Dear IADVL Members,

It is a year since the COVID-19 pandemic took the entire world by a storm and all of us are facing unprecedented challenges to cope with this outbreak. The alarming spread of COVID-19 infection in our country has plunged us in uncertainty again and as you all know we have to continue our academic as well as administrative activities in the virtual world. We all are wading through a grave scenario.

Rising to the need of the hour we have already explored and adapted to the new normal of virtual platforms since last year. IADVL shall certainly strive to guide you in fighting the battle against COVID-19 in the crucial days ahead for the benefit of our members and patients. We had initiated a series of webinars and online lectures on various topics and many more are in the pipeline. Thanks to Academy for all their support and dedicated efforts when ever in need

e-DERMACON 2021, the 49th National Conference of The Indian Association of Dermatologists, Venereologists and Leprologists (IADVL) was held from 5th to 7th February 2021. This was the first ever DERMACON, organised by IADVL EC 2020 and Academy and also conducted on a virtual platform. A pre conference workshop was held on 31st January 2021. It is a towering evidence of how we overcame the adversities that we faced in conducting this prestigious event. Though virtual, I am sure all of you would agree that we could conduct this conference without losing its pomp and splendour. The sumptuous academic feast spread by the IADVL Academy had all the flavours that our members yearned for. This virtual conference was at par with any physical conference in terms of content, conduct or faculty. The versatile platform provided opportunities for virtual network meetings and customized presentations for our industry partners as well. We look at it as how well an opportunity can be created out of adversity. There were 14 workshops in 4 parallel halls on January 31st, half a day of CME and 2 days of conference. Twentyfive faculty from USA, Europe, Australia, Brazil, Kuwait and SAARC countries, more than 400 national faculties of eminence and repute participated in a relatively short notice. All the constitutionally mandated sessions like orations, award paper sessions and thesis-based award paper sessions were held following protocol. A record number of >1700 abstracts were submitted. There were more than 7000 registered delegates. While IADVL EC took up the responsibility of administrative and organising aspects, IADVL Academy meticulously moulded the academic programmes. Events 360 provided the inevitable support of hosting the virtual platform. A series of cultural events were also aired for entertaining our members.

IADVL Constitution committee is working in association with SOP committee in stream lining and correcting ambiguities of our Constitution. ITAQ continued their sincere efforts in taking up issues related to quackery. Academy Task force, Dermatology education task force, Awards review committee, Academy task force, Election Task force etc are working hard to come out with their suggestions. International Liaison Committee, Govt Liaison committee etc also are planning various activities. Newly formed Internal complaints committee and CPS resolution committee had held few meetings. Election notification has been announce last month.

Following the havoc caused to the health care sector in our country following the COVID19 pandemic, there is an urgent need to provide assistance from IADVL. The IADVL EC has decided to provide financial assistance to the state branches, by providing 30% of the total budget limited to a maximum of 2L per state branch. We request all to make a sincere effort for success of this program that will be a small service in these very difficult times.

IADVL EC successfully conducted various e-meetings with many of the standing committees. Quiz team has called for applications for quiz masters for CUTICONS and 18 were shortlisted. Practice management Cell has initiated its activities with a CME recently. Media Cell organised a country wide awareness activity on World Skin health day. Community Dermatology has already initiated various community activities. YUVA Cell is quite active in its second

year as well. National Resident Connect Committee was actively involved by conducting various competitions successfully for residents for observing various days and also made their presence in social media platforms actively. The ACAD Google group is a platform hosting enthusiastic academic discussions. IADVL FaceBook Page is active now. Our website has been constantly updated and we have made conscious efforts to reach out to all members, through news letters, bulletins, emails, bulk mails, SMS, web site announcements, social media etc.

Leprosy Day and World Skin Health day were observed across the country with various activities initiated by IADVL EC, Academy & State Branches. Nominations for the ILDS Awards have been sent. We have confirmed our participation and an IADVL session at the forthcoming Dubai Derma 2021.

Our association has grown in leaps and bounds and presently our membership strength is, 14152 (active members). Of which 10253 are LM, 3690 are PLM, 201 AM and 6 ILM. Now we have a record number of registered e voters (Jan 2021 - 7496 (73.11 %)).

Various welfare schemes under IADVL like DVL Welfare Trust, Benevolent fund, Personal Accident Relief Fund are rolled out to our members. Benevolent fund requests have been processed and the amount has been transferred accordingly. In these times when we are fighting Corona, we lost many of our members. May the departed souls rest in peace. My sincere prayers for all their families.

I request all Provisional Life Members of IADVL, who have obtained a postgraduate degree/diploma in Dermatology and registered their PG qualification with the MCI/State Medical Council, to convert to Life Members before lapse of their 5 years of provisional membership. One can apply for conversion from PLM to LM through the Online Membership Application System (OMAS) on the IADVL website (www.iadvl.org). I also urge all life members to sign up in the website and register for e-voting and membership of DVL Welfare Trust.

I am thankful to IADVL EC 2021 for all their trust, support and co-operation whenever in need to discharge my responsibilities. My sincere thanks to Dr Jayadev Betkerur for his guidance and support throughout and for being there with me to solve any issue, any time and also for initiating various welcome changes in the association. Special thanks to Dr Kiran Godse and Dr Rashmi Sarkar for their insightful suggestions and guidance. Our vice presidents, Dr Neeraj Pandey and Dr Sanjeev Vaishampayan were always there when ever in need. Thanks to the dedicated Joint Secretaries, Dr K Rajyalaxmi, Dr Abhishek Jha, Secretary Elect Dr Dinesh and Treasurer Elect Dr Savitha for all their help, support and co operation. HONORARY TREASURER'S NOTES**Dr. RAKHESH. S.V**

Dear all,

Greetings from the treasurer's desk.

One year has passed since I had taken over the reins of the ever-expanding Finances of IADVL central. The past one year had thrown us challenges right from the beginning. The first half of the financial year was the most difficult with the logistic difficulty in opening and transfer of signatories, caused by the pandemic. The later half was not easier with me having to double up as the Treasurer of E- DERMACON 2021. I should admit, without the Help of the Academy and the rest of EC 2020, I would not have been able to play the double role. Thankfully, we could start an E-DERMACON Account in Mysore, using the DERMACON 2019 GST number and thus utilize the GST input credit of nearly 1.2 crores due to us from DERMACON 2019. I am happy to inform you that the utilization of the GST number of DERMACON 2019 has saved us up to 36 lakhs INR.

The preparation of the budget for the year 2021-22 was a novel experience. Matching the income predicted for the year which was not quite different from the previous years with the burgeoning expenses of the association was a cumbersome task. The unpredictability of the finances owing to the ongoing pandemic were not helpful either. The Uncertainty in the contribution from the DERMACON, MIDDERMACON and DERMAZONES were most disturbing. The increasing expenses on Website, IDOJ and the proposed Presidential Community project was met with some cost cutting measures on the Office Logistics, Office expenses, EC Physical meeting expenses, expenses of committees of which funds were unutilized the previous years. The total projected expense for the year 2020-21 resulting in a negligible deficit which could not be avoided, in view of the lowered income and rising expenses for the upcoming year.

This Pandemic has rolled forth various challenges in the regular financial operations of our association. Despite these challenges, the IADVL EC and the various committees have been constantly working hard to deliver as it had done before. Let us pray and hope everything returns to normal soon and we can continue to serve IADVL, as our predecessors have done all these years.

IDOJ welcome Dr K Seetharam as Editor Elect (2021) in the Editorial Board. We are glad to inform IADVL members that IDOJ has been now accepted for inclusion in Emerging Sources Citation Index (ESCI). Once indexed in ESCI (a smaller subset of Clarivate Analytics), the journal articles are now searchable and visible on Web of Science, which is the search engine of Clarivate Analytics. An ESCI indexed journal is eventually considered for SCIE review by Clarivate. Impact Factor is rewarded to a journal once it is indexed on SCIE (Science Citation Index Expanded another database of Clarivate Analytics). So IDOJ has moved one step close acquiring Impact Factor in near future. Journal manuscript submission system has been migrated to new and user friendly platform by publisher.

- On the first page, enter your details – Name, E-mail, Mobile Number and existing PLM number. Click 'Save and Proceed' . you will receive an OTP on your phone-enter that.
- On the second page, upload your recent photograph. Please choose the State branch you are presently residing/working/practicing in at the top of the page. If the State branch is different from the one your PLM is registered with, you will need a NOC from that branch. Enter your personal details & upload the documents in pdf or jpg format. Click 'Save and Proceed'.
- On the third page, enter your details about Education and practice and click 'Save and Proceed'.
- On the fourth page, review your details and Click 'Submit or Proceed' at the top of the page.
- You will receive an notification by mail with your application id once the same is accepted by the system.

Your application will first be cleared by the concerned State branch Secretary before it reaches the dash board of the Hon. Secretary General for final approval

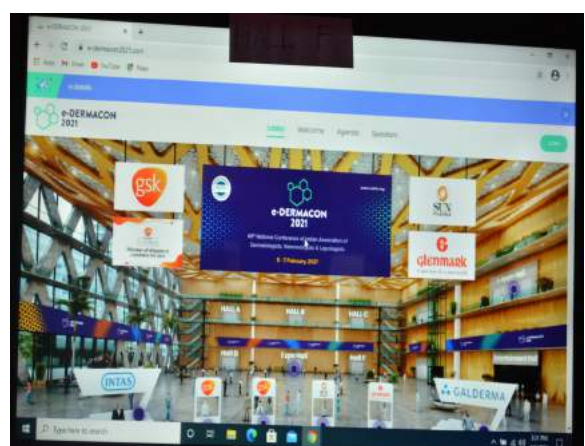
We are grateful to our pharma partners for their support and cooperation for the excellent conduct of the conference.

How will it help IADVL?

Providing service to the community regarding Skin health is one of the mission of IADVL. This proposal aims to provide need based community service to the local population of individual state. This will provide skin health care at nooks and corners of each state of India.

If constitutional – will it replace existing clause? Or modify? Give detail of the clause – Not Constitutional

Proposal: Preamble Our programs like IADVL Chala Gaon ki aur being taken up more vigorously by Bihar, the Skin Safar Rath at national level, various programs by Karnataka branch like Charma Ratha and Services by Goa are best examples of IADVL community service. We need to do more. There are 3 Es to make these programs successful. They are Education, Enlightenment and Emancipation of community. Our Skin Safar Rath was a success but it had to miss some part of the country like the upper north and North east thus not reaching the community at large. India is a large country with diverse culture, language and geography. The skin health needs differ from state to state and sometimes within the state. We need to plan our community services keeping these in mind. Some of the state like Karnataka, Maharashtra, Kerala etc. can devise community-oriented programs and sustain them on their own. But there are some states that need help. The branches may not be able to sustain such programs on their own. A well-designed program with cooperation between IADVL central and State branches will serve the targeted population. The states may need help in designing and implementing programs according to their local needs, more so financially.

Suggested areas –

- a) Occupational Dermatoses.
- b) Pediatric Skin Health
- c) Geriatric Skin health
- d) Village adoption
- e) Adopting old age home or Orphanages
- f) Mission Prison (Continuing Project of Dr Kiran Godse)
- g) Special groups- Farm Laboure's, Colliery workers, Construction workers, Tribal community etc.

Proposal

We propose that IADVL central will help branches financially

- 1) In the form of 60:40(60 from state) in case of smaller state with membership of less than 200.
- 2) Branches with membership of 201- 500 will get assistance in the ratio of 70:30
- 3) Those (single) branches with member strength of 501 and more will get at the ratio of 90:10 (501- 11 branches total 24 -7+ 17) An amount of 25-30 Lakhs will be ear-marked for this program.

Conditions

1) All state branches who have conducted DERMACON/ MIDDERMICON since JAN 2015 – till DERMACON2021(including it) will not be eligible. It is expected that they conduct a sustained community based program from the share of surplus received from IADVL central. The following states have conducted either DERMACON or MIDDERMICON from 2015

A Karnataka DERMACON 15 – Mangalore, DERMACON 19 Bengaluru

B Tamil Nadu DERMACON 16 Coimbatore, MIDDERMICON 18 Kanyakumari,

C Orissa-MIDDERMICON 16- Bhubaneswar.

D West Bengal -DERMACON 17 Kolkata,

E Maharashtra-MIDDERMICON 17 Mumbai, DERMACON 20 Pune.

F Kerala -DERMACON 18 Cochin

G Bihar- MIDDERMICON 19 Patna

MIDDERMICON 15- not held (Exemption to DERMICON2021 Hyderabad)

- 2) The project should be submitted to IADVL central by May 31 2021. Apart from the suggested areas any other project by the states is also welcome.
- 3) The projects will be routed through the State branch EC.
- 3) A minimum of 2 projects should be submitted.
- 4) A committee comprising of **A Past president, Present Vice President, 2 members from small branches and one each from middle & large states, one member of CFC nominated by Chairman CFC, Chairman of IADVL Community Dermatology will evaluate the project and report to IADVL EC**
- 5) The amount from central will be released after the state part has been invested and documents produced.
- 6) If the applicants are less the remaining amount will be shared with other applicants with small branches getting preference.
- 7) These programs will, **preferably**, have to be sustained for next 3 years with need-based modifications.
- 8) State executive will be responsible for executing the program with cooperation from sub branches/chapters of the state.

We are sure this scheme will make all branches to take part in community service and we hope the branches will make use of this opportunity. We request the members to agree to this.

Do you think this needs referral to any specific committee?

To be referred to Central Finance Committee (CFC).

CFC Opinion: Community Service by State Branches with Financial help from IADVL- INR 25-30 lakhs / year for next three years to be earmarked for this purpose

- While the Proposal is precisely in tune with the mission statement of IADVL, the major concerns of CFC include
- Practical feasibility of such a nation-wide community program with central state coordination for 3 years
- Lack of clear roadmap of the program for three years
- The budget constrains over the next 3 post Covid years of IADVL with lesser surplus from Dermacons and Mid-Dermacons.
- Level of Industry support not factored in the Proposal
- The criteria of allocation of the funds to states (conduct of Dermacons and Mid-Dermacons in past 5 years) sounds discriminatory but rather should be based on their current Financial strength (Most states are doing well and are self-sufficient)
- However, In view of the merit of the essence of the proposal, the earmarked amount of 25-30 lakhs may be released in stages, 5-10 lakhs in one quarter and the rest released based on
- Response from the states.
- Income of IADVL.
- Covid Situation

Dr.Sanjeev Vaishampayan favoured this proposal, Dr.Todsekar suggested that pharmaceutical companies can also help in these programs by providing medicines directly to the state, Dr.Rashmi Sarkar said that states have to participate actively , Dr.Suresh Joshipura suggested that there is a scope for ILDS funding such projects on request , so this should be considered, Dr. Aditya Mahajan suggested that Media cell should be involved in such projects , Dr. Vikas Shankar and Dr .Mukadam welcomed the project, Dr.Sribiju requested for recommendation from the center for specific projects, Dr. Jayadev Betkerur replied that it should be tailor made for each state according to the need, Dr. Putta Srinivas Rao too welcomes the proposal , Dr.Shashi kumar mentioned this as a novel idea but as larger branches are excluded they may be at a disadvantage and pleaded that they should also be considered, Dr.Bhumesh Katakam favored the move. The Proposal passed with a modification on the conditions barring states who have conducted DERMICON/ MIDDERMICON since JAN 2015 – till DERMICON2021(including it) , instead making all states eligible.

Proposal – 2- Providing social security to all IADVLites by Restructuring of DVL Welfare Trust with contributions by IADVL & IADVL Members

How will it help IADVL?-

This will provide Social benefit and health insurance to all IADVL Members in need of help. It is participatory project where IADVL subsidizes contribution from members

of the clause – To be added to constitution in Annexure XVII: DVL WELFARE TRUST. Page no 125-127

Proposal:

Preamble: The IADVL is caring for its members by providing assistance in time of need of members through 3 different schemes.

1- Member benevolent fund. This fund is for immediate help in case of designated health issues to a member and not for all health issues. The maximum amount payable is 2L. There is no scope for growth of this fund. Thus, the benefit reaches only few members.

2 – Accident Benefit Scheme -The scheme envisages to pay 5 L to a member in case of death due to accident. The total amount ear marked is 30Ls. It also would pay an amount determined by a committee depending on the injury and disability caused. The benefits to a LM are limited as it is only for accidents. Our chances of claiming are remote.

3 – DVL Welfare trust. DVL Welfare trust (DVLWT) is a mutual benefit scheme, like IMA, ISA etc, created by IADVL. It is managed by trust duly registered. It is by IADVL with all trust members being IADVL LMs and the trust is answerable to IADVL. The EC members of IADVL are ex officio members of the trust.

What is to be done?

Any benefit scheme for members of an association should be growth oriented and should be contributory. A little contribution by all makes up to a large amount for those in need. The scheme should become self-sufficient over period of time. The parent organization should have administrative control but leave the day-to-day management to an independent body duly formed by the association. The checks and balances of managing should be well delineated for all to understand and function.

The Need- We need to try and amalgamate all the three (3) schemes and develop a more robust all in one scheme that would benefit all members with a bit of contribution from each member. There has to be well developed mechanism to implement and carry forward the scheme. The role of each has to be defined. Various measures to prevent any misuse or abuse to be put in place. Penalty in case of default is to be defined.

The Scheme. It is continuation of DVLWT with many structural changes.

Membership. - 1- All LMs of IADVL to be made members of DVLWT. (Provided they join by paying the initial amount by 31/3/22. If approved can be extended to 31/3/23)

2- It is by default when PLM converts to LM.

Fees-**IADVL Contribution.**

IADVL pays Rs 40 Lakhs as membership fees to DVLWT every year for 5 years only. Roughly at the rate of Rs 2000 per member considering the strength as 10000 LMs. This is calculated on the basis of average admission fees, through all age groups, as Rs 3000 and IADVL subsidizes it by Rs 2000

IADVL pays 1000/2000 per LM conversion thereafter (Avg 500 conversion= 5L/10L per year) After 4 years The DVLWT will not be given any money.?

Member Contribution Initial Payment

Each LM will pay Rs 1000 + 300 (as administrative Charges) = 1300/- as initial payment from 1/4/21 to 31/3/22. PLMs will pay Rs 1000. + 300 (administrative Charges) = Rs 1300 at time of LM conversion

Annual payment

Rs 500 / death per year as Death Fraternity Contribution (DFC).

Rs 300/- Administrative charges (rent, salary, overheads, the surplus of this will go to Corpus) (To be enhanced every 3 years by Rs 100)

The amount to be collected after 31/3 every year.

Distribution of DFC-Of Rs

500 from members Rs 300 will go to member benefit (300x n)

Rs 100 will go to corpus. (interest gained on corpus will be added to member benefit) (can be reduced to Rs 50) Rs 100 to health insurance (can be increased to Rs150)

Benefit –

1st year (1/4/21 to 31/3/22) will be 5L / death (if the member has not paid the initial amount, it will be deducted from this amount + DFC of that year)

2nd year (1/4/22 to 31/3/23) 300 x n but not more 10 L per death whichever is less. (The amount depends on the IADVL contribution and Number of members joining)

After this it will be 300x n per death or Permanent disability (the 1st two years are to be used to stabilize the scheme). Of the collected amount death benefit and Health benefit can be given and remaining amount goes in to corpus. The Fund grows every year so does the benefit in case of death or permanent disability due to any cause to any LM.

Other benefit- We can provide a health benefit to any member for any cause up to 5L. This is to cover hospital cost excluding drugs. This is irrespective of the illness and any other insurance claimed by the member.

Terms and conditions

1 All LMs will become members of DVLWT from the day they pay the initial amount. From 1/4/2021 if approved. 2 All new conversion from PLM to LM will become members by default. Suitable changes to be made in OMAS and other such procedures.

3 ALL LIFE MEMBERS WILL PAY Rs 1300 IN FIRST YEAR. THOSE CONVERTING FROM PLM TO LM WILL PAY AT THE TIME OF CONVERSION.

4 The DFC amount will be notified in all official social media and through states. No individual notice will be sent. 5 The DFC amount should be paid by 31 Dec of that year. Individual E receipt will be sent to members. The web team will have to work on this.

6- **All existing members of DVLWT are exempted from paying the initial amount. They will be eligible for all benefits**

of this scheme. They will not pay DFC for life time OR an additional 20% to be added to their final settlement. (eg if the final amount is 20Lakhs they will get 24L)

7 The members are eligible for health insurance in following schedule

It will start from 1/4/22 (Till that time the IADVL Benevolent fund will continue)

- a) Claim of less than 1 L – 1 yr moratorium
- b) 100001- 200000- 2 yrs moratorium
- c) 200001 -300000 – 3 years Moratorium
- d) 300001- 500000- 4 yrs moratorium
- e) No member can claim more than twice in their life time and not more than 10L
- f) Any health claim is liable for deduction from their final settlement as follows
- i) up to 200000 – 20% of the health claim ii) 200001- 500000- 30%
- iii) 500001 and more - 40%

eg- if the health claim is 2L we will deduct 20000 from final settlement.(Death/disability benefit)

8) Conditions for defaulters.

- a) A general notice to be sent to all members for making payments in 1st week of Jan.
- b) Individual notice to be sent to defaulting members in April.
- c) If member does not pay DFC for two (2) (e g 1/4/ 2021 -31/3 2023) consecutive years 10% of final settlement to be deducted and non-eligibility to health insurance – (This will stay for 3 yrs. even if full payment is made)
- d) If member does not for pay three (3) consecutive years 25% deduction and non-eligibility to Health insurance scheme - (to stay for 5 years even if full amount is paid)
- e) If not paid for four (4) consecutive years – Termination from scheme.
- f) Readmission only on request and payment of all dues + 20% extra.
- 9 Members can pay amount not less than Rs 10000/- as deposit which will be used to cover their annual fees and DFC. They will be informed once it is exhausted.
- 10 Any member who pays Rs200000 as onetime payment is exempted from paying any dues. 11 Members above 75 will pay Rs 1300 as initial amount and there after Rs 300 per year. They will not pay DFC (The health insurance will be Limited to 5L only)
- 12) Members who pay DFC + Annual fees regularly for 25Yrs (30 Yrs.) or reaches 75 yrs. will not pay DFC after that.

Administration –

- a) The administrative and Financial HQ will be in Vadodara
- b) The IADVL HQ will manage communication with members and general administration.
- c) The account will be in Vadodara as it is registered under Charity commissioner of Gujarat and has some benefits and all settlements to be made from Vadodara office. The official auditor of IADVL will be the auditor for DVLWT. An accounting firm should be used for day-to-day accounting- The rules pertaining to DERMACON accounting apply to DVLWT with regards to all financial matters including Tax issues etc.
- d) The existing constitution of DVLWT to be changed. Suggested changes are
- i) President, Treasurer of DVLWT and Hon Treasurer of IADVL will be authorized signatories for all financial transactions.
- ii) Chairman IADVL CFC will be one of the trustees.
- iii) The tenure and place of President, Secretary, treasurer of DVLWT to be decided. Preferably 2 from Vadodara and one from Gujarat. Other trustees will be on zonal basis apart from previous presidents of IADVL
- iv) Suitable changes to be made in consultation with legal advisor and other experts.
- e) Payment will have to be made as like IADVL OMAS method. All other modes will be removed.

Responsibility – 1) The DVLWT will be responsible for sending notices and receipts. It will be responsible for processing claims and settling claims.

- 2) IADVL central HQ will be responsible for communication between DVLWT and members. All claims will be routed through IADVL.
- 3) State secretaries will forward all claims to IADVL HQ after ascertaining the claim authenticity
- 4) All members or Family of members of LM to approach the state branch secretary with claim form and relevant documents as prescribed time to time.
- 5) All claim amount to be sent to the designated account of member or legal heir by cheque. Money transfer by other modes may be considered.

Problems anticipated –

- 1) Nonpayment of DFC by members. This will be a major hitch. Mechanism to overcome this need to be discussed.
- 2) Administrative work and responsibility is very high. Needs dedicated workers who are experienced in such work. Need to appoint a good team. We can think of appointing retired employees of insurance agencies.
- 3) Disputes due to wrong claims by members and heirs. This will need to be referred to a suitable body created by DVLWT and IADVL. Disciplinary action to be framed.

Viability:

The scheme and returns become good depending on the number of members join. Hence the benefits will have to be worked after the joining period is over.

Suggested Health benefit can be implemented if more than 5000 members join. Or else we have to work out a scheme like IMA scheme with contribution from members depending on age OR we continue with IADVL benevolent fund covering only specified events with no more than 2L benefit

Beneficiary Members. At present there are many beneficiary members in DVLWT. These are spouses and children of members of DVLWT. They have to pay the annual DFC. The facility continues for all LMS but the beneficiary members have to pay admission fees and other fees as prescribed in DVLWT and as and when changes take place.

They will be eligible for all benefits except Professional indemnity and health benefit. They will not have voting rights. All the rules as applicable to LMs apply to them in other matters.

Professional Indemnity - The existing scheme will continue with members paying yearly premium. The premium may be reduced if the number of members increase and also the risk amount (the existing amount is 15L). IADVL or DVLWT will not pay the premium.

Do you think this needs referral to any specific committee? To be referred to Constitution committee and CFC

CFC opinion - recommends that the project may be deferred for 1-3 years in the light of present Financial situation of IADVL and recommends this novel project may be taken up for deliberations at multiple levels involving CFC, DVLWT, EC, Auditor and Experts from the field of insurance before reproposing

Constitution Committee Opinion - The proposal for amendment in the Constitution can be taken up for discussion in the GB

Dr .Sanjeev Vaishampayan raised a concern that expecting members to contribute every year might be difficult, Dr. Raghunatha Reddy mentioned that though the intent is good, putting it to action will be difficult . Dr. Rashmi Sarkar expressed that it may be ideal to think it over a bit more as sustaining the payment from members may be a difficult task. Dr. Ramesh Bhat suggested that let the members pay the initial payment and IADVL pay the annual fees , but Dr. Jayadev Betkerur replied that annual payment will be way too high for IADVL . Dr. Venkataram Mysore said that the complexity of the structure of this program makes the smooth running of this project troublesome. Dr. Jayadev replied that this was well discussed with DVLWT office bearers and they have assured enthusiastic support for this. Dr. Venkataram Mysore also asked the intricacies of GST in this project, Dr. Suresh Talwar raised the concern of every President coming with newer proposals every year might dilute the existing schemes. Dr. Kanwaljeet opined that the scheme is good but requires lot of further deliberations. Dr. Sanjeev Vaishampayan requested to form a committee and to refine the scheme further. Dr. Rashmi Sarkar and Dr. Kiran Godse suggested further fine tuning by forming an expert committee and call for an EGBM in a time of 2 months to discuss this matter. Dr. Sribiju mentioned that similar scheme is very successful in Kerala through IMA.

The house concluded that this proposal has to be further fine-tuned by forming an expert committee and call for an EGBM in a time of 2 months to discuss this matter.

The IADVL-Pharma postgraduate quiz is an important and integral part of IADVL activities. Annexure XIII of the constitution gives a broad framework as well as specific instructions regarding its conduct. This has not been updated since many years, and more clarity is needed. We propose these revisions in order to streamline the guidelines, and make the conduct of the quiz program fairer and smoother. There are some minor changes required in other annexures of the constitution, that are relevant to the quiz program. For example, we no longer conduct quizzes at the zonal level.

Therefore, we propose that the revised annexure XIII of the constitution, which deals with the conduct of the IADVL-Pharma quiz reads as follows:

(the revised portions are highlighted, and the structure is rearranged in chronological order of events with redundant sentences removed)

1. All state CUTICONS shall conduct a quiz under the supervision of the IADVL quiz committee, with the help of the national coordinator, under the IADVL-Pharma banner. States which have less than four teams will participate along with the neighboring state. The quiz finals must be conducted as a plenary session during a prime time of the conference. The preliminary screening test will be conducted as a closed-door session. The time and venue will be announced well in advance. Approximately 18-19 teams who are the winners of their respective state level quiz, will be selected for participation in the national level quiz, conducted during DERMACON. Those teams shall participate in a preliminary screening test. The final four teams will be selected to participate at the national level finals.
2. At the state level, teams representing each academic institution will be invited to register for participation in the quiz program. Only one team is allowed to register per college. This will be done by sending mails to the respective state secretaries, who will inform dermatology HODs of all medical colleges in their state. IADVL PLMs who are PG residents at the time of the upcoming DERMACON are eligible to participate in CUTICON and DERMACON quizzes. The national winners of previous IADVL-Pharma quizzes are not eligible for participation.
3. Quiz masters for each state can be decided by the IADVL quiz committee, with approval from the president and honorary secretary general. They will be invited through the IADVL e-groups and social media. The quiz master for the CUTICON should not be from the same state. Criteria for quiz master selection must be on various parameters such as a good academic background, experience of conducting and participating in quizzes, and interest and commitment to conduct the quiz. A mix of experienced and fresh quiz masters will be preferred for the CUTICONS. Freshers with prior aptitude and experience in quizzing will be given more preference. Quiz masters who have conducted more than three consecutive IADVL-Pharma quizzes will be given less preference.
4. Every CUTICON quiz should have one assistant quiz master as a volunteer, selected from that state to assist the quiz master in conducting the quiz. The assistant quiz master shall be provided complimentary conference registration by the local organizers, but will have to bear their own travel and accommodation arrangements. If there is no assistant quiz master volunteering from the host state, a volunteer from another state may be considered. One of the joint secretaries from the state branch, or a member from the organizing committee of that particular CUTICON must be appointed for the purpose of coordination with the IADVL quiz committee and the honorary secretary general.
5. Quiz masters shall be free to frame their own questions, which should be short, clear, with a single answer and non-controversial. All subspecialties of the subject must be covered in a standardized manner, decided by the IADVL quiz committee. If there are more than four teams at the state level, there will be a preliminary screening test consisting of 30 MCQs, covering all subspecialties. Questions must be multiple choice type, with a single answer only

(no multiple answers), with correct answers carrying 1 point & wrong answers -0.25 points. The last 6-10 questions must be allotted as tie-breaker questions. In case of a tie, the team who answered most tie-breaker questions correctly will be selected. If there is still a tie, the team with fewer negatives shall be selected. In the event of further ties, lots shall be drawn. The top four teams will be selected for the state level quiz finals. The quiz final among the four teams shall consist of eight rounds (namely, 1. Basic sciences, 2. General clinical dermatology, 3. Pediatric dermatology and genodermatoses, 4. Leprosy & STIs including HIV/AIDS, 5. Systemic clinical dermatology, 6. Diagnostics, 7. Therapeutics, 8. Dermatotomy and cosmetic dermatology, in that order) and one rapid fire round. Each round shall consist of four questions. Questions should be a single direct question, and not consist of two parts. The first round will start from Team A, the second from Team B, and so on, while the fifth round will start in reverse order, i.e., from Team D, Team C, etc. A correct answer gets 10 points, while a correctly answered passed question gets 5 points. There is no negative marking. The time for a question is 10 seconds for the primary team; if passed, the secondary team has to answer immediately. In the rapid-fire round, each team would be asked up to 10 questions in one minute. A correct answer carries 3 points. There is no negative marking. In case of a tie, the quiz master should be ready with tie breaker questions, three questions for each team. If there is still a tie, the team that scored the highest in the preliminary screening test will be declared as the winner.

The quiz masters for the national level quiz at DERMACON will be the chairperson and convener of the IADVL quiz committee, selected by the IADVL EC. The national level quiz finals have to be conducted on the second day of the conference (Saturday), as a plenary session at a prime time. A preliminary screening test will be held on the CME day or the first day of the conference. The time and venue will be announced well in advance. It will consist of 40 MCQs, covering all subspecialties. Questions must be multiple choice type, with a single answer only (no multiple answers), with correct answers carrying 1 point and wrong answers -0.25 points. The last 6-10 questions must be allotted as tiebreaker questions. In case of a tie, the team who answered most tie-breaker questions correctly will be selected. If there is still a tie, the team with fewer negatives shall be selected. In the event of further ties, lots shall be drawn. Once the final four teams are selected, the national level finals will be conducted in a manner similar to the state level finals, with eight rounds and a rapid-fire round. In case of a tie, the quiz master should be ready with tie breaker questions, three questions for each team. If there is still a tie, the team that scored the highest in the preliminary screening test will be declared as the winner.

Opinion of Academy:

- As we are no longer conducting quizzes at the zonal level, it might be nice to give a certificate to the state level winners
- If the participating postgraduates complete their course after their state level quiz, they are no longer postgraduates at the time of the national level quiz- The national quiz is held around the end of January or early February. i.e., a few weeks after they complete their residency. Since there is no set syllabus, preparation (as mentioned) may not be possible.
- The residents who complete their residency in December are perhaps the unfortunate lot, not by their choice, as they are forcefully made ineligible.
- The existing clause may continue.
- The national level quiz finals have to be conducted on the second day of the conference (Saturday), as a plenary session at a prime time-
- It maybe restrictive for the DERMACON organisers- sentence maybe reframed as- The national level quiz finals have to be conducted as a plenary session preferably on Saturday.
- The last 6-10 questions must be allotted as tie-breaker questions -The meaning of the sentence highlighted is not clear and may be reframed
- Complimentary registration, travel and accommodation is given to the state level quiz masters in CUTICONS so the same should be extended at the national level too would be best addressed by EC
- Dr.Suneil Gandhi, Chairperson of Quiz Committee briefed about the proposal.He informed that the Annexure XIII in constitution needs to be updated as same has not been done for years. This will help in smooth conduct of quiz for the future committees as well. He informed that PG residents at the time of DERMACON will only be considered. Suggestion was made to reduce negative markings from -0.5 to -0.25. The number of MCQs in prelims be reduced to 40 instead of 50. Tie- breaker questions to be included in the main set of MCQs itself. He also suggested that , both Chairperson and Convener of Quiz committee should be sponsored for finals.

Dr.Raghunatha Reddy opined that this is a well-crafted proposal and should be passed. Dr. Suresh Talwar said that debarring PG residents from AIIMS and PGI is not right. Dr. Suneil reassured that the students are not debarred. The 5th semester students can still participate. He even mentioned that the students from PGI have even qualified for the national finals and so if they are informed regarding this well in advance they can be prepared to participate in quiz in the prescribed time frame. Dr.Saumya Panda welcomed the proposal and opined that it should be accepted in toto. Dr. Soumya Jagadeesan added that this revision is made taking into account various incidents like PG residents those who go for maternity leave appearing twice for the quiz and to avoid such unwanted practices.

Request to modify the said clause as “we shall return the seed money received from IADVL within 10 days from last day of registration along with simple interest prevailing in the nationalized banks on the date of payment of refund.”

CFC Opinion:

Proposal: (It should be properly drafted)

Preamble: The International Leprosy Congress (ILC) is held every three to four years in different parts of the world. The 20th ILC was held from 10-13, September 2019 at Manila, Philippines at which there was good representation from IADVL members with many research presentations.

The proposal to bid to host the **next International Leprosy Congress (ILC)** in India was approved at the CC meet – **IADVL** (August 2019) and it was coupled with the concordance of **Indian Association of Leprologists (IAL)** and **Central leprosy division (CLD/ NLEP)**, Govt of India. Based on these, a proposal to hold the next ILC in India jointly was presented to International Leprosy Association (ILA), under whose aegis, the ILC 2019 was held at Manila. It was accepted by the ILA to allocate the next ILC to India at the concluding ceremony of the 2019 ILC held at Manila, Philippines. The symbolic ‘Key’ to hold the next ILC was handed over to the President of IADVL-2019 Dr. P Narasimha Rao at Manila congress, at the concluding ceremony of the ILC, in the presence of representatives from IADVL, IAL, Govt India, ILEP and others.

Progress made so far:

During the AGBM held in 48thDermacon, January 2020 Pune, the following resolutions were passed: a) It was decided that IADVL would support the proposed ILC, b) a core committee consisting of Dr. V M Katoch, Dr. P Narasimha Rao, Dr Bhushan Kumar, Dr. Sunil Dogra, Dr.Sujai Suneetha, Dr Tarun Narang, Dr. Santosh dev Rathod was accepted along with the President and Secretary General and president elect of IADVL as ex officio members to coordinate and planning for the ILC. C) Proposers were advised to resubmit the proposal for financial support once again.

A regional/ state committee was proposed and formed by Gujarat IADVL to work towards proposed venue for the congress. It was decided that the proposed ILC may be held during last quarter of year 2022 at Mahatma Mandir, an international convention centre, Gandhi Nagar, Gujarat, as it was found most suitable. <http://www.indextb.com/mahatma-mandir/mahatma-mandir.aspx>. The Gujarat team is already actively working to get permissions for the allocation of the proposed venue.

We would like to state that this International leprosy congress (ILC) is unlike other international dermatology conferences (eg: WCD/ ICD) bid and hosted by IADVL. **The salient features of ILC:**

1. The proposed next ILC is **allotted to India**, with IADVL, IAL and Central Leprosy Division (CLD) Government of India/NLEP work together in organising it.

2. It is **purely an academic congress** for upgrading knowledge and brainstorm policy development in leprosy to achieve Zero leprosy goal in the India and world by 2030.

3. ILC actively **involves medical professionals of all branches of medicine working for leprosy: National leprosy program managers of most leprosy endemic countries**, Clinicians and Surgeons (Dermatologists, leprologists, physicians' ophthalmologists, reconstructive surgeons, plastic surgeons, orthopedicians etc), para- medical workers, physiotherapists, nurses and persons affected by leprosy (PAL) through the national and international leprosy organisations / NGOs representing them.

4. The International leprosy association (ILA) under whose banner the ILC is to be hosted, **does not expect any financial returns from the congress.**

5. The lead agencies of the host country are expected to generate fund to conduct the congress. The chief sources are proceeds of registration fee and other donor agencies contribution.

6. It is a **3-day congress which is preceded by 3-4 days of workshops** and focused discussions on programme management issues.

7. **Total expenditure of the conference** is expected to be about 5 crores. (based on the expenditure incurred by ILC congress held at Manila in 2019)

8. Leprosy congress **may attract very little pharmaceutical industry interest** and hence its contribution will be negligible.

9. The administrative and scientific protocols need to be followed under guidance of ILA.

India shares more than 60% of the global leprosy burden and there was a great sense of expectation from all regional NGOS and various ILEP organizations in awarding this congress to India and for IADVL to take a lead as an official partner of NLEP.

The ILC is an opportunity for scientists, researchers, health staff, partners and individuals affected by leprosy to interact, discuss and share experiences in a variety of fields related to leprosy. It would be be-fitting that IADVL contributes whole heartedly to organize this prestigious congress in coordination with IAL and CLD/ NLEP, Govt of India in our country.

Hence, we request the IADVL committees and CC to look at this conference based on this perspective. IADVL/ EC will be given due credit and honour in the organisation of the ILC in the country.

Proposal to GB: We propose that:

An amount of Rs. 50 Lakhs be advanced by IADVL, as one the principal supporting partner towards the planning and hosting of the ILC congress in India, returnable after the conduct of the congress.

Dr.Santosh Rathod requested Dr.P.Narasimha Rao to apprise about the developments with regard to the conduct of ILC. Dr.P.Narasimha Rao briefed the members about the ILC. Dr.Putta Srinivas suggested as there are not many sponsors coming forward for Leprosy congress , IADVL should support with finances . Dr.Rashmi Sarkar also supported the move to sponsor this event. House agreed to contribute 15 lakhs as seed money for the conduct of ILC and Rs. 5 lakhs as scholarships for members. Dr.Jayadev Betkerur submitted ,later the contribution can be reconsidered as per the financial situation of IADVL. Dr.P.Narasimha Rao thanked and humbly accepted the recommendations of finance committee and EC. Dr.Dinesh Kumar supported ECs proposal of providing assistance. MOU shall be signed between the core committee and IADVL and the seed money should be returned with interest.

Proposal: In the wake of COVID 19 pandemic we were forced to think about alternatives for the conduct of business meetings and conferences. IADVL as an association rose to the occasion by converting business meetings and conferences to virtual ones. Nevertheless, we lack clear guidelines / Standard Operative Procedures (SOP) on the conduct of business meetings and conferences and this paved way for some amount of confusion.

Hence, We may propose that it may be incorporated in our Constitution that in unprecedented situations such a matter has to be discussed in the EC & CC and then to be placed in an Extraordinary General Body Meeting (EGBM)

with this matter as the agenda .An appropriate decision on the plan of action taken in the EGBM may be implemented, so that we have clear guidelines on the conduct of business meetings and DERMACON/MIDDERMACON/DERMAZONES when unprecedented situations or natural calamities.

Do you think this needs referral to any specific committee? Constitution Committee & SOP Committee

CONSTITUTION COMMITTEE:

The proposal can be considered in the Central Committee and placed before the General Body for approval.

SOP committee:

- 1.It needs referral to constitution committee as it requires a constitutional amendment
- 2.The proposal/Amendment can specify/define the unprecedented situations such as: pandemic, war/law and order situation, natural calamities The modus operandi of conducting the EGBM in such situations can also be specified in the amendment for better clarity

EC Opinion:

Dr. Jayadev Betkerur and Dr.P. Narasimha Rao opined that we need Clear guidelines and necessary SOP during natural calamities and unprecedented situation like Epidemics/Pandemic in conducting DERMACON/MID DERMACON and Dermazones. Dr.Kiran and Dr. Anuradha supported this move

EC also proposed that it may be incorporated in our Constitution that in unprecedented situations such a matter has to be discussed in the EC & CC and then to be placed in an EGBM with this matter as the agenda. An appropriate decision on the plan of action taken in the EGBM may be implemented.

Comments by CC members-

Dr. Rajeev Sharma said this is the right thing to do. Dr. Asokan suggested that mention should be made that it shall be Virtual EC and CC meet. Dr. Rashmi Sarkar and Dr.P.Narasimha Rao supported Dr.Asokan's suggestion.Dr. Sanjeev Handa suggested to take e- mail approval from members in this situation.

The proposal was passed with the modification “ in unprecedented situations such a matter has to be discussed in the virtual meetings of EC & CC and then to be placed in a virtual Extraordinary General Body Meeting (EGBM) with this matter as the agenda. An appropriate decision on the plan of action taken in the virtual EGBM may be implemented, so that we have clear guidelines on the conduct of business meetings and DERMACON/MIDDERMACON/ DERMAZONES when unprecedented situations or natural calamities.

Proposal: IADVL Constitution mentions in Part 1 Rules and Regulations, clause 17.Funds of Association (page 21) (v)Surplus accruing from all zonal conferences: 50% of the surplus given to the IADVL (Annexure IV). It is mentioned in Part IV: Annexure IV, Clause 2: Conference (page 77) D. 15% of all registrations and 20% of industry stall collection shall be handed over to IADVL as IADVL affiliation fee. This amount shall be divided equally as follows between: i) The organizing state 50% ii) Other participating states 30% (to be divided equally among all the states in that zone except the organizing state) iii) and the IADVL 20%.

But it is mentioned in Part V: Standard Operative Procedures (SOP), Section I: IADVL Finance Funds of IADVL (page 127) A. Surplus accruing from all zonal conferences: The audited accounts of each conference (DERMAZONE)should be submitted to the IADVL and 20% of the surplus given to the IADVL.

There is a noticeable incongruity with regards to the surplus that has to be given to the IADVL and this needs to be clarified and corrected.

Hence we propose that the following should be incorporated in the Constitution:

The DERMAZONE conference savings [Affiliation amount (15% of all registrations and 20% of industry collections)+ surplus] should be divided as follows : i) The organizing state 50% ii) Other participating states 30% (to be divided equally among all the states in that zone except the organizing state) iii) and the IADVL 20%.

Do you think this needs referral to any specific committee? Constitution Committee, SOP Committee & Central Finance Committee

CONSTITUTION COMMITTEE:

The proposal points out the incongruity between the Constitution and the SOP. However, it does not state what is proposed. A proposal (modified version) should be spelt out specifically so that the GB can consider the proposal.

SOP:

1. There is incongruity in different clauses of the constitution regarding surplus earnings from DERMAZONE. The surplus needs to be clearly defined as earnings minus affiliation fee (15% of all registrations and 20% of industry stall collection). Distribution of surplus needs to be defined and incorporated uniformly in relevant sections of the constitution and SOP
2. This proposal will require first referral to finance committee to define the distribution of surplus
3. Since it involves amendment to constitution , it will require referral to constitution committee

CFC:

The DERMAZONE sharing is already approved in AGBM and the same has been followed (As mentioned in SOP and Part IV: Annexure IV) but not reflected in the constitution. The same can be rectified in constitution bringing into the notice of CC and AGBM.

Following sentence need modification as below

Part IV: Annexure IV, Clause 2: Conference (page 77) D.15% of all registrations and 20% of industry stall collection shall be handed over to IADVL as IADVL affiliation fee. This amount The conference savings (Affiliation amount (15% of all registrations and 20% of industry collections) + surplus) shall be divided equally as follows between: i) The organizing state 50% ii) Other participating states 30% (to be divided equally among all the states in that zone except the organizing state) iii) and the IADVL 20%.

EC Opinion:

EC was of the opinion that there is a definite incongruity between the Constitution and the SOP regarding Sharing of surplus amount with regard to Dermazone. This requires corrections to be made in the constitution. Dr. Jayadev Betkerur suggested that necessary changes be made in constitution and SOP and it should be reflected as same in both. Dr. Rakesh and Dr. Anuradha supported this.

CC members comments –

Dr. Rashmi Sarkar opined that necessary changes must be made in the constitution to avoid confusion. Dr. Asokan agreed for this in principle.

The proposal was passed, proposed by Dr. Putta Srinivas and seconded by Dr. Sanjeev Vaishampayan

Proposal: IADVL Constitution mentions in Part 1 Rules and Regulations, clause 17. Funds of Association (page 21)(vi) **Surplus accruing from all national conferences (DERMACON) will be distributed to Host branch 30%, IADVL 15% and IADVL Academy 20%.** This rule will be reviewed every three years. GST and All relevant government taxes have to be paid by DERMACON organizers before submission of audited accounts for DERMACON.

It is mentioned in Part II. Bye-Laws Clause 9. Bidding for DERMACON (page 51) (g) MOU/ Undertaking for conduct of DERMACON (6) We shall return the seed money received from IADVL within 10 days from last date of registration along with 7% simple interest till date. The State branch will contribute 50% and the Centre shall provide 50% of the seed money. 15% of share of total registration fees and 20% total Pharma/Instrument company/trade collections will be minimum assured savings but Organizing Committee shall try to save a minimum 20% of the DERMACON's total receipts. The Minimum assured amount of 15% of total registration fees and 20% of total revenue from pharma & other trade sectors in the industry shall be transferred to IADVL account before DERMACON. Any surplus remaining over this minimum assured amount shall be transferred to IADVL within a month of finalizing the accounts, and not later than next Central Council meeting at any cost. **The Hon. Treasurer shall transfer state branch share of 30% (GST inclusive) of total savings remained after paying all GST and IT as academic grants to respective state.**

But it is mentioned in Part V: Standard Operative Procedures (SOP), Section VIII: DERMACON (page 188) Clause 11: Financial Accounts: **(d) 30% of the surplus if any over and above the minimum guaranteed amount (20% from stall and 15% from registration) given to the organizing state branch.**

Based on the above, we seek a clarification on the following:

. Are the terms "total savings" and "surplus" same?
- (2) 2
. What is the basis of calculation of the state branch share? Is it 30% of the total money transferred to IADVL (Minimum assured amount of 15% of total registration fees and 20% of total revenue from pharma & other trade sectors in the industry and any surplus remaining over this minimum assured amount) OR is it 30% of the surplus remaining over the minimum assured amount?
- (3) 3
. What has been the precedence in calculating state branch share?

Relevant clarifications and corrections based on the above-mentioned queries should be incorporated in the Constitution. Hence, we propose that the following should be incorporated in the Constitution:

Total DERMACON savings (profit) = affiliation amount + surplus

* Affiliation amount = 15% of registration + 20% of other collections (Pharma/Instrument company/trade collections). This is the minimum assured amount to IADVL and needs to be transferred to IADVL account before DERMACON. This affiliation amount is shown as expenditure. If a conference fails to generate minimum assured amount then corresponding amount will be deducted from the state share.

* Surplus = Excess of Income over Expenditure. This surplus amount has to be transferred to IADVL within a month of finalizing the accounts preferable within 1 month but before CCM.

State share of DERMACON

30% (GST inclusive) of total DERMACON savings remained after paying all GST and IT as academic grants to respective state.

Seed money

It's the initial amount paid to OC to meet the expenses. Same amount has to be transferred back to central as soon as possible but before the conference. The amount sanctioned is 20 lakhs from the IADVL Central. State branch will contribute the same amount. Interest is collected on this amount.

CONSTITUTION COMMITTEE:

The proposal points out the incongruity between the Constitution and the SOP. However, it does not state what is proposed. A proposal (modified version) should be spelt out specifically so that the GB can consider the proposal.

SOP:

1. A clear definition of surplus earnings from DERMACON is required as earnings minus affiliation fee (15% of all registrations and 20% of industry stall collection). Further Distribution of surplus needs to be clearly defined and incorporated uniformly in relevant sections in the constitution and SOP
2. This proposal will require first referral to finance committee to define the distribution of surplus
3. Since it involves amendment to constitution, it will require referral to constitution committee

CFC:

The DERMACON sharing is already approved in AGBM at Coimbatore and the same has been followed (As mentioned in SOP and also in IADVL news Vol 12 issue 1, page 34) but not reflected in the constitution. The same can be rectified in constitution bringing into the notice of CC and AGBM. Just to update the followed norms

DERMACON Savings**Total DERMACON savings (profit) = affiliation amount + surplus**

* Affiliation amount = 15% of registration + 20% of other collections (Pharma/Instrument company/trade collections). This is the minimum assured amount to IADVL and needs to be transferred to IADVL account before DERMACON. And this affiliation amount is shown as expenditure. If a conference fails to generate minimum assured amount then corresponding amount will be deducted from the state share.

*Surplus = Excess of Income over Expenditure. This surplus amount has to be transferred to IADVL within a month of finalizing the accounts preferable within 1 month but before CCM.

EC opinion: EC agreed that there is a definite incongruity between the Constitution and the SOP 1. regarding Sharing of surplus amount with regard to Dermacon. Dr.Jayadev and Dr.Anuradha expressed that the same wording/terminology be used in both constitution as well as SOP to avoid confusion and this requires corrections to be made in the constitution. Affiliation term was accepted by ECas the same was also opined by CFC.

CC Opinion-- It was agreed that updating in the constitution was needed in this regard .

The proposal was passed, proposed by Dr .Rashmi Sarkar and seconded Dr. Bhumesh Katakam

Agenda 9 Adoption of the annual report and accounts IJDVL - Dr. Saumya Panda

submitted that publisher was changed to Scientific Scholar and the journal is doing well in all respects. Dr.P.Narasimha Rao enquired about the financial status of the Journal.He informed that there was a deficit of Rs.50,45,000 and financial condition grim and they have to meet the expenses from Fixed deposit of Rs. 1.5 Crore and hence seek support from IADVL, measures shall be adopted to publicise the change in publisher, IADVL website can also be used for the purpose. The report was accepted.

Agenda 10 Adoption of the annual report and accounts of IDOJ

Dr. Sunil Dogra , Editor –in-Chief ,IDOJ submitted that IDOJ was started 10 years back and is now indexed with PUBMED and Scopus indexing is underway. Record number of manuscripts were received in 2020 i.e., 964.On an average 600 copies are printed. He shared about the download statistics of Journal. In the month of January, it was 1,63075.IDOJ printing and postage bill for the year 2020 is Rs.2,850,405. Proposed budget for 2021 is 25 lakhs and editorial office expenses up to 2 lakhs. Plan is to revert to online only if NMC approves for the same . Dr.P. Narasimha Rao requested EC to correspond with NMC to seek permission for exclusive online version of Journal. He suggested IADVL may draft a letter so that IADVL may approach the MCI/NMC so that IDOJ may revert to online only mode.

IADVL Academy Report-Closing year GB Meeting -February 5, 2021

Dr .Deepika Pandhi, Chairperson presented the report. She thanked EC and Academy members. She shared the members of Academy for 2020-2021 ,Dr. Kanthraj GR,Dr .Meghana M Phiske ,Dr. Nilay Kanti Das, Dr. Rashmi Jindal, Dr. Santoshdev P Rathod, Dr. Sumit Sen ,Dr Usha N Khemani .Further she informed that, Midterm Academy Meet was held on 13.06.2020 and Midterm Academy and SIG coordinators meeting was also held on 14.06.2020.

The following were the Academy activities done in 2020 which include more than 50 CMEs.

Academy webinars- 11, Physical meetings by SIGs- 6, SIG webinars- 13+ 11 with states, Eczema and hydration webinars- 2, National vitiligo day e-symposium, E-PEDDERMACON, Laser workshops- 5, PRP Workshops- 4, Hair transplant workshops- 4, Dermoscopy workshops- 3 were completed.

For the post graduates the following programmes were held- PGCON- national, virtual was conducted, PGPDT national- 2 virtual workshops, conducted with SIG Dermatosurgery, Research methodology and how to publish workshop, centrally conducted with SIG DCR, 5 Online Training modules- are available on the web. PG Thesis Grant and PG thesis based award session will be held on 6th in DERMACON, E library provides access to 8 international journals and E-books on web available are -Cutaneous adverse drug reactions and Manual on Dermatophytosis.

•Academy Convener Dr.Dipanker De shared the details of IADVL Research Grants. Seven projects were selected out of the 26 applications received at the IADVL research Grant Jury meeting held during mid-term Academy meeting on 13th June, 2020. He informed that, a total grant of Rs 30,12,403/- has been sanctioned for these. Regarding IADVL Glow derma Research grants- Two projects were selected at the IADVL research Grant Jury meeting held during mid-term Academy meeting on 13.06.2020 and total grant of Rs 9,92,000/- has been sanctioned for these. Till now IADVL funded 52 projects worth Rs.2 crores. He further informed the house regarding-IADVL Postgraduate Thesis Grant- Thirty two applications were received and these were evaluated by the members of SIG DCR. A cumulative amount of Rs 8,36,000 was sanctioned for the same. IADVL Observerships- 10 out of 93 declined offer to join observership due to personal reasons. Due to prevailing circumstances, the candidates can complete observership until 31.07.2021 as per approval of EC 2020, decided during mid-term Academy meeting 2020.

He also apprised the house that 8 new Observership centers were added taking the total to 35 in 2021. Regarding International Dermatopathology Observerships- Six candidates were selected for 2019- 2020 . As none of the candidates could complete their observership. They have been allowed to complete observership in 2021 as per EC decision during mid-term Academy meeting 2020. Hence no new applications were called for 2021.

IADVL Scholarships 2020-2021-129 scholarships were proposed for MID DERMACON ,Chennai and DERMACON, Hyderabad .Amount proposed was Rs. 19,35,000.

IADVL Abbott Researcher award- that the awardees for 2020 are Under 35 category were Dr. Afra T.P and for above 35 years category- Dr. Ramesh .V. was also shared.

•IADVL Training Courses- As per approval of AGBM held during DERMACON 2020 at Pune, IADVL training courses are initiated in Dermatopathology, Hair Restoration, Procedural Dermatology and Pediatric Dermatology. Applications received for centers willing to hold these training courses were evaluated by Academy. All Centers were approved after physical verification. Dr.Deepika informed that Publications included Newsletters by various SIGs .IADVL position statement post lockdown for Dermatology practice was also published. She submitted that IADVL Handbook of Geriatric Dermatology and Handbook on tips for Aesthetic Procedures will be released in DERMACON and for two new books editors were selected based on the applications, for book on Acne Scars Dr. Gulhima Arora shall be the Chief Editor and for the Hand book of Dermatologic

Drug Therapy Dr.P.K.Nigam is the selected Chief Editor. She shared that this year many virtual IADVL Academy Webinars and Daylong symposia /CMEs/Workshops were held and IADVL Aesthetics Online classroom (SIG Aesthetics) for small group was initiated . IADVL digital online modules (12 planned in total). SIG Pruritus and SIG Trichology and Hair Transplantation and Academy sessions on Lichenoid disorders and Non-venereal genital dermatoses/ HIV were held during MIDDERMACON-2020, at Chennai, Tamilnadu (on the web) . PG Thesis based award session was also held. IADVL Academy is contributing as the scientific Committee of e-DERMACON 2021. Pre-conference workshops (14 in number) was held on 31.01.2021 and Half day CME on clinical dermatology, procedural dermatology and STI/ leprosy- 05.02.2021 and Conference- 06.02.2021 and 07.02.2021 is being held.

Twenty four international faculty and several national faculty of repute, including several young colleagues, will be participating in scientific deliberations. This year for Dr. B. V. Satyanarayana Memorial Award 2020 for best thesis, Dr Bhavni Oberoi for the thesis 'A comparison of efficacy of epidermal harvesting system versus non-cultured melanocyte transplant in the treatment of stable vitiligo: a randomized controlled trial is the winner. Award will be given during IADVL Felicitation day at e-DERMACON 2021 on Saturday, February 6, 2021. She apprised

the members that, Clinical research online support group for IADVL members and PGs by SIG Dermatology Clinical Research (IADVL Academy) was initiated. sigclinicalresearchhelpline@gmail.com is the mail for necessary

correspondence. She informed that six SIG s have contributed to the PG thesis topic bank. Since academic activities this year have remained largely on the web, all the activities that were undertaken by the Academy have been hosted on the digital academy platform at <https://iadvl.mediknit.org> .The recordings of the webinars, workshops and e-conferences are also available at the same site. The SIG newsletters, patient information booklets, patient consent forms etc are available at the Academy page of IADVL website <https://iadvl.org> . She requested members to contribute to the Covid registry.ACADEMY ACCOUNT was opened at Chandigarh in July 2020 Operated by 2 persons : IADVL Treasurer & Chairperson/ Convener. Sanctioned Budget 2020 (Total-Rs 1,60,55,665). Income generated by academy was Rs. 67,91,612. Expected income in 2020 from other CMES Rs.12,75,000.

CFC report:

•Dr.Rakhesh SV, Treasurer IADVL & Convener of CFC presented the CFC report. He informed that CFC has recommended to increase the number of members to 11 and to have quarterly meet with organizers of DERMCON. It also recommends to have Financial asset management committee and employ a retired person at HQ for managing accounts. He also announced that adhoc Committees were formed to look into financial investments, welfare schemes and conference accounts of IADVL and to suggest recommendations.

•Following are the recommendations :

•Recommendations for financial investments:

CFC Strongly recommends to seek help of professional financial advisors. Advisor should preferably be on retainer basis. All investment must be done directly without broker/agent. Also recommends to constitute “Financial Asset Management Committee”. Employee should be a retired person (Finance background) in the HQ to manage accounts. Financial Asset Management Committee- This is a Continuous task that needs one to be aware of newer investment avenues and evolving risks.

•9 members committee + 4 ex-officio (President, Secretary, Treasurer & CFC chairman)+ 5 advisors (Past presidents). 6 yrs term, 1/3 of members (3 members) will be changed every 2 years.

CFC Strongly suggest not to invest in equity - to volatility & needs constant supervision.

•Recommendations for Welfare schemes:**•DVL WELFARE TRUST :**

Registered office at Vadodara for financial and administrative work. Corporate office at IADVL HQ for promotional activities, communications, data updating & verification. Committee members-7 trustees, 12 members of Managing Committee, 8 ex-officio members from IADVL EC/Gujarat state branch EC and 4 zonal members. Revamp the committee members to include more new members. We can have separate committee for promotional activities. Vice President or a Joint Secretary of IADVL should be given the responsibility of supervising the DVLWT works in HQ and liaise with the Trustees managing at the Vadodara office. A particular day of the week may be dedicated for DVLWT work in the HQ. Both the teams in two places can have virtual meetings as and when necessary.

Mandatory meetings every 3 months between EC/ DVL subcommittee / DVL trustees should be held

Amount received Rs.50,001 upto Rs.1,25,000 : 2 years Amount received Rs.1,25,001 up to Rs.2,00,000 : 3 years

Possible areas of overlap with Accident Relief Fund:

Blindness, Loss of limbs and Major burn are the three areas where claims may come up under both Benevolent fund and Accident Relief Fund. Therefore, the subcommittee suggests that to be eligible for a claim under Benevolent fund, blindness (partial or total) and loss of limb (single or multiple) must be due to reasons other than RTA or any other kind of injury.

Major burn sustained during a RTA shall not be covered by Benevolent fund and shall be covered by Accident Relief Fund only.

Total Amount of Disbursement

- Claim below 2.0 lakh: full reimbursement
- Claim above 2.0 lakh: 2.0 lakh maximum reimbursement
- The committee suggests that the minimum claim amount should be Rs.25,000/- less than which does not look worth the paperwork & efforts of all officials concerned

PERSONAL ACCIDENT RELIEF FUND (PARF)-

- Inclusions: The Subcommittee suggests that PARF should cover claims arising out of Road Traffic Accidents only as of now. The coverage may be extended to different other types of accidents like regular sports injuries etc. as situation may demand and we learn from experience of running such a fund.
- Exclusions: The Subcommittee recommends that claims arising out of intentional injuries and any injuries arising from participation in adventure sports like bungee jumping, mountaineering, river rafting, horse riding etc. should not be covered under the scheme. The expert committee handling the fund may specify other types of adventure sports injuries in the exclusion list.

Recommendations for Conference accounts

- Uniform conference accounts template is prepared and every organizers has to adhere while submitting accounts.
- Uniform code of conference conducts with do's and don'ts should be prepared by conference reforms committee.
- A deadline should be fixed for pharma collections (Preferable before conference date)
- To impose penalties if deadlines are not met with respect to submission of audited accounts was also suggested.

SOP Committee-

Dr.Shital Poojary submitted the following tasks have been already completed- DERMACON and MID DERMACON bidding proforma and protocol, DERMACON SOP, guidelines for organizing DERMACON international, MID DERMACON ,SOP and state academy SOP. She informed that separation of annexures from constitution was also completed . Opinion was sought from SOP Committee regarding separation of IADVL E- Groups, CC proposals and proposals for combined CC meet and AGBM 2021.

ITAQ report –

Dr.Dipali presented the report. She apprised that ITAQ Liaison cell was formed . Issues addressed in 2020 were pharma companies sponsored webinars attended by non Dermatologists and notices were sent to pharma companies not to circulate scientific material among non Dermatologists. Regarding Non Dermatologists as speakers clarification was putforth that only MCI or State medical recognized faculty should be enrolled as speakers. Certificate course training for MBBS , Plastic surgeons and Dentists was aborted with the help of State representatives, fake profiles on Practo were addressed, official warning was issued to practicing Cosmetologist in Assam.

Quiz Committee-

Dr.Sunil Gandhi submitted that flexiquiz software was finalized. Warm-up quizzes were conducted in October in all states. Actual state quiz was conducted 2-3 weeks after the warm- up quiz. He informed that state level quiz was completed by Dec 15 th and National prelims was conducted on 24 th January. He announced that finals will be conducted by him self and Dr.Sowmya Jagadeesan on 6th feb during e- DERMACON. He also announced the winner of the Monthly ACAD cracker being conducted by Dr.Anuradha .K.Babu will be announced in the ACAD meeting.

The preparation of the budget for the year 2020-21 was a novel experience. Matching the income predicted for the year

which was not quite different from the previous years with the burgeoning expenses of the association was a cumbersome task. The unpredictability of the finances owing to the ongoing pandemic were not helpful either. The total income projected for the year 2020-21 was INR 5,55,66,972. The Uncertainty in the contribution from the DERMACON, MIDDERMACON and DERMAZONES were most disturbing. The increasing expenses on Website expenses (INR 10,00,000), the ever-increasing IDOJ expenses (INR 32,00,000) and the proposed Presidential Community project (INR 30,00,000) was met with some cost cutting measures on the Office Logistics, Office expenses, EC Physical meeting expenses, expenses of committees of which funds were unutilized the previous years. Like the previous year, the fund allocation to Academy including the E – journal subscription was INR 1.55 crores and that to the member Beneficiary schemes of the Benevolent Fund and Personal Accident relief fund, together was year marked as INR 50,00,000, this year too. The total projected expense for the year 2020-21 was INR 5,57,71,120, resulting in a negligible deficit which could not be avoided, in view of the lowered income and raising expenses for the upcoming year.

Dr Deepika Pandhi Academy chairperson said digital academy platform amount will be included in academy budget. Dr P.Narasimha Rao suggested in ILDS ,to pay for only LM's. Dr Rashmi Sarkar ,president elect and Dr Venkatram mysore also had similar opinion but since amount is already paid for the year 2021 ,decided to implement it in the following year.

As the discussion went on that number of members will not be able to be reduced once added ,Dr Venkataram Mysore clarified that we can write to them that there is difficulty in paying annual subscription due to COVID situation and can ask for reducing the numbers but better let it not be below 9000 members.

President Dr Jayadev Betkerur appreciated Dr Kiran Godse Past president for collecting 2.3 crore rupees to IADVL (central share)in this difficult COVID times . He also thanked the academy and opined some more can be saved from GST. About 50 lakhs of GST refund of Bengaluru DERMACON is also expected to be saved through the conduct of e-DERMACON 2021 and this was appreciated by President and all other members.

Dr P.Narasimha Rao appreciated the budget and suggested to cut down the expenses by looking into the expenditure during previous two years and then form the budget for the following year. Dr Joshipura told more amount is spent on CC meeting as it will be physical meeting for which President answered it can be adjusted from sponsorships.

Dr Keyur asked whether for accident fund it is premium or total amount which is paid to the claimants and also about the application format for which secretary clarified it is total amount and not the premium and till now there are no claimants for accident fund , one claim was received for benovelent fund and application format is in the IADVL website. Budget passed. Proposed : Dr P.Narasimha Rao seconded : Dr Keyur

•Mid-DERMACON 2021 : Dr Ramesh Bhat said with great enthusiasm that it will be conducted like DERMACON,for 3 days.He put forward for approval of the EC few points like free registration for faculty,organised medicine,quiz,felicitation of teachers and dermatologists who worked in COVID wards.

Dr Deepak parikh appreciated the capabilities of Dr Ramesh Bhat in conducting the conference and suggested to make it hybrid which was supported by Dr Nayan Patel and Dr Shyamanta Barua for which President replied it has to be worked out depending on the situation at that time.

• How will this help IADVL?

This proposal is vital in maintaining the trust of ordinary members of IADVL for functioning of the association. It will help preserve the very heart of the association which is, welfare of its members and providing service to the field of Dermatology. This proposal seeks to undo the proposal in the previous AGBM which defies all standards of justice, transparency and 'wider deliberation before decision' which requires changes in the constitution of IADVL.

Decision regarding the issue of giving life membership to CPS and FCPS diploma and degree holders taken in last AGBM is full of flaws due to following reasons which ideally should have been discussed beforehand.

1.Said proposal was passed during IADVL AGBM held in Pune in presence of very few IADVL members.

2.Proposal itself was pushed through at the end moment without any prior notice to members (it was not part of circulated agenda of meeting).

3.Do proposals which require constitutional changes in IADVL and concerned state IADVL branches need not be passed

through EC prior to discussion in AGBM? (what is the stand of IADVL constitution on this?)

4.As clearly mentioned in the proposal that CPS course is present since the last 100 years. If IADVL has not considered giving them membership since 1973 what has changed overnight which makes it an urgent matter which was neither circulated first to members nor passed through EC?

5.As mentioned in the minutes of meetings of said AGBM, proponent of proposal has mentioned that legal advice has been taken to address any future litigations. Why document of that legal advice was not attached with the proposal? Do other state branches not reserve their right of legal advice as they are also going to be affected by this proposal?

6.As mentioned in the proposal, it was stated by proposers that this proposal was unanimously passed by IADVL-Maharashtra branch during AGBM. Do other state branches who are also going to be affected by this proposal not reserve the right to discuss this matter in their respective state branch AGBM before being taken up in National IADVL?

7.Those having financial and personal conflict of interest in the matter under consideration were also a part of proceeding when the same was discussed and passed. Is it not desirable standard for reputed institute like IADVL that any prosper disclose their conflict of interest before moving proposal of such magnitude? Was any disclosure made by proposer? At least it is not part of minutes of meeting.

8.A widely circulated message on social media has mentioned that the meeting in question was a floored one with members being present only to support the cause of CPS getting Life Membership. Is this in any way ethical? Does this uphold the values and dignity of IADVL?

9.As mentioned in minutes of the meeting during which this proposal was passed there are already 500 CPS diploma and degree holders practicing in Maharashtra. This number is going to increase with each passing year as greater number of CPS degree holders will be added in practice. Majority of CPS members are practicing in Maharashtra and some are practicing in other 3 states like Gujarat, Rajasthan and Orrisa. Giving life membership to CPS candidates with voting rights will disproportionately increase the voting share of Maharashtra and to some extent of the three other states. Will this not affect all future election process of IADVL be it post of office bearers or venue of IADVL events? Does this not require at least deliberation by states where CPS is not recognised? will it not be prudent to take in principal approval of those state branches before discussing this at national IADVL level?

If constitutional – will it replace existing clause? Or modify? Yes, Give detail of the clause page no. and clause no. Page number: 9; Clause Number 4(a) Proposal:

We recommend to undo the changes made in clause number 4(a) of IADVL constitution during last AGBM held during DERMACON-2020, Pune. Candidate with degree DDV diploma awarded by The College of Physicians and Surgeons (CPS) of Mumbai must not be made life members of IADVL.

Following answers were given as the opinion of the EC:

1. Said proposal was passed during IADVL AGBM held in Pune in presence of very few IADVL members. Answer : The quorum was full ;in the absence of the quorum the general body shall be adjourned for 40 minutes and then proceed . The combined CC and GBM was initiated only after forming the quorum hence allegation were ruled out.-(as per part 2 bye laws of constitution)

2.Proposal itself was pushed through at the end moment without any prior notice to members (it was not part of circulated agenda of meeting).

Answer : All proposals were floated before hand in IADVL website and newsletter much before DERMACON 2020 for the members so kindly refer to it and so the allegation is baseless.

3.Do proposals which require constitutional changes in IADVL and concerned state IADVL branches need not be passed through EC prior to discussion in AGBM? (what is the stand of IADVL constitution on this?)

Answer :All proposals are discussed by the EC and constitutional committee before placing on website.Constitutional committee opined to discuss it in AGBM and abide by the decision of the house.

4.As clearly mentioned in the proposal that CPS course is present since the last 100 years. If IADVL has not considered giving them membership since 1973 what has changed overnight which makes it an urgent matter which was neither circulated first to members nor passed through EC?

Answer :All proposals were circulated to its members well before ,it was taken up in the AGBM and passed through the EC.

5.As mentioned in the minutes of meetings of said AGBM, proponent of proposal has mentioned that legal advice has been taken to address any future litigations. Why document of that legal advice was not attached with the proposal? Do other state branches not reserve their right of legal advice as they are also going to be affected by this proposal?

Answer :The proforma of the proposal that had to be discussed in AGBM does not demand attachment of any document

of legal advice and hence deemed unnecessary.

6.As mentioned in the proposal, it was stated by proposers that this proposal was unanimously passed by IADVL-Maharashtra branch during AGBM. Do other state branches who are also going to be affected by this proposal not reserve the right to discuss this matter in their respective state branch AGBM before being taken up in National IADVL? Answer :The officials of the concerned state should have gone through the proposal that was floated in the website and taken necessary actions to safeguard their interests if any.

7.Those having financial and personal conflict of interest in the matter under consideration were also a part of proceeding when the same was discussed and passed. Is it not desirable standard for reputed institute like IADVL that any prosper disclose their conflict of interest before moving proposal of such magnitude? Was any disclosure made by proposer? At least it is not part of minutes of meeting.

Answer :Disclosure of conflict of interest is not mandatory while placing proposals to be discussed in AGBM and this accusation may be discarded.

8.A widely circulated message on social media has mentioned that the meeting in question was a floored one with members being present only to support the cause of CPS getting Life Membership. Is this in any way ethical? Does this uphold the values and dignity of IADVL?

Answer :IADVL cannot shoulder the responsibility of bogus social media messages. The dignity and ethics of IADVL cannot be questioned in such incidents.

9.As mentioned in minutes of the meeting during which this proposal was passed there are already 500 CPS diploma and degree holders practicing in Maharashtra. This number is going to increase with each passing year as greater number of CPS degree holders will be added in practice. Majority of CPS members are practicing in Maharashtra and some are practicing in other 3 states like Gujarat, Rajasthan and Orrisa. Giving life membership to CPS candidates with voting rights will disproportionately increase the voting share of Maharashtra and to some extent of the three other states. Will this not affect all future election process of IADVL be it post of office bearers or venue of IADVL events? Does this not require at least deliberation by states where CPS is not recognised? will it not be prudent to take in principal approval of those state branches before discussing this at national IADVL level?

The officials of the concerned state should have gone through the proposal that was floated in the website and taken necessary actions to safeguard their interests if any.

also the victory or defeat of the candidate or venue in IADVL elections is not determined by voting share of a particular state as IADVL is an association which very boldly, strongly and truly upholds the value of democracy.

So the opinion of EC is Once the opinion is passed in AGBM it does not hold merit to discuss again unless there is any fresh or new point that could not have deliberated upon when it was approved. The proposal was placed in the agenda and circulated to the members well in advance. The points raised at this point of time can very well be raised in the Pune AGBM .The members challenging the approved proposal could have attended and raised the points at that time .All the members attended from Gujarat , some who were also CC members and past presidents of IADVL preferred to remain absent in the meeting and thus have been to have concurred in Pune.It is the bounded duty of every member to attend the AGBM and participate in the discussions.

The sanctity of decision of the AGBM is lost if the revisit of the proposal was allowed just for some members who did not participate before approval of the proposal then there will be series of proposals to undo the passed proposals in previous AGBM in every AGBM thus making the mockery of the supremacy of AGBM

The president and the honorary secretary have received emails from at least 20 candidates who have not received NOC from Gujarat IADVL state secretary for life membership.

Correspondence from the National IADVL on this matter did not receive any response from Gujarat IADVL which is not appreciable.

Proposal was sent to constitution committee and it had opined that this proposal for amendment in the constitution can be taken up for discussion in the GB.

Dr J K Patel and Dr Khalil agreed to EC and opined to reject the proposal outrightly. Dr Nayan Patel presented the proposal once again. Dr Vinay singh said if it is not recognised by the national body then it may not be considered but

suggested for electoral vote pan India. Dr Sharmila said all of them have put hard work and were dedicated in CPS course so they should be considered for LM. Dr Rashmi Mahajan opined that they have not trained as we train regular DVL and MD students with adequate beds for the speciality with all training facilities so it is not correct for them to come to our level. Dr Nitin Dhepe said deciding about medical license is not duty of IADVL, it is for the authority of state or national body and state is autonomous, IADVL has no right on this, so

if any additional qualification of dermatology is there they can be life members. Dr Jithendra modi suggested to forward this to arbitration committee. Dr P. Naarasimha Rao past president opined that this problem is there for last 10 years, all were ALM's having all facilities except voting rights and contesting for elections. Once it is passed in AGBM it cannot be revoked so put up in next AGBM with fresh proposal and take it in right spirit. Dr Sardesai agreed to Dr P. Naarasimha Rao.. Dr Torsekar said not to fight against this rather fight against quackery, these people are trained for 2 years in the speciality, hence should be considered. Dr Rashmi Sarkar President elect opined that these are trained well, they have been given LM in other specialties look at it objectively without hurting anybody's sentiments' Nayan Patel said that in other specialties it is recognized by MCI and would be legal issue if they perform procedures in any workshops. It was decided by the president Dr Jayadev Betkerur to form a committee to look into this matter comprising of Vice President Dr S Vaishampayan, 2 members from Gujarat and Maharashtra and 2 members from States other than Gujarat & Maharashtra and review with the opinion of the Committee in 3 months, if it is agreeable then it may be implemented otherwise it can be discussed in next AGBM.

The conditions of eligibility for candidatureship Hon. Secretary General needs to be revised in order to ensure ample experience in administrative matters of IADVL.

Modify the existing clause:

Page 19, Part I Rules & Regulations, Clause 24: Conditions of eligibility for office bearers, Subclause (c) Honorary Secretary General and Honorary Treasurer (vi)

Proposal:

IADVL Constitution in Page 19, Part I Rules & Regulations, Clause 24: Conditions of eligibility for office bearers, Subclause (c) Honorary Secretary General and Honorary Treasurer (vi), states that

(c) Honorary Secretary General and Honorary Treasurer

(i) Should be member of the Association in good standing for the previous five years during which period he/she must have had no outstanding dues to the Association.

(ii) Should have a minimum experience of ten years in the specialty of dermatology, venereology and/or leprology after having taken his/her postgraduate qualification in the specialty.

(iii) Should be exclusively engaged in the practice, teaching and/ or research of the specialties of dermatology, venereology and/or leprology.

(v) The Honorary Secretary General and the Honorary Treasurer must be proposed jointly from the same zone (as defined in Annexure IV).

(vi) For Honorary Secretary General: Must have been actively involved in the affairs of the Association in an official capacity either at the central level as Joint Secretary/Vice President/Honorary Treasurer or in the branch/combined branch level as Honorary Secretary/Vice President/President or a Central Council member from the branch for a minimum period of two years either continuous or with breaks.

We feel that the condition of eligibility of minimum period of two years as a Central Council member is insufficient and may not provide the required exposure to central administrative matters of IADVL which is mandatory to hold such a responsible post. Moreover this condition of eligibility is the same as that prescribed for the post of Joint Secretary as well. Hence we propose that the condition of eligibility of a minimum period of two years as a Central Council member should be deleted in order to ensure ample experience in handling central office affairs for a candidate contesting for the post of Hon. Secretary General.

Do you think this needs referral to any specific committee? Please note that EC may decide to refer if it thinks it is necessary. Yes, Constitution Committee and SOP Committee

Constitutional committee opined to take up in GBM for discussion.

SOP committee opined it is a constitutional change that needs to be decided by GB and does not require comment from SOP.

Dr Venkataram Mysore ,Dr Raghunath Reddy and Dr Sheetal Poojary agreed to the proposal but Dr Nitin vora said it will narrow down the scope for the members to get into hierarchy of IADVL for that Secretary replied that there will not be any difference between Secretary and Joint Secretary criteria. Dr Sheetal said Secretary post is very vital and hence this proposal should be accepted and Dr Raghunath Reddy opined to pass the proposal.

In order to avoid undue advantage during election campaigns and to ensure dedicated service to office affairs any member who holds a responsible post in a state branch, IADVL Academy, SIG or IADVL Standing Committees should resign from that post before submitting the nomination to contest in IADVL elections.

If constitutional – will it replace existing clause? Or modify? Give detail of the clause: page no. and clause no.

Modify the existing clause: Page 20, Part I Rules & Regulations, Clause 25: Procedure for election of office bearers

Proposal:

The office bearers of IADVL are expected to deliver a dedicated service while in office. Holding a key responsible post in state executive committee might gift an undue advantage during election campaign and also divide their attention towards official affairs during their tenure.

Hence we propose that any member who holds the post of President/ Vice-President/ Hon. Secretary/ / Joint Secretary/ Treasurer in a state branch, Chairperson/Convener of IADVL Academy, Chairperson/Convener of SIG and Chairperson/Convener of IADVL Standing Committees should resign from that post before submitting the nomination to contest in IADVL elections.

Do you think this needs referral to any specific committee? Constitution Committee & SOP Committee

Constitution Committee Opinion: The proposal for amendment in the Constitution to be taken up for discussion in the GB

SOP committee :This is constitutional amendment does not require comments from SOP committee. Discussion : Dr Sheetal P said it is partially correct ,at state level there may not be much influence and senior experienced members will be restricted for standing in elections hence should be modified. Dr Joshipura gave an example of Dr Jayadev Betkerur who has resigned the post before contesting for president post ,so it is very important proposal.Dr Deepak Parikh said that he fully concur with the proposal,now as it is digital even state position also will influence pan India so this proposal has merit and it is acceptable but clear deadlines to be given and secretary replied that they should resign before submitting the application. Dr Venkataram Mysore strongly supported by saying it is very good and long overdue , it is nightmare to election officer if contestant holds various posts. Dr Bhumes k asked about the stand in holding posts in sister societies, they can also influence the voters.. Dr Deepak Parikh also suggested to take undertaking from the office bearers that they should not contest for election next one year to any post because at the middle of the year if they resign EC has to hunt for another executive,and sister societies will not come into picture ,it is the contestant who should

withdraw from that position. Dr Rashmi sarkar said that whoever is organising DERMACON should not be allowed to contest that year because they might have an undue advantage .Dr Shashi said the work will be hampered if any state executive resigns in the middle . Dr Venkataram Mysore said it is the principle ,not the convenience. Also discussion took place among Dr Raghunath reddy ,Dr Shashikumar, Dr Narender Patwardhan,Dr Venkatram Mysore,Dr Dinesh,and Dr SureshTalwar and opined that IADVL platform should not be used for campaigning. One law for every post is the opinion given by president.

How will it help IADVL? There are many rules and regulations in our constitution which are very ambiguous and many repetitions. This makes it difficult to implement these rules. Removing these and correcting will help in easy understanding of our constitution

If constitutional – will it replace existing clause? Or modify? Give detail of the clause

Proposal: After going through our constitution it has been found that some rules, regulations and clauses are vague leading to ambiguity in interpreting them.

e.g page 12 Rule 8 cessation of membership. It mentions that the recommendation from state should go to Central Council.It does not mention the central EC at all. However the recommendation of state branch should come to Central EC for placing before CC. Many such mistakes exist.

These needs to be found and corrections suggested. These suggested corrections, after approval by GB, may be worded accordingly with help of legal experts to make our constitution more easily understood and implemented. Misinterpretations and controversies can be minimized

It is to be noted that only ambiguities in the constitution are to be corrected. In SOPs which have been separated from the constitution necessary changes may be made after correcting the constitution.

Do you think this needs referral to any specific committee? To be referred to constitution committee

Dr Deepak Parikh agreed. The new constitution committee formed headed by Dr Venkataram with Dr Anuradha as convenor will come out with recommendations by CC meet.

How will it help IADVL?

Social Media is growing rapidly in today's era, so is the dermatological presence in the social media and other online public platforms. The contents posted in these platforms by one IADVL Member on another which are defamatory or

malicious in content or can have a negative influence on electorate are not looked into by any committee or body as the Constitution mentions only IADVL platforms. These posts are noticeably on the increase. It would be appropriate if we could have a Supervisory Task Force within Media Cell dedicated to

evaluate and give recommendations should such a complaint is made on such contents related to negative campaigning or derogatory posts that hurt any individual dermatologist at professional or personal level on Social Media such as Facebook, Instagram or What's app or any Forum in Public View. The task force would be empowered to evaluate such a complaint, check its veracity and recommend necessary action. This is much needed in an active and vibrant association like IADVL which is an academic body.

This should also be included in Model Code of Conduct in Elections for both candidates or other members of IADVL.

Yes, modify-Rules and regulations, Clause 25: Procedure of Electing Office Bearers: Model Code of Conduct in Elections
Change in IADVL Media Cell

Proposal: We, herein, propose a Supervisory Task Force in Media Cell which, only if requested for help by any IADVL member, will evaluate such a complaint, check its veracity and recommend necessary action in order to streamline the negative contents posted on the online platforms, and hence maintain the peace and unity under IADVL. The posts could be defamatory, derogatory, malicious, hateful or bearing a negative influence on the electorate from one member to another during elections or otherwise on social and public platforms. This cell would be working pro-actively, and be as a support system to all the IADVL members when something goes wrong in any social media platforms. This task force can also be approached by members during IADVL Elections.

Do you think this needs referral to any specific committee? No

Constitution committee : opined that since election officers is empowered to take cognizance of these matters, it is better to do modification of powers of election officer.

SOP committee : SOP should be framed only after GB approves for formation of Supervisory task force.

Dr Rashmi Sarkar clarified that anything on IADVL platform will be taken up by the election officer but in other media blaming and shaming is going on which is not good of an individual and the organization, hence such a task force formation is required and is very much the need of the hour.

Dr P.Narasimha Rao opined that IADVL can control it on only IADVL platform and during elections and malicious propaganda also should be taken into consideration. Dr Vaishampayan suggested to have a task force to take care of all these issues and recommend suitable action. Dr Deepak Parikh also opined how to implement it because election officer has all the powers, so it should work under election officer and this committee should send recommendations to election officer then election officer should take the action and that there must be a mechanism to support the official from IADVL. Dr Suresh Talwar suggested to define SOP as no SOP is done in this regard and election officer should have all powers, all points to be mentioned in SOP which should be made and signed by the candidates. Unjustified personal attacks are there on our official members like editors of journals should have back up and support of IADVL, as opined by Dr Rashmi Sarkar and Dr Deepika Pandhi.

Dr Jitendra modi said that any negative message in social media against our members should be enquired by the committee rather than ignoring it. Dr Venkataram Mysore gave suggestions to discuss the disciplinary issues and to involve ethics committee.

Hence president opined to form Election task force if GB approves that can be ratified in GBM and CC. Ethical committee will look into ethical matters and form recommendations in a few months time and SOP committee will be asked to form SOP. Agreed upon to form election task force.

Proposal: We, herein, propose the immediate implementation of 2 modifications for IADVL Academy for transparency and breaking long cycles into smaller parts in the future. This is for more inclusivity and giving a chance to a wider range of IADVL members. The two amendments which must be included are mentioned below.

1. The selection of IADVL Chairperson and Convener should be by applications as in all other academic posts in IADVL like journal editors. The method of choosing them could remain the same. This may be called just before their tenures are decided. This would be more inclusive in a large association.
2. A cooling off period of 2 years should be given to the Convener in case he/she reapplies so that a very long period of 5 years does not occur. No other academic period is in continuity for 5 years beginning from Convener Select. Do you think this needs referral to any specific committee? No, it was already part made and presented in CC meeting of 2017 but has not been implemented. It needs to find a place in the IADVL Constitution.

Constitution committee : opined this proposal calls for amendment in constitution committee and hence it has to be rewarded and made more specific. Also it should be noted that IADVL academy review task force had recommended a review of academy every 4 years and it is due this year.

Academy comments : Followed transparency , members are selected on applications on merit basis giving more importance to zonal representations and opportunities to all IADVL members. Chairperson and convener selection was based on criteria laid down which was not included in constitution. Task force to be formed , reviewed and also the recommendations to be included in the constitution.

President opined that academy task force 2021 is already formed this year and this proposal will be referred to it and act accordingly on their recommendations, put to EC and CC.

How will it help IADVL? Brief introduction.

Under byelaws 5a and b, presently , the quorum for CCM is only seven, of which only three should be other than office bearers. For GBM, it is only 40. Even if this number is not there, there is a provision for the meeting to be adjourned for half an hour and held thereafter.

These numbers for quorum were written decades ago, when the number of members was probably hardly 1000. Primarily the quorum is meant to ensure that the decisions taken by an organization truly represent the opinion

of the members. If it is too low, there is a danger that a small group of members with a single point interest may attend the meeting and manage to get a favourable decision by majority. Now the number of LM itself has increased to above 10,000. Increasing it proportionately would mean 400 for GB. However increasing to that much may mean practical difficulties in hall space.

If constitutional – will it replace existing clause? Or modify? Give detail of the clause – Yes; page 27; Clause no. 5 a and b under byelaws(IADVL Constitution 2020, (Incorporated up to Combined Central Council and Annual General Body meeting 2020 Commencing year)

Proposal:

We propose to

- a) increase the minimum number for quorum for GB from 40 to 100;
- b) Increase the minimum number of quorum for CCM from 7 to 15, with at least 10 members who are not office bearers
- c) Delete the condition that if quorum is not there, the meeting can adjourn for 30 minutes and can be reconvened. It is against the spirit of the rule and has no legal validity.

Do you think this needs referral to any specific committee? Constitutional committee

Constitutional committee :11(a) and 11(b) for amendment in the constitution can be taken up for discussion in GB and 11(c)is not legally valid ,proposal does not mention the action to be taken after 30 minutes of lack of quorum and GBM not held due to lack of quorum will also be not held at later date for the same reason.

Dr Rajesh verma opined to increase the quorum and it is very valid proposal.Dr Raghunath Reddy agreed but ways of implementing has to be seen but in principle he agreed, and Dr Joshipura agreed and said since members of IADVL has increased ,so quorum has to be increased and Dr Jithendra modi also agreed and had same opinion. Dr Venkataram

Mysore said the first part to be accepted and current system to be continued. Dr Amit Madan and all others opined that to make mandatory for CC members to attend GBM. Dr Deepak Parikh said to reimburse money of CC members only if they attend the meeting.

President opined that legal opinion will be taken and also see the rules of other associations, then it will be discussed later which was agreed upon by the proposer Dr Asokan.

TWO ITEMS included with permission of chair

1) Editor elect of IDOJ : Selection committee was formed with 2 past presidents, Dr Ramesh Bhat and Dr Yogesh Marfatia, and 3 past editors - Dr Uday Khopkar, Dr Ramam, Dr Shyam Verma and evaluated the applications and selected Dr K.A. Seetharam as editor elect of IDOJ.

2) President IADVL is given a facility to represent IADVL on international forum and due to unprecedented situation due to COVID immediate past president and secretary could not avail this privilege, hence expressed to the house to make it this year. Dr Deepak Parikh suggested to attend the meetings separately in different meetings to discuss IADVL matters which was agreed by all.

Academy proposals were supposed to be presented by Dr Dipanker De Academy convenor but President said to proceed to academy budget presentation as it was gone through them earlier.

So Academy budget was presented by Dr Deepika Pandhi, Academy Chairperson. Proposed budget for 2021 was 1,51,06,000. Approved

Communication with states

The SOPs for SIG meeting with a state, brief SOP for partial assistance for any SIG activity conducted with a state branch and the yearly Academy activities timeline were shared with the state president and secretaries. They were also requested to share names of 2 nominees from their state for receiving access to e-library. We have received nominee details from 18 state branches so far.

IADVL Observerships

Observerships are given at each centre for a duration of 4 weeks (and a stipend of Rs 10,000), for IADVL LMs or PLMs aged less than 35 years and for a duration of 2 weeks (without a stipend), for IADVL LMs aged 35 years or above. 93 candidates were selected (81<35 years of age, 12>35 years of age) for 2020. There were 10 withdrawals and only 8/83 completed their observerships. Due to prevailing circumstances, candidates were given extension until July 31, 2021 to complete their observership as per approval of EC during mid-term Academy meeting on June 13, 2020.

For observerships in 2021, we received 217 applications for 35 IADVL observership centers. Eight new centers were added this year whereas 2 existing centers dropped out. A total of 107 candidates (89 < 35 yrs and 18 > 35 yrs) were selected. Of them 79/ 89 and 17/18 respectively have confirmed their slots for Observership 2021. Five of these candidates have completed their observerships. A Whatsapp group has been started for ease of communication which include the program directors, observers, the Academy chairperson, Academy convener and coordinators of the observership program.

IADVL International Dermatopathology Observerships

Six candidates were selected for International dermatopathology observerships for observership in 2020. None of them could proceed. They have been allowed to complete observership in 2021, as per EC decision during mid-term Academy meeting 2020. Consequently, no new applications were invited for observership in 2021.

PGCON 2020 could not be held in the selected venues (as under) due to the ongoing Pandemic. Instead, a two-day centrally organized PGCON was held on the web. As per approval of EC and AGBM, the same venues will hold the PGCON 2021.

Venue and organizing states for PGCON 2021 are

1. PGCON North- Dehradun (IADVL UP and UK).
2. PGCON South- Mysuru (IADVL Karnataka)
3. PGCON West- Jaipur (IADVL Rajasthan)
4. PGCON East – Kolkata (IADVL West Bengal)

The state branches have been requested to suggest tentative dates after consultation with the constituent states for respective zonal PGCONs. Three zones have communicated the tentative dates and they are to be finalized. Modality of holding them will depend on the circumstance at that time.

PG Thesis Based Award Session

The postgraduate thesis-based award session was held on 06.02.2021. Ten selected abstracts were presented. 1st prize of Rs 10,000 each was awarded to Dr. Prateek Mohta Rajendra (Guide - Dr. Sujay Khandpur), 2nd prize of Rs 8,000 each to Dr. Durgamadhav Tripathy (Guide- Brig Dr S. Radhakrishnan), 3rd prize of Rs 5,000 each to Dr. Namrata Singh (Guide- Dr. Sanjeev Handa).

Dr B.V. Satyanarayana Memorial Award for Best Thesis

This award was presented to Dr. Bhavni Oberoi for the thesis 'A comparison of efficacy of Epidermal Harvesting System versus Non-Cultured Melanocyte Transplant in the treatment of stable vitiligo: A Randomized Controlled Trial' under the guidance of Dr. Sukriti Baveja.

IADVL Training course in sub-specialties

IADVL EC 2020 and AGBM of commencing year approved IADVL advanced training courses in Hair restoration, pediatric dermatology, dermatopathology and procedural dermatology. Applications were invited from centers interested in imparting these training courses. Four centers, one each for four sub-specialties, were selected after evaluation by members of the IADVL Academy and physical verification of the centers. The program directors of the selected centers are- Dr Bhumesh Kumar Katakam (Pediatric Dermatology, Gandhi Medical College/ Hospital, Secunderabad), Dr Kavish Chouhan (Hair restoration, Dermaclinix, New Delhi), Dr Sachin Verma (Procedural Dermatology, Skinvita Clinic, Kolkata) and Dr Venkataram Mysore (Dermatopathology, The Venkat center for skin, ENT & plastic surgery (Venkat Charnalaya), Bengaluru). After selecting centers, applications were invited from the members. There was an overwhelming response. The applications have been evaluated by the Academy members and selection of 2 candidates for each center has been made.

IADVL Abbott Researcher Award

This award is given for published research original research articles with a cash prize of Rs 25,000 each for one researcher below 35 years of age and one above 35 years of age, along with a certificate. The evaluation was done by Academy members using a pre-decided scoring sheet. Awards were given during e-DERMACON 2021, to Dr Afra TP (<35yrs) and to Dr Ramesh V (>35yrs).

ONLINE TRAINING MODULES

Online training modules were initiated in 2020. Of the planned 12 modules, 6 have been completed and the remaining ones will be completed this year.

Online Classroom Teaching- Aesthetics

These classes are intended to be interactive- hence a limited number of members are selected to attend each workshop on first come first served basis. Six such OCTs are planned this year.

SIG- dermatology clinical research has four modules for these workshops- one day Research Methodology Workshop & half day How to Publish Workshop, one day How to Publish Workshop alone, one day Research Methodology Workshop alone and critical appraisal workshop. The state branches have been requested to communicate their willingness to hold one of these workshops.

e-Dermatology e-seminars

The announcement and application format for the taskforce was finalized by Academy. Applications were subsequently sought for becoming members of the e-Dermatology taskforce. The selection committee shall finalize the members of this group.

IADVL Acne CMEs

Applications were sought from IADVL members to become member of the Acne Taskforce that will carry out 10 CMEs on acne. The selection committee shall finalize the members of this group.

IADVL Aesthetics hands on Workshops - 5 workshops have been planned for 2021

IADVL Recalcitrant Tinea CMES - 4 CMEs have been planned for 2021.

IADVL Chronic Pruritus CME - These were initiated last year and only 1 could be conducted before imposition of lockdown. These will continue in 2021.

SIG Pigmentary Disorders CME - Ten CMEs were planned and initiated in 2020. Four could be completed and 6 remaining CMEs will take place this year.

IADVL Eczema initiative - This was initiated in 2020 and was launched on National Eczema week starting September 13. Webinars, postgraduate activities, posters and patient education are part of this initiative. Remaining 8 webinars will take place in 2021.

SIG Trichology CMEs - 10 CMEs have been planned for 2021.

GA²LEN Allergy Schools

These are teaching programs including tests, lectures and workshops with interactive discussions including but not limited to the latest advances. GA²LEN faculty, both international and national, brings the expert knowledge and latest information on urticaria.

The two classes (approximately 3 hours for each class) this year are scheduled on July 4 and July 18, 2021.

Scientific session at MIDDERMACON

The Academy finalized the scientific details of two 90 minutes sessions for MIDDERMACON 2021 (September 3-5, 2021) at Mangaluru on COVID and skin and Small molecules in dermatology. The SIG Dermoscopy and SIG Neglected Tropical Diseases will hold two sessions. They will prepare scientific content of a 1-hour session, each.

IADVL SIG Activities

1. Five SIG Sessions of 1 hour each were held by SIG Aesthetics, SIG Dermatosurgery, SIG Leprosy, SIG Leprosy and SIG Pediatric Dermatology during e DERMACON 2021.
2. All the SIGs prepared the roadmap for the ensuing year and the roadmaps were discussed during IADVL Academy- SIG Coordinators meeting that was held on the web on 25.02.2021. These roadmaps have been evaluated by the Academy based on the evaluation criteria. The Academy comments are collated and communicated to the respective SIGs.
3. SIG Dermatopathology and SIG Dermatosurgery prepared newsletters that were published.
4. SIG Dermoscopy and SIG Leprosy have drafted newsletters that have been reviewed by IADVL Academy and are under production.
5. SIG leprosy has prepared very useful videos demonstrating exercises in patients with foot drop in leprosy and also on general awareness about leprosy.
6. Fourth and concluding workshop on Basic Hair Transplant by SIG Trichology and Hair Transplantation with co-opted members was held on December 20, 2021.

7. The third IADVL Dermoscopy workshop by SIG Dermoscopy and co-opted members on mucosal diseases was held on January 10, 2021. The fourth and concluding workshop on therapeutic dermoscopy was held on February 21, 2021.



IADVL Academy -e DERMACON 2021

As the IADVL Academy were the scientific committee of e-DERMACON 2021 in coordination with Organizing Committee, ie. The IADVL EC 2020, as per mandate of CC and EGBM; the latter part of the year was quite busy with activities for all members of IADVL Academy. Within a short span of time, the scientific program was formulated comprising of 14 workshops in 4 parallel halls on January 31, half a day of CME and 2 days of conference; the whole program spanning over more than 170 hours. Twenty-five faculty from USA, Europe, Australia, Brazil, Kuwait and SAARC countries participated. The list of international speakers included a the then current president of AAD and an author of a chapter in Rook's Textbook of Dermatology. More than 400 national faculty of eminence and repute participated in a relatively short notice. All the constitutionally mandated sessions like Orations, award paper sessions, thesis-based award paper sessions were held following protocol. A record number of >1700 abstracts were submitted.

Coordinating in physical meetings is something that is relatively easy to handle and coordinating on the web is quite challenging. The academic coordinators who were the members of IADVL Academy and the technical coordinators were joining in from thousands of kilometers away. All credit for smooth running of the sessions goes to these coordinators of the sessions. The teams met several times over zoom sessions that lasted several hours, drafted a common work flow for each session and executed the sessions with perfection and punctuality. The conference went well without glitches. Total of 3 and 8 CME credit hours were awarded by Delhi Medical Council for the workshop and Conference respectively.

CONSTITUTION COMMITTEE

An email group and a whatsapp group were formed for all official communications of the committee

Constitution Committee is assigned the task of updating and refining the IADVL Constitution as envisioned by Dr Jayadev Betkerur, President IADVL-2021 and approved in the Combined CC and AGBM, Commencing Year 2021.

A virtual meeting was organized on 13th February 2021, with an agenda of addressing the ambiguities and duplications in IADVL Constitution & SOPs. As an outcome of this meeting following roadmap was designed:

- *Members of Constitution Committee and SOP Committee to choose their areas of interest*
- *Meanwhile receive the minutes of combined CCM & AGBM held during e-DERMACON 2021*
- *Members of Constitution Committee and SOP Committee to work in a buddy system -Teams of 2 members (1 each from Constitution & SOP committees) with the same area of interest to be formed to identify the issues in the concerned parts of Constitution / SOPs and to come up with recommendations for corrections.*
- *Compilation of the work done by all teams to be completed and presented in a meeting by the end of April 2021*
- *First draft to be ready by June 2021 and preliminary report to be submitted to Executive Committee*
- *This draft to be presented in CCM in August 2021 , contentious issues to be discussed by the CC*
- *Final draft to be presented in next AGBM*

Dr Deepak Parikh, Dr Subodh Sirur and Dr KHS Rao were inducted as advisors. Members were asked to choose specific areas of interest to ensure efficiency and also to establish expertise. Topics in Constitution & SOP were divided based on the preferences of the members.

Members of Constitution Committee and SOP Committee went through their respective topics, identified duplications as well as ambiguities and came up with suggestions for rectification of the flaws. The suggestions put forward by the members were discussed. We are happy to inform that all members have submitted their assignments. The final report will be ready in two weeks ahead of schedule. We thank the members of both Constitution & SOP Committees for their active participation in accomplishing this task.

Also, a matter regarding the use of terms “Bye laws” and “Rules and Regulations” in the Constitution was discussed in the Constitution Committee. An expert opinion on this was also sought from the advisors. The advisors

recommended that we retain only the term “Bye-laws” in the Constitution and omit the term “Rules and Regulations” as this will achieve clarity and avoid confusion. The Constitution Committee unanimously agreed on this. Thus a recommendation that the Constitution should retain only the term “Bye laws” for all its clauses and omit the term "Rules and Regulations" was put forward to the EC to seek the opinion of the legal advisor of IADVL to further clarify this recommendation before presenting it to the General Body meeting. We thank the President and Hon. Secretary General for their support and encouragement.

2. The national group was announced and a what's app group was formed for smooth functioning.
3. A nation wise engagement of Dermatologist during World Skin Health Day, where in IADVL in association with ILDS and ISD observed World Skin Health day on 6th April. IADVL National Executive Committee, State Branches and Media cell committee and all the members organised various activities all over India as Guided by IADVL.
4. IADVL in association with IADVL Media cell, planned for a week-long activity starting from 6th April to 13th April.
The aim of World skin Health day is to promote awareness about skin diseases and importance of skin health across the globe and educate people on the same.
5. We ran skin awareness campaign spread over a week long activity involving around 14000 dermatologists across the country. The state branches and members contributed on conducting these activities.
6. The following programs were conducted:
 1. Press meet and Press release: IADVL initiated awareness by talking about general skin health in 157 newspaper articles. Also involving digital media where around 50 articles were printed. Both print media and digital media highlights on awareness activity was focused.

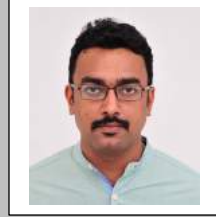

Since DERMICON 2024 is already allotted to Hyderabad, there won't be an election of Venue for DERMICON this year.

- Last date for bidding for MIDDERMICON 2023: 15-06-2021 midnight (11.59 pm)
- Last date for withdrawal of nominations/bids: 15-07-2021
- Announcement of valid candidates/bids: 16-07-2021
- Last date of submissions of objections (if any): 31-07-2021
- Opening of e-voting: 01-10-2021, 9 am
- Closure of e-voting : 15-11-2021 , 5 pm
- Counting of e-votes: 21-11-2021
- Filing of objections about results, if any, to Election Officer: 22-11-2021 to 27-11-2021
- Declaration of results on e-groups and website: 28-11-2021

ELECTION IF NO APPLICATIONS: If there is no applicant for a position on 15th June 2021, the announcement will be repeated on 16th June 2021 with 1st July 2021 being the last date for application only for those posts for which there were no applications.

If there are no applications for any post even after 1st July, the returning officer will announce a fresh election process during the CCM for the vacant posts/venues with the last date for filing being 30th November 2021. The Returning officer will declare the final list after verification by 10th December 2021. If there is more than one application for any post/venue, then election by voting by secret ballot will be arranged during closing AGBM during DERMICON 2022 on the day of the CME from 11 am to 2 pm. All eligible voters can cast their vote after verification of their membership and photo identity proof by the Returning Officer. The counting will begin immediately on conclusion of the voting process at 2 pm and the results will be announced in the closing AGBM. The entire process will be under the supervision of the Election Officer.

CODE OF CONDUCT:

a) Candidates should not seek endorsement from State or Zonal branches. This clause however does not apply to cities bidding for MIDDERRMACON.

b) Candidates/Individual members cannot use IADVL National or branch organs like e-groups, web forums, official whats app groups etc., for canvassing. Canvassing by any State branch or branches or by any official group of IADVL members individually or collectively for any candidate shall not be permitted. However, in case of bidding cities, the concerned state can use its official group for motivating its members about the city as the bid for the city is an official bid approved by AGBM. Official group is a group which is constituted for purpose of IADVL administration, either by secretary/treasurer /SIG/academy /any other committee /taskforce at state or central level.

c) All candidates are expected to campaign gracefully, maintaining decorum and shall avoid the following: abusing other candidates, showing bias against gender, offering enticements/gifts/abuse of EC/election officer

Biodata: The biodata (not exceeding 200 words), photograph and declaration of conflict of interest of all candidates will be sent along with the election materials to all eligible voters. It will also be displayed on the IADVL e-portal, circulated through IADVL e-groups / Whats app groups and printed in the IADVL Newsletter to be released in the IADVL CCM-2021 before members cast their vote. Contestants will be provided a complete list of e voters. Biodata should be placed in all official groups by the secretary generals of state and centre, multiple times; every month on a fixed day starting from August to November

. The information to be provided for cities is mentioned separately in this document

a. Candidates for the post of IADVL President Elect (2022) will be invited to attend the IADVL CCM at their own expense and will be given an opportunity to address the CC members for 5 minutes each.

b. The bidding team for MIDDERRMACON 2023 will be invited to attend the CCM at their own cost and make presentation of 5 minutes each.

c. If anything in the biodata submitted by a contestant is proved to be false, that candidate's election will be declared null and void by the Election Officer as per the process mentioned in the constitution

d. Violation of Code of Conduct: Any candidate violating the code of conduct will be subject to punishment as below:

a. The matter will be referred to the Election Officer; this may be done either by the Returning Officer or by a candidate directly through an email providing full details of their allegation, Oral complaints/whats app complaints with out any details will not be recognised

b. The Election Officer will enquire in to the issue and take any of the below actions if the complaint is found to be valid, and after giving adequate opportunity to the candidate to explain:

i. issue a private warning letter if it is a first offence or a minor offence (in the opinion of the Election Officer);

ii. issue a public warning (announcements in IADVL e-groups and WhatsApp groups for a second offence or a larger offence (in the opinion of the Election Officer)

iii. disqualify the candidate for a third offence or a second larger offence (in the opinion of the Election Officer).

e. Violation of code of conduct by general members: If a general member who is not candidate, violates code of conduct, then the election officer can take the following actions against such members depending on the seriousness of the offence. A. Warning privately. B warning publicly. C. Removing his name from all official groups. D. Recommending any of the following actions to be taken by the AGBM: Barring him from casting his vote/holding any position in any committee/ Barring him from contesting elections for any period Suspending from membership.

This procedure shall be completed within a period of ten days. The decision of the Election Officer is to be considered final and should not be discussed publicly. In case of disqualification, the disqualified candidate will have the right to appeal against the decision of the Election Officer to an Arbitration Committee, which shall be constituted by the President as per the provisions of the Constitution. The Arbitration Committee shall give its decision within one week and that decision will be final and binding. The candidate or any member on his behalf cannot raise the issue with

the members in any of the IADVL e-groups.

A duplicate set of nomination papers and all enclosures should be sent simultaneously to **Dr. DEVESH MISHRA**, the Election Officer so as to reach him by midnight of 15th June 2021. Applications received after midnight of 15th June 2021 or incomplete applications will be rejected. (Nomination form attached)

Election Deposit: They should pay the nomination fee by a DD in favor of "IADVL" payable at New Delhi or by electronic payment to IADVL, Account number **00000033582784962**, State Bank of India (Ansari Nagar branch, New Delhi-110016), IFSC code- **SBIN0001536**. The application fees for various posts are Rs. 25,000 for the post of President Elect, Rs. 15,000 for each post of Vice President, and Rs. 7,500 for each post of Honorary Joint General Secretary. If the nomination is withdrawn before 15th July 2021, the last date for withdrawal of nominations, 50% of the nomination fee will be refunded. After that date, no refund will be made under any circumstances.

1. CONDITIONS OF ELIGIBILITY FOR OFFICE BEARERS:

The candidate should be a permanent resident of India continuously for the last 5 years to be eligible to contest elections in IADVL with exception for those institutional employees who go on deputation/fellowship. In such cases, the duration of deputation should not be more than 2 years during the past five years.

The secretary of state branch should certify in a specific letter about each candidate's Membership duration, place of residence and practice, specific previous positions and dates these positions. Position should mean Elected position- president, secretary, treasurer, vice president, joint secretary, and executive committee member. Membership of committees, positions in conferences, advisor positions are not eligible. Some states are using the term managing committee member (which may be appointed member)- this is not acceptable. All state branches should use the same terminologies as in the constitution.

Any member who holds the post of President/ Vice-President/ Hon. Secretary/ / Joint Secretary/ Treasurer in a state branch, Chairperson/Convener of IADVL Academy, Chairperson/Convener of SIG and Chairperson/Convener of IADVL Standing Committees should resign from that post before submitting the nomination to contest in IADVL elections. (as per resolution passed in AGBM Commencing year 2021)

A. PRESIDENT ELECT:

1. Should have completed TEN YEARS as a member of the Association in good standing during which period he/she must have no outstanding indebtedness to the Association.
2. Shall have completed a minimum experience of 15 years in the specialty of Dermatology, Venereology, and/or Leprology, after having taken his/her post-graduate qualification in the specialty.
3. Shall be exclusively engaged in the practice, teaching and/or Research of these specialties of Dermatology, Venereology and/or Leprology.
4. Must have been actively involved in the affairs of the Association in an official capacity either at the National level as Vice-President, Honorary General Secretary or Honorary Treasurer or at the state Branch/Combined Branches level as President. The tenure of these positions should have been completed at the time of application.
5. The candidate must declare any conflict of interest as mentioned in the application form.

B. VICE PRESIDENT:

1. Should have completed SEVEN YEARS as a member of the Association in good standing during which period he/she must have no outstanding indebtedness to the Association.

2. Shall have completed a minimum experience of 10 years in the specialty of Dermatology, Venereology and/or Leprology after having taken his/her post-graduate qualifications in the specialty.
3. Shall be exclusively engaged in the practice, teaching and/or research of the specialties of Dermatology, Venereology and/or Leprology.
4. Must have been actively involved in the affairs of the Association in an official capacity either at the National level as Honorary Secretary General or Honorary Treasurer or Joint Secretary or at the state Branch / Combined Branches level as President or Vice President or Secretary or a Central Council member from the branch for a minimum period of five terms either continuous or with breaks. The tenure of these positions should have been completed at the time of application.
5. The candidate must declare any conflict of interest as mentioned in the application form.

C. JOINT SECRETARY:

1. Should have completed FIVE YEARS as a member of the Association in good standing during which period he/she must have no outstanding indebtedness to the Association.
2. Shall have completed a minimum experience of 5 years in the specialty of Dermatology, Venereology and/or Leprology after having taken his/her post-graduate qualifications in the specialty.
3. Shall be exclusively engaged in the practice, teaching and/or research of the specialties of Dermatology, Venereology and/or Leprology.
4. Must have been actively involved in the affairs of the Association in an official capacity either at the National level or at the Branch / Combined Branch level or a Central Council Member from a Branch for a minimum period of TWO YEARS either continuous or with breaks. The tenure of these positions should be complete at the time of application.
5. The candidate must declare any conflict of interest as mentioned in the application form.

Disclosures of conflict by candidates:

- a) It is expected that office bearers in key positions devote their full attention on administration of IADVL EC/organizing DERMACON or MIDDERMACON. Full commitment for one year is expected.
- b) Each type of conflict- other association/organization, conference, pharma- need to be declared explicitly in a separate form. The form also should state that they will resign from those positions (see below) on election.
- c) In case of cities, the conflicts need to be declared by the Organizing Chairperson, Secretary, Treasurer and scientific Chairperson. These are to be uploaded on website and should be visible on clicking by voters.
- d) Since secretary and treasurer hold two year terms, they should declare their conflicts annually to the EC and to AGBM.
- e) If in any situation that an office bearer wishes to organize an event during his/her term, appropriate approval must be taken from EC and the same needs to be later communicated to CCM /AGBM

II. PROCEDURE FOR ELECTIONS OF OFFICE BEARERS:

1. The Electoral Roll will consist of all direct life members of the Association and members through a state branch or combined state branch who have registered for e voting on or before one week prior to the voting day and who have no outstanding indebtedness to the Association.
2. The candidates proposed for various posts shall conform to the requirements laid down under Rule 26 and should also pay the nomination fees mentioned above.
3. They shall be duly proposed and seconded by members in good standing who have no outstanding dues to the Association. The application should bear the candidates' willingness and signature.

III. WITHDRAWAL OF NOMINATIONS: The last date for withdrawal of nominations will be 15th July 2021. This shall be indicated in the information sent by the Honorary Secretary General to the nominated member. Non-receipt of a letter of withdrawal from the candidate by the Honorary Secretary General shall be considered as acceptance of the nomination by the member.

IV. VALID NOMINATIONS:

1. The Honorary Secretary General shall send a list of nominated members to the Election Officer by 16th July 2021.

The Honorary Secretary General shall also inform the same to all the valid candidates by that date.

2. In case more than one candidate is found nominated for the post of President Elect, and more than two candidates each for the post of Vice Presidents and Honorary Joint Secretary General, a secret e- voting process must be undertaken to elect the office bearers concerned.

3. Any candidate who has any objections about any other candidate or about the process of election in any way should intimate the same to the Election Officer by 31st July 2021, so that the same can be taken up in the Central Council Meeting (CCM) of 2021. No objections either about candidature or election process or any other issue shall be entertained after this date.

V. BALLOT AND E-VOTING:

1. No ballot will be dispatched as IADVL has only e-voting, which will be conducted through IADVL Website.

2. The members shall cast their votes through the web portal integrated to the IADVL website. The member has to sign up and then log in to their profile in the website. Brief biodata of contestants will be displayed on e-portal before a member finally casts his vote electronically

VI. DECLARATION OF ELECTION RESULTS: The official declaration of the election results will be after 7 days of counting the E- votes by the Election Officer on e-groups and same will be available on website as well. The number of votes polled by various contestants shall be announced and subsequently published in IADVL News. It should also be conveyed to the contestants, various state branch secretaries and Editor of IJDVL and IDOJ. In case of any unprecedented situation like the present pandemic leading to risk of travel and or travel restrictions, Election office may decide for a virtual counting of votes, after approval from EC and ratified in CCM/GBM.

VII. ELECTION RESULT DISPUTES AND ARBITRATION: All disputes arising with regard to the results of election of office bearers should be lodged with in specified dates as mentioned above. Election officer will adjudicate on the issue. Any candidate who is not satisfied with the decision of the election officer may ask for the matter to be referred to the Arbitration Committee as. The decision of arbitration committee shall be final and binding

VIII. Complaints:

All complaints should be made by email, in the prescribed format (uploaded in the website). These need to be sent both to returning officer and election officer. On receipt the Returning officer will acknowledge within 12 hours. A decision will be taken within 48 hours and communicated. If the decision is not possible in that time, then the same will be communicated to the complainant, mentioning more time is needed.

Disrespect towards election officer and returning officer: The election officer can take the following actions against a candidate or member. A. Warning privately. B warning publicly. C. Removing him from all official groups. D. Recommending any of the following actions to be taken by the AGBM: Barring him from casting his vote/holding any position in any committee/ Barring him from contesting elections for any period Suspending from membership

MIDDERMACON

(a) Any state branch wanting to hold MIDDERMACON 2023 must call its GBM, and, by a majority vote, pass a resolution to that effect and decide the names of the Organizing Chair person, organizing Secretary, Treasurer and Scientific Chairperson of the Local Scientific Committee. The Organizing Secretary must be from the city where the MIDDERMACON is to be held.

(b) The state branch shall send the bid proposal to host MIDDERMACON to the Honorary Secretary General of IADVL two and a half years before the proposed conference only after the above procedure.

(c) The official bid for holding MID DERMACON shall be given to the Honorary Secretary General on the letterhead of the state branch, with the signatures of the President and Secretary of the branch, and the prescribed proforma (containing the details regarding the facilities available in the city and the suitability of the city for hosting DERMACON) duly filled in .

(d) Application of bids to hold the MIDERMACON 2023 should reach the IADVL Honorary Secretary General by 15th June 2021. If there is only one application for MIDERMACON, then the President, President-Elect, Past President and Hon. Secretary General shall visit the venue and report to CCM which meets in August. If the venue is not found suitable for MID DERMACON then the CCM can discuss other options.

(e) After a careful scrutiny of proposals for venue, all eligible venues shall be included in the ballot paper and the venue shall be selected by election process.

(f) All those involved in the conference arrangement, i.e. office bearers, shall disclose any conflicts of interest, including financial or any other relationships with manufacturers of commercial products (including drugs, equipment, and services) in their presentations on the conference.

PART-II BIDS INVITED FROM IADVL STATE BRANCHES TO HOST MIDDERMACON 2023.

Bids are invited from IADVL State Branches to host the 11th MIDDERMACON in 2023. Preference in the bids would be given to smaller cities of India. However, if no suitable bid is received from such smaller cities, it can be allotted to any city. When held: Ideally in August 2023

How to bid for MIDDERMACON 2023: Application of bids to hold the 11th MIDDERMACON 2023 should reach the IADVL Honorary Secretary General by 15th June 2021. As applicable to executive committee, members of same family (first degree) can not occupy five key positions in organizing committee ; organising chairperson, organizing secretary , chairman scientific , secretary scientific and treasurer

Organizing team consisting of organising chairperson , organizing secretary , chairman scientific , and treasurer should provide their membership Details, place of Residence and practice, experience as dermatologist and IADVL member, Previous organizing experience in conferences and administration in IADVL . Their conflicts should be declared as mentioned.

Guidelines of conduct of MIDDERMACON 2023:

1. Duration: Two consecutive days (a Saturday and Sunday).

2. Saturday: First day CME on topics of Clinical Dermatology. SIG groups will be involved. A parallel workshop can be organized.

3. Sunday: Second day of conference. The local scientific team will be the main planner of the scientific program. The IADVL Academy of Dermatology and Special Interest Groups (SIGs) would coordinate and help the local scientific team in its implementation.

Each of the above is to help and benefit IADVL member during any personal crisis or tragedy. Both these funds are through internal accrual while Professional Indemnity is in association with National Insurance Company limited.

IADVL BENEVOLENT FUND

IADVL Benevolent Fund is to extend solace and support to IADVL members who have undergone the misfortune of being afflicted by serious disability/ prolonged illness. The disability or ailment should be due to diseases or mishaps that are not self-inflicted. The intent of the fund is to provide emotional and financial assistance and a helping hand at a critical time. The objectives of this scheme will be to provide financial support to the deserving members in the case of invalidation or in the event of their suffering any injury or physical disability or unforeseen misfortunes like prolonged sickness leading to premature retirement. The support will be extended in the form of one-time payment to a maximum of Rupees 2 lakhs per member as per set guidelines.

Following is the list and definition of critical illness/disability eligible for grant of Benevolent Fund:

1. Stroke resulting in paralysis: Defined as a cerebrovascular accident or incident producing neurological sequelae of a permanent nature, having lasted not less than six months.
2. Chronic renal Failure: End stage kidney failure presenting as chronic irreversible failure of both kidneys to function, as a result of which regular renal dialysis is initiated or renal transplantation carried out.
3. Major Organ Transplant: The actual undergoing of a transplant as a recipient of one of the following human organs: (a) Kidney, (b) Lung(s), (c) Liver, (d) Heart, (e) Bone marrow
4. Blindness: The total, permanent and irrecoverable loss of the sight of both eyes.
5. Major Burns: Third degree burns covering more than fifty percent (50%) of the Life Assured's body surface area
6. Amputation of limb: Amputation of one or more limbs warranted due to conditions other than accidents.
7. Any other medical conditions deemed to result in a permanent or partial disability / COVID 19 infection requiring intensive unit care

IADVL PERSONAL ACCIDENT RELIEF FUND

IADVL Personal Accident Relief Fund is to provide support to IADVL members who have undergone the misfortune of being a victim of an accident. The objectives of this scheme will be to provide financial assistance to the deserving

members who meet with accident and get incapacitated temporarily or permanently or to the spouse/legal heir in case of death of a member in an accident. The support will be extended in the form of one-time payment to a maximum of Rupees 5 lakhs per member as mentioned below:

- (a) Accidental death– Rupees 5 lakhs
- (b) Loss of two limbs or two eyes or one limb and one eye/ Permanent total disablement – Rupees 5 lakhs
- (c) Loss of one limb or one eye/Permanent partial disablement – Rupees 2.5 lakhs
- (d) Hospitalisation expenses (If none of the above claimed) – Rupees 1 lakh

MODE OF DISBURSEMENT OF BENEVOLENT FUND & PERSONAL ACCIDENT RELIEF FUND

Aggrieved member can send the duly filled application form through their branch /City unit to State President/Secretary who shall forward to IADVL President / Hon. General Secretary. Upon receipt of the application an Expert Committee duly authorised by the IADVL Executive Committee headed by the President of IADVL shall evaluate and approve the same based on the merit of the case. The approved fund can be electronically transferred only in the name of the affected member whose PAN card is verified.

PROFESSIONAL INDEMNITY INSURANCE POLICY

A specially tailored Professional Indemnity Insurance Policy with NATIONAL INSURANCE COMPANY LIMITED is available for all IADVL members, who can be enrolled directly to get certified policy. Many dermato-surgical procedures are covered under the policy. The annual premium is as low as Rs 885 for coverage upto Rs 25 lakhs. There are four slabs and members could choose based on their degree of exposure.

REPORT ON PRESIDENTIAL PROJECTS

The IADVL AGBM had approved 2 presidential programs; The IADVL Community service project and the 3 books to be published.

The 2nd wave of the pandemic has brought many restrictions and change in the needs of community. Hence it was decided to make the approved IADVL Community Service project to IADVL Service for COVID19 pandemic. We are all aware of the havoc caused by COVID19 pandemic in India. Our health system is facing severe resource crunch. The manpower is overstretched, equipment are inadequate compared to cases. There is shortage of personal protection equipment for HCW. There are many more deficiencies. There is urgent need to do something to reduce the burden by providing some assistance from IADVL.

As Presidential project a Community service program by IADVL was approved for 2021 with budget of 30Lakhs. The central IADVL is willing to help the states, through this PRESIDENTIAL PROJECT, financially in any community program that your state wants to take up regarding our fight against COVID19. It could be providing Equipment, PPE materials, assistance of any other type. The program has to be based on local needs of which the local branch will be aware of or can get the information. They will know the local vendors of these materials. The national EC cannot procure and distribute to states due to logistic difficulties of transport and delivery.

The IADVL EC has decided to part finance the state branches where the state branch is willing to participate by contributing from their branch and ready to procure required material. They should also plan the distribution of the material procured.

The assistance will be 30% of your budget limited to a maximum of 2L per state branch. The total amount sanctioned is 30L to be distributed among all state branches.

The suggested models are.

1) Procure materials and distribute to all hospitals and health care centers. The issue will be the amount required will be huge and materials supplied will be limited.

2) Adopt one local Govt health care center such as A district or taluk level hospital, missionary hospital or NGO run not for profit hospital involved in COVID19 care. The branch can choose one hospital per district. The branch can supply all materials required by these selected hospitals. Here we can provide more materials which can be used effectively. Distribution of material is easy and monitoring the usage is possible.

However the mode of assistance is completely for the branch to decide.

You are requested to expediate this program and propose your detail plan of action, source and amount of state contribution, budget, invoices and bills for the Central IADVL to release the amount.

We request the state branch officials in cooperation with their members to make a sincere effort for success of this program that will be a small service in these very difficult times. We will also consider your branch activity in this project for best branch award during DERMACON 2022.

The process of publishing 3 books is underway. The Editorial board has been selected. We had called for authorship for all the 3 books. There was an overwhelming response by our members. The editorial board is short listing and informing the selected authors. I am sure that all the 3 books will be ready by their timeline and will be available for everyone to use.
