special arrangements for members who were not able to remember their credentials. The process is as under

If you are registered E-voter and have lost your password please try the following:

- 1. You must have received your password at the time of registration. Please check your mail box for that specific email from iadvlelections@gmail.com
- 2. If you cannot find that email please drop an email to iadvlelections@gmail com from your registered email address. Please mention your LM Number and Date of Birth. We will respond on the next working day with your credentials.
- In spite of repeated reminders from e-voting team, Members were not able to complete the final step of registration process: I request all to read the instructions carefully and follow the steps as written. It is very simple still we had seen many members who couldn't follow the exact steps.
- Members should not change their e mail repeatedly and if they do so, should report quickly to iadvlelectins@gmail. com with their old e mail id and new e mail Id immediately like we do it in our financial transactions! Team E voting is very friendly and are always happy to help everyone, if contacted personally.
- This time I have helped our registered e voters by offering my personal messaging system, and is a huge success and was appreciated by all members.

We like to put on records our sincere thanks to President Dr. Venkataram Mysore, IPP Dr. Deepak Parikh, President Elect Dr Devesh Mishra, Hon secretary General Dr Rashmi Sarkar, Hon. Treasurer Dr Somesh Gupta, My Colleague and Vice President Dr. Raghunatha, and Joint Secretaries Dr. Rohit and Dr Manish, Ex. Vice President Col. Dr Rajesh Verma and all State Presidents and State Secretaries for their guidance and efforts to make this project successful. My special thanks to Dr. Devesh Mishra who in fact was the person, motivated me to take this project. And last I would like to put on records special words of appreciation for the hard work done by E voting team from Agency called Techlore, Pune and Mr. Roopmay Roy who is heading the team.

I strongly and sincerely recommend few things for making E-voting more successful

 Registration time for E voting should be extended to 30th July of Each Year, instead of 20th July. This will not create





any issues as we are not enrolling new life members but we are in fact helping them to become e-voter from the pool of regular postal ballot paper voters.

2. We should target our all Life members and E voting should be made compulsory by 2018 elections. This will save huge amount of money, by avoiding printing and posting postal ballots and the counting process will become easier and very quick also.

To summarize: There is an increase of 59.27% (From 631 to 1005) in E-voters strength in current year and it shows the signs of success of this project of IADVL. Growth of 59.27% is a remarkable growth pattern and indicates its acceptance amongst Life members of IADVL. We wish in coming few years IADVL will have 100% e-voters and will save much more on money, time and environment. This is the need of the hour and will continue to work hard on this project in future also. I urge all remaining voters to register themselves as e-voter in coming

year and make our mission successful. I am fully committed to this project and will continue to work on it if required.

DERMA BASICS – 2015 Post graduate Training program for First year PGs & Prof. J N Shetty Memorial Oration - Father Muller Medical college (FMMC) on August 3rd, 2015

The department of Dermatology in association with IADVL – Karnataka conducted the 3rd PG CDE DERMA BASICS, at Fr. Muller Medical College Mangalore. Resource persons from Father Muller Medical College & other places in Karnataka delivered interesting lectures on the basics in Dermatology. They included Dr. Varadaraj Shenoy, Dr. Narendra Kamath, Dr. Smitha Bhat, Dr. Nanda Kishore B, Dr. Umashankar N, Dr. Vaman Kulkarni, Dr. Sathish Pai, Dr. Manjunath Shenoy, Dr. Ramesh Bhat M, Dr. Gatha Upadya and Dr. Anup Shetty. Around 210 delegates registered for this event and included first and second year post graduates in Dermatology from Karnataka. Dr. Sukumar D was the organizing chairman, Dr. Jacintha Martis was the Scientific committee chairman and Dr. Rochelle Monteiro was the organizing secretary for the event.

Dr. Varadaraj Shenoy, Professor, dept. of Paediatrics, FMMC spoke about Research Methodology, how to go about research projects, the different types of the studies and the one's applicable to Post graduates, the steps involved and the ethical aspects of research. Dr. Narendra Kamath, Consultant Dermatologist talk was on "How to improve your skills in clinical examination". The do's and don'ts, bedside manners in Dermatology and common mistakes to avoid.

The talk on the Art of thesis writing was delivered by Dr. Smitha Bhat, Professor, Dept. of Medicine FMMC. She guided the delegates through the steps in writing a protocol. She stressed on the importance of original research work by the post graduates. Dr. Nanda Kishore B, Professor, Dept. of Dermatology spoke on the clinical examination of Hansen's disease, how to identify and differentiate the types of leprosy and common differential diagnosis. Dr. Umashankar N, Professor & HOD, Dermatology, Rajarajeshwari Medical College, Bangalore, elaborated on Dermatosurgery, how to set up a Dermatosurgery unit, basic methods and the future options in Dermatosurgery. The talk on statistics was delivered by Dr. Vaman Kulkarni, Assoc. Prof. Community Medicine, KMC, Mangalore. He elaborated on the various terminologies in statistics and study designs and methods relevant to thesis writing. Lunch was followed by the talk on topical therapy by Dr. Sathish Pai, HOD, Dermatology KMC

Manipal. He spoke on the various topical formulations, how to choose an effective topical medication for a particular condition and the side effects of topical therapy and precautions to be followed by doctors and patients. Dr. Manjunath Shenoy, HOD, Dermatology Yenepoya Medical College spoke on the approach to STI's, normal external genitalia, common STIs encountered and how to identify each. Dr. Ramesh Bhat, HOD, Dermatology, FMMC, introduced the delegates to Dermatopathology. He showed them how to identify the layers of skin and specific pathology in each layer. Dr. Gatha Upadya, Additional Professor, KMC Mangalore spoke on critical evaluation of a Journal article. She stressed on the fact that Journal articles should be read by all prior to the presentation and after evaluation how one can send your comments as a letter to the editor of that journal.

The session ended with a demonstrative talk on power points by Dr. Anup Shetty, Professor, Microbiology, FMMC. He spoke on the do's and don'ts for an effective PPT. How to add pictures, videos and make your presentation more effective.

The Prof. J N Shetty Memorial oration was delivered by IADVL President Dr Venkataram Mysore, who spoke on the paradox of a dermatopathologist performing hair transplant. He took the audience through his early journey as a dermatologist and how he evolved into a dermatopathologist and later into a hair transplant surgeon. He stressed on the fact that changing according to the times in inevitable and essential, just as the evolution of dermatology from few topical medications to dermatopathology, lasers and cosmetology and other subspecialities at present.

Prof J N Shetty Memorial Oration was conducted during the PG CDE. The program started with a prayer song. The President of IADVL Karnataka Dr Narendra Kamath K welcomed the gathering, Rev. Fr Patrick Rodrigues, Director FMCI delivered the presidential address. The chief guest Dr Venkataram Mysore, National President IADVL delivered a short message which was preceded by lighting of the lamp. Dr. Sukumar D proposed the vote of thanks. Also present were Rev. Fr. Rudolph R D'Sa, Administrator, Father Muller Medical College, Rev. Fr. Roshan Crasta, Administrator Father Muller Hospital, Thumbay. The Prof J N Shetty Memorial oration for 2015 was delivered by the IADVL President Dr. Venkataram Mysore. He spoke on the Paradox of a Dermatopathologists becoming a hair transplant surgeon. The oration was attended by Consultant Dermatologists from Karavali Dermatology Society and





Staff & students from FMMC. The oration was chaired by Dr. Ganesh S Pai and Dr. Raghavendra Rao. Following the oration, the speaker was felicitated by the dignitaries. The event concluded with the institutional anthem.

CME on the theme: "Hansen's Disease and its challenges in the 21st century" - Father Muller Medical college(FMMC) on August 1st, 2015

In commemoration of the Post Centenary, Silver Jubilee Year of St. Joseph Leprosy Hospital at father Muller Medical College, a CME on the theme: "Hansen's Disease and its challenges in the 21st century" was hosted by the department of Dermatology, Venereology & Leprosy, Father Muller Medical college(FMMC) on August 1st, 2015. It was held with the support of Indian Association of Dermatologists, Leprologists & Venereologists (IADVL), Karnataka Branch and Special Interest Group (SIG)- Leprosy IADVL.

The scientific event was well attended by a total of 240 participants across the state and various parts of the country who had pre-registered and with a spot registration of 34 delegates.

The one day CME commenced at 9 AM with a thought provoking talk on "Management of reactions- Key challenges and what is new?" by our guest speaker, Dr Vivek V Pai, Director, Bombay Leprosy Project. He highlighted a step ladder method of determination of risk factors for the development of reactions based on number of lesions and nerve involvement. He presented, erythema nodosum leprosum (ENL) severity scale and forms for clinical assessment of the same. He emphasised on the need to continue oral steroids (prednisolone) in low doses (5 to 20 mg) for atleast 6 to 8 months after achieving clinical control in reactions. He shared his experience with steroid sparing drugs like azathioprine (2 to 2.5mg/kg/ day) and cyclosporine 3 to 5mg/kg/day. He discussed comparative efficacy of various alternative drugs in type1 and type 2 lepra reactions with corticosteroids, clofazimine, cyclosporine being efficacious in type 1 while corticosteroids, thalidomide, clofazimine, azathioprine, methotrexate and monteleukast showing benefit in type2 reactions.

The next talk was delivered by Dr Vanaja P Shetty (Deputy Director, Foundation of Medical Research, Mumbai). It dealt with "Neuropathology of Hansen's Disease: Why is it important?"It was a lucid presentation highlighting histopathology pictures of nerve pathology through the spectrum of leprosy, electron microscopy and use of special stains-Anti BCG to identify nerve damage better. She stressed on the fact that nerve damage in leprosy is often more diffuse than envisaged and regular nerve function assessments clinically as well as with the use of equipments such as, Nc stat & Neuroquick is useful in early diagnosis.

This was followed by inaugural ceremony with a key note address by Dr Derek Lobo, Retired Regional Advisor for Leprosy and other diseases, WHO, South east Asia regional office, New Delhi.He stressed on the statistical errors logistics dealing with false reporting or over reporting of new cases to achieve the national target as reported by earlier surveys.

Post inaugural ceremony, there was a talk by Hand & Microsurgery specialist, Dr Latheesh Latheef. He shared his clinical experience in treating such cases and emphasised on importance of regular cultures and use of appropriate wound care and corrective footwear for the ulcers. He demonstrated the use of pedobarometric evaluations to identify improvement in pressure areas post use of corrective footwear.

The penultimate talk in the morning session was once again by Dr VP Shetty on "Advances in laboratory research in Hansen's disease". She enlightened us about whole genome sequencing, expression & profiling and its use in testing virulence of M leprae and drug resistance.

Ongoing studies are certain new markers such as, Axonal cytoskeleton protein (Po) as a marker for nerve damage, upregulation of Tly A gene in type 1 lepra reactions & use of animal models to study neural pathology are on the horizon.

The last talk in morning session dealt with an important and clinically relevant issues pertaining to relapse in leprosy presented by Dr Nanda Kishore B, Prof & Former HOD, Dept of Dermatology, FMMC. He stressed on regular follow up after completion of MDT as various studies have found a varying time duration ranging from 2 to as long as 9 yrs after completion of treatment and that often relapse can be only neural in nature. Histopathologically, reappearance of granuloma, rise in Bl and newer diagnostic techniques like PCR, FDA-EB staining may aid in the diagnosis.

Post lunch session was a dynamic one with a very interactive panel discussion with the speakers of earlier session with Dr Jerome Pinto, an experienced senior dermatologist as the moderator. The queries of the delegates pertaining to the field of leprosy were addressed by the panelists. The following session was award paper presentation by



the young dermatology post graduate students in two parallel halls. There were paper presentations in case report as well as case study category with a total of 16 presentations. There were some interesting case reports on nasal leproma, unusual presentations in leprosy, case study on HIV and Leprosy co infection, childhood leprosy etc. There was an enthusiastic response to participation in postgraduate quiz conducted by Dr Jyothi Jayaraman, Senior resident, Dept of Dermatology, FMMC on leprosy with 12 teams and final quiz between qualifying four teams, held between 4 to 4:40 pm.

A fruitful and enlightening scientific event was then brought to a close with prize distribution to the awardees and a positive feedback from the delegates.

Report of SARCD-2015

The 9th Conference of South Asian Regional Association of Dermatologists, Venereologists and Leprologists- SARCD 2015 was conducted from 4th to 6th September 2015 at JSS Medical College, Mysuru, Karnataka, India. It was hosted by Indian Association of Dermatologists, Venereologists and Leprologists (IADVL), co-hosted by IADVL Karnataka Branch, Mysore Dermatology Society (MDS) and JSS University. Around 1000 dermatologists from India and other SAARC nations attended the conference, including post graduates from various institutions.

The conference was inaugurated on 4th September by Dr. Sharan Prakash Patil, Honourable Minister for Medical Education, Government of Karnataka. Dr. Jayamini Seneviratne, President SARAD, from Sri Lanka presided over the function and Dr. Venkatram Mysore, President IADVL graced the occasion. Dr. Sacchidanand, Organising Chairman, welcomed the gathering. Representatives from member countries of SARADnamely Bangladesh, Pakistan, Nepal and Sri Lanka spoke on the occasion. The function concluded with the blessings of His Holiness, Jagadguru Sri Shivarathri Deshikendra Mahaswamiji of Suttur Mutt. Vote of thanks was delivered by Dr. Jayadev Betkerur, Organising Secretary of SARCD 2015. 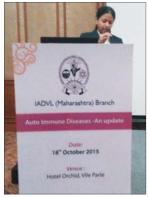

IADVL Scholarships for Attending SARCD-2015 and EADV- 2015

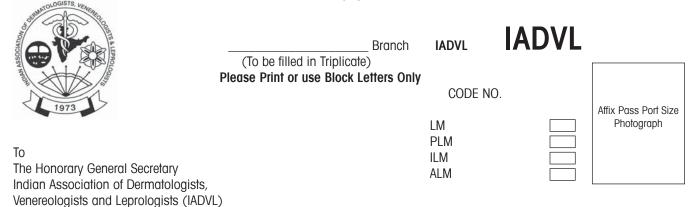
