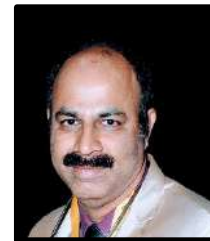

- Log onto www.iadvl.org
- Go to 'Membership' tab on homepage and click on 'Apply for Membership'
- On the new page, drag to the bottom and click on 'View Details & Apply' on the 'PLM TO LM conversion' section
- You will open up a dialogue box stating the documents required. Make sure you have soft copies (in pdf or jpg format) of all the documents ready. Click Apply.
- On the first page, enter your details – Name, E-mail, Mobile Number and existing PLM number. Click 'Save and Proceed' . you will receive an OTP on your phone-enter that.
- On the second page, upload your recent photograph. Please choose the State branch you are presently residing/working/practicing in at the top of the page. If the State branch is different from the one your PLM is registered with, you will need a NOC from that branch. Enter your personal details & upload the documents in pdf or jpg format. Click 'Save and Proceed'.
- On the third page, enter your details about Education and practice and click 'Save and Proceed'.
- On the fourth page, review your details and Click 'Submit or Proceed' at the top of the page.
- You will receive an notification by mail with your application id once the same is accepted by the system.

Your application will first be cleared by the concerned State branch Secretary before it reaches the dash board of the Hon. Secretary General for final approval

DERMACON 2020

The 48th National conference of IADVL, Dermacon 2020 was held in PUNE between 30th January - 2nd February 2020 at Laxmi Lawns, under the auspices of Maharashtra branch of IADVL. Dr. Vidyadhar Sardesai, Dr. Dhananjay Damle & Dr. Niteen Dhepe held the position of Organizing Co-chairs and Dr. Vinod Jadhav, Dr. Shekhar Pradhan & Dr. Anil Gosavi were Joint Secretaries.

About 4718 delegates and 1688 co-delegates were registered for this event. Registrations at Pune airport was a unique concept, the first of its kind for any DERMACON which helped 700 delegates & co-delegates to register at their point of entry in host city.

The conference was based on the theme "Tradition to Technology" in a city which has witnessed this transition in all aspects including science and technology. A limited number of well spaced halls were designed keeping in mind utmost delegate comfort. A total of 400 national and 30 international faculty delivered their talks and participated in audience interactive panel discussions. The scientific program had unique features like focussed sessions on acne, hair & pigmentation arranged in a single hall. CME on indoor dermatology was well appreciated by both, post-graduates & private practitioners. There were 15 video workshops which were planned to suit the need of every dermatologist. Multi-entry pass which enabled delegates to attend multiple workshops of their choice was probably first of its kind for a Dermacon. Workshop on tips and tricks, which gave lot of inputs based on the practical experience of the faculty was very well attended and appreciated by the delegates.

A newer concept of behavioural intervention in lifestyle disorders, useful for PCOD & metabolic syndrome patients was introduced in the workshop. Deepa Malik, a Rajiv Gandhi khel Ratna awardee & a paraolympian was the chief guest and guest of honour was Dr Major Gen. Madhuri Kanitkar, a Pediatric Nephrologist. Awareness on misuse of topical steroids was done by pan-India Dermatologist in Pune. A rally to create awareness and resolve mis-conceptions about Leprosy was organized on 30th January 2020 in which Dermatologists from all over the country participated with enthusiasm. For DERMACON 2020, Maharashtra Medical council granted 6 credit points.

The cultural programs were held at the same venue and were very well structured to entertain delegates, co-delegates, young and old alike. "Dermatalent" a novel concept to showcase the talent of pan-India Dermatologists was introduced by shortlisted entries. This effort was well appreciated by one and all.

"Dermfest" a dedicated area for co-delegates and children, where many interesting activities were held throughout the day kept them engaged and cheerful. The atmosphere was thoroughly enjoyed by not just the co-delegates but also by delegates. Cultural parade depicting Maharashtra's culture & DERMA TV were totally new concepts introduced at DERMACON 2020 Pune. A well spaced, aesthetically appealing trade area for sponsors drew a lot of appreciation from industry as well as delegates. The delegates were treated to mouth watering delicacies & theme-cuisines on all days of the conference. Any unutilized food was taken away by "Robin Hood Army", a well known non-profit organization. This food was served by them to the poor and needy individuals. Effectively, Zero food wastage was achieved by TEAM PUNE.

One of the conditions of eligibility for the post of IADVL Joint Secretary is that he/she must have been actively involved in the affairs of the Association in an official capacity either at the Central level or at the Branch / Combined Branch level or a Central Council Member from a Branch for a minimum period of TWO YEARS either continuous or with breaks. In most of the states CC member posts are reserved for seniors or honorary for past national office bearers due to which members who are relatively young may not get a chance to become a CC member. As a result, many young, dynamic and capable members might lose their eligibility to contest for the post of Joint Secretary in IADVL election. For this reason the number of nominations for this prestigious post is declining .Hence a modification of the conditions of eligibility should be considered

(d) Joint Secretary

(i) Should be member of the Association in good standing for the previous five years during which he or she must have no outstanding dues to the Association

(ii) Should have a minimum experience of five years in the specialty of dermatology, venereology and/or leprology after having taken his or her postgraduate qualification in the specialty.

(iii) Should be exclusively engaged in the practice, teaching and/ or research of the specialities of dermatology, venereology and/or leprology.

(iv) Must have been actively involved in the affairs of the Association in an official capacity either at the central level or at the branch/combined branch level or a Central Council Member from a branch for a minimum period of two years either continuously or with a break.

Proposal:

Background: It has already been passed that DMERAOCN INTERNATIONAL WILL BE ORGANIZED ONCE IN 4 YEARS, IN THE YEAR OF WCD. NEXT ONE IS IN 2023. These proposals are made in the light of experience gained during the DERMACON INTERNATIONAL IN BANGALORE . DERMACON INTERNATIONAL needs a venue which suits international travel, hotels, and other requirements. It also needs marketing on social media and the program should time and hall for international sessions. These may require additional organization , expertise and expenditure. Since we are developing DERMACON INTERNATIONAL LIKE EADV AND AAD, additional SOPs are needed

How will it help IADVL? It will lead to better organization of DERMACON INTERNATIONAL smoothly

If constitutional – will it replace existing clause? Or modify? This is not constitutional- this will only be added to SOPs.

Proposal: 1. The election announcement will be named as DERMACON INTERNATIONAL

2. THE VENUE which is proposed for DERMACON INTERNATIONAL SHOULD HAVE PROPER BUILDING AND NOT NEED TOO MANY TENTS. It should befit an international congress. Smaller cities with smaller venues, without international airport, limited number of hotels are not suitable

3. The city should have access for international air travel AND It should have adequate number of five star hotels to cater for international delegates

4. It should have delegate fee in Dollars for international delegates

5. Scientific program should have a hall for international sessions, time for international quiz, international free paper session.

6. International scholarships also need to be awarded to encourage delegates

7. It needs separate social media marketing and a budget is needed for the same by IADVL HQ

8. The bidding team needs to understand these requirements.

9. An international coordinator needs to be appointed by the local organizing team who will work closely with international liaison cell to ensure success. This will be named in the submission of the bid along with org chair, org secy and scientific chair and later approved in the general body

10. Venue inspection team will inspect in the light of above requirements.

These will be implemented in the election for 2023 DERMACON INTERNATIONAL to be held in 2020 . Hence it needs to be approved now.

Dr P N Rao remarked that Conference Reforms committee must be consulted on this to which Dr Venkataram Mysore replied that it will cause further delay as Reforms committee has not done anything so far. Dr Suresh Joshipura agreed with Dr Venkataram that a separate SOP is needed for the same .Dr Mukesh Girdhar opined that a minimum infrastructure is mandatory and that not all should consider bidding.

Proposal was accepted in principle and this has to be forwarded to the SOP Committee to form an SOP

Background: IADVL is one of the fast-growing associations and known for its academic and administrative excellence. Many regional countries like Afghanistan wants to get associated with us and desires to improve Dermatology on their counties, and in fact we received a request on these lines from Afghanistan. Currently, IADVL is accepting or not offering affiliate member society status to other 'country dermatology societies'.

We proposed that IADVL should grant /offer those dermatology societies a 'affiliate members societies status' and encourage them to take part our national conferences, apart from providing them academic and administrative inputs /scholarships.

No financial implication from us and on contrary IADVL can charge for such the affiliation in principle.

Proposal: Request cc to considering initiating/ granting 'IADVL affiliate member status' to 'country dermatology associations' of Asia and Africa or any one else, who approach us. Modalities can be worked out once the proposal is agreed in principle.

3.It should be permitted with a minimum of 15 life members or 75% of the existing IADVL in that particular country

Only one chapter will be allowed per country.

In cases of large countries there can be subchapters with the permission of IADVL.

All necessary legal provisions of that country will need to be fulfilled prior to initiation of the chapter.

4. It can be a working group for Academic purpose or can have Registration if required as per the countries rules and regulations.

5. The mission should be to promote Academic excellence in dermatology amongst the locals and work not only for the professional growth of the fraternity but also collaborate with the local organisations in a way to spread knowledge and brotherhood within the country.

6. There would be no disturbance to the original memberships of IADVL of the overseas members as many of these members work there only temporarily for few years and either return back or change countries. In case a member shifts from one country to another, the existing overseas membership of that chapter will cease. And if the new country have an Overseas branch of IADVL, he or she can take a transfer to the branch through Hon Secretary General after obtaining an NOC from the existing branch.

Non IADVL members will not be part of these chapters.

7. The overseas membership should be separate in addition to the life membership of IADVL and would be country specific and local funds should be managed by the overseas branch .

8. The Overseas members are not eligible to hold any office bearer posts in IADVL (National and state) by virtue of their overseas membership.

9.Overseas Chapter can host CMEs, IADVL events and the official MOU if required has to be followed wherever necessary. Overseas chapters can contribute to IADVL towards Donation/Academic Grant/Sponsorship.

10. IADVL will not be responsible for any local legal problems and financial loss.

11.IADVL may have annual meeting with the overseas Chapters during DERMACON.

Preamble: The International Leprosy Congress (ILC) is held every three years in different parts of the world. The ILC is an opportunity for scientists, researchers, health staff, partners and individuals affected by leprosy to interact, discuss and share experiences in a variety of fields related to leprosy. The 20th ILC was held from 10-13, September 2019 at Manila, Philippines at which there was good representation from IADVL members with many research presentations. The proposal to bid to host the next ILC in 2022 in India was approved at the CC meet – IADVL (August 2019) and it was coupled with the concordance of Indian Association of Leprologists and Central leprosy division, Govt of India. The proposal to hold the next ILC in India was accepted by the International Leprosy Association (ILA). At the concluding ceremony of the congress the symbolic 'Key' to hold the next ILC was handed over to the President of IADVL Dr. P Narasimha Rao at Manila. As India shares more than 60% of the global leprosy burden, there was a great sense of expectation from all regional NGOS and various ILEP organizations in awarding this congress to India and for IADVL to take a lead. It would befitting that IADVL contributes whole heartedly to organize this prestigious congress in our country.

Proposal to GB: We propose that:

1. That IADVL will take a leading role in planning and organizing the 21st ILC in India in 2022; which is to be hosted under aegis of International leprosy association (ILA) with the support of IAL and other major stake holders of leprosy in India.
2. We propose a core coordinating and organising team from IADVL for ILC consisting of – Dr. V M Katoch, Dr. P Narasimha Rao, Dr Bhushan Kumar, Dr. Sunil Dogra, Dr. SujaiSuneetha, Dr Tarun Narang, Dr. Santoshdev Rathod, along with the President and Secretary General of IADVL as ex officio members., to coordinate with ILA and other associations/ organisations, including CLD, Govt of India, for planning for the ILC.
3. An amount of Rs. 10 Lakhs as grants & 40 Lakhs as seed money to be given by IADVL towards the planning of the congress.
4. It is proposed that the ILC 2022 may be held during last quarter of year 2022 at Mahatma Mandir, an international convention centre, Gandhi Nagar, Gujarat, as it was found most suitable. The IADVL Gujarat has extended full support to this proposal.

Dr PN Rao gave an elaborate account on how IADVL bid for ILC at Manila after permission from CC. CFC reported that a modified proposal is needed. Constitution committee opined that IADVL does not allow for grants and seed money for conference not hosted by IADVL. The letter from ILA was read out to its member by Dr Umashanker Nagaraju.

Reply to Constitution committee comments

1. Dr PN Rao stated that the bid is by India and not state. IADVL should take a lead for this important matter, so state proposal is not applicable
2. MoU will be prepared
3. IADVL financial commitment needs will be clarified
4. ILA details still needed
5. To be done in due course
6. Will abide by finance committee

Dr Bhushan Kumar stated that IADVL should welcome for ILC. Dr Suresh Talwar congratulated Dr PN Rao and asked why 10 lakh should not be given as a grant. Dr Arijit Coondo opined that the proposal was not as per constitution as it was not given one month before GB. Dr Umashanker replied it was sent one month back along with other proposals. However, since modified proposal was sent to comments by CFC and as per the recommendation by CFC, it was sent to constitution committee one week back. Dr PN Rao asked for approval for the formation of core committee from GB including President elect to be a part of it. State committee from Gujarat to be formed passed with ayes from Dr Suresh Talwar and seconded by Dr Yogesh Marfatia.

This will include ex officio members President, Secretary and Treasurer. In view of the rules and regulations, cost, etc Dr PN Rao assured that by next CC meet, a concrete proposal will come up. So in principle, it was agreed to have ILC, form a Core committee (Dr VM Katoch, Dr PN Rao, Dr Bhushan Kumar, Dr Sunil Dogra, Dr Sujai Suneetha, Dr Tarung Narang, Dr Santoshdev Rathod, President and Secretary IADVL as ex officio and President Elect). Dr Bhushan Kumar opined that it is necessary to differentiate Core committee from Executive committee.

It was concluded that the AGBM in principle agreed for formation of Core committee, to conduct ILC in association with ILA and others. The third part of the proposal to come up in CC meet August 2020.

Passed in principle. IADVL will support the conference. But this has to be revised as per the comments of Central Finance Committee and Constitution Committee and to resubmit the proposal as a fresh proposal in the CC meeting in August 2020.

The intent of the fund is to provide emotional and financial assistance and a helping hand at a critical time. This will also assure members the support and good wishes of the entire IADVL family. This initiative will

strengthen the bond between the members and IADVL, making our association more popular and purposeful.

Hence the objectives of this initiative will be to provide financial assistance to the deserving members in the case of invalidation or in the event of their suffering any injury or physical disability or unforeseen misfortunes like prolonged sickness leading to premature retirement

Every bonafide IADVL member should be eligible for the fund. The modalities of request for the fund, its allotment and disbursement need to be ascertained. A comprehensive list of disabilities/ ailments eligible for the fund need to be approved by the EC and General Body of IADVL. The list could include serious disabilities like stroke (resulting in paralysis), renal failure (chronic), blindness, amputation of a limb, major organ transplant (renal, hepatic or cardiac), major burns (greater than 50%) and any other medical conditions deemed to result in a permanent/ partial disability. EC should constitute a committee of experts to catalogue all ailments which could be eligible for the fund.

Further this committee should formulate:

1. Requisites in the application form
2. Modalities of disbursement
3. Checks and balances for audit purpose
4. Statutory/ legal/income tax compliance strategies

The recommendation for this fund to the deserving members shall be forwarded through the concerned State Secretary.

The support extended will be in the form of a one-time payment for IADVL members with the defined permanent or partial disability/ ailment. This would range from Rs. 50,000 to Rs. 2,00,000 as per the guidelines set by the expert committee. The processing of the IADVL Benevolent Fund will be reassessed after a year with better understanding of the requirements of our members.

- Number of PG Teachers $300 \times 3 = 900$
- Total number of PG Residents + PG Teachers ($2250+900$) = 3150

Last date for registration as E voter: 31st August

Back ground:

Currently the registration of e voters is stopped well before almost 6 weeks prior to the start of voting. This has no justification. The current rule results in denial of voting rights to eligible life members if they realize close to the date of voting that they are not registered as e voters.

Many members confuse registration as IADVL member online with registration as e voter. This needs to be simplified.

Proposal:

1. Registration as e voter of an eligible life member should be allowed till 48 hours prior to start of voting since it is an online procedure and the e voter list can be constantly updated.

2. Life members who register online at IADVL website should automatically be taken as e voters instead of being asked to register again as e voters. This makes it simpler and does not deny any life member the right to vote.

3. The period of online voting needs to be decreased to 2- 4 weeks instead of current 6 weeks.

4. Start date for online voting may be kept as 15th Nov. – 30th Nov. This is necessary because by convention many conferences take place in the last few weeks of November and December. Delaying the dates of voting gives the candidates a chance to attend these meetings.

Dr. Kiran Godse, President, IADVL presented the following Presidential proposals for the year 2020.

1. IADVL Benevolent fund - to extend solace through financial assistance to our members who undergo the misfortune of being inflicted by serious ailments.
2. IADVL Yuva cell- This shall develop a pool of potential talents of the youth which could be channelized for the betterment of IADVL
3. Personal Accident Fund - The intent of which is to provide a helping hand by offering financial support to members who meet with accidents and become incapacitated
4. Mission Prison - We shall reach out to the underprivileged prisoners by conducting awareness programs and medical camps.
5. Fight the topical steroid misuse - To continue our battle against the misuse of topical steroids with great vigour to tackle this menace
6. President's bulletin - A monthly module for communication with all members regarding various activities of IADVL

Agenda 8: Adoption of the budget for FY 2020-2021

Dr. Shashikumar BM presented the Central Finance Committee (CFC) report. He announced that CFC plans to come with new working policy like conference analysis.

He informed that Rs 32.5 lakhs + Rs 5 lakhs as GST was given from IADVL account for Group accident policy this year. It was recommended by the CFC that the Group Accident Insurance Policy may be continued as a member benefit scheme with a change that it has to be implemented by IADVL directly. CFC recommended to form a committee with insurance experts, CFC members, IADVL auditor and lawyer for the implementation of this scheme and informed that Rs 30 lakhs will be earmarked for this. He suggested that an application for this scheme has to be submitted to the city branch which should be forwarded to the state branch and this should be further submitted to central IADVL.

He announced that Rs 20 lakhs will be earmarked for IADVL Benevolent fund which again will follow the same protocol for submission of application as mentioned for the accident fund. It was proposed to earmark a total of Rs 50 lakhs for both accidental and benevolent funds.

Dr. Arijit Coondoo requested that necessary steps should be taken for speedy disbursement of the fund to help the member at the right time and also raised a concern of forming a huge corpus if it keeps adding up every year. Dr. Ameet Valia wanted to know whether this will overlap with the existing DVL welfare trust scheme. Dr. Shashikumar suggested that a committee has to be formed to look into this matter in depth and Dr. Kiran Godse agreed on this.

Dr. Shashikumar highlighted the GST liability on the membership fees. CFC recommended to hike membership fees by 20% to include 18% GST. Dr. P. Narasimha Rao suggested that the amount for GST can be marked separately. Dr. Ramesh Bhat reminded that other speciality associations are not collecting GST on membership fees except plastic surgery. Dr. Kiran Godse raised the opinion that if the association of Chartered Accountants has included GST in their membership fees we also should be doing it. Dr. Venkataram Mysore supported this view and opined that GST must be included in the membership fees.

Dr. Rakesh SV, Treasurer, presented the budget for the year 2020- 2021.

The salient features of his presentation were:

- The total expected income from membership fees, profit sharing from DERMACON and MID-DERMACON, IADVL text book grants and pharma contributions to quiz and Academy grants was around INR 6,07,30,000.
- The total expenditure expected in the year 2020-21 is INR 6,05,51,640. A ten percent hike in the expenditure was projected in the budget allocation to Academy Expenses, Auditor fees, Lawyer retention fees, ILDS membership, office expenses etc. This year, IADVL media cell, Community Dermatology, and ITASTA were allocated a higher budget than last year. An extra 5 lakhs rupees has been allocated to e-journal Subscription this year.
- In accordance with the Central Finance Committee recommendation, Rupees Twenty lakhs has been allocated to the Presidential project of IADVL Benevolent fund and Rupees Thirty lakhs allocated for Personal Accident Fund, a newer version of last year's Presidential project yet to be envisaged, not involving a third party, for the benefit of all IADVL Life Members.

The proposed budget was passed, proposed by Dr. Shashikumar BM and seconded by Dr. Rajib Gogoi.

Agenda 9: Appointment of auditor for FY 2020-2021

It was decided by the house that the same auditor may be continued. Dr.Umashankar and Dr.K E Mukadam proposed that IADVL will continue with same auditor

Agenda 10: Academy report

Dr Deepika Pandhi , Chairperson Academy , presented the Academy report. Dr. Deepika Pandhi briefed about the proposed activities of Academy for the year 2020. The proposed Academy budget for the year 2020 was also presented.

It was proposed to bifurcate SIG- Lasers and Aesthetics and the bifurcation of erstwhile SIG- Lasers and Aesthetics into SIG- Lasers and SIG- Aesthetics was approved.

In the IADVL Academy observership program meeting, the method of matching and selection of candidates for a program was presented. Feedbacks and suggestions for improvement in the program from fellowship program directors/ fellows present in the meeting were sought. Program directors were felicitated by IADVL EC and Academy chairperson.

Dr.Deepika announced the new SIG Coordinators.

The IADVL Research grant for Rs. 50 lakhs sponsored by Glowderma was approved. It was decided to share the SOPs for SIG activities and the schedule of Academy activities 2020 with the State Presidents and Secretaries.

Possible scopes of sponsorship for CME programs/ other Academy activities were discussed. Academy activities in DERMACON 2020 was shared.

Discussion on Clinical trial liability in association with Bajaj Allianz insurance company took place, where in it was proposed to have coverage of 1 lakh per subject per claim.

Academy proposed to start seven new training centers for IADVL Observership in the coming year. Dr. Deepika informed the house that a total of thirteen applications were received for PG thesis grant. It was put forward that a total of Rs.19,35,000 would be utilized for IADVL Sponsorship. Dermagyan lectures and Omnicurris lectures shall be continued as before. Academy suggested to update Digital Education platform .It was proposed to start modules on various topics, on completion of which the member would be getting a Certificate .For this a monthly subscription of Rs. 25,000 plus GST was proposed and this was approved.

It was informed that communications have been sent to state Presidents and Secretaries for IADVL Resident Program (PGCON) to be held at each 4 zones. Proposals are being received from interested states. They will be collated and sent to IADVL EC for approval of one state per zone to hold PGCON 2020. Communications have also been sent to state Presidents and Secretaries for nominations of 2 representatives in each state for facilitation of access to an assorted bouquet of journals published by Wiley and Sons.

It was also informed that communications have been sent to state Presidents and Secretaries inviting expression of interest in holding various SIG/ other activities. SOPs for holding such meetings have been shared with the states.

The selected candidates awarded the International Dermatopathology Observership 2019 were announced.The list of selected candidates awarded the IADVL Observership 2020 were also announced Proposal to initiate Zonal Postgraduate Dermatosurgery procedural training workshops was approved. This would be 1.5 to 2.5 day workshop with hands on training. IPCA will be the sponsoring this program. Training will preferably for the second year postgraduates. For this Dr.P.Narasimha Rao added that centers should be identified with basic prerequisites and announcement should be made to call for applications from centres.

It was also brought to the notice of the house by Dr. Deepika Pandhi that the Quote for E-Library for the year 2020 is Rs. 11,40,153 and this would be Rs.13,62,143 if the subscription for International Journal of Dermatology(IJD) is also included. Approval of this matter shall be decided after verification of the download statistics of IJD.

The proposal to operate accounts of IADVL Academy from Chandigarh was approved. The proposed budget by Academy for year 2020 of Rs. 1,48,23,077 plus 3.5 lakhs was approved .

The proposal to organize IADVL PRP Conclave was approved.

Suggestion was put forward by Academy to initiate IADVL training course for a minimum of 3 to 6 months with stipend of Rs. 10,000 per month. It was decided to seek MCI recognition for such courses. Payment of stipend was not approved.

It was also proposed to merge sponsored SIG CME's with other CME's for which it was difficult to find sponsors.

SIG activities

1. The members of the reconstituted SIG Dermatopathology, Dermoscopy, Dermatology Clinical research and Pediatric Dermatology were welcomed
2. SIG- dermatology clinical research is preparing a format for 'Critical Appraisal Workshops'. This will be in addition to existing 'Research Methodology Workshops' and 'How to Publish Workshops'.
3. Topics for SIG sessions (SIG- Pruritus and SIG- Trichology and hair transplant) at MIDDERMACON 2020 are being decided by the respective SIGs.
4. It was informed that roadmaps for each of the SIGs are being finalized by the respective SIGs. These roadmaps will be sent to members of IADVL Academy and EC for their comments and approval.
6. SIG Pediatric Dermatology and Dermatosurgery are preparing curriculum for Advanced training course in their respective fields.

Announcement of Observerships

1. It was announced that 92 candidates selected for Observership were intimated about their selection and about the guidelines for observership. They are contacting their respective Observership directors to finalize the time slots for training.
2. Four candidates who completed their observership (2019 candidates) were transferred stipend of Rs.10,000 along with certificate after receiving feedback from the Directors.
3. The candidates awarded the International Dermatopathology Observership were intimated about their selection. They are coordinating with the Directors for finalization of time slots.

IADVL Research Grants

It was announced that

1. Research grant 2019 was given to Dr. Raghvendra Rao (Rs.3,50,000) for project entitled "Comparison of conventional indirect immunofluorescence with biochip mosaic slide in the diagnosis of autoimmune bullous disorders - A cross-sectional study and to Dr. Nayan Patel (Rs.100,000) for project " Comparative evaluation of host immune response and cytokine signature pertaining to Th1 and Th2 immune arms in serum and tissue among patients of acute localized versus chronic disseminated dermatophytosis, hospital based observational study" .
2. The last instalment of Loreal Grant 2018 was given to Dr. Sendhil Kumaran (Rs. 206,000) for Project (Role of Treg cells and proinflammatory cytokines IFN γ , IL17, IL 23 and IL31 in pathogenesis of alopecia areata.
3. The application for for IADVL Research Grant 2020 is being prepared

Postgraduate Thesis Grant

1. Please cancel all dermazones, considering the attendance, and disinterest of pharmas to contribute, these Dermazones need to be scraped out
2. Mid dermacons should be clubbed with 4 to 5 SIGs by rotation.

How will it help IADVL?

It is has been an emerging perception among young and senior members of IADVL that there has been a surfeit of conferences, CMEs, Congresses, workshops, etc in the past two years. There are situations where conferences clash among themselves and that leads to sharing of faculty and in many cases faculty fatigue and drop outs. There seems to be a steady attrition of audience participation and presence in halls due to the perceived excess of conferences sans a corresponding improvement in content quality. This will work detrimental to the ultimate purpose of IADVL as an academic collective. Various members have been vocal about this in various social media and same has led the proposers to make the forthcoming suggestions. If constitutional – will it replace existing clause? Or modify? Give detail of the clause – page no. and clause no. –not applicable

Proposal:

1. DERMAZONES – DERMAZONES to be reduced to once every two years with two zones conducting their zonal conferences in a year. For eg. North and West Zones conducting conferences in odd numbered years and South and East Zone conducting in even numbered years.
2. MIDCUTICONS and MIDDERMICON – It is proposed that the same may hitherto be discontinued
3. DERMACONS/DERMAZONES academic content – The tendency to include all topics in every edition of DERMACON needs to be eschewed. The same may be ensured by broadbased plans made by IADVL Conference reforms Task Force in consultation with IADVL Academy which can be conveyed to the DERMACON/DERMAZONE organisers for implementation at their end. These plans shall be broadbased and shall not involve speaker selection which is the exclusive ambit of the Conference Scientific Committee.
4. AGGLOMERATION OF SIG ACTIVITIES – Multiple SIGs can combine their programs into one event to avoid too many events and too many faculty getting divided among centres. These can be 2 day events or one day event with half day devoted for one SIG each. The same will also facilitate combining events of sponsor deficient SIGs with sponsorship rich SIGs. This will facilitate event reduction
5. LIAISON OF TASK FORCE with sister societies and parallel academic dermatologic bodies. Another reason for both faculty and audience attrition is multiple events being organized by non IADVL bodies clashing with IADVL activities causing multiple vents to coincide often in same/different cities. The Task Force shall build bridges with these non IADVL organisations and mutually plan consensually to prepone/advance events in case of such coincident dates. They will convey IADVL event dates to the functionaries of these bodies well in time and will endeavor to avoid event clashes as far as is possible.

Do you think this needs referral to any specific committee?

Dr.Narendra Patwardhan brought to the notice of the house that in view of poor attendance in scientific sessions and unwillingness of pharma companies to make contributions MIDDERMICON should be scrapped.

Dr. Brijesh Nair opined that clubbing SIG activities with MIDDERMICON will help .He also mentioned that DERMAZONE is nothing more than a glorified CUTICON.

Dr Ramesh Bhat mentioned that 2 SIG sessions are already included in MIDDERMICON. Dr Bhat urged for a reduction in private conferences and reminded that DERMAZONE provides opportunities for post graduate residents.

Dr. Koushik Lahiri , Dr Vikas and Dr Angoori G Rao were in favour of continuing MIDDERMACON.

Dr. P.Narasimha Rao was in favour of continuing MIDDERMACON and DERMAZONE and mentioned that financial viability of these conferences is not an issue because IADVL is also benefitted by savings from these conferences.

Dr. Deepika Pandhi reminded the members that already 2 SIG sessions are included in MIDDERMACON and pharma companies are still enthusiastic to participate. She also added that clubbing of CUTICON with DERMAZONE carries the advantage of greater participation.

Dr. Venkataram Mysore noted that there is a lack of financial supervision on these conferences.

Dr. Ramesh Bhat also pointed out that DERMAZONE is announced well in advance and this helps the organisers to approach pharma companies much early and hence mobilising funds should not be a difficult task.As DERMAZONE is merged with CUTICON budget should not be an issue.

Dr. Arijit Condoos suggested that as it is mandatory for post graduate residents to present papers in national conferences MIDDERMACON should definitely be continued for the benefit of PLMs.

Dr. Ramesh Bhat, Dr. P Narasimha Rao and Dr. Kiran Godse supported the continuation of DERMAZONE and MIDDERMACON as these are the two annual activities of IADVL.

The proposal to scrap MIDDERMACON and DERMAZONE was not accepted by the house.

Proposals 1 and 8 were not passed.

How will it help IADVL? IADVL is one of the largest Dermatology Related Body of Doctors with over 10,000 members and counting. It is the largest and the most important dermatology association in the body providing guidance, teaching and help to all dermatologist of the country. There are more than 500 CPS DDV holder practicing in rural and urban areas of Maharashtra. Their inclusion can further strengthen the organization

DDV diploma by The College of Physicians and Surgeons of Mumbai (a 100+ year old institution) is a degree which is recognized by Maharashtra Medical Council, Gujrat Medical Council, Orissa Medical Council and Rajasthan Medical Council.

We would like to highlight that it is a 2-year course. It is taught in MCI recognized institutions and the guides are also guides for MD / DVD(L) courses many of the guides and teachers for these students are senior reputed good standing members of dermatology and in IADVL.

The admission for these courses is done through NEET only.

Another course FCPS offered by the same institute is MCI recognized.

As the doctors who hold this degree are LEGALLY allowed to practice dermatology in the respective states, we feel it is imperative to grant them standing as LIFE MEMBERS in one of the largest Dermatology association of the world.

It is also to be noted that a dermatologist in one state cannot cease to be a dermatologist as soon as he/she crosses a state border.

Due to existing recognition in many states it is important to give life membership to these doctors so that they can give their service to the organization.

The General Body of Maharashtra IADVL branch passed a unanimous resolution in Annual GBM at CUTICON 2019 to appeal to IADVL national executive to accept them as life members and carry out the necessary changes in the constitution. And to give LIFE MEMBERSHIP to courses which are legally recognized by a state medical council after due proof is submitted by the applicant.

If constitutional – will it replace existing clause? Or modify? Give detail of the clause.

IADVL constitution: Page number: 9; Clause Number 4(a)

Proposal: (It should be properly drafted)

We recommend the following change in the constitution:

The eligibility criteria for becoming a life member of the Association shall be a postgraduate qualification in the speciality (i.e. a diploma or a degree in Dermatology or Dermatology, Venereology and Leprosy) from a medical college affiliated to and awarded by an Indian University or an institution recognized by the Medical Council of India (MCI) or an equivalent organization of the Government of India or a degree or diploma granted by an Indian University or Institution and are recognized by the respective State Medical Council (after submission of proof of recognition); or a Diploma in Dermatology or Dermatology and Venereology of the National Board of Medical Examinations, New Delhi. Others with foreign degrees or diplomas or equivalent qualifications should have their qualifications recognized by the MCI or an equivalent organization of the Government of India to become eligible. However, in the states of Andhra Pradesh, Tamil Nadu and Pondicherry (where presently only a combined degree or diploma in

Dermatology, Venereology and Leprosy is awarded), those who had acquired a postgraduate qualification (a degree or a diploma) in the specialties of Dermatology or Venereology or Leprosy will continue to be eligible to become life members of the Association.

Do you think this needs referral to any specific committee? No

Dr. Niteen Dhepe opined that State Medical Council is an autonomous body to grant registration and licence to practise and a discrimination between registration granted by State Medical Council and MCI is unwanted. He brought to the notice of the house that CPS is a legal degree and the curriculum followed for CPS degree holders is the same as that for DVL and as it is recognised by Maharashtra Medical Council, all the CPS diploma / degree holders should be made life members.

Dr. Choudhary mentioned that the licence to practise granted by West Bengal Medical Council is not valid outside West Bengal.

Dr. P.Narasimha Rao opined that CPS degree / diploma holders from one state cannot practise in other states.

Dr. Umashankar Nagaraju reminded that the supreme authority to grant licence to practice anywhere in India is MCI. Hence many were granted LM membership till 2009 after which this practice was revised.

Dr.R.Dhanpal submitted that CPS degrees are recognised by State Medical Council in almost nine states in India.

Dr. Chetan Patel highlighted that the CPS degree holders from Gujarat are allowed to practice only in Gujarat and the autonomy of State Medical Council is scrapped with the adoption of NMC that has replaced MCI.

Dr. Mukadam pointed out that CPC course is recognised by associations of all other specialities except dermatology.

Dr.Rashmi Sarkar commented that when there is State Council recognition the CPS degree/ diploma holders should be provided life membership.

Dr. Kiran Godse suggested that necessary changes be made in the bylaws of IADVL so as to provide Life membership for CPS degree / diploma holders.

Dr. Sharoff said when the same curriculum is being followed for DVL and CPS courses, CPS degree / diploma holders should be made life members.

Dr.Rajib Gogoi wanted to know what IADVL Constitution says about this matter.

The matter was put to vote and a vast majority of the members voted in favour of this proposal.

This proposal was passed.

Dr Umashankar raised a doubt on whether the implementation of this proposal will invite legal issues for which Dr Kiran Godse replied that this was discussed with our lawyer and he clarified that implementation of this proposal if passed in AGBM is legally unobjectionable.

Dr Venkataram Mysore and Dr Koushik Lahiri requested that the implementation of this proposal should follow the process as mentioned in the Constitution. Dr Ameet Valia replied that the proposal that is presented now was present in the original Constitution before a modification and so the new modification that is being sought now is what was proposed originally. Dr Anuradha also clarified that this proposal was sent for the opinion of Constitution Committee before placing this in AGBM and the Constitution Committee opined that the proposal should be discussed in the AGBM and abide by the decision of the house.

It should be made mandatory for every member to submit state medical council certificate at regular intervals to state secretary and to the National Headquarters

It may be referred to Constitution committee.

State level constitutional committee should be formed of 5 senior members from the state and should act with central constitutional committee.

At present the Directory available is not complete in many aspects as the joining dates of most old members is not updated.

It was opined by Dr. P Narasimha Rao that changes in the category of membership cannot be made retrospectively.

How will it help IADVL? Brief introduction. Off late, it has become extremely difficult to raise funds from pharma companies. More and more pharmas are inclined to favor individual delegates by registration, accommodation and air fare, howsoever junior he may be. So their budget gets diverted towards

individual doctor than the DERMACON organizers. Pharmas are contributing less than 50% than what they were contributing previously. With this policy local organizers find it difficult to meet the finances and the proposed budget for DERMACON. Situation becomes embarrassing when the expenses become clearer but not the income. My proposal is -

25% of the proposed fund should be raised by Central IADVL (Not including the seed money)

25% of the proposed fund should be raised by State IADVL in which DERMACON is being held

50% of the proposed fund should be raised by the local organizers.

Though holding DERMACON is a pride of State branch as well as local organizers, this will reduce the burden of meeting the budget tremendously and they will be able to concentrate on academic and other administrative points.

Dr.Abir Saraswat requested for specific time slot for discussing each proposal.

Dr. Suresh Joshipura was in favour of AGBM being held in a separate hall citing that business sessions may consume time which will compromise the scientific sessions.

Dr .Sashikumar pointed out that a trend of members to come in large numbers as a team just to support their proposal and leave immediately after their proposal is passed has to be discouraged.

Dr.P.Narasimha Rao suggested that Executive committee should promptly seek opinions of concerned committees on proposals before they are taken up in AGBM.

Dr. Raghunatha Reddy opined that considering lean attendance in AGBM a collective decision on issues is always better than a few members making decisions.

Dr. Rashmi Sarkar wanted to know whether the Executive Committee has the power not to take a proposal forward. Dr P Narasimha Rao and Dr Jayadev Betkerur answered that EC has no such power.

Dr. Kingshuk suggested online voting to be adopted for decisions on proposals.

Dr.Asokan requested that no proposal should be rejected but the quorum may be increased to include more members while making decisions.

This proposal was not passed.

a. Establish a continuing relationship on a regular basis with all national dermatological societies b. Establish programs of mutual benefit such as scholarships, training, sister society sessions during national congresses

It could be administrative or constitutional

Proposal: (It should be properly drafted)

In order to provide a roadmap to the IADVL Internatonal Liason Committee,the mission and vision in addition to objectivess is proposed for the future:

Mission:1.IADVL should build on building relations and sharing knowledge and literature with global societies over the next few years.

2.Propogate IADVL at all platforms by all individuals who have a chance to do so.

Vision: 1.To increase our global imprint over the world.

2.Facilitating better understanding of the dark skin.

Do you think this needs referral to any specific committee?

Please note that EC may decide to refer if it thinks it is necessary.

We leave it to the EC to decide but this may need incorporating in the Constitution.

It was informed to the house that this matter has already been accepted.

The proposal was passed.

Proposal No 12

Modifications of election rules in the light of the experience during conduct of 2019 elections

Dr Venkataram Mysore (LM/KN/3211), Dr Suresh Joshipura (LM/G/904), Dr Jayadev Betkerur (LM/KN/2009), Dr Kiran Godse(LM/M/701), Dr Ramesh Bhat(LM/KN/2051), Dr Arijit Coondoo(LM/WB/2364), Dr Suresh Talwar(LM/UP/2329), Dr Rashmi Sarkar(LM/ND/1543)

Back ground:We have observed during the election process 2019 that there are several Lacunae in the election process which we propose to rectify through the following proposals. Some of these proposals are new additions ; others are modifications.

Are they constitutional? Some are constitutional – others are administrative. So pl. refer them to constitution committee

1.Information about bidding cities:

Background: It was noticed that adequate information about cities and venues are not made available to the voter to make an informed choice. Currently the 200 word CV is not adequate for cities. Team details (their experience and eligibility) are not given. Also, the scrutiny and adequacy of the venue is now assessed after election is over. Hence:

Proposal: A. Venue: full details about space, no of halls with seating capacity space for exhibition, lunch, proposed venues for dinners should be disclosed with photos. Videos of venue and websites of venue are to be supplied mandatorily. Previous conferences organized at the venue with details should be mentioned . All these information along with Full bidding document and the budget including the proposed registration fee to be uploaded on to the voting site. SOP Committe to redesign a form for this by March 2020 so that it can be used for the next elections

B) The team Details are vital and should given in detail. As applicable to executive committee, members of same family (first degree) can not occupy four key positions in organizing committee ; org chair, secretary general, treasurer and scientific chair

Organizing team consisting of org chair, secretary general, treasurer, and scientific chair should provide their membership Details, place of Residence and practice, experience as dermatologist and iadvl member, Previous organizing experience in conferences and administration in IADVL . Their conflicts should be declared as above.

c) Each bidding city for both dermacon and middermacon should make a presentation to CCM similar to the presidential candidates. They should each be given 10 minutes each for this.

3. Candidate eligibility: Background: Eligibility depends on years of experience, place of practice and previous positions. This information is presently given in an inadequate way and the election office has to seek several clarifications to ascertain the facts.

Proposal:The secretary of state branch should certify in a specific letter about each candidate's Membership duration, place of residence and practice, specific previous positions and dates these positions. Position should mean Elected position- president, secretary, treasurer, vice president, joint

secretary, and executive committee member. Membership of committees, positions in conferences, advisor positions are not eligible. Some states are using the term managing committee member (which may be appointed member) - this is not acceptable. All state branches should use the same terminologies as in the constitution.

4. **Canvassing** :Background: The current provisions state that canvassing on official E groups are not allowed. This is redundant due to technology. The following are needed:

Proposals:

- a) Whatsapp groups need to be included in official groups
- b) A definition is needed as to what is official group: Official group is a group which is constituted for purpose of IADVL administration, either by secretary/treasurer /SIG/academy /any other committee /taskforce at state or central level.
- c) The nomenclature should mandatorily include the term IADVL/state branch name for easy recognition Eg. IADVL/finance. IADVL/KN/practitioner. No other private group is allowed to use IADVL/branch name for its name
- d) As mentioned in the constitution, CV of the candidates and cities are to be announced by the secretary general of center and states on these official whatsapp groups in official E groups
- e) Since it is in IADVL interest that best candidates and the best cities win, adequate information should be provided by IADVL itself. SO the CVs should be placed in all official groups by the secretary generals of state and center, multiple times; every month on a fixed day starting from August to November
- f) Canvassing by individual candidates on these groups is not allowed; however, in case of bidding cities, the concerned state can use its official group for motivating its members about the city as the bid for the city is an official bid approved by AGBM

5. **Complaints**: Background: Currently complaints are being made casually on whatsapp messages to the election officer. We need to have a process to lodge a complaint

Proposal: All complaints should be made by email. Each complaint should provide complete information mentioning :

Who is the complainant and his membership details

What is the complaint

Who is the violator, what is his position

What is the violation, full details need to be provided

which clause of the constitution is violated

These need to be sent both to returning officer and election officer

On receipt the Returning officer will acknowledge within 12 hours

A decision will be taken within 48 hours and communicated

If the decision is not possible in that time, then the same will be communicated to the complainant, mentioning more time is needed.

6. **Violation of code of conduct by general members**: Background: Currently, there is no provision for punishment for violation of the code by a member; it is there only for candidates. During this election, it was noticed that other members were violating the code during canvassing

Proposal: If a general member who is not candidate, violates code of conduct, then the election office can take the following actions against such members depending on the seriousness of the offence

A. Warning privately

B warning publicly

C. Removing his name from all official groups

D. Recommending any of the following actions to be taken by the agbm:

Baring him from casting his vote/holding any position in any committee/ Barring him from contesting elections for any period Suspending from membership

7. Disrespect towards election officer and returning officer: Background:Currently the constitution only states the election officer opinion should be treated with respect. It does not state the action if he shows disrespect

Proposal:The election officer can take the following actions against a candidate or member

A. Warning privately

B warning publicly

C. Removing him from all official groups

D. Recommending any of the following actions to be taken by the agbm: Baring him from casting his vote/holding any position in any committee/ Barring him from contesting elections for any period Suspending from membership

8.E voter registration: Back ground: Currently the registration of life members for evoting is stopped 6 weeks prior. This denies voting rights to eligible members. Since current technology is advanced, 6 weeks is too long a time

Proposal: Evoting registration of eligible life members be allowed till one week prior to the voting day

9. Disclosures of conflict by candidates: Background: It was noticed that as many as 5 candidates had conflicts with respect to conferences as organizers. This is a worrying sign as it can affect functioning of EC if many EC members get busy in organizing congresses. Also, Right now, declaration of conflicts is being done very casually- and cursorily. It was observed that the declaration was not clear. AGBM needs to consider this issue .While barring other posts is one solution, that may deter people with talent from contesting. We propose that:

Proposal: a)It is expected that office bearers in key positions denote their full attention on administration of IADVL EC/organizing dermacon or middermacon. Full commitment for one year is expected.

b)Each type of conflict- other association/organization, conference, pharma- need to be declared explicitly in a separate form. The form also should state that they will resign from those positions (see below) on election

c) In case of cities, the conflicts need to be declared by the Organizing Chair, Secretary, Treasurer and scientific Chair

c)These are be uploaded on website and should be visible on clicking by voters

d) Since secretary and treasurer hold two year terms, they should declare their conflicts annually to the EC and to AGBM.

e) If in any situation that an office bearer wishes to organize an event during his/her term, appropriate approval must be taken from EC and the same needs to communicated to CCM

It was decided that this proposal has to be forwarded to the Executive Committee, Constitution Committee , SOP Commiittee and E-voting Committee .These committees should provide recommendations on this matter before March 31st 2020 so that it gets implemented in the next IADVL election.

 1. To hire and use a professional media company to raise the profile of messages for public awareness. The said media company would create awareness content on steroid abuse, dermatophytosis and the need to go to the dermatologist.
 2. At least one meeting in a year in Delhi where officials from WHO, CRO, Drug Control General, Health & Family Welfare and Ministry of Chemicals & Fertilizers along with patients providing their views about how abuse of steroids are turning into a menace.
- **Constitution Committee**: Dr. Ameet Valia, Chairman, IADVL Constitution Committee informed that the updating of Constitution has been done. The following recommendations made by the Constitution Committee was approved:
 1. Separation of SOPs from the Constitution to avoid duplication and provide greater flexibility

 3. IADVL legal advisor should be asked to review the Constitution to recommend changes to avoid repetition and ambiguity

Thrissur District TB elimination Coalition: Dr Asokan was invited to attend the Thrissur district TB elimination coalition meeting representing IADVL. Organized by district tuberculosis officer, under DMO. District TB elimination coalition is a network of various professional associations including IMA. Some of the points highlighted were:

1. All patients started on tb has to be notified to the Govt agencies. It is legally binding and failure to do so can invoke criminal proceedings.
2. CB NAAT is available in DTO. They have facility to do it even in skin biopsy specimens. Specimens to be sent in distilled water or normal saline. NOT IN FORMALIN.
3. Standards of care for TB management mandates "Attempts to be made for microbial identification" in all cases. These include AFB smear/AFB culture/ and/or CB NAAT.
4. A clinician can decide a case as tuberculosis, in spite of no microbial identification.

We circulated these important points to all members.

D. DAY ACTIVITIES

IADVL Kerala has been in forefront in Community activities and has a Community Dermatology Cell headed by Dr Sribiju.

3) Community activity

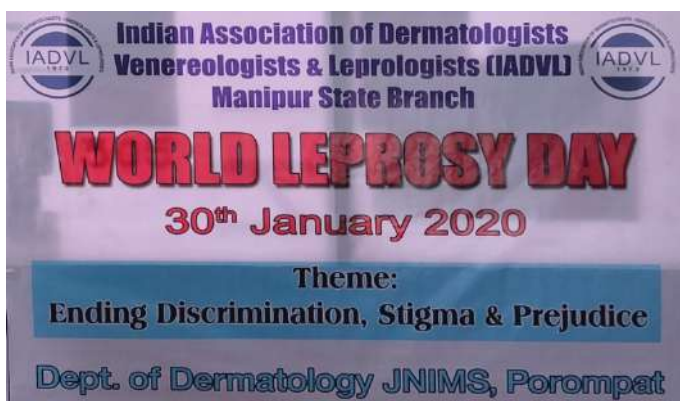
Our esteemed members are always participating on the free medical camp services, radio talks, local television talks & giving awareness about various issues on healthy skin.

Communication with states

The SOPs for SIG meeting with a state and brief SOP for partial assistance for any SIG activity conducted with a state branch and the yearly Academy activities timeline were shared with the state president and secretaries. They were also requested to share names of 2 nominees for receiving access to e-library.

IADVL Position statement on COVID-19

The Academy prepared a position statement for Dermatologic practice in the current COVID-19 pandemic. It also prepared patient education posters that were shared by webmail and on whatsapp groups.

IADVL Observerships

Observerships are given at each centre for a duration of 4 weeks (and a stipend of Rs 10,000), for IADVL LMs or PLMs aged less than 35 years and for a duration of 2 weeks (without a stipend), for IADVL LMs aged 35 years or above. 101 candidates were selected (93 < 35 years of age, 8 > 35 years) for 2019. There were 9 withdrawals and 74/92 observerships have been completed till January 2020.

For observerships in 2020, we received 132 applications for 29 IADVL observership centers. Seven new centers were added this year. A total of 87 candidates < 35 yrs and 8 > 35 yrs have confirmed their slots for Observership 2020. A Whatsapp group has been started for ease of communication which include the program directors, observers, the Academy chairperson, Academy convener and coordinators of the observership program.

IADVL International Dermatopathology Observerships 2019

Thirty-seven applications were received for the IADVL International Dermatopathology Observerships-2019 and were evaluated by the IADVL SIG Dermatopathology [Dr IS Reddy (Coordinator), Dr Saurabh Singh (Convener)] using pre-approved scoring sheets. IADVL Research Grants

Eight projects with a total grant of Rs 47,20,980/- has been sanctioned for 2019 under IADVL Research Grant 2019 and 2 projects with a total grant of Rs 10,53,750 (Rs 62,000/- is additional grant for insurance of clinical trial for one study) has been sanctioned under IADVL Glowderma Resrach rant 2019. After fulfilling all the requirements, 50% of the amount was transferred to 5 of the 10 Research Grant projects till 15th March 2020. Money was transferred to 5 out of 8 projects that received the IADVL Loreal Grant 2018 and 2 projects that received IADVL Loreal grant for 2017. IADVL Academy proposed study

A multicentric study to evaluate the host and pathogen factors in recurrent dermatophytoses' (Principal Investigators: Dr. Saumya Panda, Dr Sunil Dogra and Dr Shivaprakash Rudramurthy) was initiated at four centers (Assam Medical College, Dibrugarh; Fr Muller Medical College, Mangalore; St John's Medical College, Bengaluru; and PGI, Chandigarh) with a grant from Glenmark Pharmaceuticals. The study is complete and the final amount is in the process of being transferred to the respective centers.

IADVL Scholarships. - DERMACON 2020, Pune

For DERMACON 2020 held at Pune from 29th January to 2nd February 2020, we received a total of 101 applications: 85 PLMs, 10 LMs < 35 years & 5 LMs > 35 years. The applications were evaluated by independent judges and the results were declared on 13.01.2020. Since the number of LMs in both age categories were less than the total scholarships to be disbursed, the number of PLMs receiving the scholarships was increased to 85 after EC approval. Each scholarship carries a sum of Rs.15,000/- along with a Scholarship award certificate from IADVL. Academy has transferred scholarship money and certificates to the 100 Scholarships awardees.

Post Graduate activities

IADVL Postgraduate Thesis Grant 2019

Sixteen applications were received for PG thesis grant 2019. These were reviewed by members of the SIG Dermatology clinical research; 11 have been selected for the 2019 grant.

Guidelines for grant utilization was sent to selected PG thesis grant applicants and after fulfilling all the requirements, 50% of the amount has been transferred to six of these applicants' after receiving the required documents.

IADVL SIG Activities

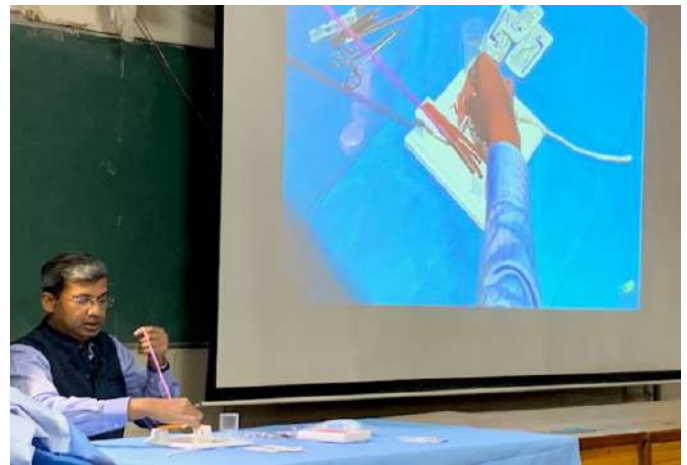

- Roadmaps for each of the SIGs has been drafted by the respective SIGs (except SIG Psoriasis and the recently reconstituted SIG Geriatric Dermatology, Aesthetics and Lasers). These roadmaps have been evaluated by the Academy based on the recently developed evaluation criteria. The Academy comments are being collated and shall be shared with respective SIGs.

 - To create a supportive group for redressal of academic, executive & personal grievances.

 - To create a strong social media presence, which the youth are adept at, & help other cells to establish the same, if needed.
 - To ensure the upliftment of the youth.

ELECTION IF NO APPLICATIONS: If there is no applicant for a position on 15th June 2020, the announcement will be repeated on 16th June 2020 with 1st July 2020 being the last date for application only for those posts for which there were no applications. If there are no applications for any post even after 1st July, the returning officer will announce a fresh election process during the CCM for the vacant posts/venues with the last date for filing being 30th November 2020. The Returning officer will declare the final list after verification by 10th December 2020. If there is more than one application for any post/venue, then election by voting by secret ballot will be arranged during DERMACON 2021 on the day of the CME from 11 am to 2 pm. All eligible voters can cast their vote after verification of their membership and photo identity proof by the Returning Officer. The counting will begin immediately on conclusion of the voting process at 2 pm and the results will be announced in the closing AGBM. The entire process will be under the supervision of the Election Officer.

CODE OF CONDUCT: Individual members cannot use IADVL National or branch organs like e-groups, web forums, official whats app groups etc., for canvassing. They should not seek endorsement from State or Zonal branches.

a. Canvassing by any State branch or branches or by any official group of IADVL members individually or collectively for any candidate shall not be permitted. However, in case of bidding cities, the concerned state can use its official group for motivating its members about the city as the bid for the city is an official bid approved by AGBM. Official group is a group which is constituted for purpose of IADVL administration, either by secretary/treasurer /SIG/academy /any other committee /taskforce at state or central level.

b. The biodata (not exceeding 200 words), photograph and declaration of conflict of interest of all candidates will be sent along with the election materials to all eligible voters. It will also be displayed on the IADVL e-portal, circulated through IADVL e-groups / Whats app groups and printed in the IADVL Newsletter to be released in the IADVL CCM-2020 before members cast their vote. Contestants will be provided a complete list of e voters. Biodata should be placed in all official groups by the secretary generals of state and centre, multiple times; every month on a fixed day starting from August to November

c. Candidates for the post of IADVL President Elect (2021) will be invited to attend the IADVL CCM-2020 at their own expense and will be given an opportunity to address the CC members for 5 minutes each.

d. The bidding team for DERMACON/ MIDDERMACON will have to attend the CCM at their own cost and make presentation of 5 minutes each.

e. If anything in the biodata submitted by a contestant is proved to be false, that candidate's election will be declared null and void by the Election Officer. In that event, the candidate who had secured the next highest number of votes will be declared elected. In case there is no contest for the post, the election will be conducted in the concluding AGBM of the year.

f. **Violation of Code of Conduct:** Any candidate violating the code of conduct will be subject to punishment as below:

a. The matter will be referred to the Election Officer; this may be done either by the Returning Officer or by a candidate directly.

b. The Election Officer will take any of the below actions if the complaint is found to be valid, and after giving adequate opportunity to the candidate to explain:

i. issue a private warning letter if it is a first offence or a minor offence (in the opinion of the Election Officer);

- ii. issue a public warning (announcements in IADVL e-groups and WhatsApp groups for a second offence or a larger offence (in the opinion of the Election Officer)
- iii. disqualify the candidate for a third offence or a second larger offence (in the opinion of the Election Officer).

c. Violation of code of conduct by general members: If a general member who is not candidate, violates code of conduct, then the election officer can take the following actions against such members depending on the seriousness of the offence. A. Warning privately. B warning publicly. C. Removing his name from all official groups. D. Recommending any of the following actions to be taken by the AGBM: Barring him from casting his vote/holding any position in any committee/ Barring him from contesting elections for any period Suspending from membership.

d. This procedure shall be completed within a period of ten days. The decision of the Election Officer is to be considered final and should not be discussed publicly. The disqualified candidate will have the right to appeal against the decision of the Election Officer to an Arbitration Committee, which shall be constituted by the President as per the provisions of the Constitution. The Arbitration Committee shall give its decision within one week and that decision will be final and binding. The candidate or any member on his behalf cannot raise the issue with the members in any of the IADVL e-groups. The application fees for various posts are Rs. 25,000 for the post of President Elect, Rs. 15,000 for each post of Vice President, Rs. 25000 (Rs 12500 each) for Hon Secretary General Elect and Hon Treasurer Elect and Rs. 7,500 for each post of Honorary Joint General Secretary. If the nomination is withdrawn before 15th July 2020, the last date for withdrawal of nominations, 50% of the nomination fee will be refunded. After that date, no refund will be made under any circumstances.

1. CONDITIONS OF ELIGIBILITY FOR OFFICE BEARERS:

The candidate should be a permanent resident of India continuously for the last 5 years to be eligible to contest elections in IADVL with exception for those institutional employees who go on deputation/fellowship. In such cases, the duration of deputation should not be more than 2 years during the past five years.

The secretary of state branch should certify in a specific letter about each candidate's Membership duration, place of residence and practice, specific previous positions and dates these positions. Position should mean Elected position- president, secretary, treasurer, vice president, joint secretary, and executive committee member. Membership of committees, positions in conferences, advisor positions are not eligible. Some states are using the term managing committee member (which may be appointed member)- this is not acceptable. All state branches should use the same terminologies as in the constitution.

A. PRESIDENT ELECT:

1. Should have completed TEN YEARS as a member of the Association in good standing during which period he/she must have no outstanding indebtedness to the Association.
2. Shall have completed a minimum experience of 15 years in the specialty of Dermatology, Venereology, and/or Leprology, after having taken his/her post-graduate qualification in the specialty .
3. Shall be exclusively engaged in the practice, teaching and/or Research of these specialties of Dermatology, Venereology and/or Leprology.
4. Must have been actively involved in the affairs of the Association in an official capacity either at the National level as Vice-President, Honorary General Secretary or Honorary Treasurer or at the state Branch/Combined Branches level as President. The tenure of these positions should have been completed at the time of application.
5. The candidate must declare any conflict of interest as mentioned in the application form.

B. VICE PRESIDENT:

1. Should have completed SEVEN YEARS as a member of the Association in good standing during which period he/she must have no outstanding indebtedness to the Association.
2. Shall have completed a minimum experience of 10 years in the specialty of Dermatology, Venereology and/or Leprology after having taken his/her post-graduate qualifications in the specialty.
3. Shall be exclusively engaged in the practice, teaching and/or research of the specialties of Dermatology, Venereology and/or Leprology.
4. Must have been actively involved in the affairs of the Association in an official capacity either at the National level as Honorary Secretary General or Honorary Treasurer or Joint Secretary or at the state Branch / Combined Branches level as President or Vice President or Secretary. The tenure of these positions should have been completed at the time of application.
5. The candidate must declare any conflict of interest as mentioned in the application form.

C. HONORARY SECRETARY GENERAL ELECT & HONORARY TREASURER ELECT:

1. Shall be member of the Association in good standing for the previous FIVE YEARS.
2. Shall have a minimum experience of 10 years in the specialty of Dermatology, Venereology and/or Leprology after having taken his/her postgraduate qualification in the specialty.
3. Shall be exclusively engaged in the practice, teaching and/or research of the specialties of Dermatology, Venereology and/or Leprology.

4. Candidate for Honorary Secretary General Elect should have been a Joint Secretary or Treasurer or Secretary or Vice President or President at the State level or a Joint Secretary or Treasurer at the National level.
5. Candidate for Honorary Treasurer Elect should have been a Joint Secretary or Treasurer or Secretary or Vice President or President at the State level or a Joint Secretary at the National level.
6. The Honorary Secretary General Elect and the Honorary Treasurer Elect must be proposed from the same zone in this particular context.
7. The candidates must declare any conflict of interest as mentioned in the application form

D. JOINT SECRETARY:

1. Should have completed FIVE YEARS as a member of the Association in good standing during which period he/she must have no outstanding indebtedness to the Association.
2. Shall have complicated a minimum experience of 5 years in the specialty of Dermatology, Venereology and/or Leprology after having taken his/her post-graduate qualifications in the specialty.
3. Shall be exclusively engaged in the practice, teaching and/or research of the specialties of Dermatology, Venereology and/or Leprology.
4. Must have been actively involved in the affairs of the Association in an official capacity either at the National level or at the Branch / Combined Branch level or a Central Council Member from a Branch for a minimum period of TWO YEARS either continuous or with breaks. The tenure of these positions should be complete at the time of application.
5. The candidate must declare any conflict of interest as mentioned in the application form.

Disclosures of conflict by candidates:

- a) It is expected that office bearers in key positions devote their full attention on administration of IADVL EC/organizing DERMACON or MIDDERMACON. Full commitment for one year is expected.
- b) Each type of conflict- other association/organization, conference, pharma- need to be declared explicitly in a separate form. The form also should state that they will resign from those positions (see below) on election
- c) In case of cities, the conflicts need to be declared by the Organizing Chairperson, Secretary, Treasurer and scientific Chairperson. These are to be uploaded on website and should be visible on clicking by voters.
- d) Since secretary and treasurer hold two year terms, they should declare their conflicts annually to the EC and to AGBM.
- e) If in any situation that an office bearer wishes to organize an event during his/her term, appropriate approval must be taken from EC and the same needs to be communicated to CCM

II. PROCEDURE FOR ELECTIONS OF OFFICE BEARERS:

1. The Electoral Roll will consist of all direct life members of the Association and members through a state branch or combined state branch who have registered for e voting on or before one week prior to the voting day and who have no outstanding indebtedness to the Association.
2. The candidates proposed for various posts shall conform to the requirements laid down under Rule 26 and should also pay the nomination fees mentioned above.

3. They shall be duly proposed and seconded by members in good standing who have no outstanding dues to the Association. The application should bear the candidates' willingness and signature.

4. AS PER the AGBM RESOLUTION PASSED IN JANUARY 2018 IN KOCHI, THERE WILL ONLY BE E-VOTING

III. WITHDRAWAL OF NOMINATIONS: The last date for withdrawal of nominations will be 15th July 2020. This shall be indicated in the information sent by the Honorary Secretary General to the nominated member. Non-receipt of a letter of withdrawal from the candidate by the Honorary Secretary General shall be considered as acceptance of the nomination by the member.

IV. VALID NOMINATIONS:

1. The Honorary Secretary General shall send a list of nominated members to the Election Officer by 16th July 2020. The Honorary Secretary General shall also inform the same to all the valid candidates by that date.

2. In case more than one candidate is found nominated for the post of President Elect, and more than two candidates each for the post of Vice Presidents and Honorary Joint Secretary General, a secret e-voting process must be undertaken to elect the office bearers concerned.

3. Any candidate who has any objections about any other candidate or about the process of election in any way should intimate the same to the Election Officer by 31st July 2020, so that the same can be taken up in the Central Council Meeting (CCM) of 2020. No objections either about candidature or election process or any other issue shall be entertained after this date.

V. BALLOT AND E-VOTING:

1. No ballot will be dispatched as IADVL will be having only e-voting.

2. The members shall cast their votes through the web portal integrated to the IADVL website. The member has to sign up and then log in to their profile in the website. Brief biodata of contestants will be displayed on e-portal before a member finally casts his vote electronically.

VI. DECLARATION OF ELECTION RESULTS: The official declaration of the election results will be after 7 days of counting the E- votes by the Election Officer on e-groups and same will be available on website as well. The number of votes polled by various contestants shall be announced and subsequently published in IADVL News. It should also be conveyed to the contestants, various state branch secretaries and Editor of IJDVL and IDOJ.

VII. ELECTION DISPUTES AND ARBITRATION: All disputes arising with regard to the election of office bearers or any dispute among the member of the Association shall be referred to the Arbitration Committee to be nominated by the Central Council and further approved by the General Body. Five Immediate Past Presidents will constitute the Arbitration Committee. Its verdict shall be final and binding on all parties.

Complaints:

All complaints should be made by email, in the prescribed format (uploaded in the website). These need to be sent both to returning officer and election officer. On receipt the Returning officer will acknowledge within 12 hours. A decision will be taken within 48 hours and communicated. If the decision is not possible in that time, then the same will be communicated to the complainant , mentioning more time is needed.

Disrespect towards election officer and returning officer: The election officer can take the following actions against a candidate or member. A. Warning privately. B warning publicly. C. Removing him from all official

groups. D. Recommending any of the following actions to be taken by the AGBM: Barring him from casting his vote/holding any position in any committee/ Barring him from contesting elections for any period Suspending from membership

DERMACON / MIDDERMACON

- (a) Any state branch wanting to hold DERMACON / MIDDERMACON must call its GBM, and, by a majority vote, pass a resolution to that effect and decide the names of the Organizing Chair person, organizing Secretary, Treasurer and Scientific Chairperson of the Local Scientific Committee. The Organizing Secretary must be from the city where the DERMACON / MIDDERMACON is to be held.
- (b) The state branch shall send the bid proposal to host DERMACON / MIDDERMACON to the Honorary Secretary General of IADVL two and a half years before the proposed conference only after the above procedure.
- (c) The official bid for holding DERMACON / MID DERMACON shall be given to the Honorary Secretary General on the letterhead of the state branch, with the signatures of the President and Secretary of the branch, and the prescribed proforma (containing the details regarding the facilities available in the city and the suitability of the city for hosting DERMACON) duly filled in .
- (d) Application of bids to hold the DERMACON and MIDDERMACON should reach the IADVL Honorary Secretary General by 15th June 2020. If there is only one application for DERMACON and or MIDDERMACON, then the President, President-Elect, Past President and Hon. Secretary General shall visit the venue and report to CCM which meets in August. If the venue is not found suitable for DERMACON / MID DERMACON then the CCM can discuss other options.
- (e) After a careful scrutiny of proposals for venue, all eligible venues shall be included in the ballot paper and the venue shall be selected by election process.
- (f) All those involved in the conference arrangement, i.e. office bearers, shall disclose any conflicts of interest, including financial or any other relationships with manufacturers of commercial products (including drugs, equipment, and services) in their presentations on the conference.

PART-II BIDS INVITED FROM IADVL STATE BRANCHES TO HOST MIDDERMACON 2022.

Bids are invited from IADVL State Branches to host the 10th MIDDERMACON in 2022. Preference in the bids would be given to smaller cities of India. However, if no suitable bid is received from such smaller cities, it can be allotted to any city. When held: Ideally in August 2022

How to bid for MIDDERMACON 2022: Application of bids to hold the 10th MIDDERMACON 2022 should reach the IADVL Honorary Secretary General by 15th June 2020. The eligible bids would be included in the e-voting form for nationwide voting for deciding the venue. The bid should mention the venue, names of Organizing Secretary, Organizing Chairperson and Scientific Chairperson. Each bid should be endorsed by the President and Secretary of the respective IADVL State Branch.

Information about bidding cities:

A. Venue: full details about space, number of halls with seating capacity, space for exhibition, lunch, proposed venues for dinners should be disclosed with photos. Videos of venue and websites of venue are to be supplied mandatorily. Previous conferences organized at the venue with details should be mentioned . All these information along with Full bidding document and the Budget including the proposed registration fee to be uploaded on to the voting site. (**Proforma attached**)

B. The team Details are vital and should be given in detail. As applicable to executive committee, members of same family (first degree) can not occupy five key positions in organizing committee ; organising chairperson, organizing secretary , chairman scientific , secretary scientific and treasurer

Organizing team consisting of organising chairperson , organizing secretary , chairman scientific , and treasurer should provide their membership Details, place of Residence and practice, experience as dermatologist and IADVL member, previous organizing experience in conferences and administration in IADVL . Their conflicts should be declared as mentioned.

Guidelines of conduct of MIDDERMACON 2022:

1. Duration: Two consecutive days (a Saturday and Sunday).
2. Saturday: First day CME on topics of Clinical Dermatology. SIG groups will be involved. A parallel workshop can be organized.
3. Sunday: Second day of conference. The local scientific team will be the main planner of the scientific program. The IADVL Academy of Dermatology and Special Interest Groups (SIGs) would coordinate and help the local scientific team in its implementation.

On winning the bid, the organizers of MIDDERMACON 2022 should sign a memorandum of understanding (MOU) with the national IADVL to accept rules in financial matters and conduct of MIDDERMACON 2022.

The winner of the bid would be announced/decided during the opening year AGBM at DERMACON 2021.

PART-III BIDS INVITED FROM IADVL STATE BRANCHES TO HOST DERMACON INTERNATIONAL 2023

1. The venue which is proposed for DERMACON INTERNATIONAL should have proper building and not need too many tents. It should befit an international congress. Smaller cities with smaller venues, without international airport, limited number of hotels are not suitable
2. The city should have access for international air travel and it should have adequate number of five star hotels to cater for international delegates
3. It should have delegate fee in Dollars for international delegates
4. Scientific program should have a hall for international sessions, time for international quiz, international free paper session.
5. International scholarships also need to be awarded to encourage delegates
6. It needs separate social media marketing
7. An international coordinator needs to be appointed by the local organizing team who will work closely with international liason cell to ensure success. This will be named in the submission of the bid along with organising chairperson, organizing secretary and scientific chairperson and later approved in the general body
8. Venue inspection team will inspect in the light of above requirements.

When held: Ideally in January 2023

As per AGBM decision, DERMACON INTERNATIONAL to be held once in every four years. Bids are invited from State Branches of IADVL to host DERMACON INTERNATIONAL 2023 in one of their cities. The application for bids to hold DERMACON INTERNATIONAL 2023 should reach IADVL Honorary Secretary General by 15th June 2020. The bid should be forwarded by the State Secretary as per the present guidelines to the Honorary Secretary General, IADVL. The bid should be accompanied by all the relevant details as per the bidding proforma. The bidder must also attach the minutes of the General Body meeting of the State which has passed the proposal for hosting DERMACON INTERNATIONAL 2023. The resolution must mention the names of the Chairperson, Secretary and Treasurer of the Organizing Committee and the Scientific Chairperson and must be accompanied by a signed MOU by Organizing team and the State Branch President and Secretary.

The Organizing Secretary of the Bid Committee should also send a write up of maximum of 500 words about the proposed venue along with 4 images and a video . The write up and images will be posted on the IADVL website and also in IADVL News. Video or slide show presentation may also be attached along with the bidding proforma. The Organizing Secretary may host a web page about the venue and send the URL of the same for displaying on the IADVL website.

Information about bidding cities:

A. Venue: full details about space, no of halls with seating capacity space for exhibition, lunch, proposed venues for dinners should be disclosed with photos. Videos of venue and websites of venue are to be supplied mandatorily. Previous conferences organized at the venue with details should be mentioned . All these information along with Full bidding document and the Budget including the proposed registration fee to be uploaded on to the voting site.

B) The team Details are vital and should given in detail. As applicable to executive committee, members of same family (first degree) cannot occupy four key positions in organizing committee ; org chair, secretary general, treasurer and scientific chair.

Organizing team consisting of org chair, secretary general, treasurer, and scientific chair should provide their membership Details, place of Residence and practice, experience as dermatologist and iadvl member, Previous organizing experience in conferences and administration in IADVL . Their conflicts should be declared as above.

NB: The withdrawal of the bid can be allowed within 15 days of applying for the bid by a resolution passed by State GBM. However, if there is no time to get a resolution passed by State GBM, the EC of the State Branch of IADVL may permit the withdrawal and subsequently get the decision ratified during the next State AGBM.
